Terms of Reference

The Sub-Committee deals with licences for which the Council is responsible under the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005, including:-

- Determination of applications for review of premises licences and club premises certificates;
- Determination of representations to applications for premises licences and club premises certificates, variations and various permits;
- Determination of police objections to applications for:
 - Variation of designated premises supervisors
 - Transfer of premises licences
 - Personal licences for the sale of alcohol
- Determination of objections to temporary event notices.

Relevant Representations

Those who have made relevant representations may address the meeting about the matter in which they have an interest. New matters, not raised within a written representation, can not be relied upon at the hearing. When dealing with Licensing Act matters the Sub-Committee must only take into account the following statutory Licensing Objectives:-

- prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety

- protection of children from harm

Likewise, when dealing with Gambling Act matters the Sub Committee must only take into account the statutory Licensing Objectives below:-

- Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling

RESOLVED that Councillor Blatchford be elected as Chair for the purposes of this meeting.

14. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING (INCLUDING MATTERS ARISING)

RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 27 July 2016 be approved and signed as a correct record.

15. **EXCLUSION OF THE PRESS AND PUBLIC**

RESOLVED that in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 that the parties to the hearing, press and public be excluded at a predetermined point whilst the Sub-Committee reaches its decision.

16. <u>APPLICATION FOR REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE - COBDEN NEWS, 113 ST</u> DENYS ROAD, SOUTHAMPTON SO17 2FS

The Sub-Committee considered the application for review of a premises licence in respect of Cobden News, 113 St. Denys Road, Southampton SO17 2FS.

Mr L Marshall (Trading Standards), PC Alex Boucouvalas (Hampshire Constabulary), Ms S Denley (Public Health), Ms S Sulh (Premises Licence Holder), Ms P Sulh (Premises Licence Holder's daughter in law), Mr A Sulh (Premises Licence Holder's son) were present and with the consent of the Chair, addressed the meeting.

The Sub-Committee considered the decision in confidential session in accordance with the Licensing Act (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

RESOLVED that the application for a premises licence be revoked.

After private deliberation the Sub-Committee reconvened and the Chair read out the following decision:-

All parties will receive formal written confirmation of the decision and reasons.

The Sub-Committee has considered very carefully the application for review of the premises licence at Cobden News, 113 St Denys Road, Southampton SO17 2FS by

Trading Standards and supported by Hampshire Constabulary and Public Health. It has given due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Objectives, statutory guidance and the adopted statement of Licensing Policy. Human Rights Legislation has been borne in mind whilst making this decision.

All the evidence presented both written and given orally today, has been carefully considered and taken into account. The Sub-Committee particularly addressed itself to the licensing objectives for the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm.

Having considered all of the above, and all the steps available under section 52, sub section 4, the Sub-Committee has decided to revoke the premises licence.

Reasons

The Sub-Committee heard evidence relating to multiple criminal offences at the premises. Evidence showed that on at least four occasions alcohol had been sold in breach of the mandatory condition requiring alcohol not to be sold below the cost of duty plus VAT. HMRC had provided a view that at the price stated (which was not considered viable), sourcing of the alcohol was of considerable concern. The price indicated an illicit source. Smuggled goods present many risks including risks to health but in this instance it is noted that Trading Standards believed the goods to be genuine. The Sub-Committee heard that a failure to promptly provide the invoice relating to those goods constituted a criminal offence and that further concerns arose regards the accuracy and credibility of that document. It is an offence for non-duty paid items to be kept at the premises also. Further to this staff at the premises were not lawfully entitled to work in the UK and were not paid – which raises serious concern that other offences may have been committed. Food at the premises was displayed past the sale by date and alcohol was not properly labelled. In addition an underage sale was made at the premises. Public Health gave evidence that confirmed the impact of this type of offending and that the area in which the premises is located is acknowledged as suffering from street drinking. The particular risks posed to children were also outlined.

The Sub-Committee heard that the premises licence holder had run the premises for forty years without blemish and that all of the issues described by Trading Standards, Hampshire Constabulary and Public Health arose from others managing and in day-to-day control of the premises.

This evidence accords entirely with the evidence of Trading Standards that the premises licence holder (also the DPS) was in effect absent from the premises and that there was, as a result, a complete lack of control. Basic due diligence at the premises was accordingly failing over a significant period. This has led to the most serious breaches of the premises licence and offences being committed.

The Sub-Committee did carefully consider the implications of revocation of the licence upon the premises licence holder and were referred to paragraph 11.23 of the statutory guidance, but in all the circumstances determined that as premises licence holder and DPS at the premises she holds the responsibility for the premises licence. The premises licence holder was unable to clarify the business arrangement and the basis on which the business and / or premises had been transferred. On this basis the Sub Committee could not be satisfied that matters could suitably be resolved moving

forward or that the premises licence holder remained suitable as a result of such substantial and prolonged error of judgement.

The Sub-Committee was referred to the statutory guidance during the course of the hearing, notably paragraphs 11.24-11.28 (reviews arising in connection with crime) and noted that where the premises are used to further crimes, revocation should be seriously considered even in the first instance.

