Legal Implications

- 1. Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that a responsible authority or any other person may apply for review of a premises licence.
- 2. In such circumstances, the applicant for the review must serve a copy of the review application on the holder of the premises licences, the licensing authority and each of the responsible authorities.
- 3. On receipt of an application for review, officers will consider its validity under delegated powers. Reasons for rejection, in whole or in part, include:
- 4. that the grounds for review are not relevant to one of more of the licensing objectives and;
- 5. that the application is frivolous, vexatious or repetitious, unless it is made by a responsible authority.
- 6. The licensing authority must display a prescribed notice of the review application on the outside or adjacent the premises, on the authority's website and at the Civic Centre; the notice must remain on display for 28 days and any interested party or the responsible authorities may make representations in that period.
- 7. The licensing authority is then required to hold a hearing to consider the review.
- 8. In doing so the sub-committee must give appropriate weight to:
 - the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;

- the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
- its own statement of licensing policy
- the Statutory Guidance
- 9. In determining an application for review, the legislation provides that the sub-committee may take any (or none) of the following steps, as it considers necessary:
 - modify the conditions of the licence;
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - revoke the licence.
- 10. The Licensing Act 2003 provides for appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the subcommittee's decision in relation to an application for review by the premises licence holder and any other party who made a representation to the application.
- 11. In considering this application the sub-committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider the application in accordance, in particular, with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended) and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the sub-committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.
- 12. The sub-committee must also have regard to:
 - The Crime and Disorder Act 1998
 Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the sub-committee under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.
 - The Human Rights Act 1998
 The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the sub-committee to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the sub-committee that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of proportionality the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the sub-committee which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matters set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.
- 13. Copies of the application for review and the representations to it are annexed to this report.

Review on grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, Prevention of public nuisance and protection of children from harm.

Licence holder and DPS continue to not fully support the licensing objectives.

Conditions attached to licence when granted October 2013

1) CCTV

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system will be able to cope with all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas. CCTV warning signs to be fitted in public places.

The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second and all recorded footage must be securely retained for a minimum of 28 days.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

The DPS or premises manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff at the premises during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies immediately to police on request when investigating allegations of offences or criminal activity. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS. Footage supplied in a digital format on CD or DVD will also have a copy of the CCTV system software enabled on the disc to allow playback.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Hampshire Western Police Licensing Unit within 24 hours.

2) Incident book

Án incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, physical ejection, injury, id seizure or drug misuse will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry.

The incident book will be checked weekly by the manager where any entries will be reviewed and signed. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the close of business in the incident book.

3) Refusals book

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to sell alcohol. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the refusals log is checked, signed and dated on a weekly basis by the store manager/manageress. The refusals log will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for inspection immediately upon request by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority.

The record of refusals will be retained for 12 months.

4) Challenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the persons date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

5) Training

Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and re-tested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

6) Prohibition of sales of single cans

Sales of single cans of alcohol shall be prohibited unless part of a basket of goods other than alcohol.

7) No beers, ciders or lager of 6.5%ABV or over shall be sold by retail, excluding premium products as agreed in writing, in advance with the Police Licensing Team.

Hampshire Constabulary request consideration be given to the revocation of the premises licence.

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police I am writing to request a review of the premises licence for Family Food Store, 156 Warren Avenue, Southampton. The review is requested on the following grounds:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2) The prevention of public nuisance
- 3) The protection of children from harm.

Hampshire Constabulary is requesting that consideration is given for the premises licence to be revoked, as a proportionate and necessary step promoting the licensing objectives. This is because the current premises licence holder and DPS, Mr Kanaththge Perera, is not demonstrating full support of the licensing objectives to prevent crime and disorder or protecting children from harm and prevent public nuisance. Steps that have been introduced during the initial application phase and a subsequent variation to enable Mr Perera to achieve this have not been maintained.

The evidence to support this review is:

On 3rd October 2013, Hampshire Constabulary received an application for a new premises licence for Family Food Store, 156 Warren Avenue, Southampton. The applicant was Mr Perera. The local safer neighbourhood team raised concerns about the sale of alcohol by retail at this location, as local residents had experienced anti-social behaviour. During the consultation period, PC 21521 Smith discussed a number of steps with Mr Perera, in person, which would address the concerns highlighted. Mr Perera agreed in writing for the steps to be added to his premises licence operating schedule as conditions. (Annex A)

Given the steps and commitment towards the promoting licensing objectives and addressing the concerns that Hampshire Constabulary had raised, the premises licence was duly granted on 26th November 2013.

