

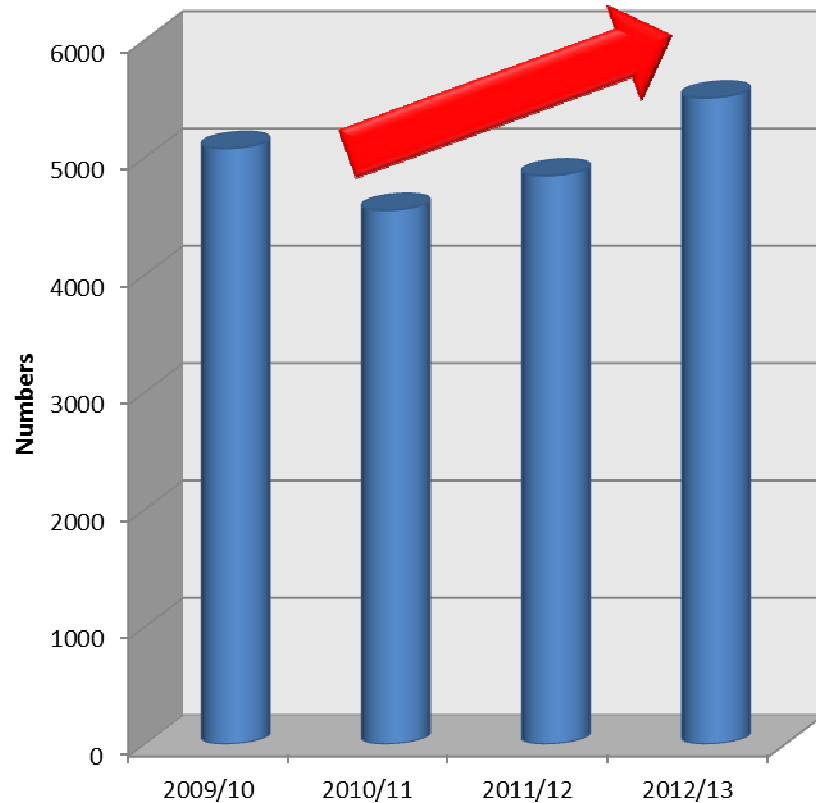

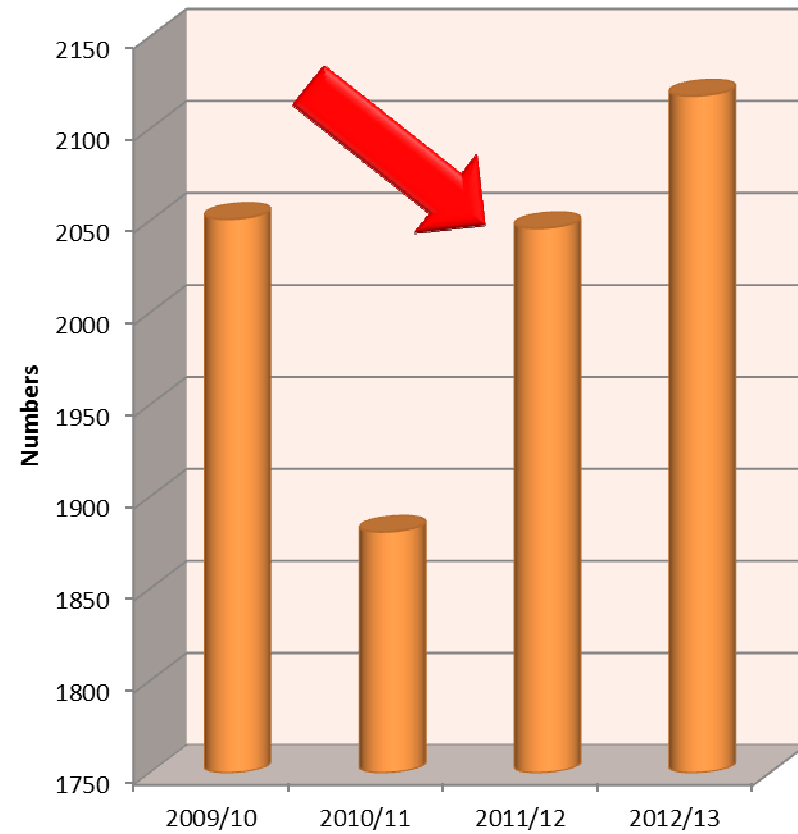
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Total Children in Need who passed through the system during the Year



