## Southampton City Council Consultation on 2012/13 grants to voluntary organisations

## Consultation dates: 11th August to 6th October 2011

This consultation is about proposed changes to the council's grants to voluntary organisations for 2012/13 and beyond as detailed in the 2012/13 Grants to Voluntary Organisations report to Cabinet on 1st August 2011. There are 4 sections:

- -- Options for 2012/13 grants to voluntary organisations
- -- Future application process for open, competitive grant schemes
- -- Grants website
- -- Your organisation

The following questions do not apply to the council's small grants scheme, Community Chest (it is currently planned to continue allocating this in 2 rounds per year) or to grants awarded on two year funding agreements.

## Options for 2012/13 grants to voluntary organisations

Applications from voluntary organisations for council grants always far exceed the available budget. However, the need to make unprecedented budget savings in 2011/12 exacerbated this situation with applications totalling £3,535,443, nearly double the available budget of £1,907,300. Following impact assessments, some grants were discontinued or significantly reduced and no new grants were awarded.

On 1st August 2011, Cabinet agreed that the 2012/13 grants to voluntary organisations budget should remain at £1,907,300 and approved consultation on how the grants should be awarded. There are 2 options that we are now consulting on:

# Option 1 - renew 2011/12 grants at current levels, excluding any paid notice, for a further year to 31st March 2013 subject to satisfactory monitoring

This means that existing grants would be renewed for 1 year, subject to recipients completing a simplified application form updating their targets and financial information, submitting their latest accounts and meeting all 2011/12 grant monitoring requirements.

Pros

- stable funding for another year for the work of existing grant recipients at a time of reduced funding both locally and nationally

- potential new applicants clear about the availability of funding

- both existing grant recipients and potential new applicants will know where they stand by the end of October and can plan for the 2012/13 financial year accordingly

Cons

- no new applications

- no possibility for existing recipients to receive increased grants

#### Option 2 - open, competitive grants scheme

This means a standard grants application process, open to any voluntary organisation that wishes to apply. An open, competitive scheme would open for applications in mid October 2011, with the grant awards being decided by the council's Cabinet in March 2012.

Pros

- open to all applicants

#### Cons


- no additional funding available

- creates instability for existing recipients as new grants could only be made by reducing existing grants

- decision on grant awards not made until March 2012

#### Future application process for open, competitive grant schemes

A long standing criticism of the grants process is that decisions are made in March each year (after Budget setting in February) leaving organisations very little time to plan and budget for the new financial year. We are therefore taking the opportunity to consult on changing the time frame.

We are considering bringing forward the grants Cabinet decision date to either December or January. Grants would be provisional, subject to council Budget setting in February. This would mean the closing date for grants would be in early or mid September. Please note - we are aware organisations may not have their accounts signed off by September and accept that some will need to submit their accounts after the closing date.

#### Shortening the application period

We currently open the Running Costs and New Projects Funds for applications 12 weeks before the closing date. However, in the last three years only 4% of applications were submitted more than one month before the deadline and 82% were submitted in the last week. We are aware that applications may be written and checked by several people in an organisation and may need to be approved by management committees before being submitted, but we feel that the above statistics show we could shorten the application period while still allowing sufficient time for applicants to complete the forms.
