Legal Implications

- 1. Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that a responsible authority of a resident or business in the vicinity (interested party) may apply for review of a premises licence.
- The grounds of review applications must relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.
- In such circumstances, the applicant for the review must serve a copy of the review application on the holder of the premises licences, the City Council and each of the responsible authorities.
- 4. On receipt of the application for review, the officers will consider its validity, under delegated powers. Reasons for rejection, in whole or in part, include:
 - that the grounds for review are not relevant to one of more of the licensing objectives and;
 - (in the case of an application not made by a responsible authority), that the application is frivolous, vexatious or repetitious.
- 5. The City Council must, within one day of receiving the application for review, display a prescribed notice of the review application on the outside or adjacent the premises; the notice must remain on display for 28 days and any interested party in the vicinity or the responsible authorities may make representations in that period.
- 6. Unless the applicant, licence holder, interested parties and responsible authorities agree that a hearing is unnecessary, the City Council is then required to hold a hearing to consider the review.
- 7. The sub-committee, in considering the application for review, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and evidence before it at the hearing.
- 8. The Licensing Act 2003 provides that, in determining an application for review, the sub-committee may take any (or none) of the following steps, as it considers necessary:
 - modify the conditions of the licence;
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - revoke the licence.
- 9. The Licensing Act 2003 makes provision for appeal to the Southampton Magistrates' Court against the sub-committee's decision in relation to an application for review.
- 10. In considering this application the sub-committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the sub-committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching its decision.
- 11. Copies of the application for review and the Police objection are annexed to this report.
- 12. The sub-committee must also have regard to:-
- 13. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

14. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another person's Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matters set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.



POUND XTRA REVIEW

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police I am writing to request review of the above Premises Licence. The review is requested on the following grounds:

- 1) The prevention of crime & disorder
- 2) Public safety
- 3) The protection of children from harm

The Police make this request based on the premises' failure to adhere to the conditions of the premises licence, and three test purchase failures at the premises since January 2010.

The current Premises Licence Holder is Sara WOLDEMICHAEL. Sara has been the holder of the licence throughout the timeframe cited within this application. Her husband, Aklilu ALEM took over the role of DPS in June 2011 and was employed at the store prior to this.

On 19th January 2010 Aklilu ALEM, whilst working at the premises, served alcohol to a 15 year old girl as part of a trading standards test purchase operation. ALEM's actions gave an early indication to his lack of support for the licensing objectives, in particular the protection of children from harm, and the prevention of crime and disorder. As a result of this ALEM received a simple caution in relation to the offence.

In November 2010 the premises was taken to review by trading standards in relation to the sale of counterfeit goods. The review application in this instance evidenced criminal activity at the premises in the form of sale of counterfeit alcohol and cigarettes. The application specifically mentioned a member of the public who had become ill having drunk a quantity of vodka purchased from the premises, and as a result reported this to trading standards. Counterfeit vodka is an increasing problem around the country. It is often produced from industrial alcohol which is imported to the UK. Controls over the quality of the product are not as strict as would be found at a distillery producing the genuine product, and issues have been reported regarding excessive levels of methanol being present — which is a poisonous substance, and clearly a danger to public safety. As part of the review it was considered that the holder of the premises licence had not fulfilled their duty under the







Licensing Act 2003 to prevent crime and disorder and to protect public safety. On 6th January 2011 the Licensing Sub-Committee suspended the premises licence for a period of three months, noting that revocation, in this instance, had not been requested.

On 13th December 2010, whilst awaiting review hearing, the premises failed another test purchase operation. Avtar SINGH sold alcohol to a 16 year old and was issued with a fixed penalty notice for the offence. To have a further failure at the premises raises serious concerns for both police and trading standards. In his appraisal of the meeting following this failure PC HARRIS details how the premises licence holder advised that they would be operating a Challenge 25 policy and offer training to staff that would be refreshed every quarter. The premises were also offered police assistance with their training and passed PC HARRIS' details in order to arrange this, however, to date no assistance has been requested.

