DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

Members are required to disclose, in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct, **both** the existence **and** nature of any "Disclosable Personal Interest" or "Other Interest" they may have in relation to matters for consideration on this Agenda.

DISCLOSABLE PERSONAL INTERESTS

A Member must regard himself or herself as having a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest in any matter that they or their spouse, partner, a person they are living with as husband or wife, or a person with whom they are living as if they were a civil partner in relation to:

(i) Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.

(ii) Sponsorship:

Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from Southampton City Council) made or provided within the relevant period in respect of any expense incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

(iii) Any contract which is made between you / your spouse etc (or a body in which the you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interest) and Southampton City Council under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed, and which has not been fully discharged.

(iv) Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of Southampton.

(v) Any license (held alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of Southampton for a month or longer.

(vi) Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) the landlord is Southampton City Council and the tenant is a body in which you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interests.

(vii) Any beneficial interest in securities of a body where that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of Southampton, and either:

- a) the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body, or
- b) if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you / your spouse etc has a beneficial interest that exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Other Interests

A Member must regard himself or herself as having a, 'Other Interest' in any membership of, or occupation of a position of general control or management in:

Any body to which they have been appointed or nominated by Southampton City Council

Any public authority or body exercising functions of a public nature

Any body directed to charitable purposes

Any body whose principal purpose includes the influence of public opinion or policy

Principles of Decision Making

All decisions of the Council will be made in accordance with the following principles:-

- proportionality (i.e. the action must be proportionate to the desired outcome);
- due consultation and the taking of professional advice from officers;
- respect for human rights;
- a presumption in favour of openness, accountability and transparency;
- setting out what options have been considered;
- setting out reasons for the decision; and
- clarity of aims and desired outcomes.

In exercising discretion, the decision maker must:

- understand the law that regulates the decision making power and gives effect to it. The decision-maker must direct itself properly in law;
- take into account all relevant matters (those matters which the law requires the authority as a matter of legal obligation to take into account);
- leave out of account irrelevant considerations;
- act for a proper purpose, exercising its powers for the public good;
- not reach a decision which no authority acting reasonably could reach, (also known as the "rationality" or "taking leave of your senses" principle);
- comply with the rule that local government finance is to be conducted on an annual basis. Save to the extent authorised by Parliament, 'live now, pay later' and forward funding are unlawful; and
- act with procedural propriety in accordance with the rules of fairness.

RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 19 September 2013 be approved and signed as a correct record.

RESOLVED that in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 that the press and public be excluded at a predetermined point whilst the Sub-Committee reach its decisions.

27. **APPLICATION FOR PREMISES LICENCE - DEVON STORE, 127 OBELISK ROAD, SOUTHAMPTON, SO19 9DN**

RESOLVED that the application be adjourned to 31 October 2013.

28. **APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE - JUNK CLUB, 55 LONDON ROAD, SOUTHAMPTON, SO15 2AD**

RESOLVED that the application be adjourned to 7 November 2013.

29. **APPLICATION FOR PREMISES LICENCE - SHELL UK OIL PRODUCTS LTD, BASSETT AVENUE, SOUTHAMPTON, SO16 7LQ**

The Sub-Committee considered the application for a premises licence in respect of Shell UK Oil Products Ltd, Bassett Avenue, Southampton SO16 7LQ. (Copy of report circulated with the agenda and appended to the signed minutes)

Mr Charalambides (Counsel for applicant), Mr Lockett (Agent for applicant), Mr and Mrs Nicholson (local residents), PC Norris and PC Smith, Hampshire Constabulary were present and with the consent of the Chair, addressed the meeting.

The Sub-Committee considered the decision in confidential session in accordance with the Licensing Act (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

RESOLVED that the application for a premises licence be granted subject to the conditions agreed with police and the conditions agreed at the meeting.

After private deliberation the Sub-Committee reconvened and the Chair read the following decision with reasons (subject to discussion regarding conditions):-

The Sub-Committee has considered very carefully the application for a premises licence at Shell Bassett Avenue. It has given due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Objectives, statutory guidance and the adopted statement of Licensing Policy. Human rights legislation has been borne in mind.

It has considered very carefully all the evidence submitted by all parties, both written and given orally today, including the additional information supplied by the applicant.

The Sub-Committee heard an initial application by the applicant to consider the effect of the European Services Directive and in particular Regulation 19 relating to authorisation procedures and the time for dealing with applications. The Sub-Committee considered (i) the fact that notice had not been given to the applicant with the hearing notice, (ii) the fact that the hearing and consideration of the application had taken in excess of a year and (iii) that the matter had already been adjourned on two occasions. These factors, the applicant asserted, meant that the application could not now be heard and that the application should be deemed to have been granted in accordance with subsection 5. The Sub-Committee determined that the process was, however, justified by overriding reasons relating to the public interest, including a legitimate interest of third parties. It arrived at this conclusion on the basis that third parties, in this case, the police and residential objectors, were entitled to a fair hearing and an expectation that their objection would properly and fully be heard, accordingly to fail to hear the application in full could be a contravention of their Human Rights amounting to an overriding reason.