Unfortunately, since opening Family Food Store, Mr Perera has shown a complete lack of understanding and commitment towards his responsibilities in promoting the licensing objectives. To date, there has been a catalogue of issues, some of which have only been

resolved when enforcement action has been started. This lack of responsibility towards the licensing objectives has culminated in a sale of alcohol to a 17 year old male and a sale of a single can of high strength beer to police witness.

Annex B contains summaries of visits and meetings that have been held with Mr Perera. Family Food Store was visited on 22nd January 2014 by PC 22237 Conway. Alcohol was on display at the premises for sale by retail, and alcohol was witnessed being sold to members of the public. A number of offences relating to the Licensing Act 2005 were seen. Mr Perera was only complying with the most basic of the conditions, the refusals book was in place and the challenge 25 policy was being advertised. At the time of the visit, there was no personal licence holder at the premises, which was one of conditions which Mr Perera had agreed to. This visit instigated a variation application. It was found that, particularly in relation to the storage of alcohol, Mr Perera was not able to adhere to the conditions which he himself had agreed to.

Mr Perera did not have a copy of his premises licence to produce, and had not made his DPS at the time aware of the conditions that were attached.

The premises were visited on 31st January 2014. On this visit, Mr Perera and his DPS were present. Efforts had been made to upgrade the CCTV system, but Mr Perera was still unable to play back or download footage. Disappointingly, there was still no due diligence training in place for staff, including Mr Perera. The DPS had advised that alcohol was only available for sale while he was present at the store, which was in the evenings.

An application to vary some of the conditions on the premises licence was submitted on 18th February 2014. During the consultation period, the premises were visited on 5th March 2014 to check compliance with the remaining conditions. The member of staff present confirmed that he was not a personal licence holder, but had received training in relation to the Licensing Act 2005 through his other place of work. The member of staff was not being supervised, but fully expected to authorise the sale of alcohol. He was also not able to operate the CCTV system in order to provide footage immediately on request.

Mr Perera was contacted, and a further visit arranged for 11th March 2014. There still remained issues with CCTV, as outlined in the meeting summary. However, a major cause for concern, considering Mr Perera had applied to remove some of the conditions, was that staff still had not been trained in relation to due diligence, preventing the sale of alcohol to children and preventing the sale of alcohol to drunks. Mr Perera had not even confirmed whether his member of staff was in fact a personal licence holder before allowing him to authorise the sale of alcohol.

Training, and understanding that training, is fundamental to preventing the sales of alcohol to children and to drunken people. Due to the failings witnessed at Family Food Store, Hampshire Constabulary raised an objection to parts of the variation application, in particular the removal of a personal licence holder to directly authorise the sale of alcohol. (Annex C)

As a result of the representation, Mr Perera's licensing consultant, Mr Jordan, attended the store and completed due diligence training with Mr Perera and other full-time staff.

Recording of refusals and incidents had been formalised. The remaining conditions were fully explained to Mr Perera, and he confirmed that he understood them and agreed to the conditions remaining.

Given the input that Mr Perera had received in order to comply with the premises licence and promote the licensing objectives into the future, Hampshire Constabulary withdrew the representation for the variation, and made no representation when Mr Perera applied to become the DPS.

On 4th June 2014, police conducted a test purchase operation. A 15 year old female purchased a bottle of WKD. Mr Perera authorised the sale. He made no attempt to verify the age of the test purchaser, nor did he request identification from the 17 year old male that she was in company with. A further compliance purchase was attempted, with a plain clothed officer, SC Stark, selecting a single can of Lech lager. The cashier, Mr Perera, informed SC Stark that he was not able to sell the single can unless it was in a basket. SC Stark duly obtained a basket from the entrance of the shop, placed the can in the basket, and then was allowed to purchase the single can with no other items of shopping. This was captured on CCTV, which although Mr Perera was not able to provide at the time, did provide when police returned on 12/06/14.

