Legal Implications

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a new Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a new Premises Licence whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

- 5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998
 - Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.
- 6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

P Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

It is my aim to sell alcohol responsibly as part of a specialist store for Polish goods, for consumption off the premises only. The alcohol will be displayed behind the counter and will not be accessible directly to customers. There is normally a member of staff behind the counter and two more staff in the shop at all times.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The alcohol will be displayed behind the counter and will not be accessible directly to customers. There is CCTV installed. There should normally be three members of staff in the shop at all times. There are no facilities which would encourage drinking in or in the vicinity of the shop, which is forbidden. Alcohol will not be sold to customers who appear the worse for drink or who are under age.

The shop will be secured by steel shutters when closed.

c) Public safety

There are fire exits to the front and rear of the shop and the premises are on the ground floor. There is suitable fire fighting equipment. The premises are approached by customers on foot only. I intend to co-operate fully with the police and to run the business responsibly to avoid danger to the public. Health and Safety issues should already be addressed by existing legislation.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The street outside is already subject to CCTV surveillance. I will arrange for a sign to be put up outside the premises to make it clear that there is not to be any drinking there and will instruct my staff to either move people on or call the police should they attempt to drink outside or nearby. I am conscious of my duty to ensure as far as possible that alcohol is not sold to people already under the influence, or to under age customers or to persons buying for under age consumers.


e) The protection of children from harm

I intend to sell only a limited range of alcohol for consumption off the premises. The shop is not intended to attract children. There are no gaming or amusement machines and no films or videos of any sort. We do not offer any form of adult entertainment. Customers are not encouraged to hang around and our premises are small. Any attempts to sell children drugs or other unsuitable items or inappropriate conduct towards children is likely to be observed by my staff and appropriate action taken to protect the children.

Re: Objection to Pod Orlem Polish Food Store Application for Licence

To The Licencesing Committee

I am a resident in Porstwood and live very close to The Broadway. I am absolutely horrified that another shop has applied to serve alcohol.

I strongly object to this because of the existing problems in this area. Recently The Council has granted licences to Andor News and 5 The Broadway (old Oxfam shop). The shop applying for the licence is Pod Orlem which is 4 doors away from 5 The Broadway and next door to Newsmaster which also has a licence.

The licence holders in this small area are, Waitrose, Iceland, Blockbusters, Andor News, 5 The Broadway, News master, Premier Post Office and Somerfield also alcohol is sold in the 5 nearby pubs which are also on the high street.

Firstly is there a need to add another site to the 13 already serving? Secondly the amount of alcohol being sold from each location makes it harder to control the drunks and increases the chance of someone selling to underage persons who are at risk from the availability. Another factor to consider is the competition each site is currently creating to gain a large part of this market with huge price cuts. In most cases a can of beer being cheaper than a can of coke this will certainly tempt the younger ages.

I have lived in Woodside Road for the past 11 years and the increasing amount of alcohol fuelled behaviour is becoming very difficult to deal with. Bins are tipped over every night causing environmental problems from food waste being left in the open; cars are always tampered with often wing mirrors being kicked off. It is also common to see people even urinating against someone's front wall.

These problems will not even show signs of disappearing if more and more licences are granted. The public is supportive of action to clean up the streets and make the area safer but with another site adding to the present, the troubles keep escalating.

It is imperative that another licence is not issued for the sake of residents and the young children growing up close to this high street.

I am writing to state my view on the application made by 'Pod Orlem' to request a premises licence. I live above the adjacent shop and continually face disruption from alcohol related issues. With a large majority of the local population being students at the university there are problems every night.

Quiet often private property is damaged and streets are littered every morning.

I have spoken to Community Police several times and they are well aware of the inconvenience caused from alcohol to people in this area.

A walk through the high street will show that there are 14 sites where alcohol can be brought, all this in a radius of 200 yards. This high street has off licences next door to each other, is this really needed?

My personal opinion is that some retailers are just unable to refuse a sale to these drunks and those who look like they have had too much to drink, because they fear the safety of their business and also don't want to lose a customer to a competitor.

A newspaper report two weeks ago reported that shops in a village in Cornwall have teamed together to refuse sales to those who look like they might cause trouble. This is an excellent strategy and should be practiced here in my area as well. However I strongly object to this application being approved because it will cause more trouble in Portwsood to the people and could result in more children drinking because it is cheap to buy.

It is important that the departments concerned are also aware that this particular shop trades in foreign tobacco and sells spirits from the rear of the shop. I have witnessed this on many occasions from my kitchen window. Does this make them responsible to sell an enjoyable but wrongly sold can be harmful product which has restrictions to it? I have spoken to Mr Marshall at Trading Standards about this matter.

I am writing to express my objection to the above on the grounds of prevention of crime & disorder & secondly the prevention of public nuisance.

With regard to the prevention of crime & disorder, sale of alcohol being possible from 8am-midnight, 7 days a week, is very likely to lead to alcohol assisted crime in the immediate area, possibly on the premises themselves. The area already has a number of premises selling alcohol-Mitre, Varsity, Gordon Arms Portswood Convenience Store, Blockbusters, Iceland, Somerfield, Waitrose, Portswood Wines, Andor News and Newsmaster which is next door to the concerned site. Adding to this already extensive list is likely to lead to a 'price war', resulting in cheaper & accessible alcohol, inevitably increasing the possibility of crime & disorder due to excessive alcohol.

Turning to the prevention of public nuisance, following on from the above, more alcohol is likely to be drunk resulting in the inevitable disruption & intimidation for local people of all ages. If a price war develops and the word gets round more buyers will appear resulting in more pressures to local traffic and parking. We have recently seen 2 shops being granted licences to serve off the premises which add to the existing sites, resulting in 6 stores with an average distance between each being only 100 yards.

Portswood has a large population of younger ages it is a very residential area with many families. Houses are located very close to the main parade, there are 2 parks and many buses dedicated to school children running services through the high street. The amenities and service to children are important part of business for many traders in Portswood. A further licensed premises is all too dangerous, it will make the availability of alcohol too easy.

Although I can't be certain but the store in concern, being a small staff run business will mean that they will have to price competitively to compete against the present 5 sites.
