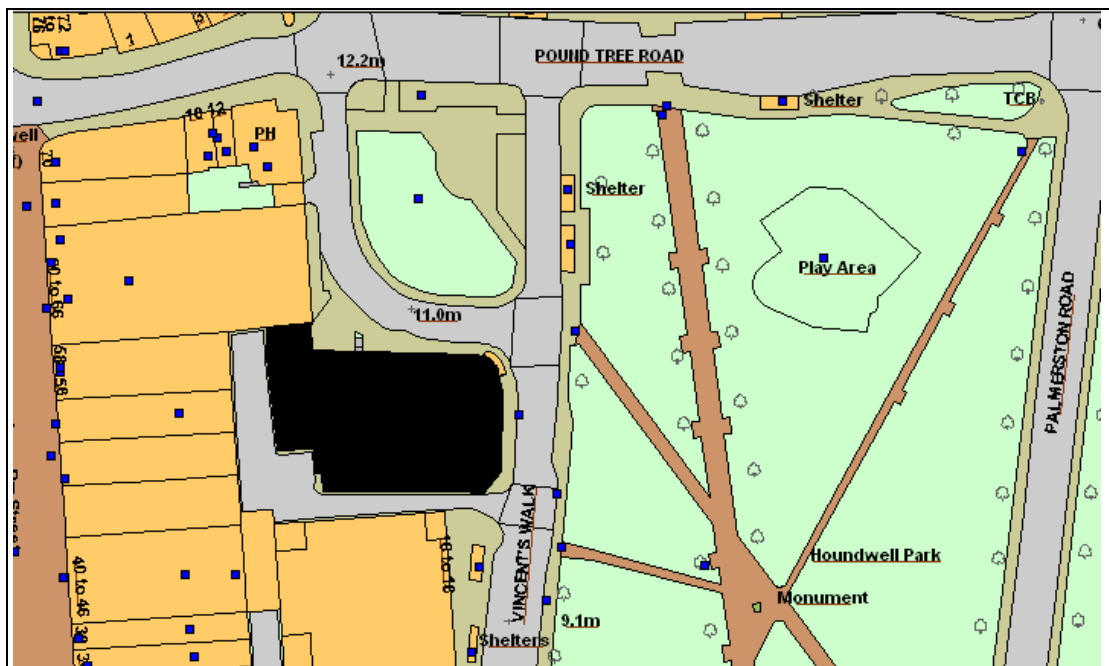

Legal Implications

1. Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that a responsible authority of a resident or business in the vicinity (interested party) may apply for review of a premises licence.
2. The grounds of review applications must relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.
3. In such circumstances, the applicant for the review must serve a copy of the review application on the holder of the premises licences, the City Council and each of the responsible authorities.
4. On receipt of the application for review, the officers will consider its validity, under delegated powers. Reasons for rejection, in whole or in part, include:
 - that the grounds for review are not relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives and;
 - (in the case of an application not made by a responsible authority), that the application is frivolous, vexatious or repetitious.
5. The City Council must, within one day of receiving the application for review, display a prescribed notice of the review application on the outside or adjacent the premises; the notice must remain on display for 28 days and any interested party in the vicinity or the responsible authorities may make representations in that period.
6. Unless the applicant, licence holder, interested parties and responsible authorities agree that a hearing is unnecessary, the City Council is then required to hold a hearing to consider the review.
7. The sub-committee, in considering the application for review, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and evidence before it at the hearing.
8. The Licensing Act 2003 provides that, in determining an application for review, the sub-committee may take any (or none) of the following steps, as it considers necessary:
 - modify the conditions of the licence;
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - revoke the licence.
9. The Licensing Act 2003 makes provision for appeal to the Southampton Magistrates' Court against the sub-committee's decision in relation to an application for review.
10. In considering this application the sub-committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the sub-committee must make its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.
11. Copies of the application for review and the Police objection are annexed to this report.
12. The sub-committee must also have regard to:-
13. *Crime and Disorder Act 1998*

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

14. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matters set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

Dear Sir,

On behalf of Hampshire Constabulary, I submit the following application for CHILLIWHITE, VINCENT WALK, SOUTHAMPTON in order to review their license. In our opinion since its last review it has continued to have repeated problems occurring for similar reason and that it is therefore not support the licensing objectives. The review is brought to uphold all of the licensing objectives.

The premise in question is situated in a cumulative impact zone, which you, as the council have recognised and implemented into your policy. The cumulative impact policy was introduced by you because of the key findings and recommendations of a police report. This report identified that there were three areas in which there is a record of violent offending that is disproportionately high in terms of the city as a whole. It identified the following-

- The peak times for violence are in keeping with peak times for the night-time economy
- Each of these locations record an above average level of offences flagged as having been influenced by alcohol.
- In terms of offences where a premise is directly involved, all three locations record multiple offences.
- The overall trend with regard to these offences is either steady or upward.

Following this report, Southampton City Council took the responsible action of implementing a policy covering the three areas of concern to be used as a tool to control violent crime and alcohol related offending. As I am sure your aware your own statement of licensing policy states that under the Licensing Act 2003 you have a duty to promote the four licensing objectives which are-

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety

- The prevention of public nuisance and
- The protection of children from harm

Further to this, Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 imposes an obligation on every police authority and local authority to do all that it can to reasonable prevent --

- crime and disorder in its area including anti-social and other behaviour adversely affecting the local environment; and
- the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances in its area.

Therefore, I submit this application to review the licence of "Chilliwhite".

This review is brought by Hampshire Constabulary as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003, because of the number of incidents at the premises and the number of drunk persons, which impact on the licensing objectives.

On the basis of the evidence outlined below, Hampshire Constabulary would wish to achieve the following:

1. The DPS and duty manager should hold a nationally recognised Level 2 DPS course
2. ID scanner to Challenge 25 policy
3. Barstaff should be trained to a personal licence holder level
4. Club Nanny
5. Toilet Checks
6. Staff Training records
7. Reduction in hours on sale of alcohol

In summary, the Police evidence to support these points is as follows:-

The premises are being taken to review due to the number of drunks leaving the premises and the number of incidents that have occurred at the premises. There have been repeated meetings with DPS and the area manager to address concerns and these meetings are all detailed in letters. In July the number of incidents and the level of incidents were so concerning that Senior Officers were looking at their powers of closure, action was not taken as the premises became very strict on entry policy and the number of incidents reduced. The premises then closed for refurbishment and rebranding and on opening again within a couple of weeks had repeated the problems raised as concerns previously.

The concerns about drunkenness have been addressed with the premises, as far back as the 31/03/10 PS Marshman explained to the area manager that "the number of people staggering, vomiting and causing public order issues was of concern... I explained that nearly 90% of the time I visited the venue there was someone either staggering about and being sick." This highlights the concerns under public safety, public nuisance and crime and disorder. A meeting took place on the 20th July 2010 as no improvement had occurred and this resulting in the premises providing police with a proposed plan to address the drunkenness on the 26th August 2010. The plan included 15 minute checks of the toilets, a club nanny and that "99p drinks is now only 6 products.. this is down from 70 products we

offered 2 months ago. On 99p drink nights we have limited the amount of drinks that each person can buy to 4 per person... when vulnerable females are found in and around the club the utmost care is taken to make sure that they are not left alone or taken home by a stranger..”

Although the policy had been put into place it was either ineffective or was stopped being used as on the 12th December 2010 a female who left the premises drunk was raped on the way home. In the victim interview she stated that throughout the night she had drunk 11 drinks including double southern comfort and Jaeger Bombs and put herself at a 9 on a scale of 1-10 of drunkenness with 1 being sober and 10 being collapsed. This is a serious concern under public safety and crime and disorder.

Another example of a concern under public safety is a drunk male seen on the premises CCTV on the 9th January 2011 being carried out of the club because he is so drunk that he is unable to walk. These concerns were discussed at meetings detailed in the letter dated the 9th February 2011. During the meetings the DPS stated that he had considered the drinks pricing and thinking of raising the prices as their current promotions at an event called “juiced” were “50p shots, £1 drinks, £1.50 spirits and mixers, £2 doubles all night” The change in drinks pricing did not last very long as on the 21st April 2011 a check on Facebook showed that the premises were advertising that “This week we have opened our doors to you locals so you can benefit from our LUDICROUS drinks deals” Then on the 1st July 2011 the “juiced” drinks promotions were advertised again but this time with the slogan “The cheapest drinks in Southampton... this is JUICED..F*ck staying in...F*ck overpriced drinks...F*ck being ANYWHERE else.. JUICED @ BLISS is taking over YOUR Friday nights... don't get stung paying more than you have to... it's the weekend £1 Drinks (selected), 50p Shots – for ALL” The promoter was also offering 99p drinks on student nights. This shows a lack of responsibility by the DPS in addressing the issues and this wording does not support the licensing objectives.