Children in Need at year end snapshot

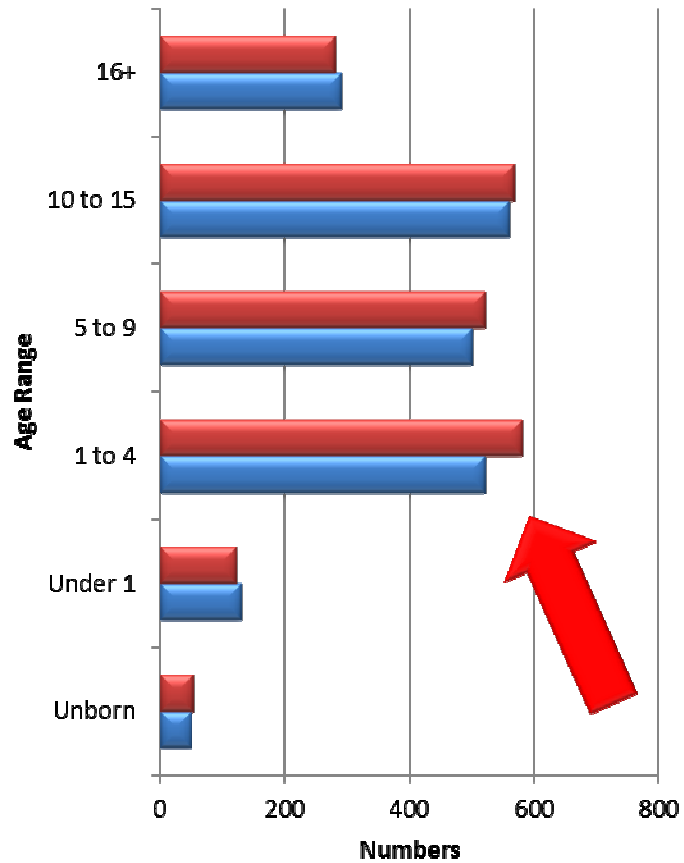

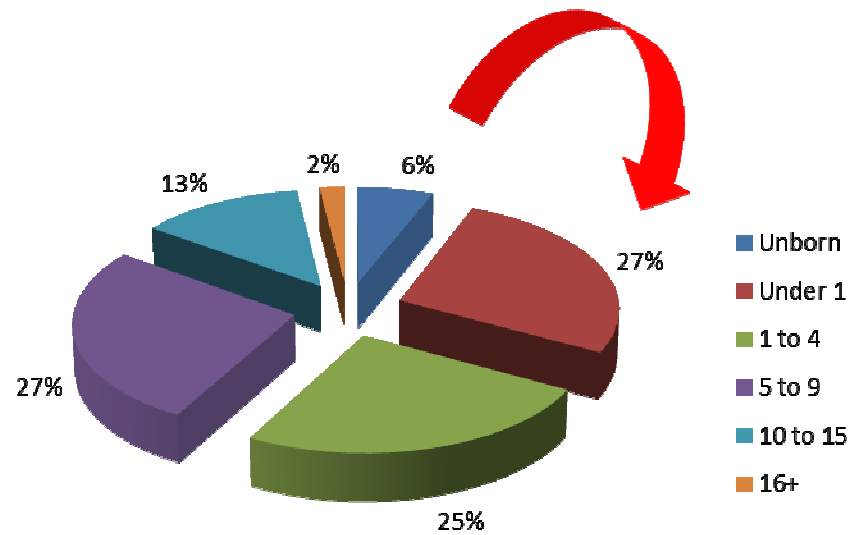

