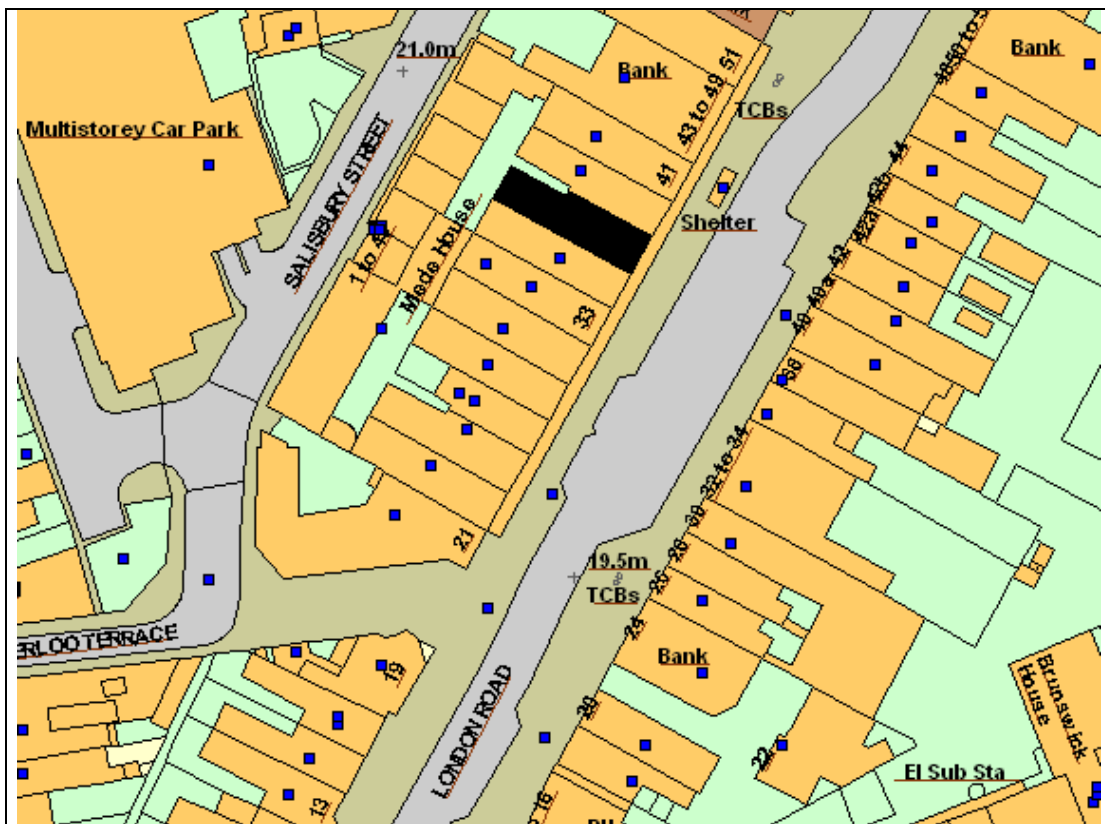

Legal Implications

1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must make its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

5. *Crime and Disorder Act 1998*
Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.
6. *Human Rights Act 1998*
The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affects another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Door staff will be on duty on Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday between 23:30 and 03:00, door staff wearing high visibility fluorescent upper clothing will patrol the outside perimeter of the front of the premises at the end of each evening (for at least an additional 10 minutes or until persons have dispersed from the unmediated area) to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of customers. Any customer congregating outside after leaving premises will be asked to depart quickly and quietly.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit the system will be able to cope with strobe lighting and all levels of illuminations throughout the premises as well as outside areas. The CCTV system at all the time in the premises are open for licensable activity. CCTV operating 24 hours seven days a week, there is a staff member available during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies in request of the police or local authorities any images recorded will be in a viewable format on either disk, CD, flash memory or VHS. The recording system will be able to capture minimum of four frames per seconds recordings will be made on weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

Notes will be displayed in the prominent positions at the exit of the premises requesting customers to leave quickly and quietly. CCTV eating sign will be fitted in public places. The premises manager will be able demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to provide recording been tampered password protected. Even in the technical failure of the CCTV equipment the premises license holder will report to the failure of the police on contact number 03380674768 immediately. We also have fire alarm and the premises is lighted enough and customer area we have three tables for eating plus 36 sq meters customer area to eat quietly and nicely.

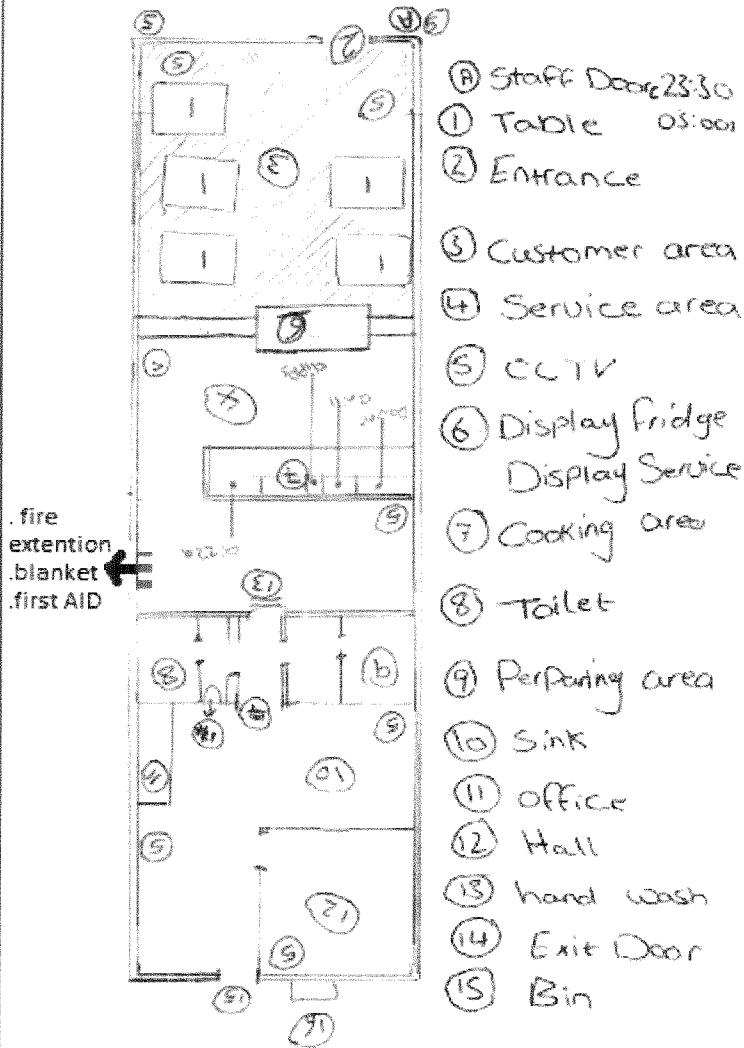

This application is for premises licence to be granted under the licensing act 2003 for a Premises Licence Permission certificate under the licensing act 2003 to sell food by retail to be consumed in or out of the premises known 37 London Road in Southampton

The joint applicants understands in addition to the above, further consultations could be carried out with property owners within 100 metres of the proposed site.