A manager was brought in at the beginning of July 2011 to take over from the DPS and this drinks pricing was discussed with him along with the concerns about the number of incidents at the premises and the drunkenness of customers leaving the premises. This proposed DPS stated that the staff needed to improve vigilance on drunks on the premises.

The premises closed for the refurbishment and rebranding and having re-opened the problems of drunkenness continued as seen in the statement by PC Gibson in relation to the 1st October 2011. “I witnessed a extremely drunk female exit the club and collapse on the floor, one of the doormen approached her picked her up and put her on one of the benches... then left her alone. ...the female had fallen off the bench and was collapsed on the floor” The officer can evidence that “This female I spoke to earlier in the evening... she appeared sober to me” The officer also details that she saw a male picked up by the doorstaff and put on the same bench as the female and that “This male was completely unresponsive and was throwing up” She states that the “drunk males friend informed me that his friend had just drunk too much and had just left Chilliwite”. On Body Worn Video footage the friends of this male tell officers that they had been in Chilliwites all night. There is also Body Worn Video of the female being spoken to by officers and she is clearly drunk, repeating herself and unable to follow conversation.

The drinks promotions still continue as the promoter for the premises has contacted PS Marshman to ask guidance on the licensing law and whether if as part of a Halloween event on the weekend of the 28th-29th October 2011 they could provide free shots to customers on entry as they wished to remain competitive with other premises.

The drunks are a concern under public safety and public nuisance and as some end up as victims or perpetrators of crime also under crime and disorder licensing objectives. It is felt that although there is training for the staff that this is not translating into a decline in the number or severity of drunkenness. It is felt that if staff selling alcohol were trained to personal licence holder level then this additional knowledge would increase responsibility and reduce the sales to drunks. To assist in identifying, removing and caring for drunks it is suggested that a specified member of staff be allocated or employed to work within the premises. The role would be to take find and remove drunk and then ensure that those found to have had too much to drink by providing them with water, placing them somewhere safe and ensuring that their friends are found or that they can get transport home. This role could also incorporate the thirty minute toilet checks suggested. The reduction in hours is put forward to reduce the hours that customers are able to drink in.

There is also concern about the number of incidents that occur at the premise. On the 2nd October which was the Saturday of a pay day weekend there were four fights with at least four injuries caused during it. The proposed DPS had left early and there was one incident after another and no management of the situations or staff. In the statement of PC Prior it details the poor management that "there was no management at the premises; the person in charge was unaware of what had happened where and then confused the matter in trying to explain to officers. The female injured during the incident was drunk, the males had clearly been drinking as they were argumentative, repetitive and not listening to what was being explained which made them difficult to deal with". When the number of incidents and injuries was addressed at a meeting, on the 7th October 2011 with the proposed DPS and area manager, the area manager did not feel that this level of incidents was concerning stating that they had had 9000 people through the premise throughout the week so that amount of incidents is a one off. The concern raised is that it is not a one off as this level of incidents in one night has occurred before on the 25-26 June 2011 where there were at least five incidents where seven people in total were injured. PC Buckingham and PC Campbell have provided statements in relation to their attendance on those nights. PC Buckingham describes what he had to deal with and states "I witnessed several incidents of low level public order by Bliss customers. These were all dealt with by police officers, who for a period of forty five minutes, were unable to leave the area due to the potential for escalating public order offences... Everyone I spoke to... had come from Bliss and were drunk... In my opinion, Staff inside of Bliss must have been serving alcohol to intoxicated people in order for the customers to be so drunk whilst outside of the premises... staff couldn't have had a grip on things"

There is a continued problem with staff dealing with situations as PC Spencer provides a statement that on the 3rd July he was outside the premise when he became aware that someone was injured inside. PC Spencer states "I asked 'what had happened' and a member of staff said 'he has fallen over' without hesitation then one of the aggrieveds friends said 'no he hasn't, he was assaulted'... it was unknown where the offender had gone" Later the club were able to provide the details of the offender as the male was someone that they had ejected on a previous occasion for fighting. When this was raised with the proposed DPS he stated that they would start a banned list and make sure people involved in previous incidents are not allowed in again. This shows that the premises were not being diligent about who is being let into the premises.

These incidents all raise concerns under crime and disorder, public safety and public

nuisance. The ID scanner has been used in other premises across the city to greatly reduce the number of incidents and when people have been involved in incidents the doorstaff can pull them up on the scanner and immediately ban them. The level 2 DPS course is requested for both the DPS and any duty manager that will be left in charge when the DPS is not on site as the management in the DPS's absence is repeatedly poor. This is evidenced as the DPS was not present when PC Buckingham and PC Prior found they were dealing with incident after incident at the premises.

There are also incidents that occur away from the premises which have initially started in the premises. An example of this is where three males were arrested for a serious assault on another male on the 25th October 2011. Two groups had been in Chilliwites and whilst on the dance floor a male from one group had bumped into a male from the other group and was pushed away. When outside the male pushed grabbed the other male but the doorstaff intervened and although one male told them he was being attacked the doorstaff told them all to go. The two groups left but met up again and started to fight and one male was left with serious injuries. One suspect interviewed stated that his friend who caused the injury "gets out of control when drunk" and that he himself would not have acted in that way he did if he was sober putting himself at 8 on a scale of 1-10 of drunkenness when 1 is sober and 10 is collapsed. The officer arresting one of the other males involved describes that when the male was arrested he "spoke quickly and with slurred speech and did not really make much sense with what he was saying. He smelt of intoxicating liquor and I believe he was drunk"

In a separate incident on the 25th October 2011 there was another large scale fight called in by CCTV regarding two groups of males where there was a male lying unconscious on the floor. On police arrival only the group with the injured male remained and they stated that they had left Chilliwites and had been attacked by another group but did not wish to make a complaint. On conducting CCTV enquiries it was established that the group with the injured friend had been fully involved in the fight and that a male from the other group was knocked to the ground unconscious first. These incidents are a huge concerns under the crime and disorder and public safety and although did not happen inside the premise are resultant from either incidents at the premises or the behaviour of the cliental from the premises.

There has been concern under the protection of children from harm when on the 28th January 2011 a 16 year old was found to be on the premise; he had managed to get in with someone else's ID. He looked extremely young and the picture on the ID looked nothing like him so had not been checked properly.

A new DPS took over the premise at the beginning of July but this has not changed the problems at the premise nor has the refurbishment and rebranding. The police have repeatedly raised issues in connection with drunks, assaults and public order incidents and the premise still continue to offer drinks deals and the incidents are still occurring and it is felt that the licensing objectives are not being supported.

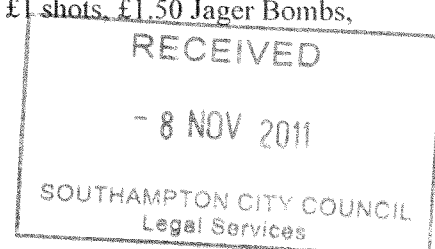

Suggested wording of conditions requested

ID SCANNER

ID scan equipment to be provided and maintained at all times. This must be in operation during licensable activities and all persons id to be scanned upon entry. Accepted forms of identification will be passport, photo driving licence, or Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS).

If a fault develops with the ID scan during operating hours, police must be notified immediately and a written record must be retained of customers ID. The fault will be rectified within one day or a replacement ID scan will need to be loaned in its place.

In all other circumstances of a breakdown, police must be notified immediately and the fault rectified within 1 day or a replacement ID scan will need to be loaned in its place.

Training

The DPS and duty manager should complete a nationally recognised **Level 2** DPS course

All staff who sell alcohol will be trained to APLH (EDI Level 2 Award for Personal License Holders) level. All sales of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by a personal licence holder until such staff have achieved training to APLH level.

Staff are trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18; signs and symptoms of drunk persons, refusal of sale due to intoxication and that records are kept of such training, which are signed and dated by the member of staff who has received the training; that staff receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and that records are signed and dated by the member of staff are kept of this refresher training. Records will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and the licensing Authority. Records will be kept for a minimum period of two years.

Club Nanny

The manager of the premises will ensure that an employee of the business will monitor persons in the premises and identify those who are drunk. The bar should also be monitored for anyone mixing multiple shots or measures together to ensure responsible alcohol consumption. Those found drunk or participating in irresponsible alcohol consumption will be asked to leave the premises. A record will be maintained to show who the nominated employee is each night and what they have dealt with, which will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and the Licensing Authority.