Children in Need Ages



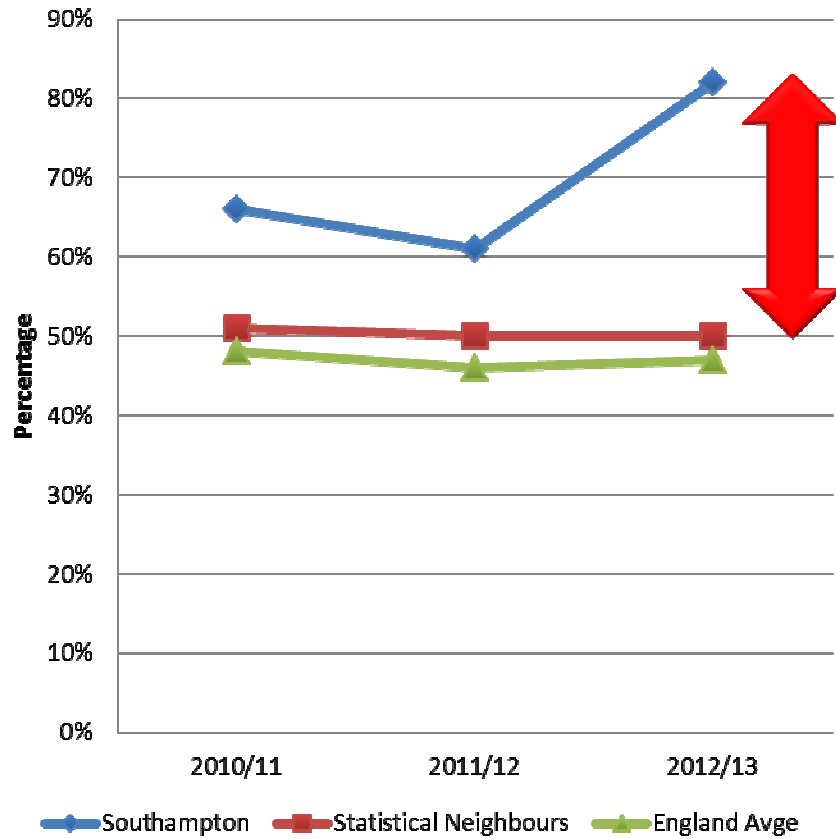
CIN Age Ranges 2012/13



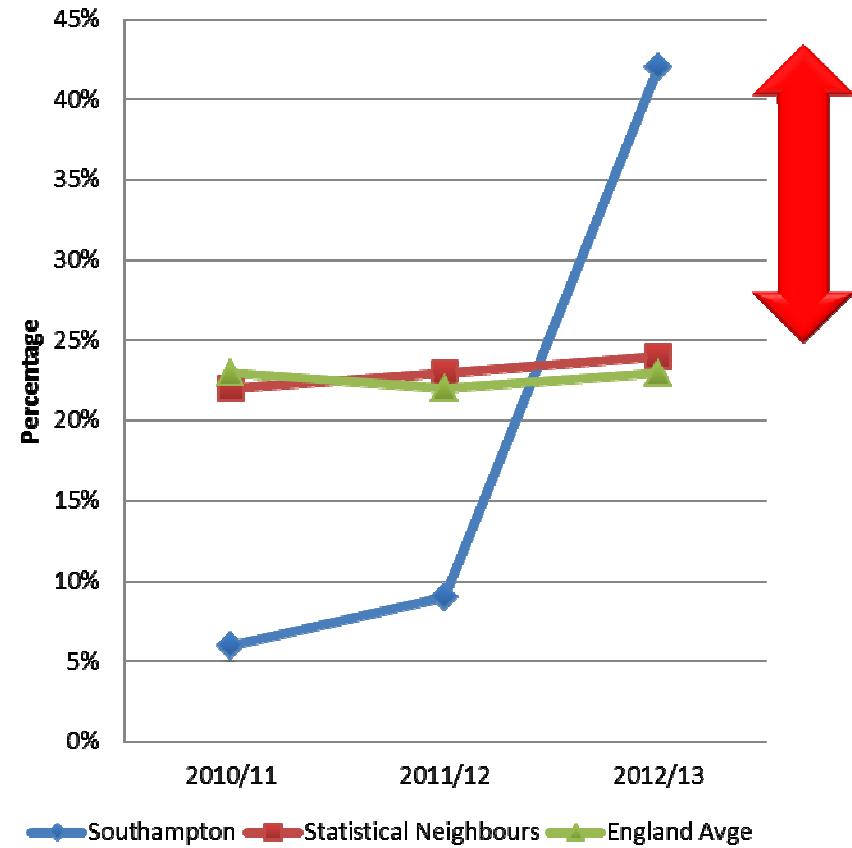

