Cupressus macrocarpa 'Goldcrest' AGM

Preferred common name Monterey cypress 'Goldcrest'

Family Cupressaceae

Cupressus are vigorous, evergreen trees with flaking or scaly bark, often with columnar or narrowly ovoid crowns, small, often aromatic, scale-like leaves and small, spherical female cones

'Goldcrest' is a narrowly columnar, evergreen conifer with bright golden-yellow foliage in ascending sprays, colour persisting into winter

How to grow Sunlight

Full sun

Aspect

- South-facing, North-facing, West-facing or East-facing
- Sheltered

Cultivation

Grow in any well-drained soil in full sun with shelter from cold, drying winds. Tolerates dry conditions when established. Can be used for hedging

Soil

- Well-drained
- · Acid, Alkaline or Neutral
- · Chalk, Clay, Sand or Loam