Toilet Checks

The public toilets within the premise shall be checked every 30 minutes when the premises are open for a licensable activity. A record shall be kept by the premise and presented on request by Hampshire constabulary. Toilet check records shall be kept for a minimum period of 3 months.

I then looked round and saw the female had fallen off the bench and was collapsed on the floor again, I went over to assist her and brought her back to her feet, her boyfriend then came over and helped her up. With another PC who had body worn video on, I then asked her where she had been tonight and how much she had drunk; she replied she had only been to Chilli Whites and she was far too drunk and shouldn't have been served any more alcohol. I then went over to check on the male again who now needed medical assistance. The paramedic came out and informed me that he was ok just very intoxicated due to too much alcohol. I was shocked by the lack of help from Chilli Whites and that the bouncer just left both the male and the female on the benches. I informed the manager and explained the situation and that both the male and female had both just exited from Chilli Whites. Wanted to make you aware. PC 25519 Jenny Gibson

Meeting at premise a month after meeting due to problems 05/08/2011 15:03 PC Lindley and I met with [REDACTED] at the premise as it has been a month since our last meeting Incident Mapping - [REDACTED] showed us the incident mapping and this is being utilised though they have only had one incident since our last meeting, it also includes slips and trips. All incidents that occur will be reported to the police. Assault outside 31/07/11 0200-0205, incident book seen and states that doorstaff heard noise at side of premise and saw male and female walk off and aggrieved informed them he had been having a cigarette and got punched. They checked the camera footage and have put details of it in the incident book. [REDACTED] stated that they had looked and the suspect had not come out of the premise, I challenged that stating the aggrieved before being punched had been told he was dancing with the suspects girlfriend in the premise earlier. Doorstaff - [REDACTED] showed us file of monthly SIA checks. He also stated that he had strengthened up the door and made sure they were strict on entries and more vigilant about preventing things in the premise. Advised that when I'd attended I had seen him directing the doorstaff and really the doorstaff needs to be making the decision as otherwise when he is not there then there could be problems with the wrong people let in. [REDACTED] said that it was part of training them and that actually he stepped back and watched some of the time and then asked them why they'd made the decision they had. He said he was also training them to be clear about saying "I think your drunk so your not coming in tonight" so that people could argue but that it was not saying "your drunk" but an opinion "I think your drunk". One doorstaff refused a drunk male due to his clothes and the male went home got changed and came back so then was told he was too drunk. He is clear he will be handing decisions over to them completely as soon as possible. Banned persons - On the door they are also giving males entering a little chat on the way in to say that if there is any trouble then they would be ejected and banned for six months. They have been back through the incident book and got 7-8 people on that banned list. They don't always have suspects names and I explained that if they issued a yellow card they would and if they had problem getting details they could request officers. Smoking area - I asked about the reason the smoking area had moved and he said it hadn't but for earlier evening trade they were opening up the top area as it means keeping the second room shut until later. Drunks -

advised to be vigilant as PS Marshman had seen drunk in the premise and pointed out and was ejected. CCTV - System checks, █████ stated that they had had a software updated to solve the download problem. Meeting at premise 4/07/11 with myself, █████ the new DPS, █████ assistant manager, and Licensing Manager from the company █████ Steve stated that he officially started last Monday and was at the premise on Friday but not Saturday and officially starts the weekends this weekend. I explained that there had been previous problems at the premise and gave Steve the last letter to the premise. I then explained that at the last meeting on 31st March 2011 things appeared to have greatly improved. That since that meeting there has been some good work with drugs found by doorstaff. █████ explained that they do still do random searches but hadn't found anything recently except a female with alcohol in her bag who was refused entry. I asked █████ if he was familiar with the conditions of the licence as there were quite a few put on after the last review. He said that he had been through it twice already but will be referring back to it to make sure that he is fully up on what the conditions are. Incidents - all the incidents (listed below) were gone through with the incident book, only one incident - the 4 ejected males on the 18/06/11 was not listed in the logs. █████ has said that will be addressed. █████ has clearly been managing the incident book and anyone involved in the incident put in an incident log. On looking through the log she is also puts

in there about females who are sick through drink and what they do to ensure their safe journey home. I explained that the number of incidents at the premise in the last three weeks has shot up and are all assaults in the premise or person who have left the premise fighting. ██████ said that he had already spoken to the head doorman about tightening the door. That the numbers coming into the premise on a Saturday night at the moment were quite low, only about 300, I pointed out that if the numbers were low then the doorstaff should be better able to see where the problems are starting. With regards to entry at the premise ██████ did say that considering one incident the suspect was recognised as a male involved in an incident in May that he was going to have a list on the door of people banned from the premise. ██████ stated that he wanted to address the doorstaff situation and make sure that they were not letting undesirable persons into the premise (he used the term 'pikeys'). In addition to the door policy he was going to start doing crime mapping to ensure that the doorstaff inside were in the right places. That also there would be a 'shake up' of the doorstaff inside to be more observant. Whilst on the subject of doorstaff I asked him to make sure they were all wearing their SIA badge as I had attended once and they weren't. I also explained that PS Marshman had not been impressed with the doorstaff dispersal of customers at the end of the night; as they were not actively doing it and not particularly happy when advised to do so. ██████ said that she agreed Friday night was not great but that they were much better on Saturday night. PS Marshman had asked the doorstaff at the weekend what the capacity of the premise was and they were unable to tell him, I pointed out that this is quite serious as the doorstaff have the clickers and manage the numbers in the premise. ██████ said that the doorstaff had been spoken to about that and about the SIA badges and it would not happen again. Drinks promotions when then discussed, I initially asked ██████ what drinks promotions he planned to have and he said that he had not been here long enough to make that decision. I asked about the 99p drinks promotion and ██████ said that was only two drinks, not particularly popular ones and until 2330 hours and was something the previous management put in place. I explained that this is not how it appeared on facebook which just stated 99p drinks which may therefore be attracting the wrong crowd. I also pointed out that a previous promotion advertised on there said "benefit from our ludicrous drinks deals" and ██████ asked ██████ to send an e-mail to the promoters about that type of language. I clearly explained that he had to make sure that he knew what the promoters were advertising on his behalf and to make sure that it was not irresponsible. I said that persons involved in the incident were clearly very drunk and that other drunk persons are evidenced in their incident book and that there needs to be more vigilance by doorstaff and bar staff to get people refused and ejected before they become a problem. I said that we were told that 'juiced' nights were not back until 30th September when the students were back and ██████ said that he thinks that will start again on the 23rd September. I asked if any other themed events were coming up. ██████ said that from this Saturday they were having 'festival' nights where the music will be based on the festivals happening around the same time. That it is more of an entertainment night and got away from some of the more problematic music styles. ██████ asked about a comment made about the premise being close to review, I explained that on the number of incidents, in particular there were 7 people assaulted in one night that if it continues then we will be going back to review. I said that I would have a meeting with them in one month and expect a great reduction in the problems. That if we were going to go to review we would want to address the problems with the client and would requested an ID scanner to do this. PC 20920 PRIOR

