Dear Sir,

This letter is in reference to a visit made to the above premises on 10<sup>th</sup> February 2012.

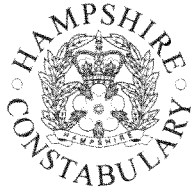
On arrival at the premises, we were most concerned that the entrance doors were unlocked and anyone free to gain entry. As we have highlighted, the licence is a club certificate and not a premises licence. Under the Licensing Act 2003, alcohol should only be sold to members of the club and guests of members. If there is no restriction to public access, then the premises is effectively being used as a public house.

During the visit, further breaches in the licence were being committed. It was apparent that whilst we were on the premises that a child 13 years of age, had not been recorded in the signing in book. This is a breach of the following condition:

*All members and guests of members who are aged from 13 to 17 years inclusive shall enter their membership details, name and age in a register kept at the Club for the purpose. Such register shall be available for inspection at the Club by police officers and authorised officers of the licensing authority on request.*

Further to this, your new CCTV system is still in breach of your conditions. No one present was able to operate the system and although I was verbally told that it recorded for 30 days, no evidence could be provided to confirm this. The image from the main lounge/bar was still inadequate and there was no facility for recorded footage to be copied to disc. This is a breach of the following condition:

*A CCTV system shall be maintained in the licensed premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and Hampshire Constabulary. As a minimum, it shall enable surveillance of both external and internal areas of the premises including entrances and exits. Recordings from the system shall be of quality acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained at the licensed*

*premises for a minimum period of 30 days after recording, and shall be surrendered to Hampshire Constabulary or the Licensing Authority immediately on request.*

I would request that you resolve the above issues immediately or cease all licensable activity at the premises. Please update me with your proposed actions.
