Legal Implications

- 1. The legislation specifically restricts the grounds on which the sub-committee may refuse an application for variation of a premises licence, or impose conditions. The legislation provides for a presumption of grant of an application for variation of a premises licence, subject to the determination of the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. In doing so the sub-committee must give appropriate weight to:
 - the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
 - the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
 - its own statement of licensing policy
 - the Statutory Guidance
- 2. An application may be refused in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 3. An applicant for variation of a premises licence whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court. Any other person, who made a valid representation, may appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the decision to grant the application or against any conditions imposed.
- 4. In considering this application the sub-committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider the application in accordance, in particular, with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended) and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the sub-committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.
- 5. The sub-committee must also have regard to:
 - The Crime and Disorder Act 1998
 Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the sub-committee under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.
 - The Human Rights Act 1998
 The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the sub-committee to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with

the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the sub-committee that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the sub-committee which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matters set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

Please describe briefly the nature of the proposed variation (Please see guidance note 2) To extend the sale of alcohol on a Friday and Saturday night until 03:00 hours the following morning. (currently permitted until 02:00 hours)

To extend the opening hours of the premises on a Friday and Saturday night until 03:30 hours the following morning.

To remove conditions, 3 and 5 from annex 2.

To remove the following conditions from Annex 2:

- A close circuit televisions system shall be provided and maintained at the place licensed to the satisfaction of Hampshire Constabulary.
- An incident book and refusal register will be kept and will be provided to the Licensing Authority and the Responsible Authorities upon request.

Add the following conditions to the premises licence:

- A CCTV system will be installed and maintained at the premises. The CCTV system will include cameras capable of recording head shots of customers entering the premises as well as covering the bar servery. The CCTV system will be capable of storing recorded footage from all cameras for a minimum of 31 days and will be capable of burning footage onto portable storage devices, such as memory stick and/or DVD. Such recordings will be made available to the Police upon request and provided on a portable device to the police within 24 hours of the request.
- No new entry or re-entry to the premises after 02:00 on Friday and Saturday nights.
- A dispersal policy will be drawn up and implemented to ensure that customers leaving the premises do so as far as practicable without causing nuisance to residents in the immediate vicinity of the premises.
- An incident log ('the log') will be maintained and used at the premises, recording all incidents of crime and disorder or public nuisance witnessed at the premises. The log will include the date, time and name of member of staff making the record, along with details of the incident and any action taken. The log will be made available to police officers on request.
- A complaints log ('the log') will be maintained and used at the premises for any complaints received in relation to noise nuisance caused by the premises. The log will include details of the time, date and person making the entry, along with details of the complaint and any action taken. The log will be made available to police officers on request.
- A refusals log ('the log') will be maintained and used at the premises to record any refusals of sales of alcohol, be they in relation to under age attempts to purchase alcohol or for drunkenness. The log will include the date, time and name of member of staff making the record, along with details of the incident and any action taken. The log will be made available to police officers or trading standards officers on request.
- During regulated entertainment or after 23:00 in any event, all doors and windows in the licensed premises will be kept closed, except for access and egress.

All other hours, activities and licensable activities to remain unchanged.

Remove the following conditions which are attached to the current licence.

3 CONDITIONS TRANSFERRED FROM THE PUBLIC MUSIC AND DANCING LICENCE

(a) ALTERATIONS

No structural or other alterations of the place licensed or of the facilities and equipment installed therein or of the means of exit there from shall be made without the licensee having submitted to the Licensing Authority detailed plans showing the proposed alterations and having received the Licensing Authority's written approval thereof.

(b) SANITARY CONVENIENCES

Adequate and separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided in the place licensed for persons of each sex to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority. Such conveniences shall be available free of charge and shall at all times be kept in good order and repair, be properly and effectually cleansed, lighted, ventilated, disinfected and supplied with water and all proper requisites, and the doors leading thereto shall be suitably marked.

(c) REFRESHMENTS

If food or drink is provided in the place licensed for persons resorting thereto all arrangements for and areas in which preparation, storage and service of such refreshment takes or is to take place shall comply with the regulations for food hygiene prescribed by law and for the time being in force, shall be of adequate size, and shall be to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

(d) REFUSE

No refuse, rubbish or waste paper shall be permitted to accumulate in any part of the place licensed.