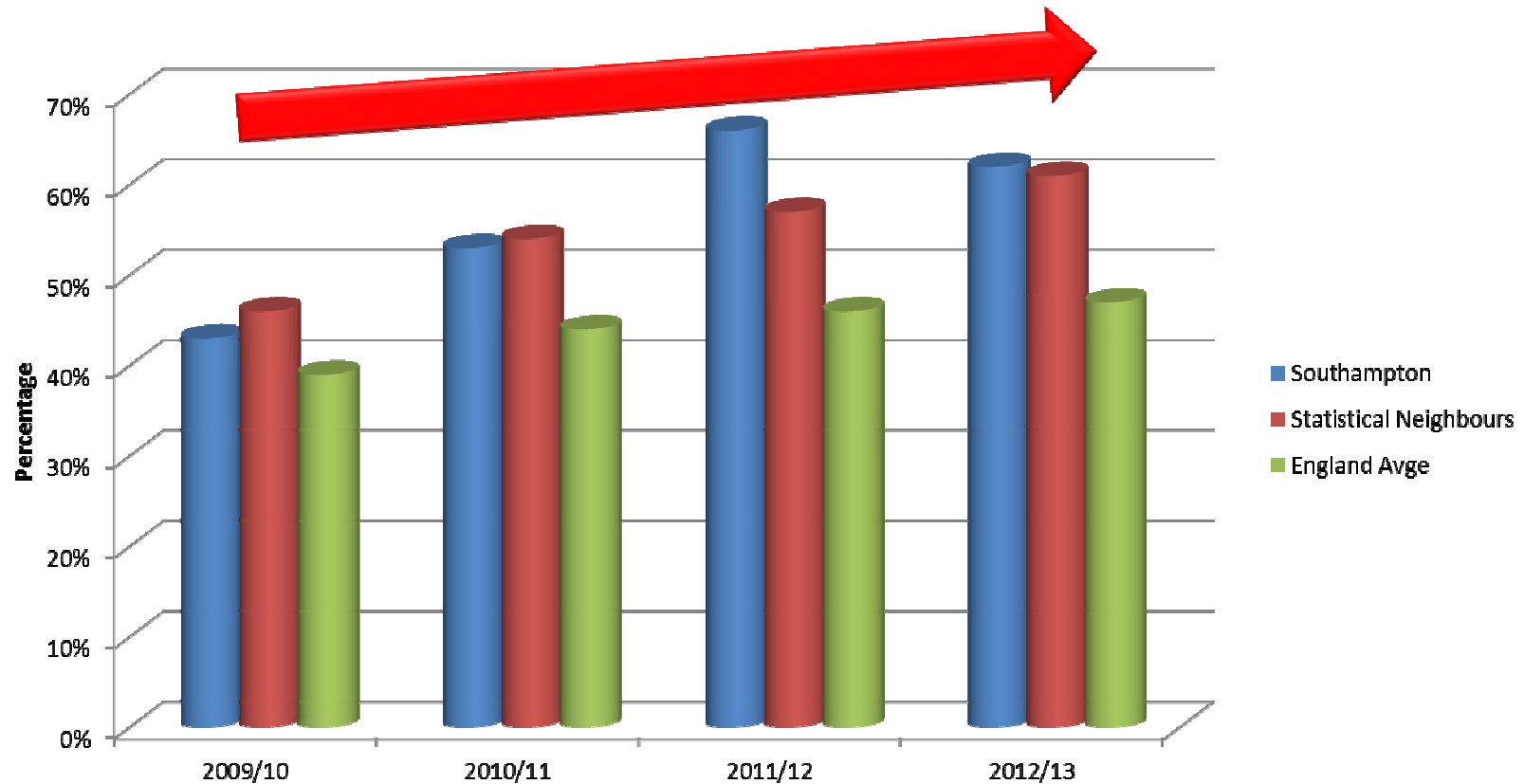
**Children with a Learning Disability
year end snapshot**