Licensing activity from this shop (site) if granted shall not cause:-

a significant effect on road safety either from the sighting of the trading activity itself, or from customers visiting or leaving the site.

There are no concerns or evidence that granting the licence shall increase concerns over the recorded level of personal injury accidents in the locality.

London Road is a commercial road (street) and trading activity will not be affected by the granting of this license.

Granting this licence as applied for, will decrease the demand of food from the existing LNT retailers, by spreading the customers over more outlets reduces friction and frustrations of waiting customers.

There would not be a significant loss of amenity caused by traffic, noise (as no music or any form of entertainment is carried out in this shop). All rubbish and litter is cleared twice a day to within 100 metre radius by the applicant the shop operator there will be no potential for the harbourage of vermin, odour or fumes. The area will be kept in a good and clean state at all times.

there is like provision in the immediate vicinity of the trading purposes.

There is no conflict with Traffic Orders such as waiting restrictions.

The site does not obstruct either pedestrian or vehicular access, or traffic flows. It does not place pedestrians in danger when in use for trading purposes.

The trading shop does not obstruct the safe passage of users of the footway or Carriageway.

the shop does not interfere with sight lines for any road users such as at road junctions or pedestrian crossing facilities.

The site does not allow the consent holder, staff and customers to park in unsafe manner.

The trading activity is carried out during normal trading hours and no later than 00:30 o'clock in the night as applied for.

There are clubs and shops open till much later than the applicant is requesting. After dusk the site is adequately lit to allow safe access and egress from the site for both customers and staff.

The applicants have considered: the public safety, public order, avoidance of nuisance and the need of the area, the applicants here with give irrevocable undertaking to comply with all legal requirements

Public Safety: The location of the shop for the proposed trading activity shall not present any substantial risk to the public in terms of road safety, obstruction and fire hazard.

1) The Prevention of Crime and disorder.

The applicant is of the opinion that this application if granted does not and will not have any serious potential to give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives, as there are other clubs and similar retailers in the area, the *Logical conclusion is that a further food retailing will reduce the pressure on the existing traders (LNT) of similar trade and thin the crowd in small areas of the existing retailers. Kelly's Night Club , in London road closes at after 4 o'clock , The clubbers, if antagonised by long waiting to be served by the fewer LNT retailers will be a catalyst for frustration and friction.*

While the applicant supports the police in all ways possible, feels that he can not compromise on his right to be able to compete with existing retailers(LNT). In our free society, and does not wish to in any way compromise his human rights under article 80 of the Human rights convention , also feels if he is refused permission of the licence applied for he feels that his legal rights will be compromised . The applicant pays all his taxes and rates , obey the law to the letter and trusts that the every one should carry their duty as assigned for an equal measure. The applicant aims to exercise his civil rights to the full.

Each application should be taken on its own merit and previous refusal have no barring on this application.

The applicants contribution for prevention of crime and Disorder, he will do the following:-

The applicant will install and maintain CCTV which will have standards and specification agreed by the Police which will be acceptable for evidential use if required . The system will record the inside and outside of the premises as per advise normally given by the police Crime prevention Officer.

Imagery obtained will be retained for a minimum of 31 Days on rolling basis and will be playable on any Windows based computer without the need for any enhancement or additional software The system will be working and maintained at all times. Staff will also will be suitably trained to ensure that they can provide CCTV recording to Police and Council Officials upon request.

2) Public Safty

A minimum of three Staff will be on duty at the premises between midnight and close on Friday into Saturday & Sunday into Sunday nights.

The applicant feels that It would be a clear violation of the applicants right NOT TO BE able to compete with existing food retailers in the area , The Panels decision, due to seriousness of incidents in Bedford Place area should have no barring on this new untested application. The police and the council can argue otherwise without a proof will have unfair advantage against a member of the business community of whom the applicant is case in time.

The applicant I aware that he needs to apply for change of use of the premises and fully understand that he further will need a planning permission, if he obtain this licence, and also understands that The planning permission if/when he is granted this licence as applied for, and aware that the planning permission overrides the premises licence. Their for he/the applicant will be applying for the Change of use permission and for the Planning permission as soon as he is granted the licence as applied for .

The applicant believes that he has demonstrated that there will be no negative

cumulative impact on one or more of the late night trading objectives.

The presence of the security personal will almost eliminate any risk of the staff being at risk.

This retailer also have a sitting area, where some of the customers will sit and consume their food, hence reduces the overall numbers of people eating on the outside standing on the pavement, especially at late night. hence reducing the provocation elements.

The applicant strongly believes that having an extra food retailer will not logically increase or decrees the numbers of the clubbers, or change their eating habits, on the contrary it will not only benefit the London Road area, but will assist in less crowding in the Bedford Place area too.

There are two other LNR premises on London Road, which remain open until 03:00 Also there are seven premises in Bedford Place. The applicants application will strike a balance by moving some of the potential crowd from Bedford Place. It is a fact that the number of Clubbers in the area will not increase or decrease by allowing a further trader in London road, but will be a welcome relief of the pressure in the are both for he police and the LNR.

In response to police advice the applicant is aiming to have door staff on Wednesday , as well as Saturdays and Sunday between 00:00 and 03:00 it is expected of the door staff on duty will be wearing High Visibility Florescence Upper Clothing and will Patrol the outside perimeters of the front of the premises at the end of each evening(for at least additional 5 minutes or until persons are disposed from the immediate area). To insure the safe and quite dispersal of customers, any customers congregating or loitering outside after leaving the premises will be asked to depart quickly and quietly.

Notice will be displayed in prominent position at the exit of the premises requesting customers to leave quietly.

* The applicant agree to install sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including the outside of the premises covering the entrance of the premises to cover all public areas

The CCTV system will be operating at all the times whilst the premises are open for the licensable activity. All the equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff available during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies on request of the Police or the local authority. Any images recovered must/will be in viewable on ether disc or VHS as recommended by the police .

The recording will be/must be able to capture 4 frames per second

Records must be/will be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that the data is /will be securely retained CCTV warning signs will/to be fitted in public places.

Recording will/to be kept for a minimum of 28 days.

The premises manager must/will be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with , i.e password protected.

In the event of the technical failer of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/ Must/will report to the police on contact number 023 80674768 immediately

* an incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises and there will be a daily debrief of door staff (where used) at the close of business which will be

evidenced in writing by the Manager or duty. Should there be n incidents then this will also be recorded at the end of the shift in the incident book.

The incident book will remain on the praises at all times and will be available to police upon request..

The book shall detail in brief, incidents of injury/ejection/refusal/drug misuse/I.d seizure/age challenge if applicable. Where there is an injury, ejection of physical alteration the entry shall be timed .date and signed by the author. If the member of staff involved has difficulties reading or writing then the entry my be written by another party. This should/would be read back to the person involved and counter signed . Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party.

The book shall detail in brief, incident of injury. The applicant will comply with all of the police recommendation on prevention of crime.

This shop does not and shall not present a risk to good public order in the locality in which it is situated. Any and all observations from the Hampshire Constabulary will be welcomed.

