Discharge of Fireworks and Stink Bombs in places of Public Entertainment

BYELAW

made by the

Southampton County Borough Council

on the sixteenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine in pursuance of the provisions of Section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933, for the Good Rule and Government of the County Borough of Southampton aforesaid.

Maximum penalty

Maximum penaloginereased to £20 - \$.92(2), Criminal Justice Act, 1957

No person shall with intent to cause annoyance or inconvenience to any person in any place of public entertainment throw or let off any fireworks, stink bomb or similar article, or squirt, spray or otherwise throw or scatter any offensive liquid, powder or substance in any such place as aforesaid. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