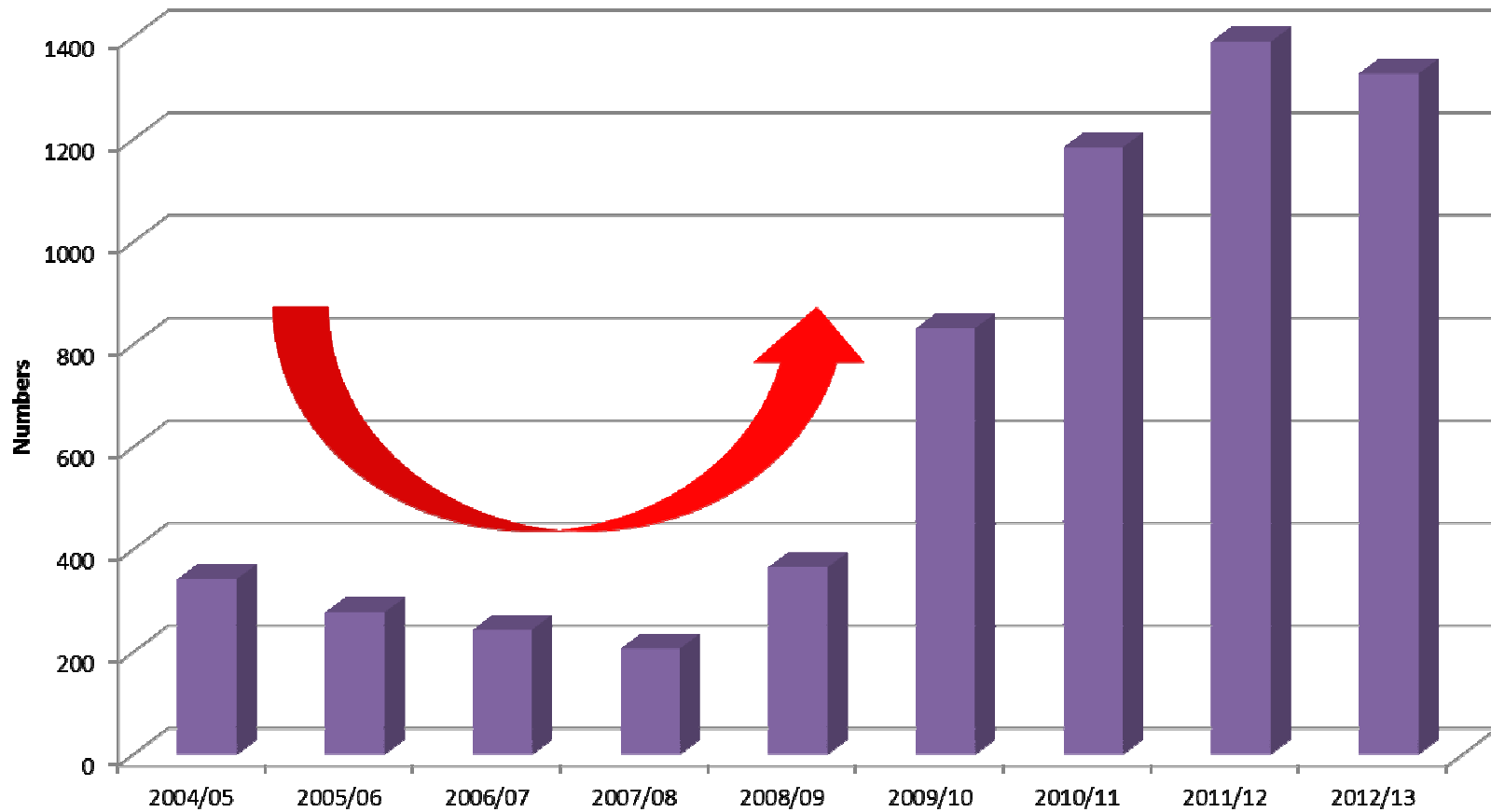
**Children with mobility problems

CIN prevalence of abuse or neglect at year end snapshot