In light of all of the above the Sub-Committee decided that revocation was appropriate and proportionate. Whilst carefully considered, alternative steps would not be sufficient to address the risks to the licensing objectives posed by the continued operation of the premises.

There is a right of appeal for all parties to the Magistrates' Court. Formal notification of the decision will set out that right in full.

Legal Implications

- 1. The legislation specifically restricts the grounds on which the sub-committee may refuse an application for a premises licence, or impose conditions. The legislation provides for a presumption of grant of a premises licence, subject to the determination of the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. In doing so the sub-committee must give appropriate weight to:
 - the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
 - the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
 - its own statement of licensing policy
 - the Statutory Guidance
- 2. An application may be refused in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 3. An applicant for the grant of a premises licence whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court. Any other person, who made a valid representation, may appeal to the magistrates' Court against the decision to grant of the application or against any conditions imposed.
- 4. In considering this application the sub-committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider the application in accordance, in particular, with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended) and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the sub-committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.
- 5. The sub-committee must also have regard to:
 - The Crime and Disorder Act 1998 Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the sub-committee under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.
 - The Human Rights Act 1998
 The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the sub-committee to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the sub-committee that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the

principle of proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the sub-committee which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matters set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

Summary of application

Applicant	Miss Danielle Bull
Designated Premises Supervisor	Miss Danielle Bull

The applicant proposes to operate an on demand drinks and snacks delivery service via online orders and telephone orders between the hours of 09:00 to Midnight 7 days a week. The public will not be allowed on the premises at any time.

The applicant had taken advice from Hampshire Constabulary licensing unit prior to submitting the application to the licensing authority and had agreed to include the following conditions on her application form.

Operating Schedule

Deliveries

Deliveries will only take place to a dwelling or place of work with a recognised postal address, including post code.

Delivery drivers will carry a maximum of £20 in change when on a delivery.

All customers will receive a phone call, to a number supplied by them, before the order is delivered to prevent deliveries to a wrong address/person.

Alcohol will only be delivered or handed to the person who placed the order and who are 18 years of age or over. Identification will need to be shown on every occasion to confirm the age of the recipient. Accepted forms of identification will be passport, photo driving licence or Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) approved ID. If there is no ID then no sale will take place.

A record will be made on the order and delivery docket of:

- the name of the customer
- Age
- Confirmation of the ID to be produced
- ID Identification number
- Address for delivery
- Contact phone number
- Method of payment
- Date and time of delivery

This record shall be maintained and shall be produced to Police upon request back dating to a period of no less than six months. These records will remain on the premises at all times and available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary immediately on request.

The details of any identification that is produced by persons receiving alcohol will be recorded. This record will be produced to Police Officers or Licensing Officers upon request back dating to a period of no less than 6 months.

An incident/refusals book will be maintained in which would be recorded any incidents where underage or drunk customers are refused alcohol sales and deliveries and any other incidents of note that may occur.

No delivery will be completed where the purchaser appears to be under the influence of drink or drugs.

Training-

Staff, including delivery drivers, will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and re-tested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session. All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

Challenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the person's date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

Incident book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, injury or id seizure will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry.

At the close of business on each day the incident book will be checked by the manager on duty where any entries will be reviewed and signed. If incidents have occurred the duty manager will debrief staff at the close of business. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the close of business in the incident book.

Refusals book

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to sell alcohol. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the refusals log is checked, signed and dated on a weekly basis by the duty manager/manageress.

The refusals log will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for inspection immediately upon request by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority.

The record of refusals will be retained for 12 months.

Moonlight Drinks is a genuine service and has no intention of fueling late night nuisance parties; consequently have chosen not to sell alcohol past midnight.

The Moonlight drinks service could play a strong part in providing a deterrent from drink driving.

I understand to run a licensed premises it is necessary to carry out certain functions and operate the business with a purpose of promoting the objectives. I respect the seriousness of underage drinking and I promise to fully support these objectives and ensure any other terms of licence are adhered to.

In Support of all Four Licensing Objectives:

I will ensure effective and regular training of all staff including delivery drivers so that they are aware of the premises licence conditions and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives; with particular attention to but not limited to the following:

Deliveries

Deliveries will only take place to a dwelling or place of work with a recognised postal address, including post code.

Delivery drivers will carry a maximum of £20 in change when on a delivery.

All customers will receive a phone call, to a number supplied by them, before the order is delivered to prevent deliveries to a wrong address/person.

Alcohol will only be delivered or handed to the person who placed the order and who are 18 years of age or over. Identification will need to be shown on every occasion to confirm the age of the recipient. Accepted forms of identification will be passport, photo driving licence or Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) approved ID. If there is no ID then no sale will take place.

A record will be made on the order and delivery docket of:

- the name of the customer
- Age
- Confirmation of the ID to be produced
- ID Identification number
- Address for delivery
- Contact phone number
- Method of payment
- Date and time of delivery

This record shall be maintained and shall be produced to Police upon request back dating to a period of no less than six months. These records will remain on the premises at all times and available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary immediately on request.

The details of any identification that is produced by persons receiving alcohol will be recorded. This record will be produced to Police Officers or Licensing Officers upon request back dating to a period of no less than 6 months.

An incident/refusals book will be maintained in which would be recorded any incidents where underage or drunk customers are refused alcohol sales and deliveries and any other incidents of note that may occur.

No delivery will be completed where the purchaser appears to be under the influence of drink or drugs.

Training-

Staff, including delivery drivers, will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and re-tested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

Challenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the persons date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

Incident book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, injury or id seizure will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry.


At the close of business on each day the incident book will be checked by the manager on duty where any entries will be reviewed and signed. If incidents have occurred the duty manager will de-brief staff at the close of business. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the close of business in the incident book.

Refusals book

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to sell alcohol. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the refusals log is checked, signed and dated on a weekly basis by the duty manager/manageress.

The refusals log will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for inspection immediately upon request by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority.

The record of refusals will be retained for 12 months.

Objection to Licence for Moonlight Drinks, Office 5,11 Cumberland Place Southampton.

It it totally unacceptable for the Council to allow yet another alcohol outlet on the fringes of the Cumulative Impact Area

which extends into the roads near to where I live.

It is proven fact that the Polygon suffers endemic criminal damage and noise nuisance connected to drinking of alcohol at bars, clubs and houses in the area of London Road and Bedford Place and Polygon, Fitzhugh.

The nuisance and stress for long term citizens has been suffered for over 25 years, during which time more outlets have

been passed and hours added to licences.

Having been an objector during that time I am extremely resentful that Licensing do not want me to put in pages of evidence lest the Panel "switch off" in case there is too much detail to take in.

Although in fact the amount of detail and number of crime and nuisance incidents prove my case conclusively.

As this is a new outlet obviously no evidence has built up, however it has occurred to me that even if deliveries stop at midnight the party hosts can easily stock up with tons of bottles and tins in the hall to last until the next day.

Polygon and Fitzhugh parties have been known to go on from afternoon to mid morning the next day.

Environmental Health cannot stop the parties and even if Noise Abatement is issued, all night music at same houses will still carry on for weeks after that.

Regarding Protection of children from Harm - there is no protection - any house delivered to can have young children inside.

PUBLIC NUISANCE-- this could occur if party guests spill out on to the road, police are too busy with bar and club problems to patrol the side streets and I have personally had to go out and deal with party nuisance myself.

Where will the alcohol be stored ?
In this end of terrace office building ?
Who else uses this place ?
Will they be disturbed by crashing and jingling of bottles and cans ?

Objection to Licence for Moonlight Drinks, Delivery to Your Door Service from Office 5 , 11 Cumberland Place Southampton.

It it somewhat shocking that the Council is even having to consider yet another alcohol outlet so near to my home, within a five to ten minute walk in a easterly direction there must be nearly 50 already.

The huge student blocks in Cumberland Place have applied for licences and these flatlets/rooms will provide a ready stream of customers for this delivery service.

It will encourage alcohol dependency in a section of the community, young people, away from home for the first time, many from abroad, not used to alcohol at all or over drinking and the dangers it can bring.

The council has a duty to protect them from harm.

The CIP directive has caused a refusal for an off licence in Bedford Place although no one was allowed to object due to the vicinity rule imposed for almost ten years. During that that period people in Polygon were forced to suffer in silence the awful crime and "punishment" of having more outlets and longer trading hours imposed . For that reason many families fled the area.

It is fact that the Polygon area suffers night time criminal damage/ and noise nuisance connected to over consuming of alcohol at bars, night clubs and houses in the area of London Road, Carlton Place, Vernon Walk and Bedford Place / Polygon, Fitzhugh.

I concede that as this is a new outlet, no evidence can or has been built up, and that this is similar to an off licence, but then would you allow another of those in view of the evidence against licences or extensions given in to Licensing in recent other objections.

About 50 pages plus photographs. ?

Environmental Health cannot stop the noisy parties at which over drinking is feature, police tell us not to approach house party premises but no one else is around to deal with it. I have been witness to violence and long term injury caused to complainants by aggressive party guests.

Licensing Objectives - regarding Protection of Children from Harm - you cannot guarantee that- that there is no protection - any place delivered to can have young children within the house or flat.

PUBLIC NUISANCE-- this would happen if or when party guests spill out on to the road, police are too busy with bar and club problems to patrol the side streets and I have personally had to go out and deal with party nuisance myself.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder- it is rarely prevented in Polygon area despite the best

efforts of the over worked police force.

Check out the press articles re the subject presented to your department on a regular basis.

Have you heard of the Council's Health and Well Being Strategy? It has been introduced to cut down on alcohol self abuse and obesity.

What good will that do if the outlets increase and drink is even more easy to obtain in an area with so much dependency already?

This can be observed by the number of empty alcohol bottles and cans seen outside local houses in the grey collection tubs

Check with the refuse department to see the ratio of such bottles compared to other areas of Southampton and the suburbs.


Moonlight Drinks Delivery Service 11 Cumberland Place