Trading Standards officer Lucas MARSHALL provides a statement in relation to a visit conducted at the premises on 1st September 2011. It clearly details how the DPS is in breach of a condition on the licence relating to retention of invoices and similar items. This condition was added to the licence following the review in January 2011, which focussed on the sale of counterfeit goods. Failure to adhere to this condition shows a lack of commitment to adhere to the licence conditions and, although on this occasion there was no issue with the composition of the items tested, raises concern that non duty paid goods are still being sold on the premises, and could be a danger to public safety.

On 3rd September 2011 the premises failed yet another test purchase operation. Once again, the now DPS, Aklilu ALEM, has made a sale to a female aged under 18. Despite the initial caution and the extra conditions added to the licence following review, the DPS continues to break the law, putting children in danger, breaching the conditions of the licence and failing to adhere to the licensing objectives.

In a visit to the premises by PC Wood & PS Marshman on 2nd November 2011 the DPS demonstrated little knowledge of the conditions attached to the premises licence following the review in January 2011, or of the licensing objectives. The licence conditions state that CCTV footage should be retained for 30 days, it was found that it was retained only as far back as 29th October – 4 days. Training records were found to be basic, and the most recent produced at the time of the visit were for the 1st April 2011, in breach of the six monthly refresher training condition. Given the previous Test Purchase failures this gives rise to serious concern as to the willingness of the DPS and Premises Licence Holder to support the licensing objectives of public safety and protection of children from harm. Further to this, the refusals log had not been signed off by either the premises licence holder or the DPS for the duration of its existence, the only evidence of it having been checked was an entry by a member of staff on the 4th May 2011 — again in breach of the licence conditions.

The same day, shortly after the meeting the DPS arrived at the Police Station armed with copies of the same basic training, this time just two copies (for his two staff members) dated 1st July 2011, no records of his own training, and advising that training was in fact conducted every three months. This being the case there would have been records dated around 1st October 2011 – there were none. The DPS also brought with him the refusals













log, which he had since signed as having been checked, but dated this check as having been conducted on 31st October, which it clearly had not. Throughout the visit, the DPS demonstrated a disregard for the importance of adhering to licence conditions and a lack of understanding as to the severity of his own failings in having twice committed the offence of selling alcohol to someone aged under 18. He was reported for summons for having breached the premises licence.

The premises have been given ample opportunity to rectify their working practices and have evidently failed to do so. Conditions were placed on the licence by the licensing panel to address previous failings, however these have been largely ignored. The premises consistently fail to promote the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, and protection of children from harm, and seem oblivious to the potential implications of this. The letter dated 22nd December 2010 by PC HARRIS to the premises states, in relation to test purchase failures "Any further failings I would consider catastrophic and I would be left with little choice but to apply for further review of your licence with the objective of having the premises licence revoked". The police therefore seek a review of the premises licence and suggest that in light of the previous suspension of the licence that this is with a view to revocation.

- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- No supply of alcohol shall be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor for the premises does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained in the licensed premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority, Hampshire Constabulary and Trading Standards. As a minimum, it shall enable surveillance of both external and internal areas of the premises including entrances and exits. Recordings from the system shall be of a quality acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained at the licensed premises for a minimum period of 30 days after the recording, and shall be surrendered to Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, or Trading Standards immediately on request. The Premises Licence Holder and staff must be capable of operating the CCTV system.


The Premises Licence Holder must keep complete records, such as invoices, receipts and delivery notes, relating to alcohol and cigarettes obtained by him for sale from his shop. Records must include the name, address and telephone number of the supplier, the date of supply, the products supplied, and their prices. Where items have been delivered to his shop from a vehicle details of the vehicle registration, the name of the delivery person and contact details including the name, address and telephone number for the business must be kept. These details must be available on request to Responsible Authorities within 24 hours. The Premises Licence Holder must be able to identify who supplied alcohol and cigarettes present at his premises

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to the Licensing Authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person. Notices regarding the store's Challenge 25 policy must be displayed.

All staff who sell alcohol will be trained to NCPLH (National Certificate of Personal Licence Holder) level. All sales of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by a Personal Licence Holder until such staff have achieved training to NCPLH level.

All staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. Records will be kept of such training, which are signed and dated by the member of staff who has received the training. Staff shall receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records, signed and dated by the member of staff, will be kept of this refresher training. Records of training will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards and other Responsible Authorities on request.