02/07/2011 19:55 Friday 1/7/11 very quiet- there was a racial assault. ██████ said that ██████ had been removed for being useless?? ██████ was present for some of the night- and they said the drinks promotion 99p drinks was until 2300 hours. ██████ said that it was only tonight and ██████ had arranged it. I explained they were on the cusp of being reviewed and PC Prior was looking indepth to see what incidents had occurred. I asked why they thought they had had a sudden spate of assaults. ██████ didn't know and ██████ was vague but assured me they would resolve it. I advised I thought it was down to the poor clientelle they were letting in. I then spoke to the head doorman ██████ the same question. He said it was because the students had gone home and now they were letting in the old crowd again. I think this is very honest and probably the reason. CCTV of the main dance floor wasn't fantastic(which was surprising). The dispersal was poor and it wasn't until I actually mentioned it did some door staff start to do this but their hearts weren't in it. This is on BWV. License meeting with DPS, licensing manager and area manager 31/03/2011 16:16 Meeting held at Bliss, informed that there have been very few incidents since our last meeting which is a vast improvement on January figures. I explained that a couple of officers have commented on how busy they were but there had not been the level of comments about drunk people that there had been previously. I did say that they had numerous thefts on the 26/27 which they were understandably unaware of as they had been reported later to us. [REDACTED] was asked what he had done to improve things. He stated that that he had had new staff join and that he has concentrated on training them. He also feels that by employing [REDACTED] to assist him he has been freed up to monitor the staff especially on the bar to make sure that they are using common sense. An example he used was that if two people came to the bar and order 10 shots the staff needed to ascertain how many people those shots were for. There has also been additional doorstaff and [REDACTED] has stated that he has asked these to concentrate more on the people stumbling and showing signs of being too drunk. The area manager made it clear that the footfall was the same as previous months. This highlights to me that it is not about how many people are in a premise but how it is managed. I asked about current drinks pricing and [REDACTED] explained that he is still frustrated at telling promoters to update their material as they are not operating under same sale prices. The area manager explained that they drop their prices to react to competition at other premises and will continue to do that. I asked [REDACTED] about specific changes to drinks that he had mentioned before and he explained that some of their promotional drinks, for example a wild bucket, previously was a vodka based drink and now he had changed the vodka for Shotz which is 13-14% and therefore less than half as alcoholic. It also has the added bonus of costing them less and therefore increasing their profit margin. He has also changed from Jager-bombs to J-bombs, this uses a similar drink but is 20% rather than 37%. I said that I approved of these changes as I feel that people come out to drink as much as their money allow and that if the alcohol given to them isn't as strong then they cannot get as drunk on the same amount. They said that they are considering an application to extend their hours as they do not feel that 0200 hours is that late particularly for a city centre and not in line with other premises in the area. I said that they had a later licence than most and that there were only a handful later than them. [REDACTED] listed [REDACTED] as 0300 and [REDACTED] as 0400 at which point I explained that [REDACTED] are only licensed on alcohol until 0300 so have an hour wind down. [REDACTED] himself pointed out that 'another venue' with a late licence has been to review twice and I suggested not to focus on being like that and that [REDACTED]. I explained that in relation to their extension we would object as they are in the CIP, that it is the city council who set that so we feel it is up to the city council to make the decision about allowing later licences within it. I suggested that they operate the way they've started to for a few months as this will be better evidence for them than what we have considering our last meeting. The licensing manager was asking about conditions and I explained that Bliss actually have the conditions that we would normally suggest for an application. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] suggested TENS but [REDACTED] stated that this was problematic as the TENS only allows 499 and their capacity is over double that so come 0200 hours he has a problem. I suggested that he put in two TENS, one from each room. He stated that he would still be over at capacity and didn't see how he could get 200 people out to allow the other 800 to stay. I feel that the figures don't quite stack up like that and he could hold off on maximum to stay open later with two TENS. They are going to discuss all this between themselves. CCTV - the two worst dancefloor cameras have been replaced with really good ones. The remaining dancefloor cameras were better than those replaced, [REDACTED] has asked if I'm

happy with them, I said they are satisfactory, that I'd love to have the newer cameras but these are sufficient. PC 20920 PRIOR

CCTV update and discussion around ID seizure 05/03/2011 01:30 CCTV - Camera 12 is excellent quality infra red camera. The cameras they have trailed on camera 7 and 13 are better than they were but not as good and 12 and they are intent on changing the cameras to the same. Seized ID's were collected. [REDACTED] said that he had someone complained that they don't have the power and he had kept the Hampshire Constabulary initiative letter that show he does. I explained that they have the power if the ID is not belonging to the person using it or is fake. I then discussed the ID seized of the male who has two yellow cards. [REDACTED] asked if it wasn't sensible to stop him by taking the ID off him whereas [REDACTED] was adamant that the ID was only removed because he did not look like the picture. They both felt that the police officer who attended and took the ID was bemused as to why they took it. I made it clear that being on the yellow card scheme was not a reason to seize the ID only if it was fake or being used by someone else. I have booked another meeting with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] (new manager who I met tonight) on the 31/03/11 at 1500 hours at the premise where I can see the CCTV system improvements and check all cameras PC 20920 PRIOR

Letter sent to premise with reference to meeting

Meeting DPS and HQ representative to discuss current concerns 10/02/2011 15:31 [REDACTED] Licensing Manager for company also attended meeting with [REDACTED] and I reviewed what had been discussed at the recent meeting and that we'd noted the positive action regarding the doorman but that we still had high concerns about the numerous drunk people coming out of the premise. We recapped on the rape, the GBH etc. I mentioned that there has been an extremely drunk female taken off to hospital and the very drunk man being carried out by friends (which is on CCTV - copy on file). I've made it clear that we will start getting BWV where we can to evidence this but that at the moment it was officers passing us the information but that they can give statements to what they have seen. I explained that also the people interviewed, one had stated that he had drunk 12 pints in the premise. [REDACTED] raised his eyebrows in disbelief at this and I explained that everyone's tolerance level was different but what was clear was that this male was saying that he was extremely drunk. I said that Insp Bates has raised it with them previously and that we are concerned about the drinks pricing. Nick explained the following. The Saturday Night - pay your half your bar bill before 2330 hours stands. The logic to this is that it is not two for one drinks which encourages the person to drink the second drink whether they wanted it or not. It is also only until 2330 hours. I stated that I still view it as half price drinks but I accept there is a time limit on it so it is not all night and that they do get busier later. Friday nights - this has been changed as of last weekend, the prices have gone up to be in line with their Monday and Thursday prices which are still cheap but not as cheap. He did defend that the prices were not all as the flyer suggested as the 50p shots were on the 12-14% alcohol, not the stronger shots of aftershook, tequila etc, those shots were also only for those wearing wrist bands (therefore on the guest list), for everyone else those same shots were £1. Similarly the £1.50 drinks were only on house spirit and mixers. They did have £2 doubles and this has now ceased being the case. He has spoken to [REDACTED] about the promotion and the advertising will changed, they've put a sign up outside before the weekend saying that due to VAT rises the drinks prices may have changed and he has had no problems. He also feels that last weekend, when this had been implemented, there had been no problems. I asked him outright if he therefore felt his drinks pricing had been a cause of the problems and he answered that he hoped that the change in drinks pricing will reduce some of the problems. Whilst on the subject of promotions I stated that we had heard rumour that they were offering free shots to persons wearing [REDACTED] wrist bands, he denied this thoroughly and states this comes from bad feeling from [REDACTED] about [REDACTED] competition with them after they pulled out of him being their Friday night promoter. I highlighted the fact that [REDACTED] needs to know exactly what his promoter is doing as ultimately he is responsible. 16 year old in premise - [REDACTED] accepts that this is the case and that although they ID 95% of customers and regularly seized ID that they need to make sure they are vigilant to this. ID scanner was mentioned to which [REDACTED] replied that he would not want to go into a club that had an ID scanner. His reasonings are that he is distrustful of the data protection side of it all. It would also not assist in people using others ID. Drugs - there have had a number of incidents of drugs found, most of these are where the doorstaff have had suspicions and called police. One was found after arrest. [REDACTED] states he will ensure the door team keep doing random searches and that as they currently do all incidents are reported to police. 'Club Nanny' - [REDACTED] does not employ specific people but has male and female glass collectors who check the booths and seating and alert doorstaff to problems, also they sit with upset people and get them a drink of water, always female staff for females and male staff for males. The bar staff have also been making more of an effort to alert doorstaff to drunk people. [REDACTED]

stated that the complaint in via the website show that they have a tough line as there has been an increase in complaints about being ejected 'for no reason' when the reason has been that they are very drunk. [redacted] showed me the refusals / compliant ejections book. Incident book - viewed and all incidents reported to police were in there, most with sufficient detail though some entries were lacking. It was also clear that there are incidents in there that aren't reported to police, no complaint assaults etc. This highlights that there are more incidents at the club that we are aware of. CCTV - [redacted] has had a company in who had installed 1 new camera to trail the improvement, his has view footage over the weekend and there is very little improvement and therefore they are coming back in tomorrow to install another type of camera. Once they have found a camera that works then the other problem cameras will also be replaced. I've asked to be kept informed and also to view footage once a suitable camera is found. They do have a CCTV condition and I have pointed out that he needs to make regular checks of his system to ensure that any changes in decoration, lighting conditions don't negatively affect the footage and that the cameras are all working to a satisfactory standard. At the end of the meeting I explained that he is clearly trying to address the problems raised but that if he continues with the number of incidents and the number of drunk people coming out of his premise then I will be looking at taking him to review base on all the information I had addressed in this and previous meetings. At this point [redacted] stated that he had problems with the lights throughout that night so I requested to see footage of a night when he hadn't had problems so he showed me footage of around midnight on a Tuesday morning (as Mondays are busy nights). DPS was asked for promotions details and gave the following Saturday - 50% off bar bill before 2330 hours Friday - £1.50 house spirits and mixer, £1.75 other spirits and mixers, £1 Pint, double vodka and mixer £2, others £1.75-£2 Monday and Thursday - similar pricing with £1.50, £1.75, £2 I informed [redacted] that the CCTV and drunk persons coming out the venue would be discussed at the next meeting and he said that we have to understand that 4000 people come through the venue and I explained that too many were far too drunk, requiring hospital treatment, and that we would argue the drink pricing was a problem with them being able to drink more for the money. With reference the GBH he was aware of the incident and he stated that both parties had been in his premise, we haven't established this as enquiries are on-going with suspect and aggrieved. I will still attend today to try and secure some CCTV where officers have stated that people have come out extremely drunk. PC 20920 PRIOR

Staff Due Diligence training attended and input given on 11/01/11 PC 20920 PRIOR

Incidents over weekend of 7th/8th Jan 09/01/2011 03:26 Bliss were the only busy club on Fri 7th with over 1000 people inside. 2 people were arrested in relation to S4 offences against the door staff/police. The second male arrested stated that he had drunk 12pints inside and put himself at 10 on a scale of 1-10 (44110009965). The duty VCS [redacted] informed us that he had treated a female at 01:00 hours

who was paraletic and could not hold her own head up. She had to go to hospital and be monitored for her own safety until she sobered up. Her friends informed [REDACTED] that she had been drinking tequila and that they had had some free champagne on the door. Another male was arrested in early hours of Sun 9th by PC HARRIS for assault, whilst we were stood with the arrested male I saw a male being carried out of the entrance by 2 male friends. He had a stream of saliva/fluid running out of his mouth and could barely walk. Due to detaining the other male we could not capture this on BWV. [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] informed me today that BLISS were selling shots at 50p on the Fri and other drinks at £1. They had advertised this via text message and flyers (not witnessed by us - only the usual 50% offer).

BLISS licencing meeting 6/01/11 after assault by door staff 07/01/2011 09:12 44110006311 - refers to an assault on a male by member of door staff. The doorstaff has been restraining someone else and male gets involved and then walks off and turns around, door staff follows and approaches male and punches him. The male did not have raised arms and was not approaching door staff. CCTV was shown to the DPS and the management of Bridgegate Security who provide the door team. After seeing the CCTV the management of the security firm phoned the member of door staff and sacked him. The incident booked was looked at and had two entries, one relating to the originally detained male and one to this incident. The entries were reasonably detailed but had a lot about the actions of the others and not about the exact actions of the door team. Advised that this would be beneficial as words like 'restrained' and 'pre-emptive strike' are insufficient. Other matters discussed were the drunkenness of people leaving the club, which [REDACTED] stated Insp Bates had already addressed with him. Some of this has come from statistics and some were noted from the VCS Sgt. I emphasised that drunk people are at risk and this is highlighted in the fact that a female who describes herself as level 9 on the drunkenness scale was raped after leaving the club. RMS 44100520003 refers. [REDACTED] stated that his usual staff were students but they had gone home over the Christmas break and therefore he had temporary staff and although he had done a due diligence input with them it was not as rigid as the one he does with his usual staff. He has training on Tuesday evening and requested I come and do a police input at the end which I have agreed to do. All other incidents were checked against the incident book and were all recorded (excluding one assault which was not reported to police until the next day so unlikely that the club had been aware of it) PC 20920 PRIOR

MEETING 25/9/10 12/10/2010 09:08 I spoke to [REDACTED] in connection with the drinks promotion. In short he stated that the shots available are a brand called Wild which are only 14% not 40%. He described it like having a shot of wine. I did point out that wine tends to get people drunk because of the alcohol content being at the level in which the body lets it straight into the system. He further added that the wrist bands were for a minority of people approx 200 given out for the whole evening. He explained that most of his promotions were available to all groups but were advertised to create the illusion of exclusivity. E.G everyone can get in at a discounted price before a certain time- even if not a VIP. I explained that he needs to risk assess the drink promotions and should there be any problems connected to the promotions it would be seen as not supporting the licence objectives. PS3555

Remarks: Initial Attendance and Update

Police were called to attend [REDACTED] by VS CCTV operators after they saw a male lying unconscious [REDACTED]. Whilst en-route to the location control room have updated officers that they had now received a call stating that the male had been assaulted and knocked unconscious by an unknown suspect/suspects.

VS CCTV described the possible group of offenders as being 5 IC3 males, all in dark clothing. They have not stated where these suspects have gone.

On police arrival there was a lot of people in the area, most of which were not involved. The aggd party [REDACTED] was then located [REDACTED] along with his two friends [REDACTED]

In brief they stated that they had been to Chilli Whites, before leaving and going to get some food. They then stated that they bumped into a group of male on the corner of Above Bar St near to [REDACTED] where an altercation has taken place. They then state that they walk into [REDACTED] and are then followed inside by some members of the other group. The altercation then continues before they state that the aggd was then almost pulled outside by the group and they have followed. They then state that [REDACTED] has been assaulted in an unprovoked attack which has knocked him unconscious and caused him to fall straight onto his face. They stated that they did not know the suspects or where they went. They also stated that they had no idea why the assault takes place.

(From viewing the various bits of CCTV footage the story of the aggd's friends does not add up. The VS CCTV clearly shows [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] fighting in the middle of the street with members of the suspect group. The footage also shows another aggd party lying on the pavement [REDACTED] on Above Bar St. This male also appears to be unconscious and appears to be a member of the possible suspects group. This assault has taken place before the aggd is assaulted and it is highly likely that the aggd or one of his friends is responsible for assaulting this male before they are then themselves assaulted).

Ambulance attended the scene and initially stated that the aggd party may have a fractured cheek bone. Due to this both the duty sgt and duty CID were liaised with and the decision taken not to put a scene on at the location due to the heavy foot traffic and lack of SOCO potential.

The aggd was taken to the hospital and has been spoken to at the location by

the duty CID. Please see his W/S for details. He has however stated that he does not wish to pursue a complaint. His injury level is still not known at this time.

Witness details were obtained from as many people as possible and have been added to the RMS.

Statements were obtained from the independent witnesses and are on RMS:

Statements still need to be obtained from the agg'd's friends:

[REDACTED] They have initially refused to assist police, possibly due to the fact that they are involved in the fight prior to their friend being assaulted.

CCTV was obtained from [REDACTED] and also VS. Attached to file.

CCTV still needs to be obtained from [REDACTED] for ID purposes of the suspects etc as it is believed they go in and pull the agg'd out before assaulting him.

The agg'd will need to be re-visited in the morning to clarify if he does wish to pursue a complaint and also to confirm his injury level.

If the agg'd does not wish to pursue a complaint then unless an offence of affray or violent disorder is pursued there is not likely to be any further enquires.

On 25/10/11 at 02:52 hrs police received a request to attend HENSTEAD ROAD SOUTHAMPTON after being requested to attend the area due to a fight outside [REDACTED] and again by the traffic lights at the junction BEDFORD PLACE with CHARLTON PLACE. It was reported that a male had been beating up by a group of ten (10) males and there were a mixture of both white and black males involved. The initial police informant was a male called [REDACTED]

Council CCTV was monitoring the suspects move towards and into HENSTEAD ROAD and in particular two (2) males who were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. As police pulled into HENSTEAD ROAD PC LANE exited and said to them both "STAY THERE". As soon as PC LANE got out of the car [REDACTED] ran. PC LANE tried to grab hold of him but his t-shirt ripped and he ran down into KENILWORTH ROAD. PC LANE gave chase and after a short time [REDACTED] went to stop but slipped falling to the floor and was detained.

PC LANE describes how [REDACTED] appeared to be intoxicated through alcohol.

Other officers arrived and stopped more of the group in HENSTEAD ROAD. In total six males were stopped details as below. [redacted] was wearing one and out of the other four (4) stopped [redacted] was also wearing a checked shirt.