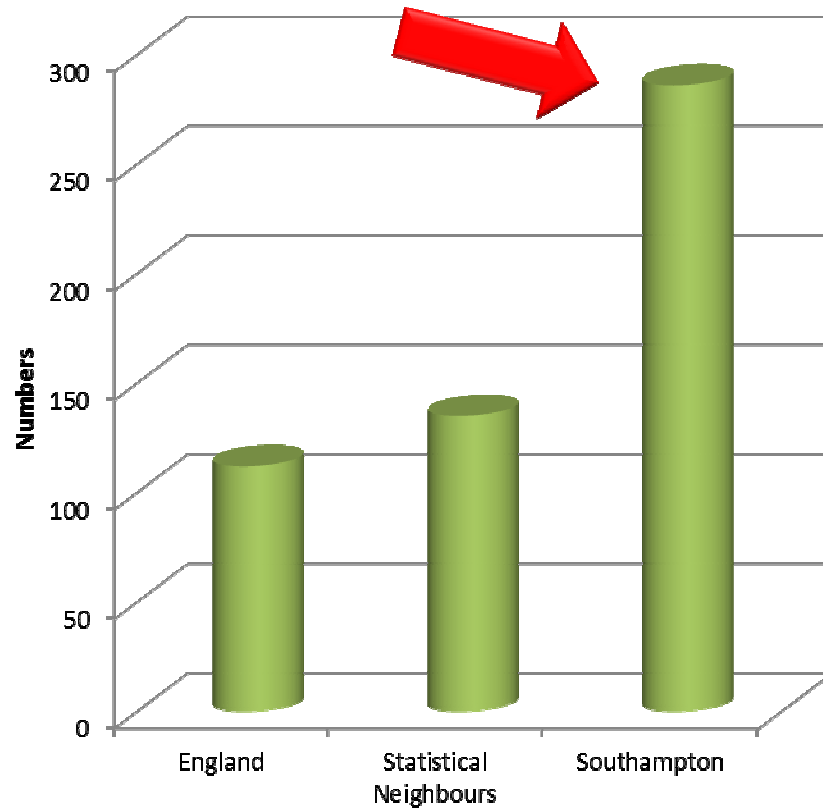
S47 Enquiries Historical Trends



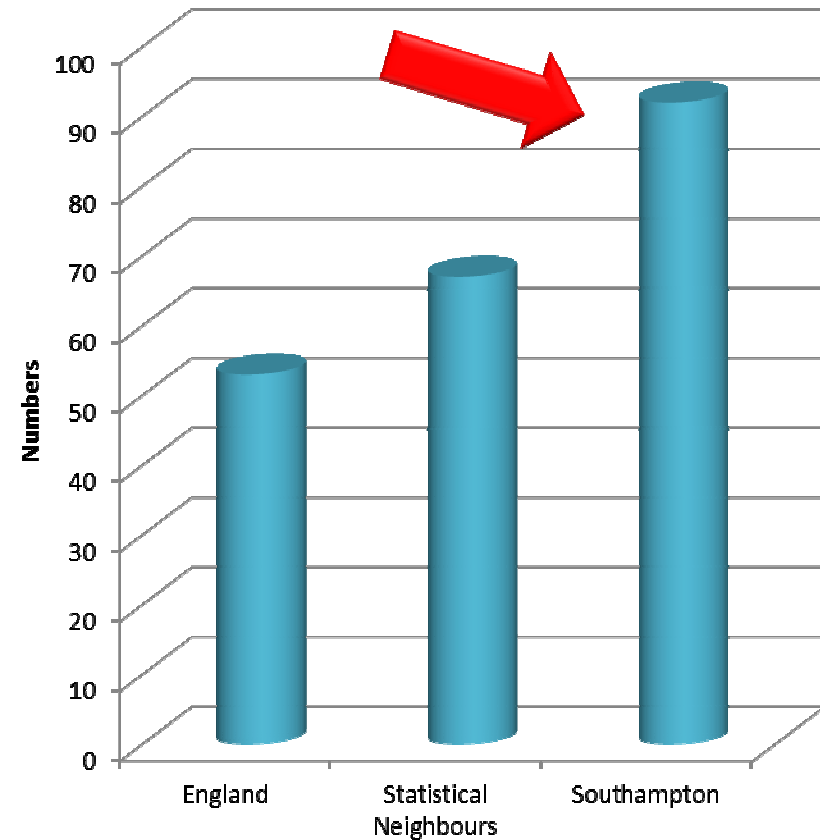

ICPCs per 10,000 population 2012/13