(e) VENTILATION

All parts of the place licensed shall be suitably and sufficiently ventilated by natural or mechanical means to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

(f) HYPNOSIS

- (i) No exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism (as defined in Section 6 of the Hypnotism Act, 1952) shall be given on any person in the place licensed except with the express consent of the Licensing Authority and in accordance with any conditions attached to such consent.
- (ii) Application for consent to give an exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism shall include a detailed description of the proposed exhibition and shall be made to the Licensing Authority not less than 21 days before the day on which the exhibition is to be given. Notice of the making of the application shall immediately be given to the Officer in Charge of the Police sub-division in which the place licensed is situate.

(g) MANAGEMENT

- (i) A responsible person nominated in writing by the licensee shall be in charge of, and present in the place licensed during all such times as public entertainment is provided therein, or members of the public are present for that purpose.
- (ii) During the whole time that public entertainment is provided in the place licensed persons in the employ of or at the direction of the licensee, trained in the routine to be followed in the case of fire or other emergency, shall be present in the place licensed. Advice on the training of such persons may be obtained from the Fire Authority.
- (iii) All parts of the place licensed and fittings therein, in particular the seating, door fastenings, floor surfaces and coverings, notices, steps and staircases shall be maintained at all times in good order and condition, and safe, suitable and sufficient means of heating shall be provided, to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority. The licensee shall, in complying with this condition, take all necessary precautions for the safety of persons frequenting the place licensed.

(h) GOOD ORDER

The licensee shall ensure that no person be admitted to or permitted to remain in the place licensed whilst in a state of intoxication. If any person in the place licensed shall act in a manner offensive to or to the

nuisance or annoyance of any other persons he shall forthwith be removed from the place licensed. The licensee shall, if necessary, seek the assistance of the Police in accomplishing this, and shall inform the Police of any conduct likely to cause a breach of the peace.

(i) NUISANCE

No public music, dancing or entertainment of a like kind shall be permitted or suffered to take place in the place licensed which shall be a nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience to any occupant of the premises in which the place licensed is situate or to any occupant of any other premises.

(j) EMERGENCY TELEPHONES

If no telephone service is available in the place licensed there shall be displayed in a conspicuous place a notice giving particulars of the nearest telephone available in an emergency and details of how to summon the emergency services. Any outbreak of fire must, immediately on its discovery, be reported to the Fire Authority.

(k) FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

All fire fighting equipment provided in the place licensed shall be examined at least once annually. In particular portable fire extinguishers shall be so examined and tested by a competent person in accordance with British Standard Code of Practice 5306; Part 3, 1980. The date of such test shall be clearly marked on the extinguisher or on stout tabs attached thereto. The licensee shall produce, if required by the Licensing Authority a certificate stating that all fire fighting equipment has been so examined and tested.

(I) INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS

- (i) Highly inflammable material must not be used in connection with any public entertainment provided in the place licensed unless it has been rendered fir retardant to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and is maintained in that condition. No naked flame shall be used in connection with any public entertainment provided in the place licensed except with the specific written consent of the Licensing Authority, and subject to any conditions attached to such consent.
- (ii) No explosive, highly inflammable or combustible substance, whether solid or liquid, shall be brought into or used or without the written consent of the Licensing Authority and subject to any conditions attached to such consent.

(m) ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS AND INSPECTIONS

- (i) Within one month of the Licensing Authority requiring an inspection to be carried out, the licensee shall, at his own expense, arrange for all the electrical installations in the place licensed to be inspected by a competent and qualified electrician and a certificate stating the condition of the installation shall, immediately after each inspection, be forwarded to the Licensing Authority by the licensee.
- (ii) Any alterations or additions, whether permanent or temporary, to the electrical installations in the place licensed shall only be carried out by a competent and qualified electrician, and shall be in accordance with the Regulations for Electrical Equipment in Buildings (Institution of Electrical Engineers).
- (iii) All electrical switches in connection with the lighting or hearing of the place licensed shall be guarded or out of reach of persons resorting to the place licensed.

(n) CONSTRUCTION

(i) Wall and Ceiling Linings, Insulation, Treatment, etc. - Any material used as a wall or ceiling lining, or as a suspended ceiling, or for acoustic or thermal insulation purposes shall be to the Licensing Authority's satisfaction and shall be fixed and supported in such manner as may be approved by the Licensing Authority.

