I attended the venue and met with the dps.

I explained to her the results of the ion track swabs from the toilets and that they all tested positive for cocaine. She said that she is planning on conducting hourly toilet checks when it was busy and was making posters to advise customers that checks will be conducted.

There is no CCTV in the venue and i explained how this could perhaps put people off using drugs in the venue and would show that she was supporting the licensing objectives. There was also an assault in June where someone was hit with a pool cue. The dps explained that she does not have the money to fund CCTV. She said business had been really quiet of late and she was thinking of getting out of the business. I did explain that i would send a letter to her and enterprise Inns with regards to CCTV and if there was further incidents, we would look to possibly go to review to have the CCTV issue addressed.

There was no incident book or record of refusals. I explained this in full to the dps and she agreed to purchase a book and then use it immediately. She did say that she generally has more mature groups and does get many young people in. This discussion went on to due diligence. She explained it was just her and her daughter that worked there, but was happy to get something together with my assistance. I will arrange another time to do this.

Meeting at Chamberlayne Arms 04/08/2011

Incidents

Police – have received sporadic information about drugs being used in the toilets at the premise and Ion-track swabs taken from all toilets showed high levels of cocaine. There was an assault on 18th June 2011, where a male had a pool cue thrown at him causing injury.

Action – DPS advised that she is intending on conducting hourly toilet checks when it is busy and will produce posters informing customers of toilet checks.

CCTV

Police – There is currently no CCTV on the premises. DPS advised that CCTV would promote licensing objectives and deter customers from using drugs and possibly committing other offences if they were aware that CCTV was installed at the venue. CCTV will assist police in investigating any offences that may occur on the premises. DPS was advised that should there be further incidents and this matter is not addressed, we would look to take the matter further and this may be by a review of the premises licence.

Venue – DPS advised police there is not sufficient funding for a CCTV system.

Action – Letter to be sent to Enterprise Inns highlighting police concern over there being no CCTV at the venue.

Incident book

Police – There was no incident book currently being used. Police explained the benefits of maintaining a diarised book.

Venue – The DPS advised she was happy to use an incident book and would get one in place immediately.

Action – New incident book to be checked on next visit.

Refusals log

Police – Advised the benefits of maintaining a log with regards to due diligence.

Venue – The DPS advised that she would maintain a record within the incident book.

Action – To be checked on next visit.

Due Diligence training pack

Police – Currently no due diligence package in place, so explained how due diligence can protect licensees and DPS. Informed DPS of test purchase operations.

Venue – The DPS advised it is only her and her daughter that work at the premise, but she would be happy to produce a due diligence package with police assistance.

Action – Police to contact DPS to make further arrangement.

Dear Sir,

This letter is with regards to a meeting that was held between Susan Diaper, designated premise supervisor for Chamberlayne Arms in Southampton and myself on 4th August 2011.

During this meeting we discussed the fact that the venue has no CCTV. This is not acceptable and is not supporting licensing objectives. Police received recent information of drug use in the toilets and ion-track drug swabs taken from the toilets have confirmed there was traces of cocaine. There was also an assault on 18th June 2011, where a pool cue was thrown at the aggrieved causing injury. CCTV would have assisted police in this investigation in identifying the offender and will deter customers from committing offences. If a further incident was to occur and there was no CCTV to assist police in a criminal investigation, then we would look to address the matter and this may be by way of a review of the premises licence. Remarks: Update re problems in area

I attended [REDACTED] and although [REDACTED] were not there, [REDACTED] was. She confirmed they experience various asb occurrences including damage to vehicles, plant pots turned over, fighting in the street and damage to garden fences which they attribute to the pub although they have said problems occur up to 0200. I pointed out the pub closes at 0030 Friday/Sat but she said that they hang around outside or in the car park. I have left my contact details with [REDACTED] but advised that they must report incidents. I also advised I would be addressing this matter with the landlord.

On return to the station I have completed an RMS search of incidents that have occurred in North East Road. This is under the general search criteria I have set up for AB area. Surprisingly there were only 18 incidents for the past year. One of the occurrences I looked at (44110201529) the informant mentioned CCTV in the area so I called her [REDACTED]. She did not know where this comment came from regarding CCTV but did provide a broader insight into problems in the area. She advised there is also resettlement housing with what she describes as people with some severe issues who can cause a lot of noise. She also believed that a lot of the problems are youth related stating there are 2 estates and children stay out late causing asb.