Avoidance of Nuisance: this shop activity does not present a substantial risk of nuisance from noise, rubbish, potential for the harbourage of vermin, smells or fumes to households and businesses in the vicinity of the trading site. Observations from Council Officers shall be welcomed

Needs of the Area:

1. There is presence of like outlets existing in the immediate locality of the proposed street . A further outlet will reduce crowding in other retailers and assist in the quailing the potential crowd reducing violent offending.
2. The general needs of a locality exist, to serve the passing trade fast.

-Compliance with legal requirements: The trading activity shall be carried out from an already existing trading unit that complies with all the relevant legislation. Permitted trading hours requested are as applied for. the applicant is of a good standing , and has managed his existing food retailing for a good length of time at Lodge road with no previous incidents, and feels that this should be taken into consideration by this committee .

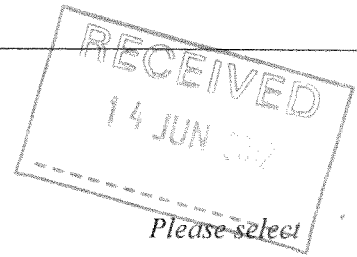

The Police would make representations based on the effects of cumulative impact.

The premises is located within a "Special Policy" area.

The Police are of the opinion that this application, if granted, has the potential to give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The DCMS guidelines state that "The effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives"

The premises applied for is 37 London Road and is situated next to Kelly's Night Club. London Road is often where people gather after leaving pubs and earlier closing venues as there is a taxi rank and two other late night refreshment premises which are Subway and the Kebab House. There was another application, under a previous owner, for the same premises last year. The police objected to the late night refreshment aspect of that application and this went to a hearing (Annex A). At the hearing on the 22nd September 2011 the decision was made by the Sub-Committee to refuse the application stating that "the Sub-Committee holds grave concerns with regards to the location of the premises and the issue of crime and disorder, in particular" (Annex B).

It is understood that each application be taken on its merit and this applicant has changed the application from that of the previous owner. There are two differences in this application, one is that there will be a seating area for customers inside due to a change of layout from the previous application. The other change is that the applicant will have doorstaff on duty 3 nights of the week between 2330-0300 hours with them on duty for an additional 10 minutes after close to disperse customers. The police do not consider that the applicant has demonstrated that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

Analyst reports were created in 2010 and 2011 for this area and these have been disclosed to highlight the on-going problems (Annex C & D). The 2010 report (Annex C) details the increase of violence and criminal damage during the Night Time Economy (NTE) where between January and November in 2010 there were 607 assaults and 365 criminal damage offences. The number of assaults peak between 0200-0259 hours which is when the applicant is likely to see a large increase in the number of customers due to the closing time of premises in that area. The 2011 report (Annex D) is more detailed in relation to London Road and pulls date from between 01/08/12 and 31/07/11. This report rates one of the late night food premises in the road in the top 3 locations for crime and disorder and the peak in those crimes being between 0200-0300 hours. The report also details that 67% of violent crime offences on London Road are not in pubs or clubs and therefore are attributed to incidents in the street or in fast food premises. This can be attributed to London Road being a place where people congregate and loiter after the closing of the earlier venues. Late Night Refreshment premises do contribute and encourage people to remain in the area.

Annex E is a 15 page list of incidents that have occurred on London Road between the 01/01/12 and the 31/05/12 after 2300 hours. It details 51 assaults, 4 incidents of criminal damage, 19 public order offences and 12 section 27 dispersals (this is a power to disperse people who have been drinking and that have or are likely to cause disorder) amongst other incidents. Analysing these incidents it can be seen that there were 7 incidents between 2300-2359, 16 incidents between 0000-0059, 29 incidents between 0100-0159, 21 incidents between 0200-0259 and 30 after 0300 hours. These incidents evidence that the hours applied for are the hours when crime is increasing to its peak rate.

There have been a number of incidents of note at premises already holding a late night refreshment licence on London Road (Annex E). There are incidents where staff have felt at risk, examples are on the 05/03/12 at 0234 hours (Page 7) where there was a fight which numerous customers got involved in and 02/05/12 at 0020 hours (Page 12) where a female became aggressive towards staff. There are incidents where the food at the premises is thrown at people resulting in assaults occurring as shown on the 05/02/12 at 0046 hours (Page 3) and the 31/05/12 at 0108 hours (Page 15). There are numerous examples of assaults in the premises, on the 20/01/12 at 0230 hours (Page 2), the 08/02/12 at 0202 hours (Page 4) and the 26/02/12 at 0238 hours (Page 6). Another problem suffered by late night food premises is when they are closing and have to refuse customers as seen in the incident on the 23/03/12 at 0300 hours (Page 9) which resulted in criminal damage being caused. The other two late night refreshment premises on the road have doorstaff on duty on key nights and have seated areas for their patrons as offered by the applicant on his schedule. It is clear that any new late night refreshment premises is likely to suffering the same problems as those evidenced.

These reports and incidents clearly highlight the cumulative impact of the late night premises in this area. There is clear evidence that Crime and Disorder occurs at late night food premises and through assaults there is an impact on public safety. The noise, litter & criminal damage from drunk people leaving the night time economy affects residents and businesses. Hampshire Constabulary feel that if the hours were to be extended through the week until 0300 hours this will simply result in more disorder, more violent assaults on innocent members of the public and create more criminal damage.

The Police are making this representation based upon the effects of cumulative impact within the area.

The premises is located within a "Special Policy" area.

The Police are of the opinion that this application, if granted, has the potential to give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The Cumulative Impact Policy was introduced in order to address such saturation issues. In relation to Policy: CIP2 within the Statement of Licensing Policy, the police would suggest that the variation requested is a 'substantial' one and should therefore be refused.

The Department of Culture, Media and Sport guidelines state that "The effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives"

The Police believe that the applicant has not demonstrated within the operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The applicant has offered to provide a member of door staff between the hours of 00:00 and 03:00 on a Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday morning. However, it is not clear how this member of door staff will manage both the internal and external areas of the shop at the same time. The shop will still be

susceptible to theft and disorder could also potentially occur both inside and outside of the shop due to more people congregating to eat their food.

There are already two other premises on London Road which provide LNR until 03:00 - Kebab House and Subway. These two premises also provide fixed indoor seating areas for customers to use. The applicant is not able to provide such a service to his customers and intends for them to eat in the street outside once they have purchased their meal. There is less chance of customers becoming disorderly if they are able to sit down and eat rather than if they are stood up bumping into each other. This is clearly going to have an impact upon the local community by creating more noise in the street and more rubbish to clear away. This will add to and not prevent public nuisance, which is already stressed within the area.

As mentioned already there are two other LNR premises on London Road, which remain open until 03:00 am. This is supported by a further seven premises in Bedford Place, which provide LNR. The police believe that this amount of LNR premises is already more than enough to cater for the night time economy (NTE) in the Bedford Place area. If this application is granted, it would create another location in an already saturated area for revellers to congregate and potentially cause disorder.

Southampton's NTE has been shown to fuel increased levels of violence and criminal damage offences throughout the year. Beat areas SW01 (City Centre) and SW03 (Polygon), which is where the majority of the night time economy is concentrated, comfortably show the highest numbers of assault offences within the area despite their comparatively small size. For the period of January to November 2010 assault and criminal damage offences in the City Centre (SW01), Waterfront (SW02) and the Polygon (SW03) have been individually assessed as to whether they are linked to the NTE (and recorded if they are) in an effort to better understand the problem. 607 assault and 365 criminal damage offences have been identified in this period.