Note: For the purpose of this condition the Licensing Authority will normally require such material to be non-combustible or be rated Class 1 of the classification for surface spread of flame when tested in accordance with the appropriate provisions of B.S. 476; Part 7, 1971, and be throughout its thickness of no greater flammability than its surface. Certain other materials may, however, be accepted, subject to compliance with such conditions as the Licensing Authority may consider appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

(ii) Decorative Features and Finishings - Any fixed or permanent decorative feature shall be of such materials as would be permitted for wall or ceiling linings. Any decorative surface finishing, including any fabric, shall be either non-combustible, inherently non-flammable or durably flameproof except that wallpaper and similar thin surface finishing may be accepted provided that it is fixed firmly with an adhesive approved by the Licensing Authority.

(o) CEILINGS

If the Licensing Authority require, provision shall be made, to the Licensing Authority's satisfaction, for the examination from above of any suspended ceiling over such parts of the place licensed frequented by persons resorting thereto and thereto and such other parts of the premises as the Licensing Authority may deem necessary.

(p) SEATING AND GANGWAYS

Seating, tables and chairs and other furniture and fittings in the place licensed shall be so arranged as to allow free and ready access to the exits.

(q) LIGHTING

- (i) Provision All parts of the place licensed shall be provided with adequate means of illumination and, except where otherwise permitted in writing by the Licensing Authority, those parts to which the public have access and all routes of escape for performers or staff shall be provided with adequate means of illumination from two independent sources.
- (ii) Standard of Illumination The illumination from each source shall be sufficient to enable the public, performers and staff to see their way out of the place licensed in safety at any time, and shall not be derived from prepayment meters.
- (iii) Segregation of the Two Systems of Lighting Where two lighting systems are provided each shall be so installed that a fault or accident arising on one system shall not jeopardise the other.
- (iv) Illumination of Exit Notices The exit notices required by the following Condition shall be provided with adequate means of illumination from two independent sources. Where the general lighting may be dimmed or extinguished whilst the public are present in the place licensed the exit notices shall be internally illuminated and shall conform with B.S. 2560; 1978. The lighting points for the illumination of those exit notices which are not required to be internally illuminated shall be located in proximity to the notices.

(r) EXIT NOTICES

- (i) Form and Position All doors or openings approved as exits shall be clearly indicated (above the door where possible) by the word "EXIT" or the words "EMERGENCY EXIT". Where an exit or emergency exit is not immediately visible to members of the public supplementary "EXIT" or "EMERGENCY EXIT" signs and arrows shall be placed so as to indicate the location of the exit or emergency exit to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority. All "EXIT" or "EMERGENCY EXIT" signs shall be in plain letters not less that 75 millimetres high and shall be between 2.0 and 2.5 metres above floor level. Unless otherwise permitted by the Licensing Authority, no other notice or wording shall be incorporated in, or form part of, an exit notice.
- (ii) Doors other than Exits Any door or opening, other than an exit, which leads to parts of the place licensed accessible to the public, shall have a conspicuous notice indicating the use of such parts. Any door not usable by the public shall be similarly indicated or shall be marked "PRIVATE". Notices bearing the words "NO EXIT" or "NO WAY OUT" shall not be provided.

(s) EXITS

- (i) Doors and Fastenings Unless otherwise permitted in writing by the Licensing Authority, exit doors and gates shall open in the direction of exit, and shall in all cases be free from fastenings other than panic bolts or such fastenings as may be approved by the Licensing Authority.
- (ii) Exit Routes All exit routes including passages, courts, ramps, gangways corridors and stairways, to which the public have access and which lead from the place licensed to the outside, shall at all times be kept free from obstruction.

(t) SPECIAL EFFECTS

No laser beam or other hazardous effect may be used in the place licensed without the prior written approval of the Licensing Authority. The licensee shall give at least 21 days' written notice to the Licensing Authority of such proposed use to allow adequate consideration.

