

Legal Implications

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
- 2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
- 3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
- 4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must makes its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

5. Crime and Disorder Act 1998

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.


6. Human Rights Act 1998

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I am writing to lodge a representation to the above application on the following grounds:

- 1) The prevention of crime and disorder.
- 2) Public safety.
- 3) The prevention of public nuisance.
- 3) The protection of children from harm.

The Police do not object to the additional licensing activities applied for but do object to the increase in hours and make representations based on the effects of cumulative impact.

The venue is located within a "Special Policy" area.

The Police are of the opinion that this application, if granted, has the potential to give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The DCMS (Department of Culture, Media and Sport) guidelines state that "The effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives"

The Police would suggest that the applicant has not demonstrated within the operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

Southampton's night time economy (NTE) has been shown to fuel increased levels of violence and criminal damage offences throughout the year. Beat areas SW01 (City Centre) and SW03 (Polygon), which is where the majority of the night time economy is concentrated, comfortably show the highest numbers of assault offences in the area despite their comparatively small size.

In 2011 in the Polygon area there were 258 assaults and a further 292 section 27 dispersals where officers have tried to remove people from the area before incidents occur. This clearly shows the impact that late night licensed premises have on an area and why the city council put their policy into

place.

Hampshire Constabulary feels that the increase in hours will have an effect in the area and ask that the committee consider this application taking into account the City Council guidelines.

The premises has been visited by police and on the 30th September 2011 the manager was unable to download the CCTV footage and stated that the DPS could but was not on site at the time. On all attendances the DPS has not been on site and the manager, who is a family member of the DPS lives above the premises and is appears to be running the business. A meeting was arranged with the DPS on the 21st December 2011 but the DPS did not attend and the manager did. The manager was requested to download some CCTV footage but could not get the system to playback and did not know when it had stopped working. The manager was asked for staff training records and he could not find the due diligence training records and he could not produce a refusals log. When asked he was not sure on what age verification scheme they operated to and went and checked a poster and answered that it said challenge 21. The incident book was produced on request and was being filled in when the doorstaff were in but one of the incidents I could not understand what had been written and neither could the manager. This meeting had raised a number of concerns about the management of the premises; the manager who was on site in charge of the premises had not automatically known the age verification policy and did not know where the refusals log was. This raises concerns under the licensing objectives of crime and disorder, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. The CCTV condition had been breached as they could not provide the CCTV requested and the incident log was not being maintained if the entries were not legible. These conditions were put in place to address concerns under crime and disorder at the premises.

These concerns were raised with the premises licence holder and the DPS, who stated that he had not attended the first meeting due to a family emergency, so another meeting was arranged for the 29th December 2011. At this meeting the DPS was able to produce the training records for staff and stated that they were now going to operate to a challenge 25 policy. He produced the refusals log and showed the incident book which were both being fully operated from after the meeting on the 21st December. It is felt that the newer conditions in relation to CCTV and Incident Book give much more guidance to the premises licence holder and DPS as to what is expected in relation to the maintenance and checking of them.

If the premises was being effectively managed then it is still felt that there would be a negative impact in the area on having an extension in a stress area; but where the premises is not being effectively managed this concern is increased and the impact would be greater should extra hours be granted.

State any conditions that the Police seek to negate the need for a hearing

There is no objection to the additional licensing activities if they fall in line with the current hours of the licence and no objection to those additional licensing activities on the non-standard hours applied for being the same as currently on the licence. There would be no objection to all applied for remaining within the current operating hours of the premises.

To ensure minimum impact to the area it is suggested that the management improve by strengthening the CCTV and Incident book conditions to leave no doubt as to the premises responsibilities in

relation to them and that staff training and refusals book conditions are added. These would ensure that the premises are supporting the licensing objectives and would help to reduce the concerns under the licensing objectives as would result in less drunk persons leaving the premises and therefore have less of an impact on the area.