The Sub-Committee after careful consideration of all the factors has determined to grant the application subject to the following conditions:

- 1) The premises licence holder shall ensure that figures enabling the comparison of total turnover (excluding VAT) at the premises for fuel with convenience store goods are produced to the Licensing Authority at six-monthly intervals and covering the same period.
- 2) A minimum of two litter bins shall be placed on the forecourt of the premises. A minimum of two litter picks will take place per day to cover the forecourt area and the immediate vicinity of the premises.
- 3) The premises shall not be permitted to sell individual cans or bottles of lager, beer, cider or spirit mixer drinks and shall not sell, in any case, high strength lager, beer, cider or spirit mixer (in this instance "high strength" means drinks above 6.0% ABV).

In addition, the Sub Committee confirmed and imposed conditions that had been agreed between the applicant and the Police relating to CCTV, Incident book, Refusals book, Challenge 25 and training.

Reasons

The Sub-Committee listened carefully to the representations of residents and heard evidence presented by the applicant, including an explanation of figures produced. In addition the Sub-Committee heard evidence from the Police primarily in relation to the primary use of the premises as a garage.

It is noted that the applicant has on two previous occasions been required to produce figures relating to transactions by way of number with regards fuel purchases only, fuel and convenience purchases and convenience purchases only as well as comparison of turnover excluding VAT. It is further noted that the applicant has failed to produce that information despite on the last occasion, the Sub-Committee requesting only two weeks of figures. The Sub-Committee is extremely disappointed to be in the same position and without the information it has requested in accordance with the hearings regulations.

The Sub-Committee is, however, no longer willing to adjourn the application any further and has determined to make a decision based on the evidence that it has before it. On the basis of the statistics presented the Sub-Committee has no option other than to conclude that the primary use of the premises is not that of a garage. The statistics show that the highest proportion of turnover at the premises, excluding VAT relates to convenience store items and there is no evidence presented to the Sub-Committee to warrant an alternative determination at this time.

There is a right of appeal for all parties to the Magistrates' Court. All parties will receive written notification of the decision with reasons and that notification will set out the right of appeal in full.

30. **APPLICATION FOR PREMISES LICENCE - SHELL HAMPTON COURT, 197 BURGESS ROAD, SOUTHAMPTON, SO17 1TU**

The Sub-Committee considered the application for a premises licence in respect of Shell Hampton Court, 197 Burgess Road, Southampton SO17 1TU. (Copy of report circulated with the agenda and appended to the signed minutes)

Mr Charalambides (Counsel for applicant), Mr Lockett (Agent for applicant), PC Norris and PC Smith, Hampshire Constabulary were present and with the consent of the Chair, addressed the meeting.

The Sub-Committee considered the decision in confidential session in accordance with the Licensing Act (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The issue being precisely the same (save for the lack of residential objection) as that determined in the previous agenda item, the Sub-Committee indicated it was minded to make a similar determination and invited representations. Both parties accepted the similarity and no objection was raised other than noting minor differences.

RESOLVED that the application for a premises licence be granted subject to the conditions agreed with police and the conditions agreed at the meeting. Further, that a similar decision to the former be imposed save for minor amendment as follows:

The Sub-Committee has considered very carefully the application for a premises licence at Shell Hampton Park. It has given due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Objectives, statutory guidance and the adopted statement of Licensing Policy. Human rights legislation has been borne in mind.