(u) DOOR SUPERVISORS

All references in this licence to door supervisors shall mean door supervisors licensed pursuant to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 by the Security Industry Authority

- (v) The licensee shall ensure that all door supervisors engaging in licensable conduct (as defined in section 25 and paragraph 8 of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) at the place licensed are licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Private Security Industry Act 2001.
- (w) The Licensee(s) shall maintain a duty register giving details of every person at the place licensed engaging in licensable conduct, as defined in section 25 and paragraph 8 of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001, and the Licensee(s) shall immediately provide, on request by any authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority, Police Officer, or authorised Officer of the Security Industry Authority, the following details:
- (i) the licence number, name, date of birth and residential address of that person;
- (ii) the time at which that person commenced that period of duty, with the signed acknowledgement of that person;
- (iii) the time at which that person finished that duty that period of duty, with the signed acknowledgement of that person;
- (iv) any times during the period of duty when the person was not on duty;
- (v) if that person is not an employee of the Licensee(s), the name of the person by whom that person is employed or through whom the services of that person were engaged;
- (vi) the duty register shall be so kept that it can be readily inspected by a authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority, Police Officer, or authorised Officer of the Security Industry Authority
- (vii) the duty register shall comprise of a bound book with pages consecutively numbered and the Licensee(s) shall ensure that it is kept in a secure environment in order to prevent unauthorised access or alteration to the same.
- 4. A close circuit television system shall be provided and maintained at the place licensed to the satisfaction of Hampshire Constabulary
- 5(a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall extend until 02:00 in the morning following [or, if an earlier hour is specified in the special hours certificate, that hour], except that -
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00:00 on any day on which music and dancing is not (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming facilities are not) provided after 00:00; and
 - (ii) on any day that music and dancing end (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming ends) between 00:00 and 02:00 in the morning, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end or, as the case may be, when the gaming ends;
 - (b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect -
 - (i) with the substitution of references to 03:00 in the morning for references to 02:00 in the morning [or one hour following the hour actually specified in the certificate where the certificate currently requires closure between 01:00 and 02:00]
 - (c) Except as provided in (d) below, the permitted hours on Sundays shall extend until 00:30 in the morning following [or, if an earlier hour is specified in the special hours certificate, that hour], except that -
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00:00 on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming facilities are not) provided after midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming ends) between midnight on any Sunday and 00:30, the permitted hours on that Sunday or, as the case may be, when the gaming ends.
 - (d) On Sundays immediately before bank holidays other than Easter Sunday, the permitted hours shall extend until 02:00 in the morning following, except that -
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming facilities are not) provided after midnight;

- (ii) where music and dancing end (or, in the case of casino premises, gaming ends) between midnight on any Sunday and 02:00, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end or, as the case may be, when the gaming ends
- (e) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (f) Late night refreshment may additionally be provided up to 30 minutes after the terminal hour for the sale or supply of alcohol on any day.
- 6- An incident book and refusal register will be kept and will be provided to the Licensing Authority and the Responsible Authorities upon request.

- No supply of alcohol shall be made under the premises licence:
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence,
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor for the premises does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

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- premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant
 - supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the
- discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; favourable manner.
- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistant by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

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B - Exhibition of Films

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Films may be exhibited in the licensed premises, subject to the following:

No film shall be exhibited unless it has received a "U", "PG", "12", "12A", "15" or "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification or the licensing authority, or it is current news reel which has not been so certified.

(c) REFRESHMENTS

If food or drink is provided in the place licensed for persons resorting thereto all arrangements for and areas in which preparation, storage and service of such refreshment takes or is to take place shall comply with the regulations for food hygiene prescribed by law and for the time being in force, shall be of adequate size, and shall be to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

(d) REFUSE

No refuse, rubbish or waste paper shall be permitted to accumulate in any part of the place licensed.

(e) VENTILATION

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"I parts of the place licensed shall be suitably and sufficiently ventilated by natural or mechanical means to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

(f) HYPNOSIS

(i) No exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism (as defined in Section 6 of the Hypnotism Act, 1952) shall be given on any person in the place licensed except with the express consent of the Licensing Authority and in accordance with any conditions attached to such consent.

(ii) Application for consent to give an exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism shall include a detailed description of the proposed exhibition and shall be made to the Licensing Authority not less than 21 days before the day on which the exhibition is to be given. Notice of the making of the application shall immediately be given to the Officer in Charge of the Police sub-division in which the place licensed is situate.