Lucas Marshall from Trading Standards attended the store with police following the alcohol sales. Mr Marshall noted in particular, that Mr Perera was not able to produce a current premises licence to confirm the conditions in relation to the strength of beers, lagers and ciders permitted. The initial premises licence stated prohibition of products above 5.2%ABV, whilst the variation had amended this condition to products of 6.5%ABV and above. It transpired in further conversations, that Mr Perera had not advised the Licensing Authority of a change of address, so Mr Perera had not received it. Mr Perera stated that his licensing consultant had not forwarded the documents.

Since the first visit to the premises, Mr Perera has shown a lack of personal responsibility towards the licensing objectives. He has refused to accept on a number of occasions that it is his errors and lack of understanding that has resulted in the failings found. Mr Perera has repeatedly made the excuses that his licensing consultant has not forwarded documentation, or provided the correct advice, even when the consultant has not been involved in decisions. Only when offences can be evidenced, as with the failed test purchase, has Mr Perera admitted to his errors.

The failed test purchase and failed compliance check is deeply concerning to Hampshire Constabulary. There has been a catalogue of non-compliance with the premises licence, and a complete lack of promotion of the licensing objectives by Mr Perera in both his roles of premises licence holder and as DPS. Despite repeated warnings, Mr Perera seems to have not taken on board his responsibilities towards the licensing objectives. Over recent months, Mr Perera himself has received official training in his responsibilities as a personal licence holder, inputs from Hampshire Constabulary regarding prevention of unauthorised sales of alcohol and preventing underage sales. Mr Jordan has also provided due diligence training in March 2014. Mr Perera has also received input on the Challenge 25 policy from National Lottery. Yet, despite this recent training, Mr Perera failed to make refusals when required. If

Mr Perera is not taking his responsibilities as DPS and PLH seriously, he is not in a position to direct his staff to do so either.

Family Food Store is less than half a mile from St James Park and Shirley High Street, an area where one of the local priorities which the community would like police to reduce is street drinking and begging. Annex E shows the reported incidents during March and June 2014. There are repeated reports of aggressive begging, drunkenness and youth nuisance, even in these relatively cooler months. The area of Shirley Road and Shirley High Street and immediate surroundings therefore require responsible retailers who will do all they reasonably and proportionately to prevent their premises from contributing to the existing problems. A responsible retailer does not take 6 months, and numerous contact with police, to take even the most basic steps to adhere to authorisations and legislation.

Hampshire Constabulary is requesting that the premises licence is revoked for Family Food Store, 156 Warren Avenue. Mr Perera has shown that he is not able to promote the licensing objectives, or even trade within legislation. He has repeatedly failed to implement the steps that he put forward in his application, and then only doing so when official representations are made to the Licensing Authority. The steps that are currently on the premises licence have the aim of preventing sales of alcohol to children and preventing sales of alcohol to people who contribute to crime and disorder and public nuisance. Despite these steps, the premises have sold alcohol to a 15 year old and lager as a single purchase.

Hampshire Constabulary have considered if there are any other steps that can be taken, but feel that all the necessary and proportionate steps are in place, but are being disregarded. Therefore we feel that revocation of the premises licence is now the appropriate option to prevent crime and disorder, prevent public nuisance and protect children from harm.

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, physical ejection, injury, id seizure or drug misuse will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry.

The incident book will be checked weekly by the manager where any entries will be reviewed and signed. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the close of business in the incident book.

3) Refusals book

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to sell alcohol. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the refusals log is checked, signed and dated on a weekly basis by the store manager/manageress.

The refusals log will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for inspection immediately upon request by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority. The record of refusals will be retained for 12 months.

4) Challenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the persons date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

5) Training

Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will

be retrained and re-tested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

6) Prohibition of sales of single cans

Sales of single cans of alcohol shall be prohibited unless part of a basket of goods other than alcohol.

7) No beers, ciders or lager of 6.5%ABV or over shall be sold by retail, excluding premium products as agreed in writing, in advance with the Police Licensing Team.



Below is a copy of the conditions that were agreed with Mr Perera. I understand Mr Perera met with my colleague, PC Smith, to discuss the conditions fully and the implications.

The extra conditions - strength, storage, advertising and personal licence holder present, were put forward due to concerns from the safer neighbourhood team about access to alcohol and the related anti-social behaviour in the area.