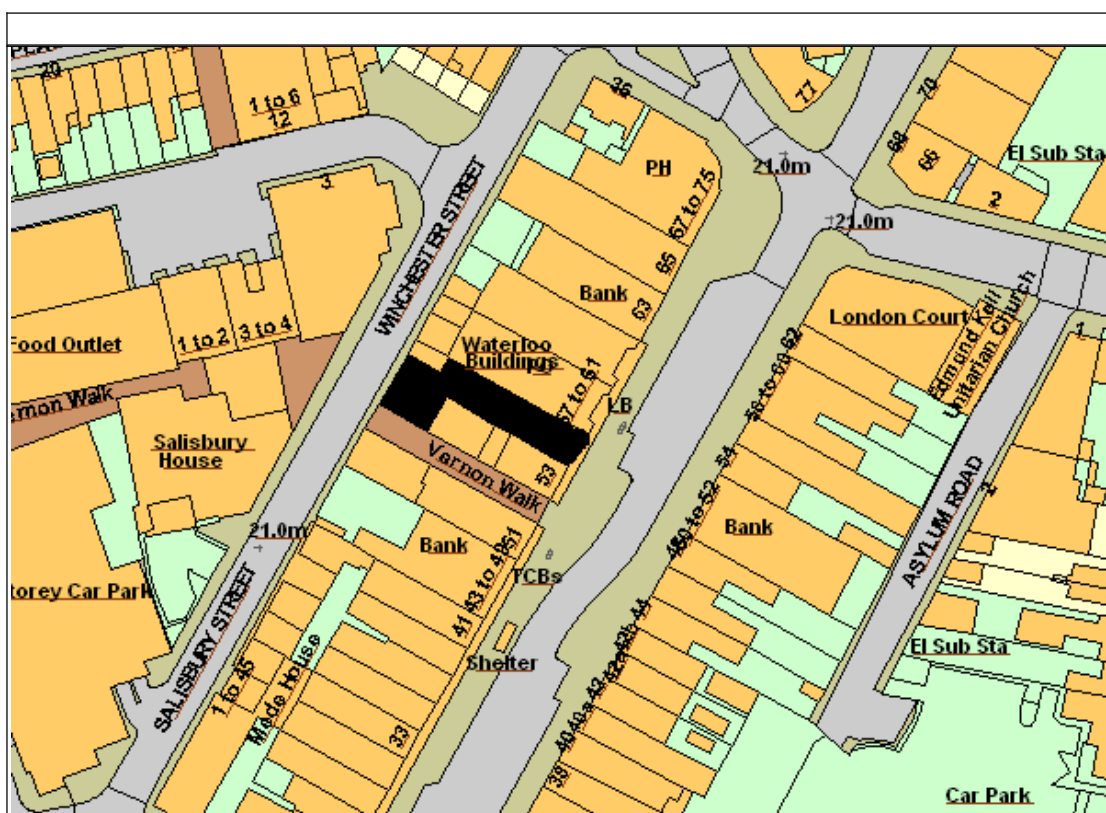

Legal Implications

1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.
3. An applicant for a variation, whose application has been refused, or who is aggrieved by conditions imposed, may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.
4. In considering this application the committee will sit in a quasi-judicial capacity and is thus obliged to consider applications in accordance with both the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, and amending secondary legislation and the rules of natural justice. The practical effect of this is that the committee must make its decision based on evidence submitted in accordance with the legislation and give

adequate reasons for reaching it's decision.

The committee must also have regard to:-

5. *Crime and Disorder Act 1998*

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places the Council under a duty to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area.

6. *Human Rights Act 1998*

The Act requires UK legislation to be interpreted in a manner consistent with the European Convention on Human Rights. It is unlawful for the Council to act in a way that is incompatible (or fail to act in a way that is compatible) with the rights protected by the Act. Any action undertaken by the Council that could have an effect upon another persons Human Rights must be taken having regard to the principle of Proportionality - the need to balance the rights of the individual with the rights of the community as a whole. Any action taken by the Council which affect another's rights must be no more onerous than is necessary in a democratic society. The matter set out in this report must be considered in light of the above obligations.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

- Adopt the best practice for training recommended by the Hampshire Police Licensing Authority
- Support the new Police Scheme which accredits venues for their welfare and safety policies.
- This will also include a training session given by a member of the Licensing team on a 6 monthly basis.
- Introduce an identification receipt system for seized ID's
- Ensure a written dispersal policy is in place and approved by Hampshire Police
- All in-house staff shall undergo an online licensing accreditation procedure approved by Hampshire police within 4 weeks of their start date
- Toilet checks will be added to the licensing conditions and will include checks every 30 minutes and recorded in the incident book and kept for a minimum of 3 months
- We also believe that by extending our licence in this way will bring us in line with other clubs in other cities of a similar type who also promote Internationally renowned DJs and Artists. The Artists we currently book and will be able to book will attract discerning music loving clientele into the area rather than simply cheap drink orientated customers. These Acts and Artists in turn promote Southampton as a cultural destination which raises the profile of the city. We have been successfully operating temporary event notices until 6am for many years without objection from the responsible authorities.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The venue has a dedicated SIA Trained security team along with CCTV with clearly visible signs.
- The venue operates with a strict door entry policy which ensures the venue has an excellent level of clientele. This in turn ensures a very low level of crime and disorder.
- Doorstaff often help Hampshire Constabulary with incidents in the local area (positive intervention).
- Participation in the Southampton Licensing Link scheme, including the Red Card and use of ID scanner.
- Use of tall Heras fence barriers and tarpaulin to segregate and protect customers in the smoking area from vagrants and potentially unruly passers by.

c) Public safety

- The venue will have a dedicated medical room for the purposes of administering first aid. A first aid treatment box will be available and kept maintained. Persons identified as vulnerable will be taken to the room where enquiries can be conducted to ensure their safety.
- On Fridays, Saturdays and special events the venue will provide a First Aider qualified to minimum Emergency First Aid at Work level and the DPS will ensure the First Aider's qualification is valid.
- A member of staff will be employed to patrol and monitor customers for signs and/or symptoms of excess alcohol consumption. Anyone suspected of consuming excess amounts of alcohol will be taken to the first aid room. The club nanny will monitor persons purchasing alcohol to check they are not mixing multiple shots or measures together to ensure responsible alcohol consumption. A record will be maintained providing details of persons attended to, date, time, along with with the members of staff involved.
- All staff including bar staff and security have been trained in fire safety by a certified company
- The public toilets within the premises shall be checked every 30 minutes when the premises are open for a licensable activity. A record shall be kept by the premises for a period of 3

months for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary.

- Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, crime scene management, vulnerability, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.
- All staff will receive refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training
- In addition to their training a written test related to the training will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol sales. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate should be 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and retested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of 2 sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.
- All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any other responsible authority and kept on the licensed premises for a period of 2 years

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- The venue already has a dispersal policy in the conditions to the satisfaction of the Hampshire Constabulary, and goes above and beyond what is expected by providing the Police with positive intervention assistance in the London Road area
 - Door supervisors will remove all bottles and glasses from any customers attempting to leave the venue carrying such items
 - Doorstaff wearing high visibility armbands will patrol the venue at the end of each night for a period of 30 minutes or until such persons are dispersed from the area to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of customers. Any customers congregating or loitering outside the venue after leaving the premises will be asked to depart quickly and quietly
- Notices will continue to be displayed in prominent positions at the exit of the premises requesting customers to leave quickly and quietly.
- During the last 30 minutes of trading the service points at the bar will be reduced and staff reallocated to collect glasses
- When the bar closes the lighting levels will be increased to encourage the gradual dispersal of customers in the bar area
- Music will be lowered in volume in the last 15 minutes of trading, so that for those customers that remain it will send out a clear message that the venue is preparing to close and to encourage customers to be ready to leave
- The venue is part of the Licensing link and Red Card scheme which ensures it shares information about troublesome individuals with the rest of the licensees



State the ground(s) for representation *(please read guidance notes 1 & 2)*

This representation relates to Junk Club, which is situated in London Road. The premises is located in one of the areas of Southampton, subject to a policy of cumulative impact as detailed in the present Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-2014, issued by Southampton City Council as the licensing authority.

The area of concern in this particular case is the Bedford Place Stress Area, which based on evidence previously received by Southampton City Council, is one of 3 areas that already suffers cumulative impact. As a result it is appropriate, proportionate and necessary for special policies to address that issue.

As per paragraph 16.7 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, Hampshire Police make representations on the basis that the applicant is applying for a significant variation to the premises existing licence. The applicant has applied to extend the premises opening hours by 1.5 hours every Saturday and 30 minutes every other day of the week. This in total provides the premises with a total of 4.5 hours of extended trading time per week or 234 hours over the course of a year. The applicant requests to extend the supply by retail of alcohol by the same increment although supply would cease as it does at the moment, half an hour before the closing time. Licensable activities such as recorded music and live music, the applicant seeks to extend these and keep them in line with the proposed opening hours.

The venue has submitted 9 temporary event notices (TEN) so far this year to extend its operating hours and licensable activities to 06:00 hours on 13 nights it was trading. However, it has been noted that of those 13 nights, only 6 occasions did the premises remain open until 06:00 hours and 1 night to 05:00 on a Saturday. On another occasion, the venue still closed at 04:00 and the other TEN's have occurred on other nights of the week. Although there has not been many incidents linked to Junk near to the 06:00 closing on a Sunday morning, six occasions is quite different to the 52 occasions that the extension to the licence would provide.

The police would suggest that the temporary events have only occurred on select nights. A bank holiday weekend or when a particular DJ is in attendance. People will not generally hear about the extended opening times unless it is a particular DJ they follow in comparison to the venue having an extension to its licence every night of the week. A TEN limits the amount of people that can attend to 499, which includes all its staff. Whereas the capacity for the venue is 750, an increase of 50%. There are other factors that make the application more significant. The venue wishes to extend its last entry from 02:30 to 03:30. This will likely attract further crowds that are leaving other venues and likely to be well under the influence of alcohol. This will place a heavy burden on the door security team at the venue in assessing who is fit or not fit for entry. The police anticipate, that by extending the venues hours and increasing the hours alcohol is available for consumption, on the balance of

probabilities this will only add to crime and disorder already experienced in the area.

