# 6. A: CAB068-10/2008- Review of City Council Residential Care Home Provision in Southampton

## Reasons given for the call-in:

- 1. Failure to explore the viability of alternative proposals.
- 2. The decision will lead to a smaller, less competitive market place for publicly funded care.
- 3. Failure to take into account the views of those most effected.

## Recommendations from the call-in meeting:

That the Cabinet Member reconsiders the decision at the next Cabinet meeting, and that the following recommendations be considered:

- (a) that the search for a private sector partner, beyond the two already consulted to run either or both of these care homes, be extended, including exploring the option for a management co-operative;
- (b) that a LIFT scheme to fund a multi-layered residential offer for older people be investigated;
- (c) that the PCT minutes detailing full discussions relating to alternatives that had been exhausted be made available to the Overview & Scrutiny Management Committee;
- (d) that a mixed use community care provision be investigated in one of the two care homes before any closure, with a suggested split of 60% long term and 40% respite care;
- (e) that the Overview & Scrutiny Management Committee be provided with evidence that the demand for respite care in the city was met;
- (f) that the Cabinet Member ensured that lessons about the success or otherwise of this consultation process were learnt; and
- (g) that the work associated with recommendations (a) to (g) was completed as quickly as possible.

## Subsequent decision of the Executive:

At a special meeting on the 14<sup>th</sup> November the executive re-affirmed the original decision, taking into consideration recommendations b, c and e put forward by the Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee recorded above and an amended recommendation g, agreeing that the work associated with recommendations b, c and e should be completed as quickly as possible.

## 7. B: CAB094-11/2008: Installation of New Cremators and Modernisation Works at Southampton Crematorium

## Reasons given for the call-in:

- 1. Failure to justify the decision.
- 2. Failure to take into account the effects of the decision on the service.
- 3. Failure to take into account the effects of the decision on Southampton residents

## Recommendations from the call-in meeting:

- (i) that the Cabinet Member be requested to re-consider the decision; and
- (ii) that the Cabinet Member be requested to consider the phasing in of the price increase, once the full financial information was available.

## Subsequent decision of the Executive:

At a special meeting on the 10<sup>th</sup> December the Executive resolved to endorse the original decision approved by Cabinet on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2008.