The holder of the premises licence shall keep a written record, namely a refusals book, of those incidents where a person who a member of staff believes to be under the age of 18, and is unable to produce acceptable means of identification proving that they are of 18 years or more, attempts to purchase alcohol and is refused. The record shall include details, in English, of the date, time, a brief description, including estimated age, of the person who attempted to purchase the alcohol, the type of alcohol and the name of the person who refused the sale. Staff shall be trained in the use of the refusals book and it should be kept in a readily accessible place known by all members of staff. The record will be regularly checked by the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor to ensure that all staff are completing records and, and this person will sign and date the record as evidence that they have checked it. The refusals book will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards and other relevant authorities on request.



On 27th July 2010 a complaint was received by Southampton City Council Trading Standards Service alleging that counterfeit Smirnoff Vodka was being sold at Pound Xtra, 106 St Marys Rd, Southampton. The complainant claimed that the Smirnoff Vodka which he had purchased from Pound Xtra had made him ill.

Counterfeit vodka has increasingly been found by Trading Standards Officers around the UK. It is often produced from industrial alcohol which is imported into the country. It is diluted and packed in bottles which are copies of a variety of brands, including Smirnoff. Clearly controls over the quality of the product are not as strict as would be found at a distillery producing the genuine product, and issues have been reported regarding excessive levels of methanol being present, which is poisonous.

On 27th July 2010 an inspection of Pound Xtra was made by a Trading Standards Officer, and samples of Smirnoff Vodka and Marlboro cigarettes were taken from the premises. These were later examined and confirmed as being counterfeit.

Paragraph 11.26 of the October 2010 Amended Guidance Issued Under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states that "there is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously." Which includes "the use of the licensed premises for the sale of smuggled tobacco and alcohol". Counterfeit cigarettes usually originate in China, and are smuggled into the UK. It is also highly unlikely that duty would have been paid on the Smirnoff vodka.

Pound Xtra Review App Form

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

On 27th July 2010 a contacted Southampton Trading Service regarding Pound Xtra, 106 St Marys Road, Southampton. He claimed that he had purchased a 70cl bottle of Smirnoff Vodka there on the 26th July 2010. He drank a quantity of the vodka that evening, which had caused symptoms including vomiting and blurred vision, which he said that he would not usually suffer, and he believed that the vodka was counterfeit (see statement of Joseph Kelly).

On 27th July I visited Pound Xtra. I spoke to Aklilu Alem. He is a partner in the business with his wife Sara Desta Woldemichael, who is the Premise Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor. Mr Alem claimed that his wife is only at the store a couple of times a week, as she looks after their child. Mr Alem is usually present at the store.

Using guidance produced by Diageo, the manufacturer of Smirnoff Vodka, I examined Smirnoff which was displayed for sale behind the counter and identified some which was likely to be counterfeit. I took samples which included 4 x 70cl bottles of Smirnoff Vodka (sample ref 012085 and exhibit LM/1). Mr Alem claimed that he had obtained the Smirnoff and other vodka from a man who had visited his premises in a van, and whom he had no previous dealings with. Mr Alem said he believed the man was from London. He said that he had not paid for the delivery and that the man had told him that he would return to receive payment. He produced a delivery note (exhibit LM/2) which he claimed was for the Smirnoff, however Smirnoff is not one of the products listed on the note.

Whilst searching behind the counter in the store I found a black bin bag containing 72 packs of 20 Marlboro Cigarettes (exhibits LM/3 and LM/4). The packaging didn't look genuine, so I seized them. Mr Alem claimed that the cigarettes were not intended for sale: he said that he was given them to store by a man who he knows as Harvey on the previous evening. I requested to see the CCTV footage of Harvey delivering the cigarettes, and Harvey's telephone number, on this and subsequent occassions, however, despite stating that he would do so, Mr Alem has not provided this information.

On 28th July 2010 I revisited Pound Xtra and found another 70cl bottle of Smirnoff Vodka which appeared to be counterfeit. I took this as a sample (exhibit LM/5). I also visited the complainant, Mr Kelly, and took the remainder of his vodka as a sample (reference CS009275).