The majority of pubs and clubs in the Polygon (SW03) are situated in the area which is boarded by Bedford Place, Carlton Crescent and London Road which will be referred to as Bedford Place. Between January and December 2010, in Bedford Place, there was a total of 531 relevant offences, of which 254 were assaults and 119 were drunkenness and public order incidents, 100 incidents of criminal damage, 28 drug related offences and 4 indecent assaults. All of these have been marked as involving drink or drugs and the majority of which were linked directly to licensed premises and the night time economy

Police have also used their powers under Sect 27 Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006 on 214 occasions in Bedford Place between January and December 2010. These are all, by their very nature, directly linked to the night time economy, which this premises is proposing to increase its participation in. This power allows officers to disperse people if it is believed that the individual concerned is likely to be involved in alcohol related disorder type offences.

This clearly highlights the cumulative impact of the clubs and LNR premises in this area. Hampshire Constabulary feel that if Late Night Refreshment hours were to be granted throughout the week and especially until 0300 hours on a Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday, this will simply result in more people hanging around in London Road, in another location, which will in turn create more disorder,

The system should be able to cope with strobe lighting and all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas. The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff available during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies on request of the Police or local authority. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

CCTV warning signs to be fitted in public places.

Recordings to be kept for a minimum of 28 days.

LICENSING (LICENSING AND GAMBLING) SUB – COMMITTEE
DECISION OF THE MEETING HELD ON 22nd SEPTEMBER 2011
TREATS, LONDON ROAD, S015 2AD

The Sub-Committee has considered very carefully the application to vary the premises licence at Treats. It has given due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Objectives, statutory guidance and the adopted statement of Licensing Policy.

It notes that the premises licence holder and Hampshire Constabulary had reached agreement on relevant conditions. It was further noted that agreement had been reached with regard to the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol, being 23h00.

The remaining issue to be determined being the licensable activity of the provision of late night refreshment.

Legal advice was accepted by the Sub-Committee in relation to the Cumulative Impact Policy. It was noted that the premises is located within the boundary of a previously identified saturation area, however, the policy would not apply given the particular circumstances in this case i.e. the premises being an off-licence.

It has considered very carefully all the evidence submitted by both parties both written and given orally today.

Having considered all of the above, the Sub-Committee has decided to grant the variation insofar as the agreed hours relating to the sale of alcohol only.

Accordingly the application regarding the provision of late night refreshment is refused.

REASONS

The Sub-Committee accepts that the applicant is of good standing and had no previous incidents in operating his business. However, the Sub-Committee holds grave concerns with regards to the location of the premises and the issue of crime and disorder, in particular.

The Police evidence clearly shows that the issue of violent offending is prevalent in that locality at the times the premises intends to trade. Whilst it is accepted there are other premises in the locality providing late night refreshment at those times, this premises shall not be providing any area for seating with food being consumed on the street. Further, the existing premises are suffering issues and it is felt that additional premises in this area is likely to lead to an increase in those issues by way of providing an additional venue/service. In this respect the Sub-Committee has taken into consideration cumulative impact issues and has determined that the additional

licensable activities proposed will likely lead to an unacceptable increase or concentration of crime and disorder.

Despite the applicant's assertion that the premises will not be selling alcohol after 23h00 and therefore directly contributing to the crime and disorder issues experienced resulting from the consumption of alcohol, the Sub-Committee has paid careful attention and considered carefully the effect that the proposed licensable activities will in fact have on those already in the area and concluded that in despite the sale of alcohol ceasing at 23h00, the continued provision of late night refreshment would add to the problems of the area.

The Sub-Committee was not satisfied, on the evidence, that the applicant held sufficient experience in trading after 23h00 when the police statistics clearly show the crime and disorder issues increase significantly.

There is a right of appeal for all parties against the decision to the Magistrates Court.

