

## **Legal Implications**

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a new Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a new Premises Licence whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the

committee must make its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

#### 5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area

#### 6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

My wife and I are the owners and occupiers of 65 Oxford Street Southampton and our house is nearly directly opposite the above premises. We are aware that an application has been made for a late night liquor licence for the premises.

This end of Oxford Street is nearly entirely residential and the premises is surrounded on all sides by flats and houses. Although we can hear music from the other end of the Street and get occasional noise nuisance from pedestrians at night, which we accept as part of the pleasure of central city living, we have grave concerns as to the granting of a late night licence to the above premises. As the owner of a residential property at 5 Oxford Street, Southampton, I would like to object to the application for a late night bar licence at number 1 Oxford Street. This property has previously been operated as a restaurant however, due to the close proximity to my property, if converted to a bar, I am concerned that noise from music and people leaving the bar, waiting for taxi□s etc after closing time will be disruptive and disturbing.

This end of Oxford Street where I am located is relatively quiet with bars etc being located at the other end, further enough away to avoid disturbance. The restaurants that have previously occupied number 1 Oxford Street have not played music and have closed by 11pm. A late licence with music would negatively change the living environment.

Importance: High Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to object in the strongest terms to the granting of a late night bar and music licence for 1 Oxford Street, on the grounds of noise.

My reasons are as follows:

1 Oxford Street is situated at the residential end of Oxford Street □ granting a late night licence to these premises for use of a bar with music is placing a source of noise disruption within 50 metres of homes with small children.

The inevitable gathering of smokers outside will further add to the noise within such a short distance of our homes and further attract taxis to unlawfully queue outside

Cargo and Med Bar  $\square$  each of whom have been granted late night licenses already cause significant noise issues, both from the live music from Cargo and from the gathering of drinkers / smokers on the pavements outside.

Council has also granted a live music licence to the 1865 club in Brunswick Square, just behind Oxford Street, which despite sound-proofing regularly booms out music that disrupts sleep, especially during the summer when it is impracticable to keep windows shut.

All the premises with late night licences have attracted a huge number of taxis that now use Oxford Street as an unofficial taxi rank, significantly increasing traffic and noise at this residential end. Despite many requests of the council / police / traffic wardens / taxi companies to control this, the taxis swarm to Oxford Street on Fridays and Saturdays to the point where it is becoming intolerable.

These late night licences many with music has significantly eroded the quality of life for residents over the last 8-10 years. Despite Council claims that the plan is to create an up-market part of town in this area, the commerciality of licence fees has been placed higher than the needs of the ordinary resident and council tax payer.

The Bernard Street end of Oxford Street is primarily residential, as is Orchard Lane, and I appeal to Council to consider the needs of everyone in the area. Oxford Street is already well served with bars, restaurants and music granting a licence right in the residential part of the street would significantly increase the existing noise nuisance and further diminish our rights of enjoyment of our own properties.

Whilst I suspect that residents□ views will inevitably be ignored, I would
certainly hope that Councillors would take the opportunity to experience the
current situation $\square$ I would be very pleased to meet with Councillors in Oxford
Street and demonstrate the issues.