Having been to the premises, I see that the storage condition is not workable for this particular store. It remains preferable for the alcohol to be secure, however, I am agreeable to an amendment in this condition.

I am also agreeable to an amendment in the condition relating to the strength of beers, lagers and ciders available from the store.

I would therefore consider the following amendments, by way of variation:

As discussed on the phone, I am dealing with you application for a premises licence at family food store 156 Warren Avenue. I am awaiting any representation from the local beat team. In the mean time please read the provisional conditions below that I would like to agree for inclusion on the licence should it be granted. We can discuss them at our meeting on 15th October.

1) CCTV

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system will be able to cope with all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas.

CCTV warning signs to be fitted in public places.

The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second and all recorded footage must be securely retained for a minimum of 28 days.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

The DPS or premises manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff at the premises during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies immediately to police on request when investigating allegations of offences or criminal activity. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS. Footage

supplied in a digital format on CD or DVD will also have a copy of the CCTV system software enabled on the disc to allow playback.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Hampshire Western Police Licensing Unit within 24 hours.

2) Incident book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, physical ejection, injury, id seizure or drug misuse will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). 3) Refusals book

4) Challenge 25

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of

identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

5) Training-

Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and retested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

6) Supervision of alcohol sales

Each and every sale of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by the designated premises supervisor or a personal licence holder.

7) Prohibition of sales of single cans

Sales of single cans of alcohol shall be prohibited unless part of a basket of goods other than alcohol.

8) Advertising, display and location of alcohol

The sale of alcohol will not be advertised. Alcohol displayed for sale will not be visible from outside the premises and will be stored behind the sales counter. Customers will not be able self select alcohol.

Premises visited - conditions not being adhered to

Report:

Premises visited. PLH Kanaththge PERERA was present as was his wife. Neither holds a personal licence at this time, although PERERA is in the process of awaiting his CRB check in order to apply.

Sale of alcohol seen - 3 cans of lager were self-selected by a customer from a fridge in the store. A fourth was handed to her by the PLH, from an area where customers can select alcohol. The customer and her friend did smell of alcohol, but were not presenting as overly drunk.

Two further customers attempted to purchase alcohol while i was present, both were refused due to the licence issues, as they were self-selecting. One presented as intoxicated.

DPS attended, as he is local to the store.

It was established that PERERA has not received the premises licence from his agent since the initial issue or DPS variation. Therefore, neither PLH nor DPS have sighted the conditions which the PLH agreed to in the application stage. PERERA has been verbally told that the premises has been granted a licence, so has stocked and sold alcohol with no regard to the licence. The DPS has made little or no effort to seek the premises licence and familiarize himself with the attached conditions.

Licence was not on display. No licence was on the premises.

CCTV - There is a CCTV system in place. However, the hard drive is not linked to the monitor, therefore cannot be checked for storage, coverage or usability. It is assumed that storage is about a month, but the PLH has not checked this. The system downloads onto USB. PLH was advised that the condition requires a disc to be produced immediately on request. I suggested that the PLH has a laptop or suitable system available so the USB data can be transferred to disc. The PLH asked why the system was suitable for the previous owner, and why some off-licences do not have CCTV. It was explained that the previous owner did not have a premises licence, so the installation was not prescribed. In the case of other premises, if the situation was that the premises licence was not new, then they may not have any reason to install CCTV.

The system has 4 cameras - 2 inside and 2 outside. As the system could not be viewed, it cannot be confirmed if the area next to the till where the alcohol is stored would be covered.

Weekly checks are not being conducted - advise provided.

Incident book / refusals book - Refusals book in place and being utilised for cigarettes, mainly for no ID. No refusals made in relation to alcohol. Advice provided on incidents to be recorded, and suggestion made that incidents and CCTV checks to be made in the refusals book, as the PLH is already utilising this and is familiar with this record.

Challenge 25 - posters on display advertising C25. Refusals being made in relaiton to cigarettes.