The graph in annex a shows reported incidents in the demographic beat area of 1SW03 over three different years. As the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) was applied to the city in May 2009, the report shows crime reporting trends a year before the introduction of the CIP and then comparisons can be made between 2010 - 2011 and 2012 to 2013. The search criteria takes into account crimes of wounding, robbery - personal, public order, offensive weapon, indecent assault, drug offences, criminal damage, assault on police and assault. Regardless of year, the graph clearly shows the detrimental effect the night time economy and alcohol has on crime reporting. In each of the years evidenced, it shows a steady increase in crime reporting from 22:00 until 03:00 hours, with a dramatic drop between 05:00 - 06:00, when the majority of licensed premises are closed. Between 2010 and 2011, the area did become far more popular for a night out and this can be evidenced by the increase in crimes between 23:00 - 04:00 hours. The main concern to be drawn from the graph is there is far more crime being reported in the early hours of the morning in 2012 - 2013 than there was in 2008 - 2009. Between 03:00 - 05:00, we are seeing an increase of nearly 50% of the crimes highlighted above when compared to crime reported in 2008. As to whether the CIP has worked in this area is hard to say. As mentioned, the area did become much more popular for a night out, so taking this into account, its probably fair to say it has prevented it from getting any worse. If you compare the crimes reported in 2008 between 18:00 and 06:00, there were 732 reported in 2008-2009 compared to 837 reported between 2012 and 2013.

Annex b provides a list of occurrences that have been linked directly to Junk since the turn of the year. They are linked, as the occurrences would have occurred in the venue or involved its clientele. Most of the incidents have happened between the hours of 02:00 and 04:00, which is the last two hours the premises is normally open. People in general are coming out later at night than they used to and they will stay out later if the premises are open to cater for them into the early hours. By providing premises with even later opening times will only exasperate the problem and we will see further increases in crime in the early hours of the morning.

The applicant has advised that as part of the additional steps they intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives they will include supporting the police in its new scheme, which accredits venues for their welfare and safety policies. This scheme is still in the process of being produced and will have set criteria that venues will have to meet in order to be eligible. Until it is agreed as to what the criteria is, we cannot say whether or not the scheme would be offered to Junk.

The applicant has stated that "the venue operates a strict door entry policy which ensures the venue has an excellent level of clientele and in turn ensures a very low level of crime and disorder". The police have passed praise to the door team for having caught a number of its clientele with drugs over the past year. Annex b shows that 10 of the occurrences listed were drug related. Occurrence 20 was excellent work by door staff, as they stopped a male upon entry to the venue. He was later identified as a London based drug dealer who had on him around 30 mixed wraps of cocaine, MDMA and ketamine. Two class a drugs and a class c drug which were intended to be sold in the venue. Occurrence 25 provides details about a group of males located in the toilets of the venue by door staff.

It is again good work by the door team, as the suspect had enough MDMA in separate wraps to be charged with possession with intent to supply. The other 8 occurrences relate to general possession of drugs including MDMA, amphetamine/speed, ketamine and heroin. Of note, one of the arrested used to be a resident DJ at the venue. As much as the venue can be congratulated for its work in identifying these offenders, it does raise concerns regarding the venues clientele that it attracts. The drugs found on the offenders above, the majority have been linked with the club and rave scene for years. Annex c details a visit to the venue by PC Conway and PS Plascott on 01/03/13. The bar manager informed the officers their was an incident which involved the main act who were performing at the venue. The head doorman had gone into the toilet and caught one of the group snorting cocaine of his arm.

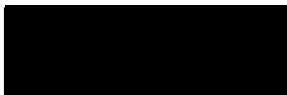
There are a number of other occurrences listed in annex b which raise concern about the venues clientele or certainly would go against the applicants suggestion that they are excellent. In occurrence 11, a male is assaulted by another and the offender bites through his lip. The offender has since been charged with causing grievous bodily harm (GBH). Occurrence 8, relates to 3 door staff being assaulted as does occurrence 9. Occurrence 15 details an assault on the manager of the venue. The manager was punched in the face as he tried to stop a customer from stealing a bottle of Vodka and Rum. Occurrence 1 relates to criminal damage to the designated premises supervisors (DPS) vehicle. A male in the smoking area throws a shoe which hits the bonnet.

Under the prevention of crime and disorder in the operating schedule, the applicant has listed a number of ways they intend on promoting the licensing objectives. This is nothing different to what they do already so there is no reason to suspect anything different if the venue was to operate to a later time.

The applicant also wishes to bring in an exception to its current condition relating to serving drinks in polycarbonate glasses. We do not have concerns with regards to the exception of champagne glasses being permitted within the VIP area, however, we do not consider that there is any evidence to suggest that Corona or Desperados will attract a higher class of clientele as stated by the applicant. Empty glass bottles can easily be used as a weapon during an altercation, with glass more likely to cause serious injury and permanent disfigurement.

It is on the above grounds that the police wish to object to the proposed variations. Any extension in hours is likely to add to problems already experienced in an area, highly saturated with licensed premises.