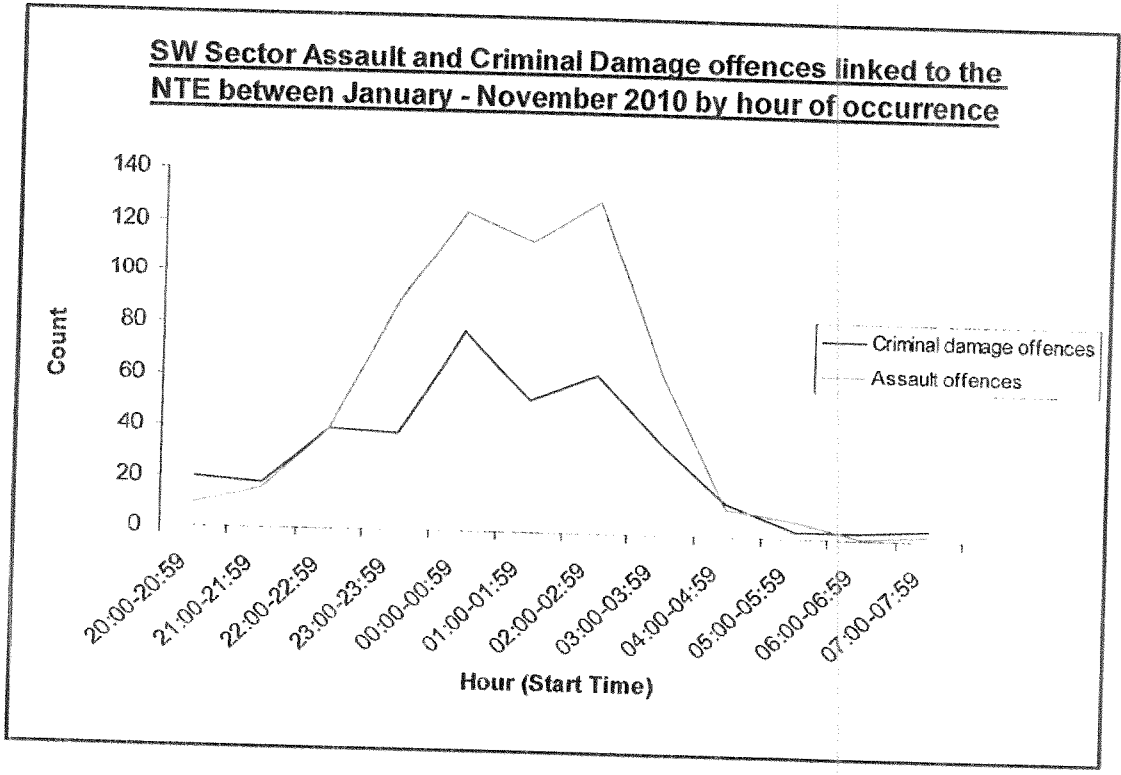

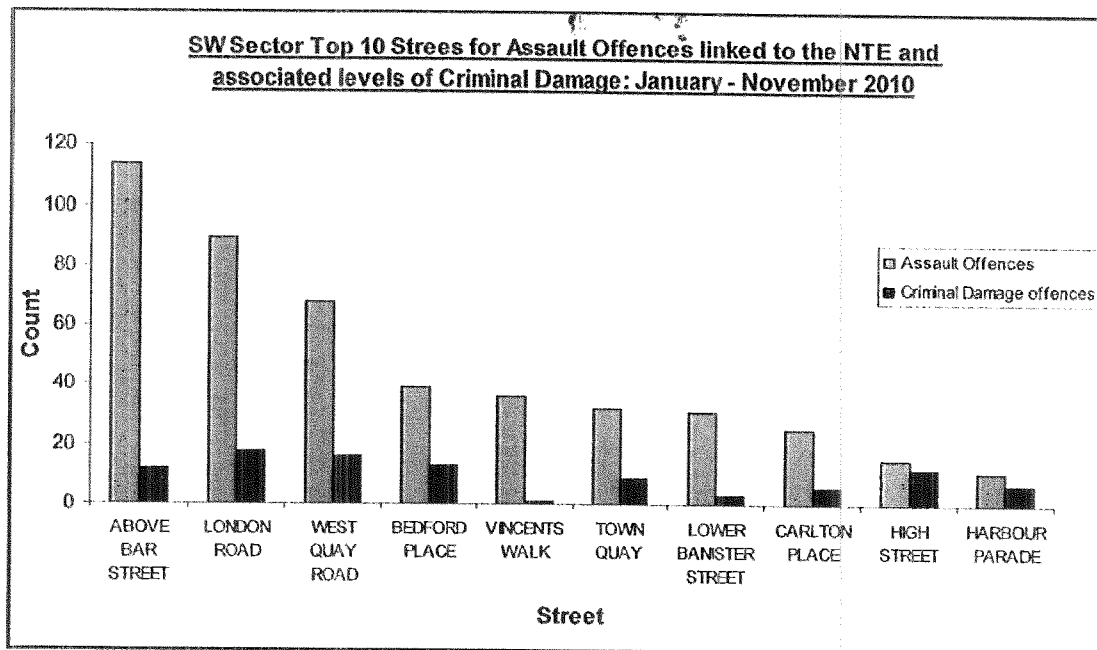

Southampton's night time economy (NTE) has been shown to fuel increased levels of violence and criminal damage offences throughout the year. Beat areas SW01 (City Centre) and SW03 (Polygon), which is where the majority of the night time economy is concentrated, comfortably show the highest numbers of assault offences in the OCU despite their comparatively small size. For the period of January to November 2010 assault and criminal damage offences in the City Centre (SW01), Waterfront (SW02) and the Polygon (SW03) have been individually assessed as to whether they are linked to the NTE (and recorded if they are) in an effort to better understand the problem. 607 assault and 365 criminal damage offences have been identified in this period and the below graphs display the most frequent times and locations for these occurrences:



The above graph shows there is a steady increase in NTE related assaults and criminal damage offences from 22:00 peaking at between 02:00 and 02:59 for assaults and 00:00 – 00:59 for damage offences. Between 03:00 and 04:59 there is a dramatic drop-off in assault offending levels and from this point criminal damage occurrences also decline. This is attributable to the closure of both licensed premises and fast food outlets at 03:00 encouraging people to leave the area.

Criminal damage linked to the NTE is seen in the City Centre itself with licensed premises and shops often being damaged but also in surrounding residential areas, most notably the Polygon, where damage to property is seen to be caused by individuals en-route home from a night out.



██████ is located on Vernon Walk which is close to Carlton Place a street which ranks 8th in terms of the number of assault figures. Nearby streets also include London Road and Bedford Place both of which experience high levels of assaults. Vernon Walk is located in the Polygon area (SW03 beat) of the City which as a beat accounts for the highest proportion of both assault offences at 43.3% (263/607) and criminal damage offences at 58.4% (213/365) across Southampton.

Recommendations:

The prompt closure of all licensed premises and fast food outlets at 03:00 can be seen to reduce the levels of assault and criminal damage offences in the City Centre area. The level of assaults between 02:00 – 02:59 is more than double (130) the level of assaults between 03:00 – 03:59 (62). Any extension to the opening hours would undoubtedly lead to more individuals remaining in the town centre longer and therefore increase the likelihood of such offences occurring. An extension of opening hours to licensed premises on Vernon Walk is likely to have a greater effect as this street is located close to two of the busiest streets in Southampton for assault offences and is located in the busiest area of the City Centre, the Polygon.

Further to this criminal damage offences are high in this beat area in general and any extension of hours along Vernon Walk is likely to result in more people exiting onto either London Road or Bedford Place, both of these streets experience higher levels of criminal damage offences as they act as thoroughfares for people returning home to residential areas in the Polygon and Portswood. The extension of licensing hours past 03:00 is likely to increase both the levels of assaults in the area and also increase the time frame when additional police resources are required in this relatively small area of the City Centre. It is our view that the prompt closure of licensed premises at 03:00 reduces offending levels and the strain on police resources.

Introduction

Southampton Central Violent Crime & Licensing team are currently putting together an objection for the premise 'Treats' in London Road, who have just applied to add the provision of Late Night Refreshment to their licence (they want to stay open from 2300 to 0300 to sell food). This report has been commissioned in order to identify what crimes are occurring in that area during the proposed opening times (23:00 – 03:00) and how this premise might add to the problems already there at that time of night.

Methodology

An Ibase 8 search was conducted looking at all offences/incidents that occurred in the Polygon neighbourhood (SW03). This was then filtered down to London Road. The time period reviewed was 01/08/2010 – 31/07/2011. Recently completed analytical products were also reviewed in order to contextualise the issue of the Night Time Economy in the area.

Neighbourhood background & its impact on area figures

"Treats" is located on London Road in Southampton which is covered by the Polygon neighbourhood (SW03).

SW03 The Polygon recently featured in a TAP report¹ (covering Friday and Saturday nights between 01/01/11 – 02/05/11) as being the key location for violent related offences within the city, with London Road and Bedford Place continually reporting higher levels of offences. This report also highlighted the fact that The Polygon accounts for the majority of ASB incidents reported in the NTE areas over the weekend. Outside of the nightclub "Junk" in London Road was identified as repeat location.

Also, in the most recent fortnightly Analysis of Night Time Economy Related Issues² London Road remained a hotspot for ASB & Violence.

Temporal analysis of all offences/incidents occurring in London Road between 01/08/2010 – 31/07/2011 showed that there is a clear peak on Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday mornings between 00:00 & 04:00.