Training - not in place. Requirements discussed - all people serving alcohol, including personal licence holders, need to be trained and refresher training conducted every 6 months, with a questionnaire. At present, there is only the PLH and his wife working at the store, neither of whom have received training from the DPS,

Personal licence holders to personally supervise sales - This was discussed at great length with both the DPS and PLH. They were both under the impression that having the named DPS was sufficient to cover this, confusing this with the mandatory condition. It was explained that while the PLH was waiting the CRB check and the personal licence to be issued, the DPS would need to be present at this store to personally authorise sales. The DPS explained that he had another store, but had checked with the council and the agent as to whether he could be DPS at both places. It seems that the DPS and PLH have only listened to advice in relation to the mandatory conditions, but not to this agreed condition. I also advised that this condition had been put forward and agreed to in the application process due to concerns raised by SNT.

Single sales - Again, this condition was not being adhered to in any way. Condition explained that single cans can only be sold with a selection of other groceries. The condition does allow multiples of cans (ie 4 pack)

advertising, display and location - I wrongly assumed that these conditions had been put forward by the applicant. However it seems that these conditions were put forward by police and agreed to, even though the store is an incredably small store, and would need refurb to extend the counter.

Alcohol and offers were being advertised on A frames outside the store. This was pointed out to the PLH.

Due to the size and layout of the store, only the counter can be seen from outside when the door is open. The current location of the fridge and non-spirits cannot be seen from outside.

None of the alcohol is stored behind the counter, The spirits are just to the side of the counter, but within reach of customers. The fridges are not located near the counter. Customers are able to self-select all alcohol.

advice provided to the DPS and PLH that the current layout / no personal licence holders do not comply with the agreements made during the consultation period, and that the PLH was fully aware that the agreement had been made. Any sales of alcohol which were self-selected or not personally authorised by the DPS are not authorised, and therefore leave the PLH and DPS open to prosecution and/or review.

Beer of cider over 5.2% - not a complete shock to the PLH, but also not being complied with. He beleived that the strength he had agreed to was 5.6%. There were a number brands, particularly Polish lagers, which were 5.6%, but there was also Scrumpy Jacks at 6%. Advised that these products would need to be removed from sale whilst this condition remains on the licence. Consideration would be made for a variation to beers, lagers and ciders of 6.5% and above, as with the 'reducing the strength' initiative.

Further discussion needs to be made in relation to the storage and strength conditions.

Thank you for the application to vary the conditions attached to the operating schedule for Family Food Store, Warren Avenue.

As discussed previously, I am agreement for condition 8 'the sale of alcohol will not be advertised. Alcohol displayed for sale will not be visible from outside the premises and will be stored behind the counter. Customers will not be able to self select alcohol' to be removed.

I am also in agreement for condition 9 'No beer or cider will be sold that has an ABV of over 5.2%', to be replaced with a condition limiting products of an ABV of 6.5% and above. I would like to propose the following wording for consideration for your client

'No beers, ciders or lager of 6.5% ABV or over shall be sold by retail, excluding premium products as agreed in writing, in advance with the police licensing team.'

Having visited the premises and spoken to your client, I will be agreable to the removal of the condition 'Each and every sale of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by the designated premises supervisor or a personal licence holder.' However, all members of staff authorising the sale of alcohol MUST be trained according to the current condition, prior to this amendment coming into force.

In relation to the condition for the prohibition of single cans, this condition was put forward as a step to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance, particularly in relation to street drinking and the resulting alcohol related anti-social behaviour. Family Food Store is in the vicinity of Shirley High Street and St James park in particular, where the current policing priority raised by the local residents and councillors is to tackle street drinking. In conjunction with the removal from sale of high strength beers, lagers and ciders, this condition is a reasonable step in order to support the licencing objectives and for your client to support his local community, and not add to the current problems encountered in the vicinity.

As such, this condition should remain on the operating schedule as a condition, and I, on behalf of Hampshire Constabulary would object to this condition being removed.

Mr Perera was advised that I was looking to make sure that conditions remaining should the variation be granted were in place and being adhered to.

CCTV - Mr Perera was unable to work the system. He was unable to confirm that the storage is 28 days, and has not been checking the system. Mr Perera was asked for the records to confirm he has been checking the system, which he could not furnish. Mr Perera was asked to download some footage, to confirm that the system is working as per the condition. Mr Perera does have discs available to him, but stated that his installer was able to provide footage. I advised Mr Perera that he should be able to use his system, particularly as there was an expectation that he would be training other members of staff to provide footage immediately on request.

