



## **EMOTIONAL LITERACY LIST 4<sup>TH</sup> EDITION**

The intention of these lists is to provide a memory jogger for Teachers and Librarians, enabling them to find books already available in libraries both at school and at the School Library Service, to support work concerning, emotions, values, citizenship and pastoral problems. The titles are primarily aimed at Key Stages 1 and 2 but there are some titles that could be used at lower secondary level. The majority of titles are picture books. Longer stories contain so many emotions, that the ability to list them with clarity becomes impossible.

Where possible, the titles are recent publications, though there are some older titles listed which are either so appropriate that they were worth listing again, or that have been suggested by Teachers and Librarians after the first lists were in circulation and have been therefore added to the later lists.

The lists are not intended as bibliographical tools for ordering books. Some of the titles are now out of print. Many books are available in hardback, paperback and even big book editions from library stocks. There are a small number of non-fiction titles that were felt to be appropriate, but the list of non-fiction is not exhaustive. Some indication has been given as to whether the titles are more suitable for Key Stage 1 or Key Stage 2.