(g) MANAGEMENT

- (i) A responsible person nominated in writing by the licensee shall be in charge of, and present in the place licensed during all such times as public entertainment is provided therein, or members of the public are present for that purpose.
 - (ii) During the whole time that public entertainment is provided in the place licensed persons in the employ of or at the direction of the licensee, trained in the routine to be followed in the case of fire or other emergency, shall be present in the place licensed. Advice on the training of such persons may be obtained from the Fire Authority.
- (iii) All parts of the place licensed and fittings therein, in particular the seating, door fastenings, floor surfaces and coverings, notices, steps and staircases shall be maintained at all times in good order and condition, and safe, suitable and sufficient means of heating shall be provided, to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority. The licensee shall, in complying with this condition, take all necessary precautions for the safety of persons frequenting the place licensed.

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(h) GOOD ORDER

The licensee shall ensure that no person be admitted to or permitted to remain in the place licensed whilst in a state of intoxication. If any person in the place licensed shall act in a manner offensive to or to the nuisance or annoyance of any other persons he shall forthwith be removed from the place licensed. The licensee shall, if necessary, seek the assistance of the Police in accomplishing this, and shall inform the Police of any conduct likely to cause a breach of the peace.

(i) NUISANCE

No public music, dancing or entertainment of a like kind shall be permitted or suffered to take place in the place licensed which shall be a nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience to any occupant of the premises in which the place licensed is situate or to any occupant of any other premises.

(j) EMERGENCY TELEPHONES

If no telephone service is available in the place licensed there shall be displayed in a conspicuous place a notice giving particulars of the nearest telephone available in an emergency and details of how to summon the emergency services. Any outbreak of fire must, immediately on its discovery, be reported to the Fire Authority.

(k) FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

All fire fighting equipment provided in the place licensed shall be examined at least once annually. In particular portable fire extinguishers shall be so examined and tested by a competent person in accordance with British Standard Code of Practice 5306; Part 3, 1980. The date of such test shall be clearly marked on the extinguisher or on stout tabs attached thereto. The licensee shall produce, if required by the Licensing Authority a certificate stating that all fire fighting equipment has been so examined and tested.

(I) INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS

- (i) Highly inflammable material must not be used in connection with any public entertainment provided in the place licensed unless it has been rendered fir retardant to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and is maintained in that condition. No naked flame shall be used in connection with any public entertainment provided in the place licensed except with the specific written consent of the Licensing Authority, and subject to any conditions attached to such consent.

 - (ii) Any alterations or additions, whether permanent or temporary, to the electrical installations in the place licensed shall only be carried out by a competent and qualified electrician, and shall be in accordance with the Regulations for Electrical Equipment in Buildings (Institution of Electrical Engineers).
- (iii) all electrical switches in connection with the lighting or hearing of the place licensed shall be guarded or out of reach of persons resorting to the place licensed.

(n) CONSTRUCTION

(i) Wall and Ceiling Linings, Insulation, Treatment, etc. - Any material used as a wall or ceiling lining, or as a suspended ceiling, or for acoustic or thermal insulation purposes shall be to the Licensing Authority's satisfaction and shall be fixed and supported in such manner as may be approved by the Licensing Authority.

Note: For the purpose of this condition the Licensing Authority will normally require such material to be non-combustible or be rated Class 1 of the classification for surface spread of flame when tested in accordance with the appropriate provisions of B.S. 476; Part 7, 1971, and be throughout its thickness of no greater flammability than its surface. Certain other materials may, however, be accepted, subject to compliance with such conditions as the Licensing Authority may consider appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

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(ii) Decorative Features and Finishings - Any fixed or permanent decorative feature shall be of such materials as would be permitted for wall or ceiling linings. Any decorative surface finishing, including any fabric, shall be either non-combustible, inherently non-flammable or durably flameproof except that wallpaper and similar thin surface finishing may be accepted provided that it is fixed firmly with an adhesive approved by the Licensing Authority.

Seating, tables and chairs and other furniture and fittings in the place licensed shall be so arranged as to allow free and ready access to the exits.

- (i) Provision All parts of the place licensed shall be provided with adequate means of illumination and, except where otherwise permitted in writing by the Licensing Authority, those parts to which the public have access and all routes of escape for performers or staff shall be provided with adequate means of illumination from two independent sources.
 - (ii) Standard of Illumination The illumination from each source shall be sufficient to enable the public, performers and staff to see their way out of the place licensed in safety at any time, and shall not be derived from prepayment meters.