PC LANE returned to the police station and spoke with a male whom was identified as [redacted]. [redacted] had facial injuries and photographs were obtained of his injuries which have been detailed below. He states that they both had been drinking alcohol and had been socialising with other friends. The club closed at 02:00 hrs and they went outside. [redacted] describes how there were a large amount of people outside the venue and after a short time he became aware that [redacted] has having a verbal argument with a guy who was described and referred to in his statement as Small white guy. The door staff intervened and it all calmed down. [redacted] spoke with [redacted] who stated that it was all sorted and that he was going to get some food. [redacted] then left and started walking through the park opposite with a female friend of his. As [redacted] walked he received a call from [redacted] who said words to the effect of "THEY ARE AFTER ME" and stated he was up near to [redacted] upon hearing [redacted] ran through the parks and when he arrived at [redacted] he saw [redacted] lying on the floor. There were various males standing around him and [redacted] stated that he is confident that one of the black guys was standing next to him shouting at him. [redacted] was bleeding and so [redacted] went to help him get to his feet. [redacted] states that [redacted] was bleeding and certainly looked as if he had been beaten up. [redacted]

Interview summary

[REDACTED] was asked whether he had assaulted anyone during the incident for which he was arrested to which he replied 'TO SOME EXTENT'. [REDACTED] was asked to provide an account of the circumstances leading to his arrest. He stated that he had been in Chilliwite during the evening to celebrate a friends birthday with a group of friends. He stated that he was on the dance floor and that a song was being played that meant that people were jumping around to it a pushing each other, not in a fighting way but in a dancing way. He stated that a male stepped on his leg by accident and he pushed the male away from him but stated that nothing was said between them. [REDACTED] stated that he and his friends left the club at closing time and went and stood outside. [REDACTED] stated that once outside the male came up to him and grabbed him by his clothing but in doing so managed to grab some of the skin on his neck too. [REDACTED] stated that he went 'mad at this' and that it 'got him going' but didn't hit the male back at this point. He stated that the bouncers came over and intervened at which point he told the bouncers that the male had just attacked him. [REDACTED] stated that he tried to ask the male why he had grabbed him like that and stated that he heard the male tell one of his friends that he wanted a fight.

CLARK stated that he and his friends then walked to a kebab shop. [REDACTED] stated that he was sat on the step of the shop when he saw that the male was

there again and that the male started to give him 'mouth'. He stated that the male shouted at him 'YOU, COME HERE' and that [REDACTED] asked him again why he had grabbed him. [REDACTED] stated that his friend [REDACTED] then came out of the kebab shop and punched the male to his face before flinging him on the floor. [REDACTED] stated that his friends started to ask him why he was not dealing with his own fight and so he felt peer pressure to get involved. He stated that his friends told him that it was 'his battle' and that he initially told them to stop but then felt obliged to join in. [REDACTED] confirmed that no-one forced him to get involved with the fight. [REDACTED] stated that he hit the male a couple of times but thought that only one of his punches actually connected, to the back of the males head. [REDACTED] explained that he and his all friends decided the leave the male alone as he had had enough and was so outnumbered. [REDACTED] stated that the male's friend was also there trying to get his friend away.

[REDACTED] stated that he and his friend started to walk off through the park but the male followed them and was still shouting comments at him and his group. [REDACTED] stated that the male was making him angry as he was calling him a 'midget'. [REDACTED] stated that he saw the male's friend tell the male to stop and go home but the male kept on following them and seemed as though he wanted a fight. [REDACTED] stated that some of his friends went up to the male and tried to convince him to stop what he was doing and go home and that the male's own friend was trying to pull him away but the male would not listen. [REDACTED] stated he heard the male say that he was not going to leave until he had had a one-to-one with him [REDACTED] decided that he was going to have a fight as the male would not leave them alone and it was the only way to get him to go. He stated that he took off the shirt he was wearing in preparation for a fight but then had second thoughts. He stated that at that time they were by a set of traffic lights and that he tried to 'grapple' with the male and take him to the floor but was unable too. [REDACTED] stated that his plan was to take to male to the ground and then leave him there so that he could walk off from him and get away from him but he stated that the male was too big for him to be able to get him onto the ground. He stated that the male was fighting back at this point and was trying to grab for him. [REDACTED] stated that the male somehow ended up on the floor and whilst he was lying on the ground he kicked him to his shoulder. [REDACTED] stated that when he kicked the male the male had his back to him and he described the kick as more of a 'brush'.

[REDACTED] stated that he knew that what he had done was wrong and that he had

acted unreasonably. He stated that he was shocked that he had given in to peer pressure and stated that he could have just walked away from the incident.

[REDACTED] accepted that he had assaulted the male and had not acted in self defence as he had punched him to the back of his head and kicked him whilst he was lying on the ground. [REDACTED] stated that although the male had antagonised him and his friends and had caused the incident he still feels sorry for him as he was drunk and outnumbered. [REDACTED] also stated that his friend [REDACTED] gets out of control when he is drunk. [REDACTED] stated that his friends and the male were pushing and shoving each other at this point but he could not be more specific as to who did what.

[REDACTED] stated that he did not know the male and had never seen him before. [REDACTED] stated that he saw that the male had a bleeding injury to his face but stated that he does not believe that he caused the male that injury as he only punched him to the back of his head and kicked his shoulder. [REDACTED] stated that he saw someone assault the male to his face that may have caused that injury but he would not name that person.

[REDACTED] stated that he had consumed some vodka and lemonade and lime at home prior to going into town and stated that he had consumed some champagne at the Chilliwite. He stated that he was 7 or 8 out of ten drunk and stated that he would not have acted in the way he had if he had been sober. [REDACTED] stated that he had not consumed any drugs or medication at the time of the incident. [REDACTED] stated that at the time of the incident he was wearing brown [REDACTED] [REDACTED] accepted that [REDACTED] statement.

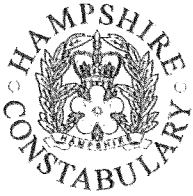

As you are aware Southampton Police are committed to working with the licensees in supporting the four licensing objective i.e. –

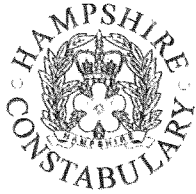

Meeting regarding Chilliwite Nightclub 7th October 2011

Drunks

Discussion: A drunk male and female were placed by doorstaff on a bench, given water and left. The female then fell off the bench. It is disputed whether the male was in the premise as he came from the side and I am awaiting the body worn video in relation to this male.

Advised: To request street pastors or have staff assisting and detail that in the incident book

Updated: A new policy was put in place the same night this was brought to DPS attention. In summary for drunks the policy states - not to leave drunks on benches, more proactive checking for drunks inside & refresher training for staff. There will also be an additional member of doorstaff on the Monday and Friday

Incident book

Discussion: The book has each doorstaff witnessing putting in an entry but it is confusing where some have put an incorrect date for the entry in.

Advised: That management who check the entries are sufficient also check the dates, it would also assist if on the log the doorstaff indicated an approximate time for the incident

Management of Incidents

Discussion: On the weekend (30th – 2nd) there was a number of incidents occurring and I was there to witness one fight occurring after the other with persons ejected. I had to go round to doorstaff, witnesses and aggrieveds to ascertain what had happened, the doorstaff did not know where the management was or who had seen which incidents and which detained persons related to each other. The DPS was not at the premise and the manager was with another member of staff administering first aid to a female with a bloody nose.

Concerns raised that those let into the premise may be on a yellow card and one was a group of males.

Updated: DPS explained he had been there and supervised the entry to the premise but left during the night. DPS will address the lack of control and coordination after the incidents with the manager. DPS also explained that one of the doorstaff who is good at managing the staff was not performing that role at the time and DPS will look into why

Advised: That although the DPS is entitled to time off that perhaps consideration be given to less busy nights rather than a Saturday of a pay day weekend. Yellow card scheme needs to be looked at and ensure that doorstaff and management supervising entry to the premise are aware of persons on that scheme. The premise is part of licensing link and should be issuing yellow cards rather than expecting the police to as yellow cards are usually only issued by police when persons are arrested. The police can assist the premise in obtaining details of persons they wish to issue a yellow card to. Please request any details of previous incidents if it is felt that a yellow card should be issued.

ID Scanner

This was discussed as part of a solution to some of the entry problems at the premise as it acts as a deterrent. It can also be used to input persons on the yellow card scheme into. Although feedback from the area manager is that the system has been tried and found not to be cost effective we now have a number of premises in the area utilising the system and nearly all have given positive feedback describing it as like having another member of doorstaff

happened but she was drunk and upset and said she did not know. I asked the female's boyfriend what had happened and he said that some males were dancing up to his girlfriend and she pushed them away so they then hip bumped her and she fell over injuring herself. He then explained that he was angry so punched one of the males and then was attacked by them. Having established that this was the male that I was looking for I obtained his details and that he wanted to make no complaint against the male detained for kicking him. I then went to speak to the detained male but on exiting the cloakroom found that doorstaff were bring out some more males for fighting. At this point further units were called to the club to assist with dealing with the detained people. Other officers arrived at which point I was able to go back inside again to establish what had happened at this next incident. I managed to establish from different doorstaff that a male in a yellow top had assaulted another male in the smoking area. I then went to find [REDACTED] and discovered she was in the office with a colleague who wanted to know what happened. [REDACTED] was trying to explain to the officer what she knew but was confusing the two incidents so I had to explain that there were two separate incidents and explained who was responsible for which.

I felt that there was no management of the premises; the person in charge was unaware of what had happened where and then confused the matter in trying to explain to officers. The female injured during the incident was drunk, the males had clearly been drinking as they were argumentative, repetitive and not listening to what was being explained which made them difficult to deal with them even as witnesses.

