Clarke, Jane	Trumpet, the Little elephant with the Big Temper	Trumpet nearly spoils his Birthday, but Mum gets him to count to 10 and soon it is Trumpet who is making his Mum count to 10.

Foreman, J and M	Say hello	Very simple story about being left out and the power of being friendly.
Freedman, Claire	New Kid in Town	The animals are scared of Big Bad Wolf, but his reputation is all wrong and it takes Mouse to welcome him into the group.

French, Vivian	Ellie and Elvis	A good friendship gets rocked when a monkey undermines the trust between these elephant friends.
Griffiths, Neil	Winnie Wagtail	Winnie can't wag her tale and tries lots of other ways to learn how, but eventually the skill comes naturally.
Horse, Harry	Little rabbit's new baby	Little Rabbit is excited at the thought of siblings, but reality is a little different – then he slowly learns to adapt and be of real help.
Hudson, Charlotte	In a Little While	Wobbily Fang's Mum is in hospital and will be home in "A little while", but he becomes impatient.
Johnson, Adrian	That's not Funny	Schadenfreude – or laughing at the bad luck of others - Alfie learns the hard way that not everything is to be laughed at.
Kirk, Daniel	Library Mouse	Achievement, motivation and recognition, but as the author here is a mouse, he prefers that he remains anonymous.
Lairla, Sergio	Abel and the Wolf	An empathetic story about a jealous and angry wolf and a sympathetic boy whose patience finally makes them friends
Lloyd, Sam	Mr Pussikins and Little Whiskers	Mr Pussikins is cross at having to put up with a kitten and suffers the injustice of being blamed for her noise, but Little Whiskers feels guilty and all is well.
Lobel, Gill	All my friends	Shy and lonely, Keisha makes friends through what she thinks is a disaster.
McBratney, Sam	It's Lovely when you smile	Roo is feeling grumpy and nothing his mother can do will make him smile – until they get muddy and all is well.
McConnell, Sarah	Marvin's funny Dance	Marvin the Meerkat clown doesn't like being serious even when it gets him into trouble, his friends find him the perfect job.
McCullen, Sam	Billy Back-to-Front	Being different is no reason to be shy, and sometimes it makes others more friendly – the opposite can be very lonely.
Maddern, Eric	Cow on the roof	Folk tale about appreciating the work others do which looks more simple and less hard work than it actually is.
Matthews, Cecily	Cock-a-doodle-do	Lacking in confidence, Leonard the cockerel stands in Basil's Shadow, but when Basil loses his voice Leonard has to save the day
Melling, David	Scallywags	Because the Scallywag wolves are badly behaved and smelly the other animals ignore them, but you can learn to be good at things and still have fun.
Meserve, Jessica	Small	Small resents being stuck in Big's shadow, but eventually they learn their own worth and become friends.
Pichon, Liz	Bored Bill	Bill is boring as well as bored, his trip to an alien planet shows him that doing nothing is what is actually boring and he changes.
Rankin, Laura	Ruthie and the (not so) Teeny Tiny Lie	Ruthie finds a camera in school and claims it as her own, but conscience strikes and she confesses at home and then apologies in school the next day.

Reynolds, Peter H.	Ish	Ramon's confidence in drawing is destroyed by a big brother's teasing, but his little sister shows how his approach is appreciated and just right for him.

Willis, Jeanne	Cottonwool Colin	An over protective Mother tries to wrap her undersized son in cotton wool, but he is more resilient than she realises.
Wisdom, Jude	Billy Jupiter	Billy Jupiter is always scared. His reputation is of a superhero and the insects expect him to protect them, fortunately their enemy is a friend after all.
Wojtowicz, Jen	Boy who grew flowers	Unusual fantasy about being different. Friendship gives Rink the means to help Angelina overcome her disability.