Sample reference 012085 and the complainant's sample were submitted to Hampshire Scientific Services, the Public Analyst, and confirmed as being counterfeit (Certificates of Analysis exhibits LM/6 and LM/7). The markings on the 3 remaining bottles (exhibits LM/1 and LM/5) indicate that these are also counterfeit.

A sample of the Marlboro Cigarettes (LM/4) was submitted to Robert Fenton, Security Liaison Manager at the Tobacco Manufacturers Association. He confirmed that they were counterfeit (see statement of Robert Fenton).

Incidents of poisoning following consumption of counterfeit vodka have been reported occurring across the UK. It is not acceptable that a premises licenced by this Authority should become a market place for counterfeit goods. I would therefore request that the following conditions are imposed on the premises licence to promote the licensing objectives:

- "A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained in the licensed premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority, Hampshire Constabulary and Trading Standards. As a minimum, it shall enable surveillance of both external and internal areas of the premises including entrances and exits. Recordings from the system shall be of a quality acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained at the licensed premises for a minimum period of 30 days after the recording, and shall be surrendered to Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, or Trading Standards immediately on request. The Premises Licence Holder and staff must be capable of operating the CCTV system".
- "The Premises Licence Holder must keep complete records, such as invoices, receipts and delivery notes, relating to alcohol and cigarettes obtained by him for sale from his shop. Records must include the name, address and telephone number of the supplier, the date of supply, the products supplied, and their prices. Where items have been delivered to his shop from a vehicle details of the vehicle registration, the name of the delivery person and contact details including the name, address and telephone number for the business must be kept. These details must be available on request to Responsible Authorities within 24 hours. The Premises Licence Holder must be able to identify who supplied alcohol and cigarettes present at his premises "

Mr Alem has previously received a Simple Caution regarding the sale of alcohol to a 15 year old girl which occurred at Pound Xtra on 19th January 2010 so I would also request that the following conditions are imposed on the premises licence so as to assist the licence holder and designated premises supervisor in the effective management of the premises and to promote the licensing objectives.

- "The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to the Licensing Authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person. Notices regarding the store's "Challenge 25" policy must be displayed"
- "All staff who sell alcohol will be trained to NCPLH (National Certificate of Personal Licence Holder) level. All sales of alcohol must be directly supervised and authorised by a Personal Licence Holder until such staff have achieved training to NCPLH level."
- "That staff are trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18; that records are kept of such training, which are signed and dated by the member of staff who has received the training; that staff receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and that records, signed and dated by the member of staff, are kept of this refresher training. Records of training will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards and other Responsible Authorities on request."
- "The holder of the premises licence shall keep a written record, namely a refusals book, of those incidents where a person who a member of staff believes to be under the age of 18, and is unable to produce acceptable means of identification proving that they are of 18 years or more, attempts to purchase alcohol and is refused. The record shall include details, in English, of the date, time, a brief description, including estimated age, of the person who attempted to purchase the alcohol, the type of alcohol and the name of the person who refused the sale. Staff shall be trained in the use of the refusals book and it should be kept in a readily accessible place known by all members of staff. The record will be regularly checked by the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor to ensure that all staff are completing records and, and this person will sign and date the record as evidence that they have

	checked it. The refusals book will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards and other relevant authorities on request."
	- I would also ask that the licence is suspended for a period of 3 months, both as a deterrent and to give the Premises Licence Holder a period of time in which to put the above conditions into effect.

I have examined the packet on an electronic reader and it shown them to be not recognised. I have examined up the packet and discovered that they were in fact hand packed probably from China. I also note that the tear strip on the packet said that they were Exclusive for Duty Free sale and yet the packet itself showed the UK fiscal mark as a duty paid product. There is absolutely no doubt that they are a counterfeit product. The brand owners are Phillip Morris International. After examination I resealed them together with the original seal and bag in a tamper proof bag with seal number BA50147

The Sub-Committee felt it was fortunate that the implications of selling the vodka had not led to more serious results. It was noted that revocation had not been asked for. The Sub-Committee therefore suspended the premises licence for a period of three months.

I am PC 24288 HARRIS, employed by Hampshire constabulary and currently stationed at Southampton Central police station.