Training - Mr Perera looked through some folders of paperwork, however could not find any training package and does not have any training records. He stated that the only other members of staff who work at the store are his wife and Mr ATAPATTA, who Mr Perera believes to be a personal licence holder through his other place of work. I asked if Mr Perera has any record of the personal licence, or if he has checked for himself that Mr I holds a personal licence. Mr Perera stated that he has not asked to see the personal licence, so cannot confirm whether conditions are being adhered to.

I advised that Mr Ampallo confirmed to me that he does not hold a personal licence, and advised Mr Perera that he has a responsibilty to confirm any training qualifications of staff members.

Refusals book - this is in place, and refusals, mainly for cigarettes, are recorded.

Alcohol remains behind a clear plastic covering.

Mr Perera was advised that offences were being committed by not adhereing to the conditions, and it was disappointing that no progress has been made to address the issues first highlighted. Mr Perera was advised that serious concideration would now be made to objecting to the variation.

The premises licence holder and his wife were present.

CCTV - PLH was able to operate the system. He explained that he has bought a larger hard drive to assist with storage. This hard drive was installed around 14/03. Footage from 15/03 was viewed. PLH has been downloading footage onto discs as part of his checks, which he is recording daily in the incident book. Advised to record the date of the last stored footage as part of his checks, so that he can confirm that 28 days are being recorded.

Incident book / Refusals book - New recording files have been put in place, one for incidents and one for refusals. It was suggested to the PLH to use one file only for refusals for alcohol, cigarettes and lottery - he is currently utilising all records that have been provided to him. Refusals noted for no id & drunkiness. Incident book records a theft of alcohol when customer was refused.

Challenge 25 - advertised. Refusals noted for cigarettes & alcohol. Message about Ch25 was re-iterated by National Lottery, who were training in the use of lottery / scratchcards

Training - Training records were seen, these were very basic, but covered the main points outlined in the conditions. The questions used were sample questions from a personal licence course. The PLH advised that the course booklet had also been utilised as part of the training. Advice provided to research a more formal package, as well as putting reminders in electronic calenders for refresher training. PLH also advised that he had booked his wife on a personal licence holders course.

Single cans / High strength products - PLH happy with these conditions, and is agreable to these remaining.

All alcohol is currently behind sheets of newspaper at present until new conditions agreed.

DPS - disappointly, the PLH does not seem to have sought advice and guidance from his DPS. It was pointed out, that while the PLH is not named as the DPS, any DPS would be equally as responsible for maintaining conditions. Advice provided in order for DPS to submit variation, as the current variation does not cover any change of DPS.

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I am writing to lodge a representation of the above application on the following grounds:

- 1) The prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2) The prevention of public nuisance
- 4) Protection of Children from Harm

The police have concerns over the application. These concerns are outlined below:

Mr Perera has submitted an application to vary some of the conditions that have been applied to the premises licence operating schedule. Hampshire Constabulary believe that some of the proposals, should they be granted, will have a detrimental effect on the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder, preventing public nuisance and protecting children from harm.

The variation application requests the removal of the following conditions:

- Supervision of alcohol sales: Each and every sale of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by the designated premises supervisor or a personal licence holder.
- Prohibition of single cans: Sales of single cans of alcohol shall be prohibited unless part of a basket of goods other than alcohol
- Advertising, display and location of alcohol: The sale of alcohol will not be advertised. Alcohol displayed for sale will not be visible from outside the premises and will be stored behind the sales counter. Customers will not be able to self select alcohol.
- No beer or cider will be sold that has an ABV of over 5.2%.

The application states that the additional step of 'No beer or cider will be sold that has an ABV of over 6.5%' will be taken.

Hampshire Constabulary are agreeable for some amendments to be made to the operating schedule. However, Mr Perera has shown that he is not a responsible retailer, and has made little effort to adhere to the remaining conditions on the operating schedule. Hampshire Constabulary believe that the conditions remain necessary and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives, and propose the following:

- Each and every sale of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by the designated premises supervisor or a personal licence holder

- Sales of single cans of alcohol shall be prohibited unless part if a basket of goods other than alcohol.
- No beers, lagers or ciders of 6.5% ABV or above shall be sold by retail, excluding premium products as agreed in writing, in advance with the police licensing team.
- removal of the condition relating to advertising, display and location of alcohol.