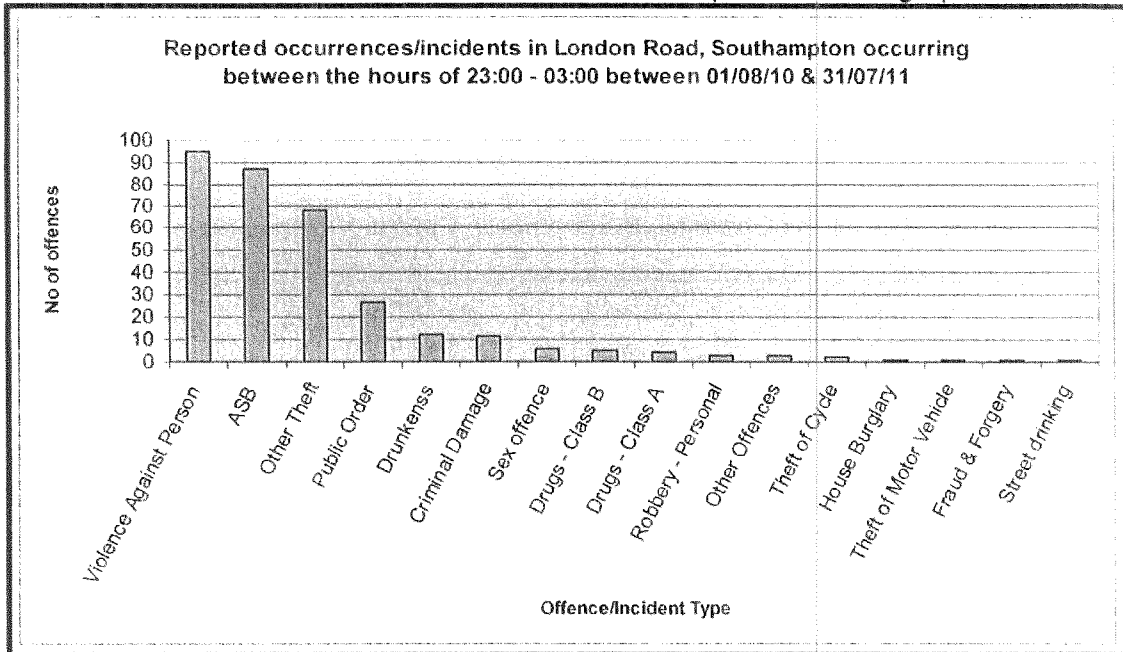
Incidents

Looking at offences that occurred between 23:00 & 03:00 between the dates of 01/08/10 - 31/07/11, there were 1818 occurrences in total recorded for the whole of SW03 Polygon. 22% (407) of these occurred on London Road. This is significantly higher than the other streets in the area; Bedford Place was the second highest

Those occurrences linked to London Road have been plotted on the graph below.



The most commonly reported crime type in London Road during the relevant times is Violence Against Person. This is followed by ASB incidents and then other theft offences.

Violence Against Person

VAP offences account for 23% (95) of the total crime occurring in London Road between 23:00 & 03:00. Of the 95 offences, only 31 were recorded as occurring in licensed premises suggesting that street violence outside of the pubs and clubs or in nearby food outlets accounts for up to 67%. 46 of the VAP were shown as being alcohol or drug related. The top 3 locations for VAP offences were "Junk" which accounted for 25% (24), "Kellys" which accounted for 7% (7) and "Subway" which accounted for 5% (5).

Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)

ASB incidents account for 21% (87) of the total crime occurring in London Road between 23:00 & 03:00. This includes those incidents recorded as Rowdy & Inconsiderate and more recently, ASB including ASB - Personal & ASB - Environmental. The top 3 locations for ASB incidents were again "Junk" which accounted for 40% (35), "Kellys" which accounted for 13% (11) and "Subway" which accounted for 9% (8).

Other theft

Other theft accounted for 17% (68) of the total crime occurring in London Road between 23:00 & 03:00. Of these, 26 were theft from person and 42 were theft if not classified elsewhere. These offences generally involved the theft of wallets or mobile phones from handbags or pockets of persons whilst in clubs. 52 of the 68 theft offences occurred in Junk Night Club. Only 2 offences occurred in the food outlets nearby.

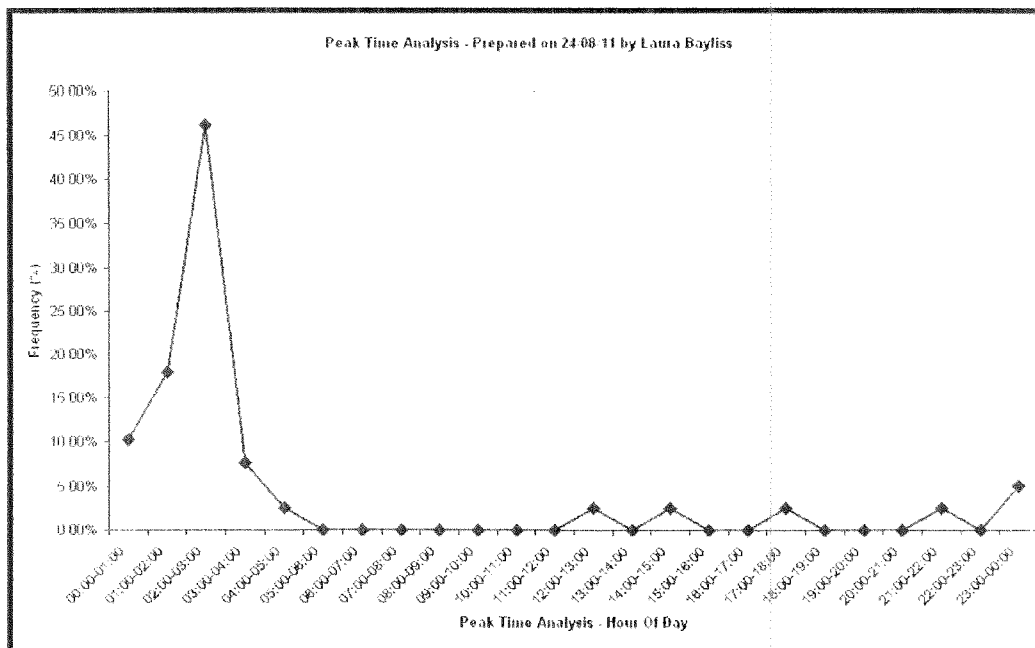
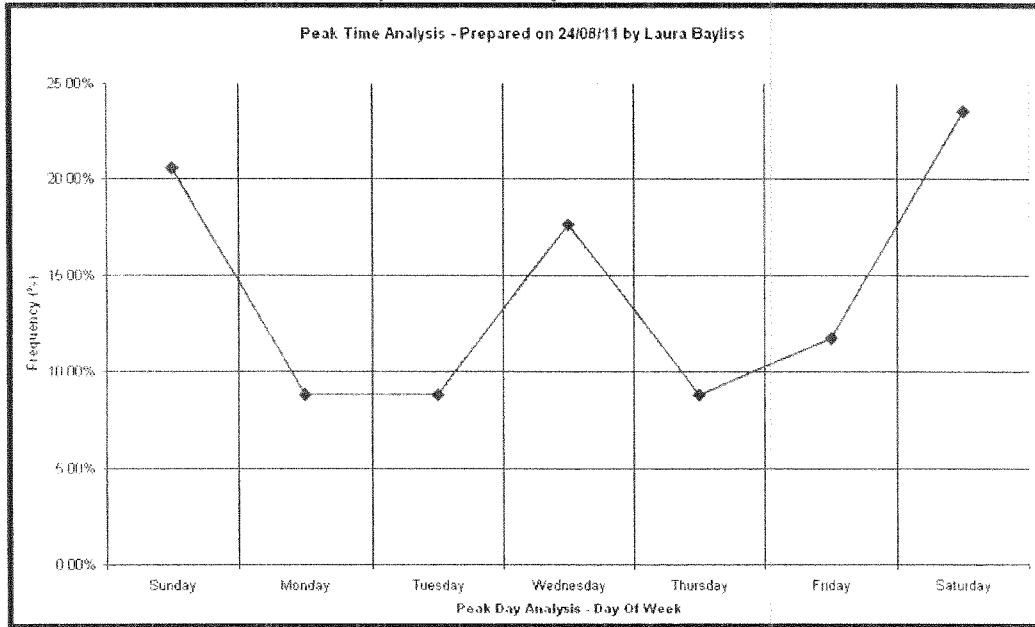
Premise breakdown

The top 3 locations for crime and Disorder in London Road between 23:00 & 03:00 were as follows:

- Junk (152) 37%
- Kellys (35) 9%
- Subway (30) 7%

"Subway" is currently the nearest non licensed, late opening premise to "Treats". For that reason this has been reviewed as a benchmark in order to see what sort of issues this premise experiences and when. All offences/incidents occurring at this location between 01/08/10 & 31/07/11 were reviewed (not just those occurring between 23:00 – 03:00). It should however be noted that "Treats" is a convenience store as opposed to a fast food outlet, thus the chance of violence and disorder is likely to be less than in an environment in which customers are expected to wait for food.

Temporal Analysis – Subway 01/08/10 – 31/07/2011



As can be seen above, there is a clear peak in offending at "Subway" between 02:00 & 03:00 on Saturday, Sunday and Wednesday mornings. It can therefore be inferred that the vast majority of crime and disorder at this premise is related to the night time economy (Tuesday nights being "student" night in Southampton). 94% (32) of the

Conclusion & Recommendations

"Treats", the premise in question, is situated in a street that sees a disproportionate amount of crime and disorder in comparison to the rest of the neighbourhood in which it is located. Resources and funding are required to police this area every weekend and during key Night time economy events. Treats is also situated next to "Kellys" and a few shops down from "Junk", the 2 most problematic locations in terms of crime and disorder in London Road at the relevant times.

Analysis of the nearest non licensed food outlet has shown that 94% of the offences at that location occurred between the hours of 23:00 & 04:00 (with a significant peak between 02:00 & 03:00) which is the time frame during which "Treats" has requested to remain open and sell food. Should the provision of Late Night Refreshment be added to the licence, it is likely to encourage more people to linger in an area prone to violence and disorder at a time when police resources are already stretched. It is therefore recommended that this request is objected. Failing an objection, if the provision is agreed, it is strongly recommended that the hours are revised and a closure of 02:00 is agreed as opposed to 03:00 as analysis has shown that this is when the majority of offences/incidents are likely to occur.

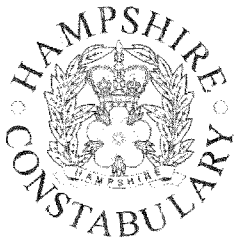

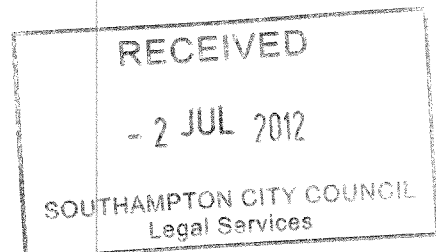

Hampshire Police licensing have received an application for a change in licensing hours for Treats at 37 London Road, Southampton, SO15 2AD (the new owner for Treats is requesting a new licence with later hours). The application is for licensed hours until 03:00 hours.

Southampton's night time economy (NTE) has been shown to fuel increased levels of violence and criminal damage offences throughout the year and is currently raised as a priority crime area for violence¹. City Centre (beat area SW01) and Polygon (beat area SW03), which is where the majority of the NTE is concentrated, record the highest numbers of assault offences in the city despite their comparatively small size.

The Polygon recently featured in a TAP report² (covering Friday and Saturday nights between 01/01/11 – 02/05/11) as being the key location for violent related offences within the city, with London Road and Bedford Place continually reporting higher levels of offences. This report also highlighted the fact that The Polygon accounts for the majority of ASB incidents reported in the NTE areas over the weekend. Outside of the nightclub "██████" in London Road was identified as repeat location.

DATA REVIEW

For the period of December 2011 to May 2012 all assault and criminal damage offences that could have occurred between 19:00 and 07:00 in the SW sector have been reviewed to whether they are linked to the NTE in an effort to better understand the problem.

In total 548 violent occurrences and 167 criminal damage offences were recorded in SW sector. Specifically in the SW03 area (The town centre area which encompasses Treats) there have been 297 violent occurrences and 97 criminal damage offences linked to the NTE.

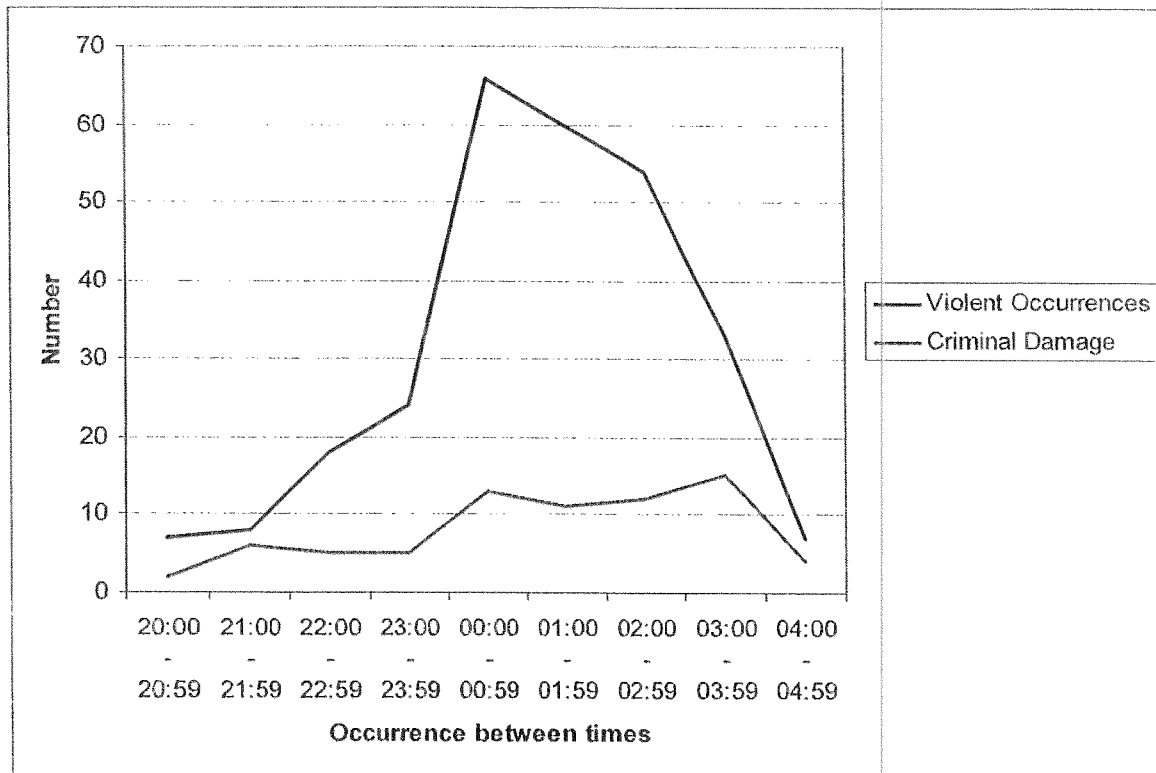

TEMPORAL / LOCATION ANALYSIS

The graph below display the most frequent times and locations for the occurrences.