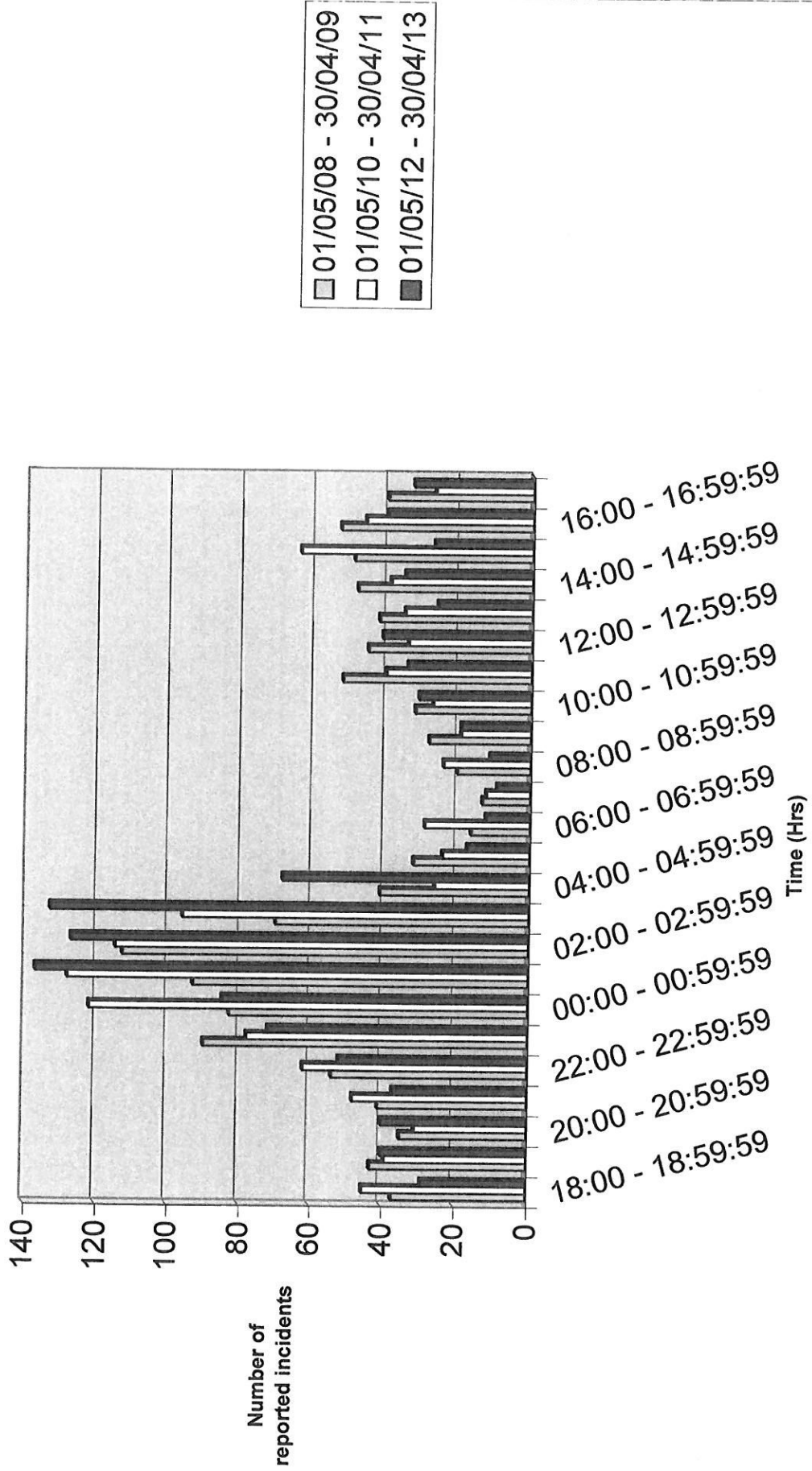

01/03/13 - I have attended Junk this evening with Pc Conway in response to this incident and 44130076952 which happened in the early hours of this morning. We spoke with door staff and with the Bar Manager, both stated that the males involved in this incident were actually the main act performing at the venue. Their details will be available. The head Doorman, Chris stated that as he walked into the gents toilets within the venue he noticed that one of this group was snorting a line of cocaine from off of his forearm. Chris challenged this male who became abusive and tried to continue taking the drug. Chris started to eject this male and when doing so the rest of the male's friends, approx 10, all began to get abusive, one or two began throwing glasses and a chair. The doorstaff were outnumbered at one stage and called WWUN. Police attended and the group were dispersed.

I have challenged the door staff as to why they have not provided statements and more details as the males in this group should be at the very least provided with a red card ban if we are unable to prove any substantive offences.

However they state that they do have CCTV and there are staff who witnessed this incident, Chris the doorman will provide a statement.

I have tasked the original officer who attended to re-attend take statements and cctv footage to progress this.