As a result, I have sent the following email to PC RAINSCOURT engagement officer at AB:

Hi Dan

Just following on from our last conversations, I have been to [REDACTED] Road. [REDACTED] were at work, but [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] East Road was there. She explained that after closing of the pub and can continue until around 0200, there is often various disturbances including damage to fences, plant pots and fighting in the street. I did mention that the pub should be closed long before then (0030 Friday and Saturday), but they believe people hang around outside and in the car park.

[REDACTED] went on to say that it was not every weekend they experience problems, but on occasions it can be really bad and recently there has been an increase.

I have since looked at reports of asb including damage, assault and public order

occurrences, I have contacted a [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] North East Road. She has advised me that there is a much broader spectrum of problems I need to consider. She said that there is resettlement housing for people with severe issues who tend to cause a lot of noise and 2 estates with children that tend to stay out really late causing asb issues (we both know that). There is clearly a lot of problems occurring that are not being reported.

From a licensing perspective, if it is the pubs patrons that are causing problems then they will need to take some positive action to address the issues. I am happy to arrange a meeting with them and will address it from a licensing point of view, but wondered if you would like to attend to provide your views.

As it would appear to be a cummulation of issues in the area, can I ask that SNT look into this. If any of the problems can be linked to the pub, then please let us know so we can deal.

Attended an initially spoke with daughter of DPS (Tanya). I explained about the drugs intel we had rcvd and advised that it suggested that they were perhaps aware and even involved. I explained i was not accusing them, but making them aware of the information. I said if there was any truth in the allegation and this was identified they could loose their licence.

Tanya laughed it off and was fairly dismissive about it and then said i know whos doing this. Mum the dps was then called down and i went through the information again. She denied the allegations and the daughter said again we know whos doing this and became agitated. Mum advised her not to worry about it. I explained that we would look to attend the premises regularly to conduct drug swabs in the toilets.

I was pleased to see that they had put notices on the doors of the toilets advising that hourly checks would be made in the toilets to ensure drugs are not being taken in there. Having checked the toilets i could see no residue of any drugs.

Whilst walking from the car park of the Chamberlayne Arms in Sholing to the entrance, a male could be seen through the frosted window of the disabled toilet. He appeared to be taking drugs on the window seal. The male was identified as He was searched, remaining calm throughout and made suggestions that it was others we should be worried about and that we would find nothing on him. He had £100 in cash in his back pocket, a rolled up £10 note clearly just used to snort cocaine and another £5 in another pocket. Residue of white powder could be seen on the window sill and at this point admitted to taking cocaine saying someone left it for him.

..... currently deals Cocaine in the area he will also deal from within 'The Chamberlayne Arms', North East Road. will sell to who is the landlady and also 'sleep with her', in return for Cocaine.

07/02/2012 10:25

Cocaine drug dealing is taking place openly within the Chamberlayne Arms, Sholing, Southampton. The landlady is called Sue and he daughter is They are both users of Cocaine and are involved in the selling as well. The father is called and he is believed to be "clean". 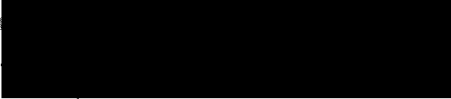

I saw Blue Jersey male and his 4 mates come towards me. Blue Jersey male came right up to me and when I started saying anything started hitting me with clenched fists, I can't remember what hands he used. I thought I needed to defend myself so I managed to hit him back. At the same time I was trying to walk away but Blue Jersey male's friends just pushed me back into the front. Blue Jersey male then bite me to my right cheek and then on top of my crown. I then managed to hit him many which started him. I just wanted to get away from the situation. So I walked past the pub towards ~~South East~~ ~~pub~~ way. I took the first right then first left. I looked around and saw Blue Jersey male being me. I knew I couldn't run away from him. So I turned up to him and said 'mate just turn away and go'. Blue Jersey male then started to hit me again, I again defended myself. I then saw a female being Blue Jersey male, she was calling him back. I knew it was the German as I remember her being near Blue Jersey male then walking away. I then called 999. I thought the police would not be able

to find me where I was, so I decided to walk back to North East Road my to the pub. So the police could see me. I stopped by the house which is left of the pub. I noticed the lights of the ~~BAR~~^{DC} pub. As I was going a blue jersey male came out of the pub with a female who I do not recognise any the barmaid. I tried to say away from blue jersey male. Blue jersey male then came over to me and said 'What are you going home?' I told him I was waiting for someone and I then said 'Leave me alone' Blue jersey male then said 'Nah, nah, you deserve this' I told blue jersey male that I may call the police and they went on their way. Blue jersey male then hit me hard to the face, I fell onto the ground, which was in the house's garden and while I was waiting. Blue jersey male then stomped on my head then kicked me to the right side of my head. I can't really remember what happened after that. Like I was. I did nothing to provoke the attack. I was pulled to stand off with as I was called that. Then I was hit with no reason. I had to defend myself as if I might. I believe I would have been severely injured. I'm still in stock being bitten to the face. It was the first time I had come to that pub. I certainly won't be going back there.

