### PART A - Regulations to be met & government advice

### Education (Pupil Registration)(England) Regulations

These are the three applicable criteria that must be met for removal from roll to be lawful. We are trying to determine if they have been met and the 'key words' are highlighted in red.

8(1)(e) except in the case of a boarder, that he has ceased to attend the school and no longer ordinarily resides at a place which is a reasonable distance from the school at which he is registered;

8(1)(f) in the case of a pupil granted leave of absence in accordance with regulation 7(3), that —

(*i*) the pupil has failed to attend the school within the ten school days immediately following the expiry of the period for which such leave was granted;

(*ii*) the proprietor does not have reasonable grounds to believe that the pupil is unable to attend the school by reason of sickness or any **unavoidable cause**; and

(iii) both the proprietor and the local education authority have failed, after reasonable enquiry, to ascertain where the pupil is;

8(1)(h) that he has been continuously absent from the school for a period of not less than twenty school days and —

(i) at no time was his absence during that period authorised by the proprietor in accordance with regulation 6(2);

(ii) the proprietor does not have reasonable grounds to believe that the pupil is unable to attend the school by reason of sickness or any **unavoidable cause**; and

(iii) both the proprietor of the school and the local education authority have **failed**, after reasonable enquiry, to ascertain where the pupil is;

### **Government advice** updated 8 July 2021 on holidays and travel abroad:

Parents should:

- Avoid seeking permission to take your children out of school or college during term time. Make sure any travel is in line with <u>national travel guidance</u>.
- Keep in mind that you and your children may need to self-isolate when you return from a trip overseas. Any self-isolation should also fall within the school or college holidays.
- Respond to the latest rules on international travel, the red/amber/green classification of countries can be changed at any time and at short notice, even if you have already left the UK, while also minimising the impact on your child's education.

Schools and LAs:

- Where a child is abroad and unable to return, local authorities and schools should continue to work with parents to understand their circumstances and plans to return. They should encourage you to return where you are able and it is safe and you should adhere to government travel advice.
- A pupil's name can only lawfully be deleted from the admission register on the grounds prescribed in regulation 8 of the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006 as amended.
- Where able, schools should provide remote education for pupils unable to return from abroad due to COVID-19 travel restrictions, for the period they are abroad.