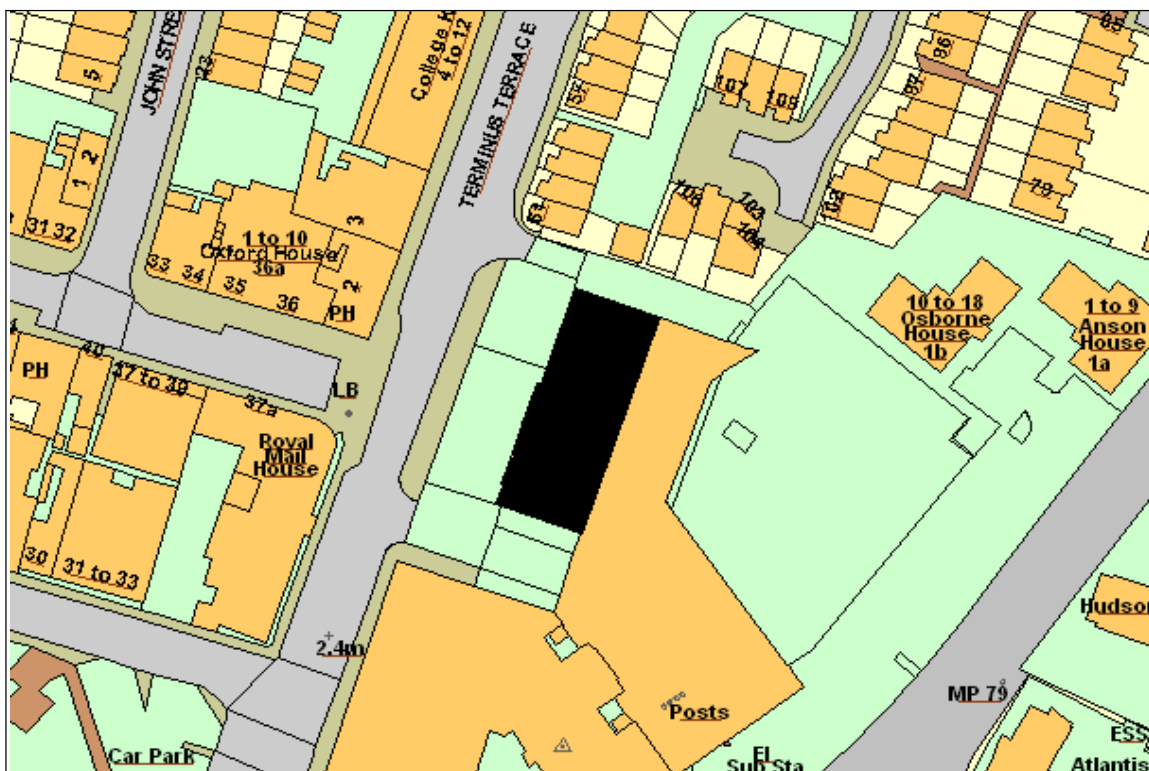

Legal Implications

1. The Licensing Act 2003 specifically restricts the grounds on which the Council, as Licensing Authority (LA), may refuse an application for a major variation of a Premises Licence, or impose conditions. Where relevant representations are made, the LA may refuse on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not met or the operating schedule is inadequate. Equally, conditions may be imposed where relevant and necessary. The LA may also refuse an application in part and thereby only permit some of the licensable activities sought.
2. The decision making committee, in considering an application, must have regard to the adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and any relevant representations made by those directly affected.



