Legal Implications

- 1. On application for transfer of a premises licence, the applicant is required to serve notice on the Council, as Licensing Authority, and a copy on the Chief Officer of Police.
- The Licensing Act 2003 requires that, where a valid application for transfer of a licence
 has been received by the Licensing Authority, the application must be granted, unless
 the Chief Officer of Police gives notice of objection to the application within 14 days of
 receipt of the application.
- 3. To object, the Chief Officer of Police must be satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the application would undermine the crime prevention objective, and the notice of objection must state their reasons why the Chief Officer of Police is so satisfied.
- 4. Where objection is made by the Police, and is not withdrawn, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the notice of objection and, having regard to the notice, reject the application if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the statutory crime prevention objective.
- 5. The Licensing Authority, the Police and the applicant for transfer of the licence may agree that a hearing is not necessary. No such agreement has been reached in this case.
- 6. In determining the application, the Licensing Authority's discretion is to either grant or refuse the application for transfer. There is no discretion to vary the licence conditions.
- 7. The decision making panel, in considering an application, must have regard to the notice, adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations of the applicant.
- 8. An applicant, whose application has been rejected, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court. Likewise the Chief Officer of Police may appeal against a decision to grant the application.
- 9. On determination of the application of the transfer, the Licensing Authority must give notice of its decision to the Chief Officer of the Police, the applicant for transfer and, if the application is granted, the applicant for the transfer and, if the application is granted, the holder of the previous licence, or if the application is refused, the continuing holder of the licence.
- 10. If the applicant and the designated premises supervisor are not the same person and the application is granted, the applicant must notify the designated premises supervisor of the transfer.
- 11. In considering this application the panel will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the panel must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The panel must also have regard to:-

12. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

13. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

I am PS 18 Christine Plascott of Hampshire Constabulary currently stationed at Southampton Central Police Station.

I am a Licensing Officer and have a responsibility within my policing area to ensure that the Licensed Premises are promoting and upholding the four licensing objectives.

These are as follows:

- The prevention of crime & disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

A method used to ensure that the four licensing objectives are being met is to conduct Test Purchase Operations.

Section 149 and 152 of the Licensing Act 2003 allows for the purchase or attempted purchase of alcohol in licensed premises by young persons under the age of 18 years at the request of a Police Officer acting in the course of their duty. It further allows a Police Officer in the course of their duty to send a young person under the age of 18 years to obtain alcohol into licensed premises to purchase or attempt to purchase alcohol without an offence being committed.

It an offence contrary to section 146(1) and (7) of The Licensing Act 2003 to sell alcohol to a person under the age of 18 years old.

On Friday 8th February 2013 from 1730 hours I participated in a test purchase operation with two test purchasers. Test purchaser one was a female aged 17 years old, and test purchaser two was

I was in plain clothes together with PC 22237 CONWAY and PS 2117 WOOD. Our role in the operation was to monitor the test purchasers at all times, ensure their safety and give evidence in relation to any offences committed.

At approximately 2140 hours I attended an off-license premises called Bargain Booze, Shirley High Street, Southampton. I entered the premises a headed to the confectionary display which is situated to the right of the store as you enter. I browsed the shelves and noted that there was one male serving behind the counter which is situated next to the main entrance to the store.

I then saw test purchaser 1 and test purchaser 2 enter the store. They both approached the alcohol which was directly behind me. I saw Test purchaser 2 selected two bottles of cider from the display and both he and test purchaser 1 walked to the shop counter. I walked directly behind them and stood behind them at the till. I saw Test Purchaser 2 place the bottles on the counter and the male behind the counter served him. The male did not at any stage ask for test purchaser 2 to provide identification. When Test purchaser 2 had paid for the bottles of cider he turned and walked out of the store. I purchased an item and left the store a moment after.

At 2145 hours I returned to the store with Pc 22237 Conway and I was present when the male cashier who has served Test purchaser 2 was issues with a fixed penalty notice.

I had no further dealings.

the safety of the test purchaser and to deal with any offences committed by the premises.

At approximately 21:50hrs I attended Bargain Booze, Shirley Road, Southampton. I was advised by PS Plascott that a sale had been made at the premises. On attending, PS Plascott identified the staff member who had authorised the sale, explaining that the male member of bar staff had sold two bottles of cider, making no request for identification from either test purchaser.

I spoke with the male member of staff who gave their details as Zain ALI, DOB 30/05/66.

At 22:05hrs I reported ALI for the offence of selling alcohol to someone under the age of 18 contrary to S146(1) and (7) of The Licensing Act 2003. ALI was cautioned to which he made no reply. ALI was issued with a fixed penalty notice in relation to the offence, the reference for which is 2033827

Meeting with DPS

DPS Shoib ALI attended SC as arranged.

PLH, Sundur Saleem, did not attend, and DPS stated that he did not have any other contact information for her

Since the last meeting, ALI has informed his staff more fully on C25, putting more signs up at the till explaining to request ID from all people who look under 25, and to accept only driving licences, passports and PASS id's.

Further posters have been put up around the staff areas of the shop.

DPS has also arranged for people under 25 to come into the shop as a 'homemade' test purchase. Staff have requested ID and noted this in the refusals book.

No formal training package has been put in place, although DPS stated that he has ordered a training package. DPS could not provide any details of the package that he has ordered.

CCTV of the test purchase has not been viewed. A copy has also not been provided. The DPS stated that the DVD drawer no longer works, so footage is not able to be downloaded. The DPS stated that police have seized the hard drive in the past, as no-one was able to use the system. I have advised that police would have no reason to seize the hard drive if the system was fully operational and footage can be provided by staff.

Refusals book is in place - this has been utilised recently, with refusals being noted for alcohol and cigarettes.

Concerns discussed -

C25 policy not fully understood by staff - Zain ALI had stated that, as the test purchaser looked 18, he did not need to request ID, and as the 2nd test purchaser was not actually buying the alcohol, ID was not required from her. I have advised the DPS that his staff need to be trained fully on the C25, in that everyone who looks under the age of 18, whether buying the alcohol or in a group with the person buying the alcohol, everyone's age must be verified to prevent offences being committed - sale to an U18 or sales on behalf of U18 (proxy sales).

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Training - a formal training package should be implemented, covering avoidance of sales to children, signs and symptoms of drunkiness and refusals of sales to drunk people. The provision of training should be recorded, refresher training provided every 6 months, and staff tested on their understanding with questions, the pass mark being 80%.

CCTV - as this is a useful tool in the prevention of crime and protection of children, any CCTV needs to be maintained in full working order. I have outlined the basics of police expectations - 28 days storage with staff to be able to proved footage on request in a viewable format.

I have advised the DPS that I still need to speak with the PLH, as I will be looking for these proposals to be added to the licence as the standard of operating the premises.

I have also advised the DPS that the premises has now committed the offence of persistant sales of alcohol to children, for which the PLH is liable to be prosecuted for. I have advised that further formal action will be taken with the premises, which could include prosecution or closure notice under S147A LA, and a review.