On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I am writing to lodge a representation of the above application on the following grounds:

- The prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2) Public Safety
- 3) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The police have concerns over the application. These concerns are outlined below:

On 20th April, 2015 representation to vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Shooting Star, Bevois Valley, Southampton. This application identified that they would submit a last entry of 0200hrs on Friday and Saturday evenings. The venues immediately surrounding this applicant have alcohol sales predominately to 0200hrs. A dispersal policy has also been mentioned but no evidence of how this will be managed has been included within this application.

Should the opening hours of the venue be extended from 0200hrs to 0330hrs with alcohol sales also being extended to 0300hrs on both Friday and Saturday nights as a new condition, it is believed that this would undermine the Cumulative Impact Policy, the Premise Licence and the Crime Prevention objectives.

This premises is located within a residential area of Southampton and is subject to the Councils cumulative impact area policy as detailed in the present Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-2014, issued by Southampton City Council as the licensing authority.

The area of concern in this particular case is the Bevois Valley Area, which based on evidence previously received by Southampton City Council is one of 3 areas that already suffers from the cumulative impact created by the night time economy venues. As a result it is appropriate, proportionate and necessary for special policies to address that issue.

The DCMS guidelines state that the effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licenses or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can



demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives".

As per paragraph 16.7 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, Hampshire police make representations on the basis that although this venue is currently operating in this stress area the applicant is applying for licensing activities until 03:30 hours Friday and Saturdays.

The applicant already has conditions on their licence to assist with promoting the four licensing objectives, however the police do not consider that any number of conditions could prevent this premises from adding to the cumulative impact already experienced in the area.

Bevois Valley has a number of late night venues in close proximity to each other. All of which fall under the umbrella of the CIP. The venues within the CIP area have opening hours which all apart from one does not exceed 0230hrs. The only venue in the CIP exceeding to 0345hrs is approx 100yds away from the applicant's venue. These licences have been in existence for some time and were issued long before cumulative impact was recognised and introduced.

The police suggest that there is already a very wide selection of late night venues for late night revellers to choose from without the need for another with extended hours. This application is for a similar venue not a different product so it doesn't offer more choice.

Venues open to this time encourage people to hang around in the area, when from a public interest and policing aspect we want them to go home. Their customers have the opportunity to consume alcohol over a considerable amount of hours, which can make them more susceptible to becoming involved in disorder. Flashpoints can often occur in these venues between drunken groups of people in which staff may struggle to control. This has led to premises in the area having to employ door staff, the applicant being one such premises.

The following information presents relevant data on crime reports taken in the Bevois Valley Road/Onslow Road area of Southampton during the Night time economy period from 1/4/14 to 31/3/15. This Information demonstrates the impact of extended hours. This does includes a venue albeit outside of the CIP, but is relevant to demonstrate how crime has increased around this area.

Overall there were 2224 reports received by Police for the Bevois Valley/Onslow Road area during the year, of which 1884 were occurrences types which could be associated with the night time economy. Of these, 190 occurrences were confirmed as linked to the NTE.

- The most common occurrence types linked to the NTE in the Bevois Valley area were assaults, anti-social behaviour (ASB), public order, criminal damage and drugs offences.
- There appears to be a general problem in the area with assaults, ASB and criminal damage regardless of the NTE.



 It appears that the NTE contributes particularly to assaults, public order, drug offences and robberies.

Assault: 49% of NTE reports

- Assaults were the most reported occurrence type related to the NTE.
- There were 92 assaults linked to the NTE, 1 of which was an assault on police.
- Around half of these resulted in injury.
- Assault was a general problem in this area, with NTE related assaults accounting for 25% of all assaults reported in the Bevois Valley area during the year.

ASB: 14% of NTE reports

- ASB was the second most frequently reported occurrence type relating to the NTE.
- There were 27 reports of ASB linked to the NTE.
- 63% of the NTE related ASB occurrences related to rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, 22% to street drinking.
- ASB was the most commonly reported non-NTE problem in the area and NTE related ASB accounted for only 6% of the total ASB reports.