Mr Perera applied for a premises licence for Family Food Store, 156 Warren Avenue, during October 2013. The local safer neighbourhood team raised concerns about the sale of alcohol by retail at this location, as local residents had experienced anti-social behaviour. During the consultation period, PC 21521 Smith discussed a number of steps with Mr Perera in person, which would address the concerns highlighted (Annex A).

Mr Perera agreed, in writing, for the steps, including those he now wishes to vary, to be added to his premises licence operating schedule as conditions (Annex B). The premises licence was subsequently issued on 26th November 2013.

Family Food Store was visited on 22nd January 2014 by PC 22237 Conway. Alcohol was on display at the premises, and alcohol was witnessed being sold to members of the public. A number of offences relating to the Licensing Act 2003 were found. In essence, Mr Perera showed a total disregard for the authority that Southampton Licensing Authority had granted, and a total disregard to his responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003.

The summary of the visit is provided by PC Conway in Annex C. The DPS, Mr Dissanayaka, had not been provided a copy of the licence, so had no idea of the conditions for which he was responsible for maintaining. The only aspects of the conditions listed in the operating schedule were that a refusals book was in place, and the challenge 25 policy was being advertised. At the time of the visit, Mr Perera had not applied for his personal licence, believing that attendance on a personal licence holder course was adequate.

Mr Dissanayaka, the nominated DPS, does not work at the premises, but runs his own store in New Milton. Mr Dissanayaka is a friend of Mr Perera, hence his agreement to be nominated as DPS in order for Mr Perera to sell alcohol.

This meeting instigated the variation application, as it was found, particularly in relation to storage of alcohol, Mr Perera is not able to adhere to the conditions which he himself had agreed to.

The premises was visited again on 31st January 2014. On this visit, both Mr Perera and Mr Dissanayaka were present. The CCTV had been upgraded, so was still building footage to the required 28 days. However, the CCTV could not be operated to confirm this. Disappointingly, there was still no training package in place. Mr Perera stated that his only other member of staff was a personal licence holder (Annex D)

On 18th February 2014, Hampshire Constabulary received an application to vary conditions on the premises licence. Initial contact was made to the agent that Hampshire Constabulary would agree in principle for the removal of a personal licence holder to directly authorise sales, on the understanding

that all members of staff involved in the sale of alcohol were trained in accordance with the condition which is to remain.

During the consultation period, a visit was made to the premises on 5th March 2014. The member of staff present confirmed that he was not a personal licence holder, but had received training in relation to the Licensing Act through his other place of work. The member of staff was not being supervised, and fully expected to authorise the sale of alcohol. He was also not able to operate the CCTV system in order to provide footage immediately on request (Annex E).

Mr Perera was contacted on Tuesday 11th March and a further visit arranged with PC Conway. During this visit, disappointingly, Mr Perera was unable operate the CCTV system, and he has not been checking the system to ensure it is working correctly (Annex F).

CCTV can actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime generally. However, in order for the full benefit of this step to be taken, operators need to be able to access the footage that is recorded.

Mr Perera was asked for the training package and the training records for his staff members. It was pointed out that the member of staff at the premises on 5th March 2014 was not a personal licence holder. Mr Perera was not able to locate any training package for his staff, and was not able to provide any training records, citing that the member of staff had been trained and holds a personal licence with another company. Mr Perera was not able to evidence this, as Mr Perera has not utilised due diligence and confirmed the existance of a personal licence.

Mr Perera has requested that the condition for a personal licence holder to directly supervise the sales of alcohol to be removed. In light that Mr Perera is the only person at the premises that has received any form of training since the premises licence came into effect, Hampshire Constabulary are concerned that the removal of this condition will be detrimental to the licensing objectives. Training is fundamental to preventing sales of alcohol to drunk people or to children under 18, and also preventing crime in relation to the authorisation of the sale of alcohol. Mr Perera and Mr Dissanayaka have failed to implement any training at Family Food Store, so a third party evidence of suitable initial training is required. Hampshire Constabulary are therefore requesting that this condition remains in place as a proportionate step for Family Food Store.