I am Police Constable 25519 Jennifer Gibson. I am employed by Hampshire Constabulary and I currently work at Southampton Central Police Station.

This statement is in relation to an incident I attended at Chilli Whites Night Club, Southampton.
On Saturday 1st October 2011 I was on duty, in full uniform and on club patrol in Southampton City Centre. I was with my colleague PC 24133 SMITH. During the evening I patrolled the bars on Above Bar Street and Chilli Whites Night Club.

Throughout the evening I was mainly outside Chilli Whites Night club as I have received some information that there were many people outside of the club in the road drinking alcohol. I made myself a high visible presence outside the club on a off from midnight to close at 03:00 hours.

At approximately 03:00 hours when Chilli Whites were closing I witnessed a a extremely drunk female exit the club and collapse on the floor, one of the doormen approached her picked her up and put her on one of the benches opposite the club. He then left and re appeared with a bottle of water and gave it to her and then left her alone. This female I spoke to earlier in the evening (Approximately midnight) when she was entering the club and she appeared sober to me at this point.

Approximately 5 minutes later I was alerted to another extremely drunk person opposite Chilli Whites on the other side of the road with a friend. I approached the male to see if he was okay, the drunk males friend informed me that his friend had just drunk too much and had just left Chilli Whites and was trying to get a taxi home. About 5 minutes later I saw the same bouncer who dealt with the drunk female approach the drunk male who was now collapsed on the grass area opposite Chilli Whites. The bouncer then picked him up and put him on the bench next to the drunk

female. This male was completely un responsive and was throwing up. The bouncer just left him to it and went back inside. I then looked round and saw the female had fallen off the bench and was collapsed on the floor again, I went over to assist her and brought her back to her feet, her boyfriend then came over and helped her up. With another PC who had body worn video on, I then asked her where she had been tonight and how much she had drunk; she replied she had only been to Chilli Whites and she was far too drunk and shouldn't have been served any more alcohol. I then went over to see to the drunk male who appeared to be throwing up more and sweating, I was worried for his welfare so I called for a paramedic to assist me and look him over. Minutes later the paramedic came out and informed me that he was ok just very intoxicated due to too much alcohol.

I was shocked by the lack of help from Chilli Whites and that the bouncer just left both the male and the female on the benches. I was shocked to find that both of the drunk male and female had been drinking in Chilli Whites and in my professional opinion should not have been served alcohol and should not have been left outside the club unattended.

Updated: Doorstaff are now stricter on entries and more vigilant inside to prevent problems.

Advised: that he had been seen making door decisions and that doorstaff need to make decision. Steve stated that they are being trained to his decision level but would soon be making all decisions

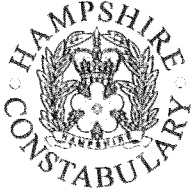

This letter is in reference to our licence meetings on the 4th July 2011 at Bliss Nightclub. At the meeting a number of issues were discussed and are summarised on the attached sheet. I realise that you have only officially started at the premise last Monday but you need to read the letter I provided of the previous meeting at the premise as I feel that the problems have resurfaced.

As you are aware Southampton Police are committed to working with the licensees in supporting the four licensing objective i.e. –

- The prevention of crime & disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

At this time we are not satisfied that this premise is supporting those objectives. The high number of incidents is serious and that this level of disorder will not be tolerated and must cease. If this disorder continues then consideration will be given to the powers available to police under the licensing act to ensure public safety. There will be the licensing unit and the duty Inspectors monitoring the premise over the next few weekends and action will be taken if there is not improvement.

I am Police Constable 25070 Simon SPENCER currently stationed at Southampton Central Police Station in Hampshire Constabulary. This statement is in relation to an incident on the 3rd July 2011.

Around 0115hrs I was on duty and in full uniform with PC JONES, we were on high visibility patrols on a Saturday night as part of the Violent Crime Strategy to prevent alcohol related disorder. We were stood outside of BLISS NIGHTCLUB on VINCENTS WALK. We were there for a few minutes when the male member of door staff disappeared inside, he returned a short time later a bit shocked and I overheard him say to another member of staff "HE HAS GOT BLOOD ALL OVER HIS FACE". At this point we were still not informed of what had happened but after a short time a male was brought outside by a member of staff the male was quite animated, he was followed by a female who came out screaming and she had blood down her right arm. I decided to go inside the club to find out what had happened. The club inside did not appear that busy at the time, I managed to locate a male in a side room, he was bleeding heavily from the face and BLISS staff were trying to clean him up. I asked "WHAT HAS HAPPENED" and a member of staff said "HE HAS FALLEN OVER" without hesitation, then one of the aggrieved's friend's said "NO HE HASN'T, HE WAS ASSAULTED", I called for an ambulance to attend as staff had not called one. I found out that the assault took place on the dance floor and it was unknown where the offender had gone.

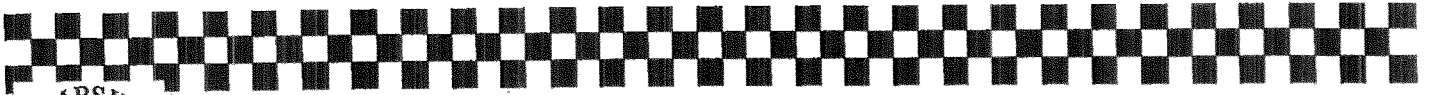

I am PC 21378 Buckingham, currently employed by Hampshire Constabulary and posted at Southampton central police station.

On Sunday 26th June 2011, I was on duty in full uniform in Southampton. I was attached to Operation Erwood which is the weekly operation linked to policing the night time economy in Southampton. I was crewed in a marked police vehicle, using the call sign XS96 and accompanied by PS 3322 Anderson, PC 23968 Shirley, PC 24244 Barton and PC 24256 Jassal.

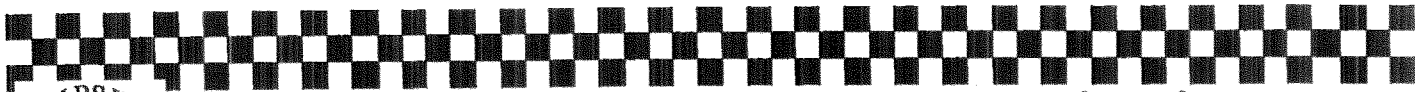
At approximately 0030 hours that day, we were deployed to Vincents Walk in Southampton following a request by officers already in attendance, for more units. On my arrival, I could see that there were two groups of females being separated by officers. It transpired that they had been inside of BLISS and on leaving, there had been a dispute which lead to an assault with a high heel shoe of some sort. An ambulance attended for the aggrieved party. Both groups were under the influence of alcohol and extremely verbal towards each other. I feel that had it not been for the police presence, there would have been further violence between the two groups.

Whilst present, I witnessed a group of three males being physically ejected from BLISS by the door staff. On speaking to the group and attempting to calm them, it was clear they were heavily

intoxicated. A member of staff who was involved in ejecting the group explained that one of the group had been dancing with his shirt off. Despite numerous requests, he refused to put it on so he and his friends were ejected.

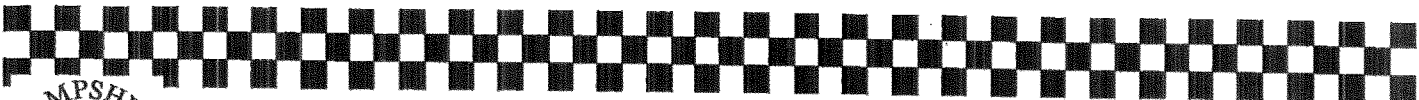
Shortly after dealing with this group, I was alerted to a couple in the small park between BLISS and Poundtree Road by door staff. This was a verbal domestic incident between a young male and female who had just left BLISS. The male was drunk and aggressive towards me when we spoke. He was suitably advised and directed to leave the area. I was then called back to the BLISS entrance as another male had been ejected by door staff for being too drunk inside of the premise. He was verbally aggressive towards door staff as he had been ejected without his suit jacket and wanted it returned before he left. After calming him down, door staff were spoken to and the males jacket was returned. This male was then verbally abusive towards me and had to be removed from the area. Fortunately, his friends were more sensible and took him away.