I would describe blue jersey male as a white male, aged in his mid to late 20's, he had short brown hair which was cut between stage 2 and stage 3. He was clean shaven. I did not notice any piercings or tattoos on him. He was about 6' tall and was very athletic build. He was wearing a deep blue jumper it had a badge on it, it looked like he was just finished work. The jumper almost looked like a school jumper. He had blue jeans on and was wearing blue Timberland boots.

I can't remember how long the incident took as I lost consciousness. The closest blue jersey male was to me was literally in my face. There was no obstacles in my way. It was night time so was dark, there was street lighting outside the pub which was on. I ~~had~~ do not know blue

I am the above named person and I live at the address overleaf. This statement refers to when I witnessed an assault outside the Chamberlyn Arms public house in North East Road, Southampton.

I will be mentioning the following persons, overweight male who was the male who got assaulted and dark clothed male who assaulted overweight male.

The assault happened on Sunday 1st April 2012 at around 2100hrs.

[Redacted] Chamberlyn Arms in North East Road, Southampton. On Sunday 1st April 2012 I was [Redacted] At around 2100hrs I heard a lot of shouting which I could hear over the sound of my TV. I instantly knew it was coming from the pub [Redacted] I saw overweight male with out a t-shirt on with a pair of shorts on in a tussle with another male. Overweight male looked like he was trying to defend himself. I phoned up 999 to report what was happening. I then saw another fight break out on [Redacted] driveway at [Redacted] I could not believe what I was witnessing. The fights then seemed just to stop and I saw number of males go back into the pub and I saw overweight male walk down the road in the direction of South East Road. I only remember the description of overweight male, none of the other males or the male fighting with overweight male the first time. There were also 2 females who were standing at the front of the driveway of 114. I cannot remember any description of these females, and I'm not to sure where they went afterwards.

[Redacted] I called the police again asking where an officer was. I then noticed overweight male come back up the road towards the pub again. I'm not sure why he came back. The male sat on the wall of a house which is to the left of the pub as you look at it and next door to the pub car park. Overweight male then saw someone come out of the pub and he hid behind the wall of the house. 2 males

came out but they did not notice him. Dark clothed male then came out of the pub and saw overweight male in the garden, he literally charged at him. The overweight male landed on the ground and dark clothed male started to land punches and kicks to the male. I was still on the phone to the police and told them what was going on. Again I was shocked. Overweight male was just set upon for no reason. I was so glad my wife was not witnessing this, I felt sick to my stomach how another person could do this to another. The fight ended and overweight male was lying in the garden of the house. I saw dark clothed male walk away and I think I cannot be 100% sure but I think he went back into the pub.

I did notice a patrol car go racing pass the pub before the second assault, whilst overweight male was behind the wall. I thought they had driven pass by mistake. I noticed after the police car went pass that all the lights went off in the pub, which I thought was strange.

After a few minutes of overweight male being attacked the second time I saw another patrol car arrive at the side of overweight male and an officer deal with him.

I would describe overweight male. As a white male, he had no top on and was wearing shorts. He was in his early 20's.

I would describe dark clothed male as a white male, short dark hair, stocky build, aged between med to late 20's to mid to late 30's. He was wearing dark clothes. I only got a quick glimpse of his face, just enough to show that he had white skin, and otherwise I saw him from the rear most of the time

The whole incident from me hearing the first shouting outside the pub to when the police arrived was about 20minutes. It was dark as it was night time, but it was clear. There was street lighting which was the orange kind of lighting. [REDACTED]

I do not know either of the males. I have never seen them before either.

Attended premises with Gavin from EH and PC Rainscourt engagement officer and met with DPS.

Went through recent incident where male was verbally abused by another in the being called fat. The male that abuses him then follows him outside and assaults him. The aggrieved tries to defend himself and hits the offender back giving him a chance to walk away. He does not get far, the male catches up with and assaults him again this time being pursued by what the aggrieved described as the barmaid with her blond hair. (i am aware that Tanya, the dps daughter matches this description). The barmaid was calling the offender back to the pub. The offender does then walk away.

At this point the aggrieved telephones police and decides to walk back to the pub believing police would be able to locate him there better. He sees the lights from the bar go out and then the offender walks out from the pub with the blond barmaid and another female he did not recognise. It would appear that staff did not call police or get the male out of the pub, instead getting him back inside. Its for this reason that the aggrieved is assaulted again, knocked to the floor and kicked. He has stated that he believed he was knocked unconscious.

