# **DECISION PAPER**

**SUBJECT:** Review of SLA – Supply Cover for Long Term Sickness 2013/2014

**DATE:** 19<sup>th</sup> September 2012 **RECIPIENT:** SCHOOLS FORUM

#### SUMMARY:

1. We have undertaken a review of the supply cover SLA to ensure that schools are not only receiving good value for money but also that future take up would still make this SLA sustainable.

### **BACKGROUND and BRIEFING DETAILS:**

- 2. Schools currently have the option to buy into this SLA which funds a contribution towards the supply costs incurred due to long term sickness. This service enables schools to pool the risks of long term sickness of teachers and, in primary schools only, support staff excluding cleaners and caretakers.
- 3. However over time we have seen a decline in the number of schools agreeing to buy into this SLA, Table 1 in appendix A details the take up over the last 4 years. As can be seen there is a low number of schools subscribing in 2012-13 which is likely to reduce further in 2013-14 allowing for academy transfers alone.
- 4. Analysis contained within Table 2 in Appendix A shows that on average secondary schools receive a larger amount of funding from the scheme than primary schools do. Even in previous years where secondary schools have made up a smaller proportion of the total number of subscribing schools they have still been taking up more than their share of the subscriptions.
- If this service was to continue we may need to consider a pricing mechanism that would be fairer across both sectors which would inevitably lead to secondary schools paying more.

### 6. **RECOMMENDATION**:

The Forum are asked to give a view on:

Whether the current SLA for supply cover in relation to long term sickness should be withdrawn with effect from financial year 2013-14.