On Monday 13 December 2010, I was involved in a joint test purchase operation with Trading Standards. At around 18:05 hours, I attended POUND XTRA OFF LICENCE at 106 ST MARY'S ROAD, SOUTHAMPTON. The test purchaser, who was only 16 years of age, entered the premise and was shortly followed by Elaine GIBSON who is a Southampton City Council Fair Trading officer. Both had only been in the store for a matter of minutes when I saw the test purchaser exit, carrying a bag which contained 3 cans of ZYWIEC beer. GIBSON exited just behind the test purchaser and she told me that a small male of Asian ethnicity had sold the alcohol which she had witnessed.

I then entered the store with GIBSON and we both introduced ourselves to the male cashier who was later identified as Avtar SINGH 25/07/1987. He was informed that she had committed an offence contrary to S146 of the Licensing Act 2003 by selling alcohol to a person under the age of 18. I then informed SINGH that the way I intended on dealing with the offence was by issuing a penalty notice for disorder or he could opt to have the case heard at court. SINGH stated that she would prefer the penalty notice. Regretfully, I was not in possession of a penalty notice at the time so I agreed to meet SINGH at his work the following day. Before leaving the address, I informed SINGH "I AM REPORTING YOU FOR THE OFFENCE OF SELLING ALCOHOL TO A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 18". I then cautioned him to which he made no reply. I returned to the same address at 13:15 hours the following day and PND 2024457 was issued.

The t/p failure that occurred on Monday 13/12/10 was discussed with both Sara and Aklilu and they were asked what measures they have brought into place to prevent another failing. They stated they have now decided to ask everyone (apart from those clearly old enough) for Id. They have implemented the challenge 25 policy and will ensure their staff adhere to this.

SINGH who sold the alcohol on the night is still employed but he has been removed from the counter and will not sell for around 3-4 months. He is being further trained with the view to being sent on a course.

Sara and Aklilu have agreed to print off some challenge 25 posters and place them around their store with reminders on the tills. They have also agreed to train staff on a quarterly basis and will retain records of the training.

They already have a refusals book for alcohol, cigarettes and knives and will continue to maintain this.

I have informed them that I would be happy to go along to any due diligence training to enforce anything they are saving which they seemed keen on. They have my contact details to follow this up.

I reiterated that police will continue to run test purchase operations and highlighted that a further failing would be catastrophic.

Lucas Marshall from Trading standards was also present who is already taking the premise to review in the new year due to a previous test purchase failure and for selling fake alcoholic goods. He advised that he would be added this failure to his presentation.

Following our recent meeting regarding a test purchase failure at Pound Xtra off Licence, I am writing to confirm what was discussed and agreed. Hampshire Constabulary are extremely concerned by the significant failings of your business, which resulted in a 16 year old female being served alcohol. This is in direct breach of licensing objectives.

As a responsible licensee, you should be aware of your obligation to promote the four licensing objectives -

- 1) the prevention of crime and disorder
- 2) public safety
- 3) the prevention of public nuisance
- 4) the protection of children from harm

During the meeting, we discussed the consideration of implementing new measures to prevent further incidents occurring, which could be perceived as undermining or breaching the four licensing objectives.

Since the test purchase failure, you have taken a number of actions to minimise the possibility of future incidents.

I can confirm that it was agreed that:

- 1. The member of staff that sold the alcohol to the test purchaser has been removed from the counter and will not sell alcohol for around 3 to 4 months.
- 2. Challenge 25 policy will now be adhered to and posters will be obtained to display in and outside the premise. A reminder will also be placed on the till to remind staff to challenge.

- You will provide due diligence training to all staff on a quarterly basis and retain records of this training. (I have offered police attendance during training to reinforce what you are saying)
- 4. You have a refusals book in which you record refusals for alcohol, cigarettes and knives.

I am aware that following an investigation by Trading Standards, your premise licence is being reviewed. The test purchase failing will only provide further evidence of poor management. Please be aware that we will continue to operate test purchase operations. Any further failings, I would consider catastrophic and I would be left with little choice, but to apply for a further review of your licence with the objective of having the premise licence revoked.

Hopefully we can work together regarding these issues which will highlight your commitment to supporting the four licensing objectives.

I look forward to hearing from you in the near future.