At 0115 hours, I was flagged down by a taxi driver who informed me that there was an assault in progress on Poundtree Road outside of the Barclays bank. Due to this, I left the vicinity of BLISS. During my time spent outside of BLISS, I witnessed several incidents of low level public order by BLISS customers. These were all dealt with by police officers, who for a period of forty five minutes, were unable to leave the area due to the potential for escalating public order offences. I was amazed to see the sheer amount of people outside of BLISS at that time as the premise was still open for another hour or so. Everybody I spoke to or witnessed being involved in incidents had come from BLISS and were drunk. The atmosphere was extremely tense and I recall that one of the door staff said to me that he didn't know what had gotten into people that night. I am aware that after leaving BLISS to deal with other incidents, there was another assault matter involving BLISS customers. Two persons were assaulted and attended the Southampton A&E Department.

At the time of the assault, no police officers were near by to prevent the disorder.

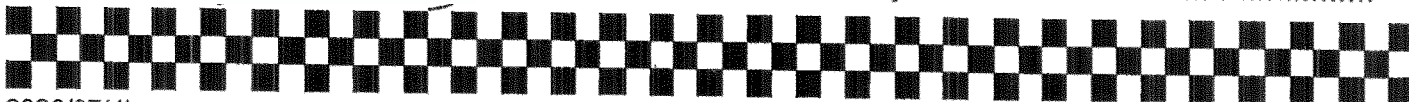

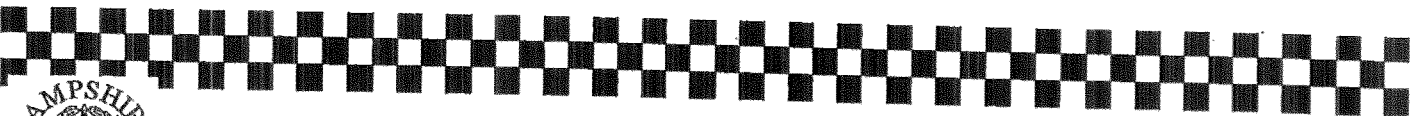

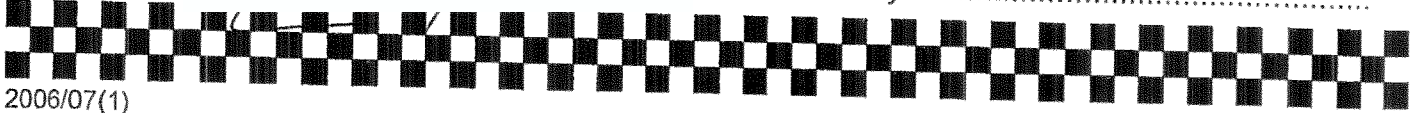

I am Police Constable 924 of Hampshire Constabulary currently employed as a Police Dog Handler.
On Sunday the 26th of June 2011 I was on duty in uniform in a marked Police vehicle patrolling Southampton city centre when at approximately 0040hrs I was directed to outside The Bliss night club in Vincents walk where is had been reported several females were fighting. I arrived several minutes later. On my arrival there were two groups of girls who had been inside the premises but were shouting abuse at each other. There were no complaints forthcoming and I was shortly joined by several other Police units. The local units obtained the details of these girls.
During this time before all the girls left the area, there was a large crowd gathered watching what was happening.
I had to warned numerous persons in this crowd regarding their behaviour as the mood of the crowd was negative. There were persons obstructing officers and verbally abusive throughout my time there. I shortly was redeployed to another incident

This letter is in reference to our licence meetings on the 6th January 2011 at Bliss Nightclub and on the 9th February 2011. At the meetings a number of issues were discussed and are detailed below.

The meeting on the 6th January 2011, focussed on the complaint against doorstaff, the footage was viewed and a decision was made by yourselves that the member of doorstaff would not work at the premise again. The company he worked for also made their own decision to end his employment with them. It was clear that what was written in the incident book about a 'pre-emptive' strike did not correlate to the CCTV footage. A discussion was had around the fact that the incident book is filled in but that more details could be included when terms like 'pre-emptive' strike and 'restrained' are used. On looking at the other incidents put in the incident book it was clear that incident are being recorded appropriately.

The amount of very drunk people leaving the premise was mentioned and you stated that Insp Bates had already mentioned this to you. I emphasised that drunk people are at risk and that this was highlighted by a female who left your club and was raped, she had stated that on a scale of 1-10 of drunkenness with 1 being sober and 10 being unable to stand she put herself at 9.

At that meeting you stated that the bar staff had changed with university students who were staff going home over the Christmas break and you had the usual staff returning. You invited me to the staff training and I gave an input to the staff about their responsibilities to ID persons and about serving drunk people.

I attended Bliss to collect CCTV footage and seized ID's from you on the 28th January 2011 and during this attendance I checked the CCTV system and found the footage on some of the cameras, particularly those covering the dance floors, was extremely poor. It was so bad that if an incident occurred it would be difficult to ascertain what had happened or identify those responsible.

At the meeting on the 9th February we recapped on the previous meetings. You confirmed that you are addressing the problems with the CCTV and have had a new camera put in to trail over last weekend but that camera is no improvement so the firm are coming back tomorrow to try another solution.; once a solution is found all problem cameras will be changed. As this is a condition on



your licence I need to be kept up to date of timescales and also view the footage when cameras are changed. I have advised to do regularly checks on the cameras to make sure any change in lighting, position or even decoration is not affecting the footage. I would suggest that these checks are recorded to show what problems are found and how they are addressed.

During the meeting I explained what evidence we currently have of extremely drunk people, some requiring hospital treatment, that we have. I explained that some of this information is through officers on patrol or attending incidents and some is through people interviewed after being arrested for offences. There is also footage of your main door at closing time where a male is being dragged out by two other males which is an unacceptable level of drunkenness. We are endeavouring to obtain this best evidence by getting these type of attendances recorded on body worn video footage. I raised that we felt that this level of drunkenness came from the drinks promotions at the club.

You stood by your promotion on a Saturday night where half the bar bill is paid before 2330 hours as you felt this is better than two for one drinks where another drink is given whether or not someone wants it. I still feel this is half prices drinks but accept that it is capped at an hour not long after the majority of people enter the club.

I showed you the flyer that we had in relation to the Friday night 'Juiced' promotion that shows "50p shots, £1 drinks, £1.50 spirits and mixers, £2 doubles, all night" and advertises it as the "cheapest night in Southampton" In defence of this you stated that the 50p shots were on 12-14% alcohol, so not the aftershock, tequila and similar strength drinks. That it was only 50p for those on the guest list who were given a wristband; it was £1 to everyone else. You also stated that the £1.50 drinks was only on the house spirits and mixers. You've explained that as of last week you have changed the pricing structure on this and have put it in line with the Monday and Thursday drink prices. We discussed that you need to be mindful of what your promoter is advertising and how they are approaching that advertising as ultimately you are responsible. I would like to see a copy of the new flyer for Juiced when it is produced.

The 'club nanny' role was discussed with you explaining the majority of the role was taken up looking after those who are upset. You explained that your glass collectors and bar staff are instructed on identifying drunk people and reporting that to the door team. This has recently resulted in more complaints on your website by people saying their were removed for no reason when in fact it was because they'd had too much to drink. During this discussion you showed me the book with numerous entries for refusals at the door and compliant ejections.

I asked to see the incident book and noted that although some entries still need a bit more detail there are all the incidents being reported to police in there. There are also other incidents not reported to the police but still being fully logged.

Recently there have been a few incidents where drugs have been found, the majority have been through your stops and searches being reported to police. I encourage you to continue in this manner to deter persons with drugs coming into the premise as consistently getting the police involved is a proven deterrent.

The door team at Bliss are known for checking ID's on the majority of people entering the premise and we do note that you have seized numerous ID's from persons trying to use someone else's ID to enter the premise. However despite these checks a 16 year was found to have been in the premise and what is even more concerning is that this male looks young and the ID he had on him looked nothing like him. This issue needs to be addressed with the door team as it seems to be quite a failing under the protection of children from harm.

As you are aware, Southampton Police are committed to working with the licensees in supporting the four licensing objective i.e. –

Please keep in contact with me in relation to this as currently the number of assaults in the premise, the breach in licence condition (poor CCTV) and the number of drunks leaving the premise is unacceptable. You have told me on this occasion that you are amending your pricing structure for the 'juiced' event and looking at how you market it differently. In relation to the CCTV you are looking at which cameras will be effective and intend to replace those that are currently of poor quality. I look forward to hearing from you as soon as these are addressed.

On 99p Drink nights we have limited the amount of drinks that each person can buy to 4 per person so that we are able to assess more customers as they come to the bar. During the busy periods of the night 10pm till 1am there will be a heightened management presence on the door to assess the door staff and customers.

When venerable females are found in or around the club the upmost care is taken to make sure that they are not left alone or taken home by a stranger, we will endeavour to do our upmost to make sure that they are pick up by a friend or relative or taken home in a licensed taxi.
