# Legal Implications

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.

The committee must also have regards to:-

#### 5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

#### 6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

Having had regard to the four licensing objectives and the locality, the following conditions are appropriate.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The premises shall maintain a CCTV system which gives coverage of all entry and exit points.
  The system shall continually record whilst the premises are open and conducting licensable
  activities. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 21 days. Recordings shall be
  made available upon the receipt of a request by an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local
  Authority.
- 2. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed at the premises.
- 3. An incident log (whether kept in a written or electronic form) shall be retained at the premises and made available to an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.
- 4. The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme, such as a Challenge 25, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall be either a photographic driving licence, a valid passport or any other recognised form of photographic identification incorporating the PASS logo.
- 5. The premises will be fitted with a burglar alarm system
- 6. The premises will be fitted with a panic button system for staff to utilise in the case of an emergency.

#### c) Public safety

The premises licence holder shall ensure that the appropriate fire safety, and health and safety regulations are applied at the premises.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

The premises licence holder will, upon request, provide the telephone number of their Customer Relations Contact Centre.

#### e) The protection of children from harm

- 1. All staff will receive comprehensive training in relation to age restricted products and in particular the sale of alcohol. No member of staff will be permitted to sell age restricted products until such time as they have successfully completed the aforementioned training.
- 2. An age till prompt system will be utilised at the premises in respect of age restricted products.

Ré application to vary a Premises Licence: Co-operative Food Group, 72-74 Warburton Road, Thornhill, and 30-32 Thornhill Park Road, Southampton.

Members of the Parochial Church Council of St Christopher's Church, Thornhill are concerned at the application for an extension of hours for selling alcohol at the above premises.

We feel that the hours already in place are quite lengthy and are perfectly adequate for those wishing to purchase alcohol.

In the 2011 Census this area (www.neighbourhoodstatistics.gov.uk Area: Southampton 025) is identified as being one of the most deprived areas in the country for Total Deprivation and also Health Deprivation. There are many people in Thornhill and particularly Hightown, where the Warburton Road premises are situated, that have very low incomes. They are tempted to spend money on alcohol which is often detrimental to their health and the well-being of children and would have more benefit if spent on essentials.

Cases of domestic and other violence are often fuelled by the over-consumption of alcohol. Domestic violence accounts for one quarter of all recorded violent crime (www.womensaid.org.uk) of which there were15 cases in the Hightown area just during January 2013 (www.police.co.uk). Easy availability of alcohol can only add to the likelihood of more of these cases.

We realise that those who wish to purchase alcohol will do so whatever the licensed hours of the local premises. However we feel that increasing these already generous hours gives a message that alcohol is as readily available as food such as bread and milk, rather than being an item which needs to be consumed with a responsible attitude. In the Thornhill area it would be appropriate to keep the licensed hours as they are so as not to encourage further drinking by some residents and to show that drinking alcohol needs to be done responsibly.
