Legal Implications

- The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.



Reason for representation

The King George public house is a detached 1930s building situated in a predominantly residential location on Oakley Road, Shirley, Southampton. The adjacent residential roads include; King George's Avenue, Oakley Road, Percy Road and King Edward Avenue. (see photographs and area plan attached)

We in Environmental Health are concerned that the granting of the variation will increase the likelihood of noise nuisance complaints from the occupiers of residential properties in the area, caused by the extended hours for regulated entertainments, dispersal noise of persons leaving the pub, and noise from persons occupying the pub garden.

A breakdown of our concerns relating to the increased potential for noise problems is as follows:-

- (i) There is a history of noise nuisance problems emanating from this pub. In 1998, the then occupiers of the pub were prosecuted for breaching the requirements of a noise abatement notice served by environmental health, for amplified sound. The statutory noise nuisance was witnessed from a nearby residential property at hours earlier than those now being requested.
- (ii) In May 2006, a noise abatement notice was served by environmental health on the then occupier of the pub, for causing a statutory noise nuisance comprising amplified music, and the amplified voice of a compere. The nuisance was witnessed from within a neighbouring residential property.
- (iii) No acoustic scheme specifying the measures needed to soundproof the pub has been submitted by the applicants in support of their application.
- (iv) The applicants have stated that they are not intending to undertake works to sound proof the premises, or to commission an acoustic consultant's scheme to prescribe any such works.
- (v) The existing (1930s) structure of the premises, in our opinion, is not adequately attenuated to prevent sound from the regulated entertainments breaking out and causing a disturbance to the occupiers of residential properties. For example; The premises is single glazed except for 1 window, there is no acoustic lobby to prevent sound breaking out when persons enter and exit the building, the building is not equipped with an air conditioning system, and therefore, by the applicant's own omission, open windows are deemed necessary to provide adequate ventilation. There is an open chimney flue in the room in which the

entertainments are held. The chimney flue is also a potential noise breakout point.

- (vi) Given that this is a predominantly residential area, with houses in close proximity to the pub, Environmental Health feel that local residents are more likely to be disturbed by those persons leaving the pub at the later hours requested. As such, even if the pub were properly sound attenuated, noise problems would not cease to be an issue.
- (vii) The pubs back garden is surrounded by residential properties. Noise from persons occupying the garden at later hours could cause a disturbance to the occupiers of these properties.
- (viii) Whilst the applicant has stated in section D of the application (The prevention of Public Nuisance) that *"a sound monitor is in place to prevent any amplified music from being too loud"*, there is nothing to verify that the device has been set up by an acoustic consultant to minimise the impact of noise to the occupiers of nearby residential properties. These devices tend to work in conjunction with sound proofing measures and are set up in accordance with an acoustic scheme. Furthermore, the device at the premises works retrospectively, and as such, power is only cut when levels have been exceeded for a given time period.
 The sound cut out device fitted at the premises may not be suitable for live bands which may trigger the cut out too easily.
- (ix) Whilst we have had no noise complaints about the entertainments at the pub under the management of the current leaseholders, they have occupied the premises for less than 12 months, and, live bands are currently restricted to 23:00 hours. Furthermore, this application relates to the Premises Licence and therefore, we need to consider all eventualities, not simply the current licensees.
- (x) The licence application states that late night refreshment is to be served until 01:30 hours 7 days a week, yet the closing times at the pub are stated to be 01:00 hours 7 days a week. There is clearly an error here which needs to be clarified by the applicants, in writing. Furthermore, the applicants say that the hours requested on the application may now be different to those that they actually require. Written confirmation of the hours required have not been received by Environmental Health.

Conclusion

For the aforementioned reasons, Environmental Health (Food Safety Services) do not feel that it is appropriate to extend the hours of The King George public house for any of the licensable activities / regulated entertainments, beyond the current permitted hours. We therefore submit this representation to licensing services.

However, discussions have taken place between the Applicant and the Police as a result of which the Applicant had agreed to amend the application as follows...

Supply of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday inclusive... terminal hour **midnight**. Friday & Saturday...terminal hour **0030 hours**.

The terminal hour for Live Music, Performances of dance and anything similar, Provision of Facilities for making music and dancing and anything similar will correspond to the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol as stated above. The terminal hour for **Recorded music** and **Late Night Refreshment** will correspond to the end of the daily Wind Down period as below.

Following the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol there will follow a daily Wind Down period of 30 minutes following cessation of the service of alcohol.

Late night Refreshment will commence at 2300 hours daily.

Should the Applicant agree to these conditions then the Police will be of the opinion that a hearing is no longer necessary.