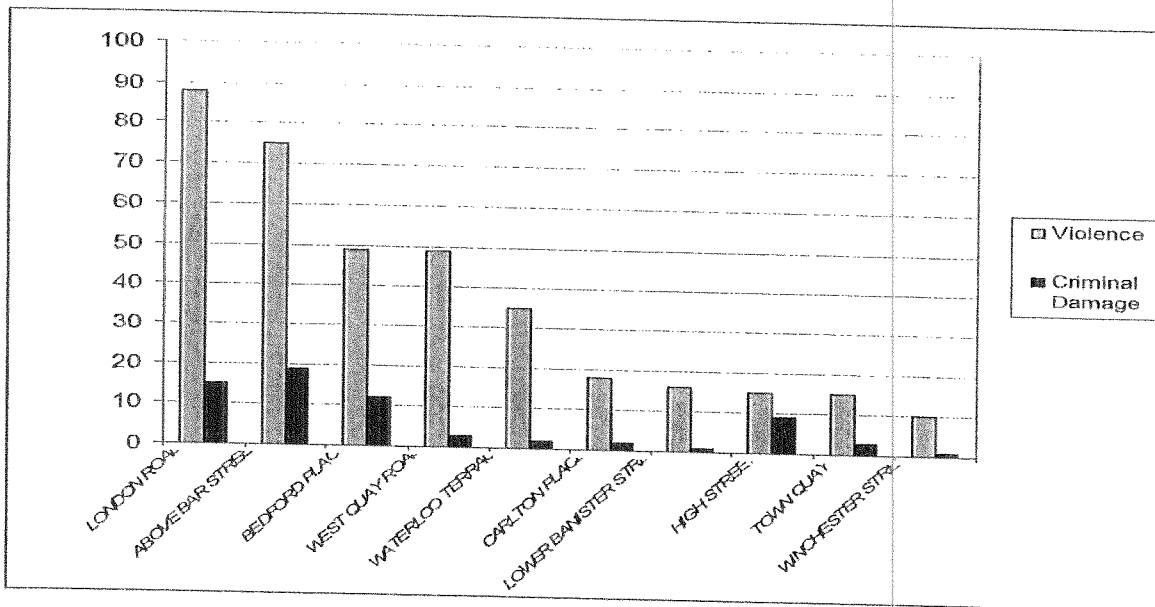
Figure 1: Temporal Analysis of NTE Occurrences in SW03.



The above graph shows a steady increase in NTE related violent occurrences from 22:00 which peak between 00:00 – 02:00. After this peak in assault offences there is a dramatic reduction in the levels of offending; a result of the closure of licensed premises and fast food outlets from 02:00. Criminal damage offences maintain a fairly constant level throughout the period as offences continue to occur within the city centre and in the surrounding residential areas as people leave the area.

66% of all violent occurrences linked to the NTE take place between Friday and Sunday. Wednesday is the next highest day accounting for 20% (n.59) of the occurrences; this is linked to Tuesday night being the principal student night in the city.

Figure 2: Top ten streets for Violent and Criminal Damage Occurrences in SW Sector



The above graph shows that London Road is the most common street for NTE related assaults and criminal damage across the whole of the SW sector. London Road has recorded 16% (n.88) offences of violence linked to the NTE in the City Centre. It also accounts for 9% (n.15) of criminal damage occurrences.

The locations of the offences were spread out across London Road with 35% (n.36) of the occurrences not linked to a specific location. This is related to individuals leaving premises in this or surrounding streets (Bedford Place and Carlton Place both feature in the top 10 streets in SW Sector) on their way to taxi ranks / bus stops located in London Road. Of the named locations Kellys and [REDACTED] nightclubs accounted for 33% (n.35) of the occurrences, it should be noted that Treats is located between these locations.

Analysis of the nearest non licensed food outlet has shown that 94% of the offences at that location occurred between the hours of 23:00 & 04:00 (with a significant peak between 02:00 & 03:00) which is the time frame during which "Treats" has requested to remain open and sell food. Should the provision of Late Night Refreshment be added to the licence, it is likely to encourage more people to linger in an area prone to violence and disorder at a time when police resources are already stretched.³

Conclusions:

"Treats" is situated in London Road which is the top reported street for assaults and 2nd highest street for criminal damage in SW Sector; as such London Road sees a disproportionate amount of crime and disorder in comparison to the rest of the neighbourhood in which it is located.

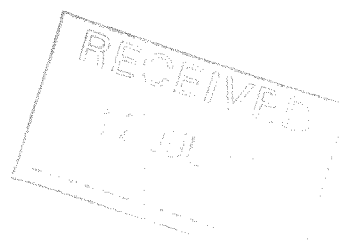
Resources and funding are required to police this area every weekend and during key NTE events. Treats is situated between "Kellys" and "[REDACTED]", which are the two most problematic locations in terms of crime and disorder in the London Road NTE.

The proposed extended opening hours of Treats would undoubtedly increase the number of people who either enter the area or who remain in the area after leaving night clubs; increasing the likelihood of further violent occurrences in this street which is already the highest street for violent occurrences in the area.

This will have the effect of shifting the peak time period from 02:00 – 02:59 to 03:00 – 03:59, thereby potentially stretching resources aimed at policing the area.

Application for permits license for the provision of late refreshment until 03:00 and the removal of Supply of Alcohol from the license.

As a member of the local community and neighbour to the 37 London Road , I am writing to lodge a representation to the above application on the grounds of

1. The prevention of crime and disorder , public safety and the prevention of public nuisance.
2. There are already two late night refreshment premises which the Subway and the Kebab House both well managed and sufficient for London Road area.
3. I am aware that the previous application , under the different applicants' name last year , when the Police objected and was further rejected by in the hearing of 22 September 2011.
4. The current use of the premises is to retail Alcohol to 11o'clock . Although we feel that the current existing density of food retailing in the area is saturated.
5. The existing food retailers have door staff who manage both internal and external areas of the shop , and have a seating where most of the costumers can sit down to consume their food. It is not the case in this application which may result in most of the costumers will consume the food on the street where potentially friction can easily rise disputes including fighting and potentially causing crime.
6. The writers believes that the number of late retailers in the area is already more than enough to cater for night time customers in London Road and Bedford Road area.
7. Allowing further late night retailing in my belief may cause friction between the existing well established retailer and the new competitors , as the new comers to the area may viewed as a potential snatchers to the existing regular customers , hence increase the likely food of further feud and increasing pressure in the direction of possible disputes and potential to violence between the existing retailers and the new comers to the community of Late Night Traders themselves.

For the sake of better community adherence , and protection of the existing late night traders existing businesses , I feel the Council would be acting wisely by supporting our existing traders and encourage any new businesses to be widely spread over Southampton

than encouraging the further concentration of late night trade in a very saturated area of the city.

It would be more prudent in my opinion to refuse the application on the grounds as stated in this letter.