The conditions in relation to storage, strength and prohibition of single cans of alcohol were agreed with Mr Perera during the initial consultation period for the initial grant of the premises licence. The conditions were put forward by Hampshire Constabulary given the concerns raised by the local safer neighbourhood team. Family Food Store is also less than half a mile from St James Park and Shirley High Street, Southampton. These areas are a particular concern to local residents and councillors due to the prevalence of alcohol related anti-social behaviour and street drinking. In light of these local issues, all new applicants are being asked by Hampshire Constabulary to remove themselves from this concern and support their community by additional conditions being placed on their operating schedule.

Initially, the restriction of beers and ciders of an ABV above 5.2%, in conjuntion with a restriction on the sale of single cans, were put forward and agreed by Mr Perera. During the visit in January 2014, Mr Perera was found to be selling products above this ABV, and also selling single cans of alcohol.

In further discussions with police, it has been agreed for the condition relating to strength to be increased to products above 6.5%, in line with the initiative to address the concerns of alcohol related street drinking.

Mr Perera has applied for the removal of the condition relating to the sale of single cans of alcohol. As Mr Perera has not trained his staff in preventing sales to drunk people, then Hampshire Constabulary believe that this measure should remain in place as a proportionate measure to prevent Family Food Stores contributing to the existing issues.

The condition in relation to advertising, display and location of alcohol was agreed by Mr Perera, when he had full knowledge that his premises was too small to be able to comply with this condition without major refurbishment, particularly for alcohol to be stored behind the counter and not available for self selection.

Although Hampshire Constabulary are in agreement that this condition is not proportionate to remain on the premises licence, the agreement provides further evidence that Mr Perera requires additional steps such as all sales alcohol to be directly supervised by a personal licence holder, prohibition of single cans of alcohol and restriction on high strength beers, lagers and ciders in order to support the licensing objectives.

Hampshire Constabulary propose the following amendments to the premises licence.

Removal of condition 8 - the sale of alcohol will not be advertised. Alcohol displayed for sale will not be visible from outside the premises and will be stored behind the counter. Customers will not be able to self select alcohol.

I write in support of Hampshire Constabulary's application for review of the Premises Licence for Family Food Store, 156 Warren Avenue, Southampton, SO16 6AD, on the grounds that the Premises Licence Holder, Mr Perera, has failed to support the Licensing Objectives to prevent crime and disorder, prevent public nuisance and to protect children from harm.

The Police and Trading Standards share responsibility in the enforcement of the Licensing Act 2003 with regard to under age sales of alcohol. I have read PC Sharon Conway's application for the review of the above premises licence, which relates to sale of a single can of beer and an under age sale of alcohol which took place on the 4th June 2014, and repeat breaches of conditions that were put on the licence both to assist the premises in meeting the Licensing Objectives and to address the issues that area has with street drinking. That the Premises Licence Holder has sold alcohol to a girl of only 15 years is inexcusable and demonstrates a disregard for basic diligence procedures. That he believes that he can bypass the condition relating to sale of single cans of beer by putting it in a basket demonstrates his ignorance regarding the purpose of the condition, and that he is more concerned with selling alcohol than he is with the prevention of street drinking. It is clear from the application that considerable advice has been given to the premises by the Police regarding compliance with those conditions.

I assisted the Police in the above mentioned under age sales exercise and have enclosed a statement regarding the sale. To summarise following the sale I entered the store with PC Boucovalas and spoke to the seller, Mr Perera. A refusals record was dated, but the year not given. The incident book had details of when CCTV had been checked, with the last entry dated 25/5, however this is meant to be done on a weekly basis but had not been. Again the year was not given. Mr Perera was unable to provide copies of CCTV immediately. The refusals record had only been signed by Mr Perera, and no other staff - he said that he signs on their behalf. I could not find what I would regard as training records, only signed sheets confirming that staff had been trained.

Hampshire Constabulary have asked in their application that revocation of the Premises Licence should be considered and Southampton Trading Standards supports that request.

I asked to see the store's record of refused sales, which he provided to me. The last entry was dated '25/5', with no year given. There were 29 entries for what I understood to be for 2014. Mr Perera also showed me an incident book which detailed when the CCTV system had been checked. The last recorded check was '25/5', again no year was given. The CCTV is meant to be checked on a weekly basis, so assuming it was last checked on 25th May 2014 this would have been over a week. Mr Perera could not obtain a copy of a recording from his CCTV system