I relayed all this information from the aggrieved statement to the dps. She said had heard about it from police but was not working. I asked who was working and suggested the description of the barmaid sounded like her daughter. She quickly said her daughter was not working that night and that it was a girl called [REDACTED] (I have since called [REDACTED] and she confirmed she was working ALONE and did not witness any assault.) I would suggest she is covering up as staff are seen leaving the pub when the pub closes and the offender comes out and assaulted the aggrieved again.

I asked the DPS if a record had been made in the incident book. I was passed the book which was being filled in correctly until November last year and then it just stopped. There was no entry with regards to this matter. I said to the dps that this looks bad as she would have known nothing about the matter if police had not visited to see if she had CCTV. I sympathised that she had been unwell, but added that as dps she is responsible for the day to day runnings of the pub. It would appear that no staff took any positive action that night and the bar staff says she did not see anything!

I went over a letter i sent to the premises in August last year regarding CCTV,
 RESTRICTED

Incident book etc and said none of this had been introduced. I advised that she now needs to get CCTV or we would look to review in order to have conditions added to the licence. I did add that the SGT had not reviewed this matter and may look to review now (so she is aware). She advised that she cant even afford to pay the brewery and certainly wont be able to afford CCTV. Again she said she had been intending on handing the key back to the brewery and aimed to be out in 6 weeks.

EH and PC Rainscourt both introduced themselves and went over their concerns regarding noise. A letter was issued from EH to confirm a conversation had taken place with the dps.

I advised i would send a letter to both dps and brewery advising of the meeting.

Attended premises with PC Prior.

Whilst walking from the car park to the front entrance I saw a male doing what appeared to be snorting drugs off a window seal through the frosted window of the disabled toilet in the chamberlayne arms in north east road.

We waited for the male to open the door, immediately detaining him for a section 23 search. He was incredibly calm throughout and suggested we should worry about other people. There was a remanence of white powder on the window which was pointed out and although no drugs were found on him, he admitted to having just taken. He had £100 in his back pocket a rolled up £10 and a £5 in another pocket. The male was [REDACTED] RMS shows he has plenty of intel for drugs and connections with some other fairly known offenders all in relation to DR.

DPS or her daughter were not working at the time. An unknown older male was working behind the bar. I asked him to get the dps down in order to speak with her. It took a while, but i eventually was able to speak with her in the kitchen area. I explained what had happened and recommended that in order to take a positive step in promoting licensing objectives they should consider barring the male. I advised this was her decision and she said she would get dressed (being in her dressing gown) and then sort it out. I advised that based on the evidence we will be making regular visits.

Swabs were taken from all toilets, PC Prior commented there was remanence in the female toilets. Update to be added after swabs have been put through ion track.

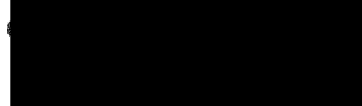
I have been a local resident for a number of years and live in close proximity to the CHAMBERLAYNE ARMS. Over the past 6 months, I have noticed an increase in noise, assaults, damage and broken glass associated to the premises. It appears to me that little is being done by the premises to resolve the problems and the clientele from the pub involved with these incidents have little or no regard to the residents in the area.

There was an incident around last November at around 2230 hours. Whilst in my property I heard some loud shouting from outside. I observed as a young male in his late teens walk away from the pub, screaming "COME ON THEN" as he did so. He continued down the road shouting and screaming, kicking walls and smashing the fence of the SALVATION ARMY premises before he entered the front garden of pensioner's flats. I watched as he picked up a paving slab out of the patio to one of the flats. He walked back up the road towards the pub and then decided to smash the paving slab on the pavement into smaller pieces. He then walked towards the pub, still screaming and shouting before a blond haired female in her late 30's to early 40's came out to speak with him. I thought the male was going to go in and smash up the pub, but she stood her ground and eventually the males friends walked him away. I would add that I never contacted police on this occasion although I was surprised that they never arrived. I would have thought that the premises would have called police considering the circumstances.

I provided a statement to police just yesterday (18th April 2012) regarding an assault that occurred on Sunday 1st April 2012. I will not reiterate what I saw, but just add that the incident left me shocked. Given the number of young families in the area, I am concerned for all our safety and this is why I have approached regarding the problems.



As I have stated, in addition to these incidents that I have witnessed, I regularly find broken clear glass in the street near to the pub which is a further hazard and shows a lack of control from the premises.