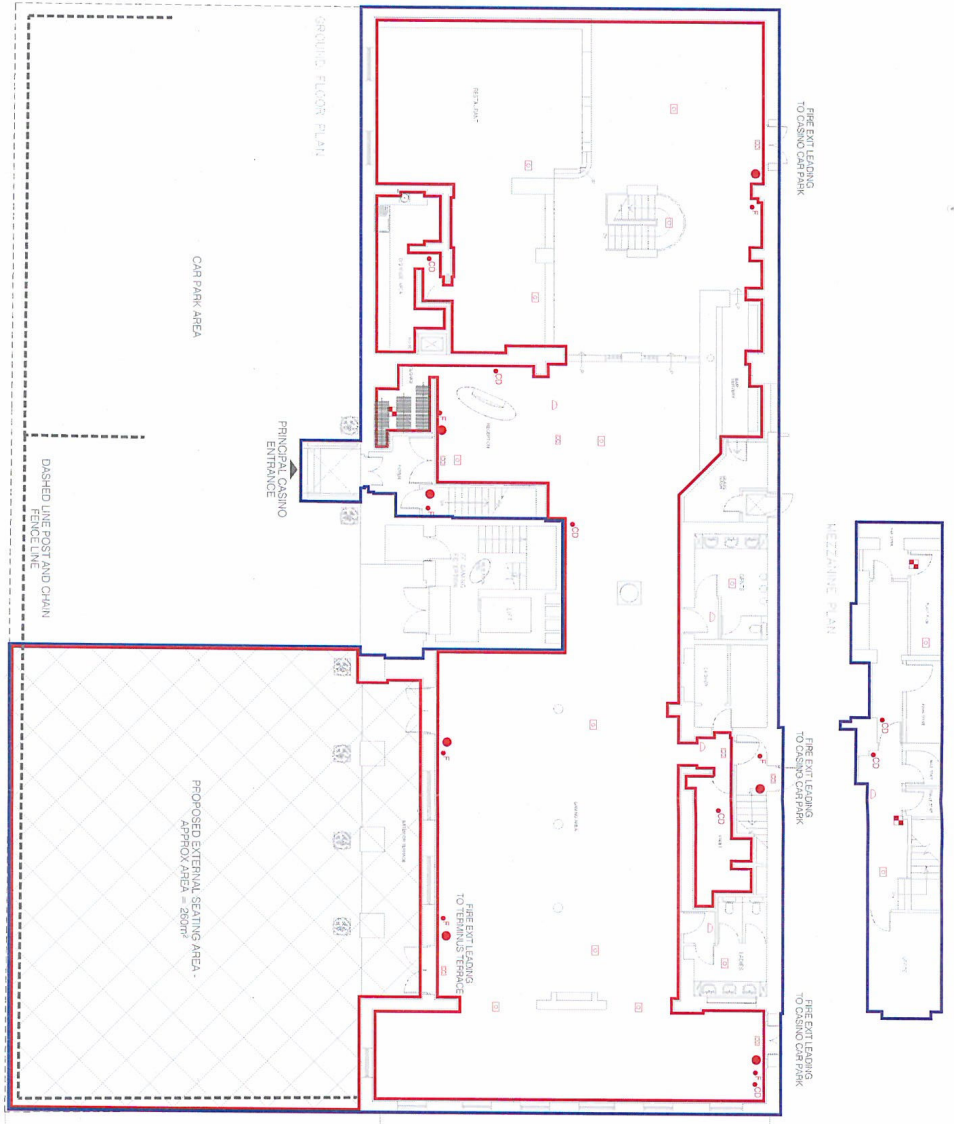
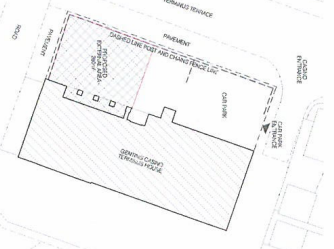

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I am writing to lodge a representation of the above application on the following grounds:

- 1) The prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2) Public Safety
- 3) The prevention of Public Nuisance.

The police have concerns over the application which are detailed below.

The applicants are requesting to extend the area licensed for the sale of alcohol and late night refreshments into the external area at the front of the premises from 08 00hrs to 02 00hrs (appendix A) and if granted the removal of the existing condition stating "all activities permitted by this licence shall take place inside the Licensed Premises". The police have been in discussions with the applicants discussing the implementation of two conditions and agreeing hours for the external area of Mon to Wed 08 00 to 01 00hrs, Thurs, Fri and Sat 08 00hrs to 01 30hrs and Sunday 08 00hrs to 00 30hrs. The premises is in an area with a high amount of assorted public houses and restaurants and also many residential properties. The application has been submitted in order that the venue can try and increase their trade and compete with the neighbouring businesses by allowing customers to benefit from sitting outside for a meal or a drink in clement weather which they cannot currently offer. The police have concerns that without conditions in place there could be an increase in crime and disorder and public nuisance caused by patrons being in drink and or making excessive noise. This could impact on members of the public passing by or the nearby residents.

There is a cctv condition currently in place however we are just requesting that a more up to date condition is applied to the licence. Theoretically there is going to be an increase in trade which in turn increases the likelihood of crime and disorder. The premises currently only has to secure footage of the reception area for 31 days. We are requesting that if any incidents take place which are recorded at the venue any footage of that incident will be backed up and retained. Any footage other than in the reception area is only secured for 7 days.

There is currently only one nearby venue which still has tables and chairs outside in the early hours of the morning and we have requested that the venue adjust the requested opening hours to ensure that there is no real increase to nearby residents caused by noise. The venue currently have a 24 hour licence so they are still able to supply alcohol and late night refreshments to their patrons however this will need to take place within the venue. I do not feel it necessary for patrons to be outside the venue until 02 00hrs and the slight amendment to the requested hours should have no real impact on them. Unfortunately we have not managed to come to an agreement in the time allowed and so

Outside Checks

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that any patrons using the outside licensed area at the front of the premises after 22 00hrs do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance. Checks are to be made at 30 minute intervals and records are to made and should be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority. The records should be retained for a period of 3 months.

CCTV

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system will be able to cope with strobe lighting (where used) and all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas.

CCTV warning signs to be fitted in public places.

The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second and the recordings of the reception area shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

The DPS or premises manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff at the premises during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies immediately to police on request when investigating allegations of offences or criminal activity. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS. Footage supplied in a digital format on CD or DVD will also have a copy of the CCTV system software enabled on the disc to allow playback.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST
