(i) Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.(ii) Sponsorship:

Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from Southampton City Council) made or provided within the relevant period in respect of any expense incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

(iii) Any contract which is made between you / your spouse etc (or a body in which the you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interest) and Southampton City Council under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed, and which has not been fully discharged.

(iv) Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of Southampton.

(v) Any license (held alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of Southampton for a month or longer.

(vi) Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) the landlord is Southampton City Council and the tenant is a body in which you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interests.

(vii) Any beneficial interest in securities of a body where that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of Southampton, and either:

- a) the total nominal value fo the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body, or
- b) if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interest that exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

# **Principles of Decision Making**

### 51. ELECTION OF CHAIR

**RESOLVED** that Councillor Cunio be elected Chair for the purposes of this meeting.

## 52. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING (INCLUDING MATTERS ARISING)

**<u>RESOLVED</u>** that the Minutes of the Meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2012 be signed as a correct record. (Copy of the minutes circulated with the agenda and appended to the signed minutes).

## 53. EXCLUSION OF THE PRESS AND PUBLIC

**<u>RESOLVED</u>** that in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 that the press and public be excluded at a predetermined point whilst the Sub-Committee reached its decisions.

### 54. <u>APPLICATION FOR PREMISES LICENCE - DONYA LIMITED, 50 OXFORD STREET,</u> <u>SOUTHAMPTON, SO14 3DL</u>

The Sub-Committee considered the application for a premises licence in respect of Donya Limited, 50 Oxford Street, Southampton, SO14 3DL. (Copy of the report circulated with the agenda and appended to the signed minutes).

Mr Morris, Solicitor for the applicant, Mr Panjganj, Designated Premises Supervisor and Mr Wainwright, Environmental Health Officer were present and with the consent of the Chair, addressed the meeting.

The Sub-Committee considered the decision in confidential session in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

**RESOLVED** that the application for a premises licence be granted, subject to:-

- (i) the following conditions, agreed with the police as detailed on pages 24 and 25 of the bundle:-
  - CCTV
  - Training
  - Challenge 25
  - Refusals Book
  - Incident Book;

- (ii) that the roof terrace shall not be utilised by patrons of the licensed premises; and
- (iii) an acoustic report, the terms of instruction to be agreed by Environmental Health in advance, would be prepared by an independent acoustic engineer, likewise so approved. The recommendations of that report would be implemented at the premises and their satisfactory implementation confirmed by Environmental Health in writing, prior to the commencement of any licensable activities. A copy of the proposed terms of instruction and any report prepared would be provided to Environmental Heath to enable enforcement of this condition. Any works detailed, approved and implemented, would be maintained at the premises.

# **REASONS**

The Sub-Committee considered very carefully the application for a premises licence at Donya and gave due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing objectives, statutory guidance, the adopted statement of licensing policy, human rights legislation as well as the evidence submitted by all parties, both written and given orally today and in particular, considered which steps, if any, were necessary and appropriate in accordance with the legislation and the terms of guidance.

The Sub-Committee noted that the application had been adjourned from 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2012 and during that time the applicant had been in contact with the Environmental Health Department and had accepted their recommendations regarding the undertaking of an acoustic report (independent acoustic engineers). In this regard an agreed draft condition was presented to the Sub-Committee for its consideration requiring the same and compliance with any recommendation of that report. Environmental Health confirmed that this would address their concerns regarding the potential for noise nuisance, if they were provided with a copy of the report to enable checking the proposed measures were in fact implemented. The acoustic report would consider external acoustics and internal specifications (including glazing, extraction and the lobby) to address the potential for noise transfer from commercial to residential. Environmental Health confirmed that their considerations not only considered existing residents in the area, but also future residents created by the development of the premises itself.

It was also noted that the applicant had negotiated with the police and agreed substantial conditions to be attached to the licence, including that the roof terrace would not be open to the public, nor used by the premises (ie limited to residential use associated with the flats only).

The Sub-Committee noted the extent of co-operation shown by the premises with the police and Environmental Health and the fact that the agreed conditions and recommended noise attenuation works would be put in place, by way of and in accordance with the proposed agreed condition.

The Sub-Committee considered very carefully residential concerns and gave due weight to their representations in relation to public nuisance and noise. However, it

was felt that the above agreed conditions would be sufficient and appropriate measures, if properly implemented, to address those issues.


The Sub-Committee did have concerns regarding the potential for noise nuisance generated by those leaving the premises late at night and gave very careful consideration to limiting the hours of operation. However, in light of the extent of the agreed conditions and the nature of the proposed premises (being food-led/restaurant), it was not considered appropriate or proportionate in the absence of evidence, to restrict the hours of operation at this stage. It was also noted that the premises were not intending to make full use of the hours detailed in the application, but made the application to enable flexibility in their operation.

The Sub-Committee, whilst making this decision, took into account the ability of residents to make representation in the future where evidence showed the premises were the cause of additional noise nuisance or associated nuisance, which would lead to a review hearing where further steps could be taken to address those issues. Accordingly, residents should be reassured that the licensing authority had significant powers, if appropriate and proportionate, when dealing with a premises on review.



# Legal Implications

- The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.

4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

#### 5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

#### 6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.



## Legal Implications

 The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a new Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.

- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a new Premises Licence whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. 

#### **State the ground(s) for representation** (please read guidance notes 1 & 2)

This applicant has provided limited evidence showing its analysis of intensity of use between 1<sup>st</sup> April to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2011. 48% is fuel only and 52% its convenience store. In relation to S176 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport states that the licensing authority must decide whether or not any premises is 'used primarily as a garage' in deciding on whether a licence should be granted. This only highlights that nearly half of its customers will only purchase fuel and if the licence was granted , put before them the temptation to purchase alcohol.

We have requested that the applicant provide the police with more cogent evidence of transactions, broken down, identifying numbers of transactions made by customers over a protracted period of 6 months during 2012:

The number of customers who drive or ride motor vehicles onto the site and purchase fuel for the vehicle only.

The number of customers who drive or ride motor vehicles onto the site and purchase fuel for the vehicle and also purchase non-garage goods.

The number of customers who drive or ride motor vehicles onto the site and purchase non-garage goods only.

The number of customers who access the premises on foot and make any purchase.

The above information would indicate in much more detail as to whether this premises is primarily a garage or not allowing a more informed decision.

At this time the applicant has not been able to supply the above information and the data they have provided to date only details the number of transactions between fuel and the convenience store. They have explained that if a customer attended the premises and purchased £60 of fuel and whilst paying decided to purchase a single bar of chocolate at 70p this would be counted as a transaction for fuel and a transaction for the convenience store. However, it would be quite evident that the main intention of the customer would have been to purchase fuel.

Petrol stations, by their very nature, are strongly associated with driving and attract a significant trade from motorists. It is therefore reasonable to argue that sales of alcohol from such premises may increase the number of drink related road injuries and deaths (although Police data does not presently capture where alcohol has been purchased) and may also be potentially damaging to public campaigns

that seek to highlight the risks of drinking and driving. Fatalities on the road resulting from drink and drive accidents are still one of the highest contributing factors. Evidence produced by the Department for Transport published 16<sup>th</sup> August 2012 show that the number of fatal drink and drive accidents rose to 260 in 2011, an increase of 18% relative to 2010. Further evidence provided by Alcohol Concern states that as many as one in six deaths on roads in the UK are caused by drivers over the legal alcohol limit. Driving whilst under the influence of alcohol can impair an individuals judgement and therefore their ability to drive safely. Some countries have an outright ban on petrol stations selling alcohol due to the link between alcohol consumption and motor accidents. Since the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2012 to 30<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 the Southampton area alone has had 95 impairment occurrences. In the promotion of the licensing objectives "public safety and the prevention of crime and disorder" the police believe we should avoid placing the temptation on motorists of consuming alcohol behind the wheel.

# State any conditions that the Police seek to negate the need for a hearing

To negate a hearing taking place we would need to be provided with statistics that show that the primary use of the premises is not that as a garage but as a convenience store. Currently in discussions with regard to conditions that we would like to be added to the licence should it be granted which could also be discussed at hearing if not agreed to beforehand.

We would like to register our strong objection to the proposed licence to sell alcohol on these premises 24/24 and for "late night refreshments" to be available from 11pm till 5am.

The site is virtually in a residential area. The residents suffered enough from the litter arising from the previous "convenience" store, and to have extra bottles, cans etc. discarded (as they will be) would be awful.

The petrol filling site is one of the busiest in the south. It really does not justify customers of the new deli stocking up on alcohol - and is the sale of Late Night Refreshments from 11pm - 5am really essential?-There is little we can do about a general 'convenience' store, BUT Alcohol available all day and all night should not be a 'convenience'. How can the sale of alcohol to minors/over the limit drivers be monitored?

The alley at the side of the filling station, and at the back of same, is unlit at night. There is regular damage to the entrance to the Motorway in the alley (the door has been stolen and there is now direct access for anything-anyone) and the lock is usually broken, when there. This is potentially very dangerous, particularly if fuelled by readily available alcohol. It seems to attract undesirables anxious to find a quiet/dark place for "L'ord know What' (but being 86 and 77 years old respectively - we can guess - perhaps we can keep the birth rate down a little as well!)

Surely at the start of the M3 Motorway it is not a good thing to have unlimited alcohol available all day - and night - every day and night. A filling station is surely for fuel for motors, NOT alcoholic fuel for drivers. Does "Don't Drink and Drive" count for nothing.

Please we would urge the Licensing Team to reject this application. Thank you .....