Public Order: 7% of NTE reports

- There were 14 public order offences relating to the NTE during the time period.
- The NTE reports accounted for 20% of the total public order reports for the area, although the total number of reports for the area was relatively low compared to other offences.

Criminal Damage: 5% of NTE reports

- There were 10 reports of criminal damage associated with the NTE.
- Criminal damage was the fourth most common non-NTE issue in the area
- 7% of all criminal damage reports related to the NTE.

Drug Offences: 5% of NTE reports

- There were 10 drug offences related to the NTE.
- The NTE offences account for 11% of the total drug offences in the area.
- Drug offences account for only 4% of the total occurrences in the area.

Other Issues

- There were 8 personal robberies linked to the NTE in the area, which was only 4% of the total occurrences linked to the NTE. However, the NTE robberies accounted for 57% of all personal robberies in the area so appear to be a problem specifically affected by the NTE.
- Theft offences were the third highest reported occurrence type in the area, but there
 was only 1 linked to the NTE so this does not appear to be affected by the NTE.
- There was 1 report linked to the NTE each for rape, sex offender offences and indecent assault, less than 1% of all NTE occurrences each.



Offence locations: The roads in the Bevois Valley area with the highest number of occurrences were St. Marys Road, Bevois Valley Road and Onslow Road.

Premises A, St. Marys Road

- This was the premises with by far the highest number of NTE related occurrences, accounting for 61% of the NTE occurrences on St. Marys Road, and 23% of the total NTE occurrences in the Bevois Valley area.
- The occurrences were primarily assaults (14 with injury) but there have also been drug offences, ASB, criminal damage and a mixture of others including public order and a robbery.
- There were 27 other occurrences at this location during the year which were not linked to the NTE bus/org, primarily theft offences as well as more ASB, vehicle related offences and violence.
- Premises A has a licence to sell alcohol until 0500hrs on most days. The extended opening time may account for the higher number of occurrences, as people may go there later after they have consumed alcohol elsewhere and other clubs have started to shut.

Of the 190 occurrences, 169 were reported during the night time economy times (7pm to 7am) and 21 were reported later on in the day relating to a previous night.

Analysis has shown that:

- Reports began to rise at around 1900hrs with a peak between 0200hrs and 0300hrs.
- Over half of all the reports were received during the 3 hour period between 0100hrs and 0400hrs. This is likely to coincide with when the highest numbers of people are out in the area, with a high proportion of them intoxicated from earlier drinking.
- Saturdays and Sundays generally saw the highest number of reports during the week, in the early hours of the morning.



The graphs attached as Annex A shows the risk associated with different times and days based on the occurrence start and end times for all the NTE related occurrences. They clearly show the peak in risk at around 0200-0300hrs and on Saturdays and Sundays.

The applicant on this occasion is a venue located on a very busy main road within the cumulative impact area. The location of this venue is a short distance away from a main junction which leads directly onto Thomas Lewis Way dual carriageway (A335). It is also located along a main road which is already saturated with night time economy venues including other night clubs, public houses, and food outlets including several takeaways.

The next graph Annex B shows the total number of Licensed Premises operating within the CIP area of Bevois Valley.

Annex C attached shows just exactly how many of these competitive venues are in proximity to each other as well as accentuating the dangerous road this venue leads directly onto, albeit for a small pavement in front of the venues.

To summarise the above, the Police object to this application because:

- The venue is situated within a CIP area for which there is a rebuttable presumption that applications in these areas will be refused.
- The applicant has not demonstrated or produced an application adequate enough to show how it will not add to the cumulative impact already experienced in that area or how it will not undermine the licensing objectives. The onus is on the applicant to do so.
- The venue is not offering any variety to what it already does or what is readily available in that area. This is a simple an extension of its current service hours.
- Other venues within the same cumulative impact area have previously submitted similar applications and have been refused. Should this application be authorised then more applications can be expected and in turn this will further impact on the cumulative impact and subsequently undermine the licensing objectives
- This area within a large residential neighbourhood is already saturated with night time economy establishments.

The police make this representation based upon the effects of cumulative impact within the area. Therefore, after taking into consideration all of the above information, the police are of the opinion that this application, if granted, has the potential to give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. Any venue increasing its hours in this area has the potential to increase incidents in the vicinity and particularly around the times of closing.








