BRIEF SUMMARY

This report requests that the Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee (OSMC) agrees the outline terms of reference for a scrutiny review examining the contribution which planning policy can make to maintaining balanced neighbourhoods and the quality of life for their residents.

The draft terms of reference, outlined below have been developed in consultation with the Chair and Vice Chair of the Committee and the Head of Planning, Transport and Sustainability.

If the Committee approves the outline terms of reference it is recommended that authority be delegated to the Head of Communities, Change and Partnerships, in consultation with the Chair of Scrutiny Panel A, to finalise the terms of reference for the review.

RECOMMENDATION:

- (i) That the Committee consider and approve the draft outline terms of reference for the scrutiny review.
- (ii) That authority is delegated to the Head of Communities, Change and Partnerships, in consultation with the Chair of Scrutiny Panel A, to finalise the terms of reference for the review.

REASON FOR REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

1. To enable the Scrutiny Panel A to commence the scrutiny review examining the contribution which planning policy can make to maintaining balanced neighbourhoods and the quality of life for their residents.

DETAIL (Including consultation carried out)

- 3. Scrutiny Panel B is due to conclude its Apprenticeships Inquiry in September 2013. It was agreed that Scrutiny Panel's would run consecutively, therefore, to enable Scrutiny Panel A to commence a scrutiny review in October the OSMC needs to agree outline terms of reference for a scrutiny review.
- 4. The Vice Chair of the OSMC suggested that Scrutiny Panel A undertake a review looking at planning and development control for residential areas. Following a meeting between the Chair and Vice Chair of the OSMC, the Head of Planning, Transport and Sustainability, and the Improvement Manager the proposed outline terms of reference for the scrutiny review, to be conducted by Scrutiny Panel A over approximately 6 meetings are as follows:
 - To review how effectively the City Council's Article 4 and Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMO) Supplementary Planning Document is working;
 - To increase understanding of the various Government proposals to relax permitted development rights, including those relating to extensions, office to residential conversions and changing retail use without consent, and to consider if a local response should be developed;
 - To consider the Council's approach to planning enforcement
- 5. The terms of reference need to be developed and refined, with clear objectives and outcomes for each meeting determined, best practice examples considered and witnesses identified. It is recommended that this be undertaken by the Head of Communities, Change and Partnerships, in consultation with the Chair of Scrutiny Panel A.
- 6. The final report and recommendations of the Scrutiny Panel will be considered by the OSMC prior to Cabinet to ensure that the review has met the agreed outline terms of reference set by this Committee.