Eventually he gave up and asked a member of staff. Darota, to do it for him. The system kept jumping to 29/10/11. Tried 03/10/11 still iumped to 29/10/11. The furthest back that the system has retained footage is the 29th October. 4 days. BREACH OF LICENCE.

Records of Invoices - not checked

Challenge 25 - Poster on door, next to 'Crunk Juice on sale here!' sticker. Refusals log viewed, however recent TP failure would indicate BREACH OF LICENCE

NCPLH - The PLH, DPS and two staff are all now personal licence holders.

TRAINING - Staff to be trained regarding underage sales, records to be kept, signed and dated by staff, and refresher training conducted every six months. DPS produced one loose A4 paged document which he had been given by trading standards which details vague aspects of licensing law. There was nothing to cover Challenge 25. He also had several handwritten A4 documents which appeared to be written by Sara - the PLH. It had 5-6 points on it which included 'Remember Challenge 25'. Each page was signed and dated by members of staff -Avtar SINGH, Darota, and ALEM. Dates included 10th October 2010, and 1st April 2011. Nothing more recent. BREACH OF LICENCE.

REFUSALS BOOK - Is up and running and being used. However, the last check of the book was made by Darota on 4th May 2011. There is no evidence of either the DPS or PLH having checked the book. It is certainly not signed or dated as such. BREACH OF LICENCE.

At 1141hrs Aklilu ALEM was reported for being in breach of the premises licence and informed that the premises would be taken to review.

Dear Sir/Madam

I am in receipt of a copy of the Licence Review Application relating to Pound Xtra, 106 St Marys Rd, Licence no. 2011/01632/01SPRD. Southampton City Council Trading Standards Service wishes to make a representation in support of Hampshire Constabulary's application on the grounds of prevention of crime, public safety and protection of children from harm. In November 2010 I applied for a review of the premises licence, relating to the sale of counterfeit alcohol, possession of counterfeit cigarettes and two underage sales of alcohol. The licence was suspended for 3 months and conditions relating to the prevention of under age sales and the keeping of records of alcohol purchased were imposed on the licence.

On 1st September 2011, following a complaint alleging sale of illegal vodka at Pound Xtra, I visited the shop and examined spirits displayed for sale behind the counter. One of the spirits, Vantage Vodka, was priced at only £6.99: this is a very low price for a 70cl bottle of vodka, and would not cover the cost of duty and VAT, which would be approximately £8.00. A sample of the product was taken and submitted for analysis. Compositionally it was found to be satisfactory, however given the low price, and that the duty number, A40000000892, is not a valid number, it is likely to be non-duty paid. It is an offence under Section 144 of the Licensing Act 2003, for keeping on the premises goods which have been imported without payment of duty or which have otherwise been unlawfully imported, and Regulation 8 of the Consumer Protection from Unfair Trading Regulations 2008, for stating or otherwise creating the impression that a product can legally be sold when it cannot. There were a total of 120 bottles of the product in the store. There is a condition on the licence that: "The Premises Licence Holder must keep complete records, such as invoices, receipts and delivery notes, relating to alcohol and cigarettes obtained by him for sale from his shop. Records must include the name, address and telephone number of the supplier, the date of supply, the products supplied, and their prices. Where items have been delivered to his shop from a vehicle details of the vehicle registration, the name of the delivery person and contact details including the name, address and telephone number for the business must be kept. These details must be available on request to Responsible Authorities within 24 hours. The Premises Licence Holder must be able to identify who supplied alcohol and cigarettes present at his premises".

Mr Alem provided delivery notes which he claimed related to deliveries of the Vantage Vodka, however they do not clearly itemise the quantity of Vantage Vodka purchased by Mr Alem and do not correlate with the quantity which I found on the premises. There has clearly been a breach of this condition. Additionally details regarding the delivery vehicle had not been recorded. A copy of my statement regarding this matter is included in the Application.

Repeat under age sales and possession of illegal alcohol demonstrate little regard for the licensing objectives. Conditions imposed on the licence to assist the Premises Licence Holder and DPS in the prevention of further such incidents have not been implemented. Mr Alem, who is the DPS, owner and manager of the store is not competent in this role. In my opinion revocation of the licence is the only means by which further incidents at the premises can be avoided. Yours faithfully