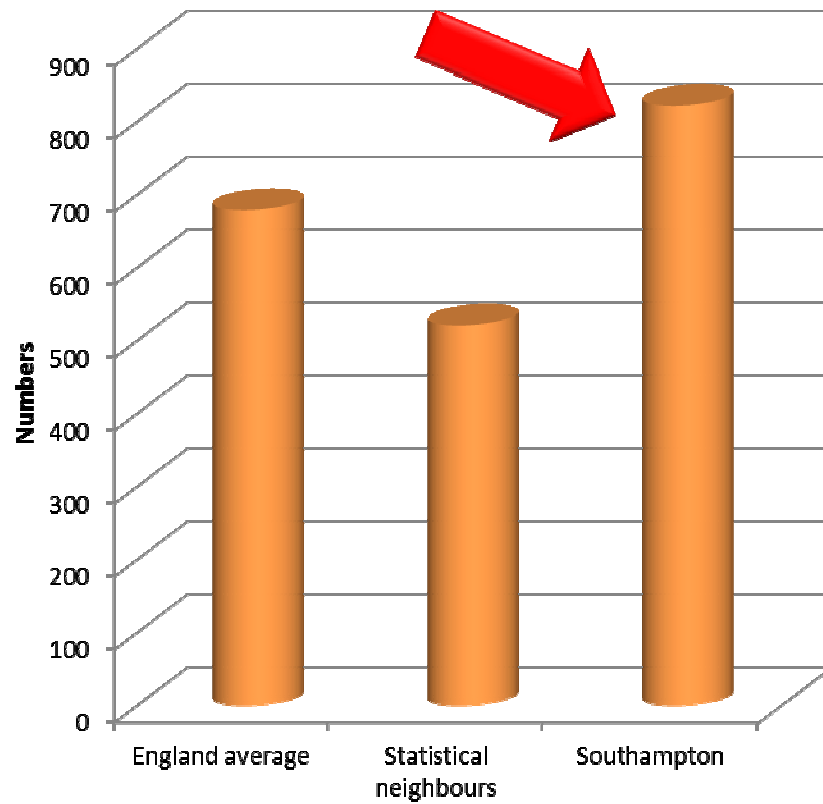


% of S47s progressing to ICPC during 2013/14 = 34% which is similar to 2012/13

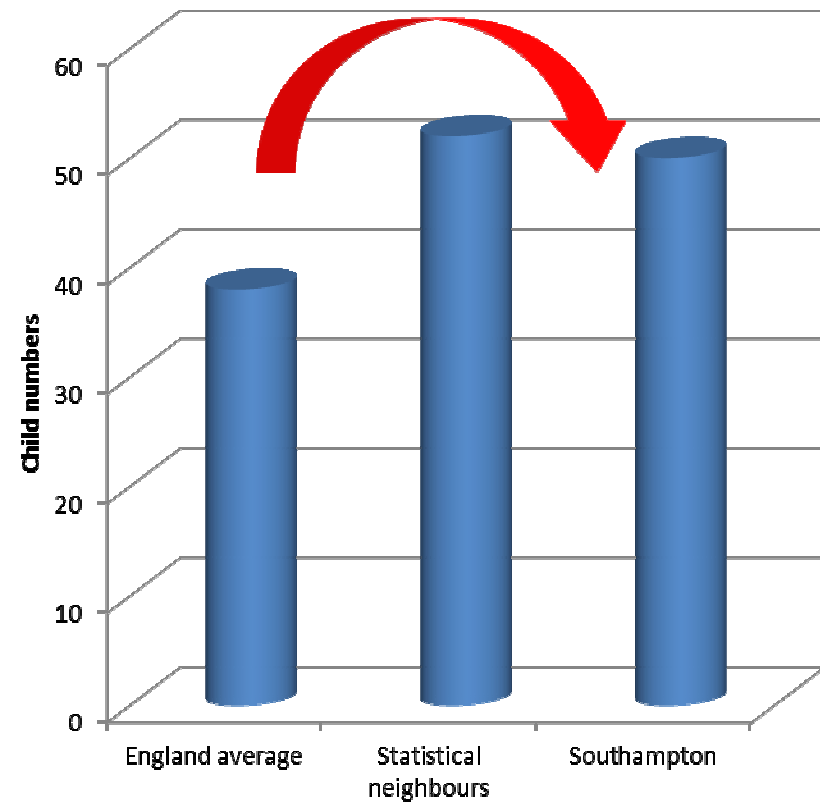

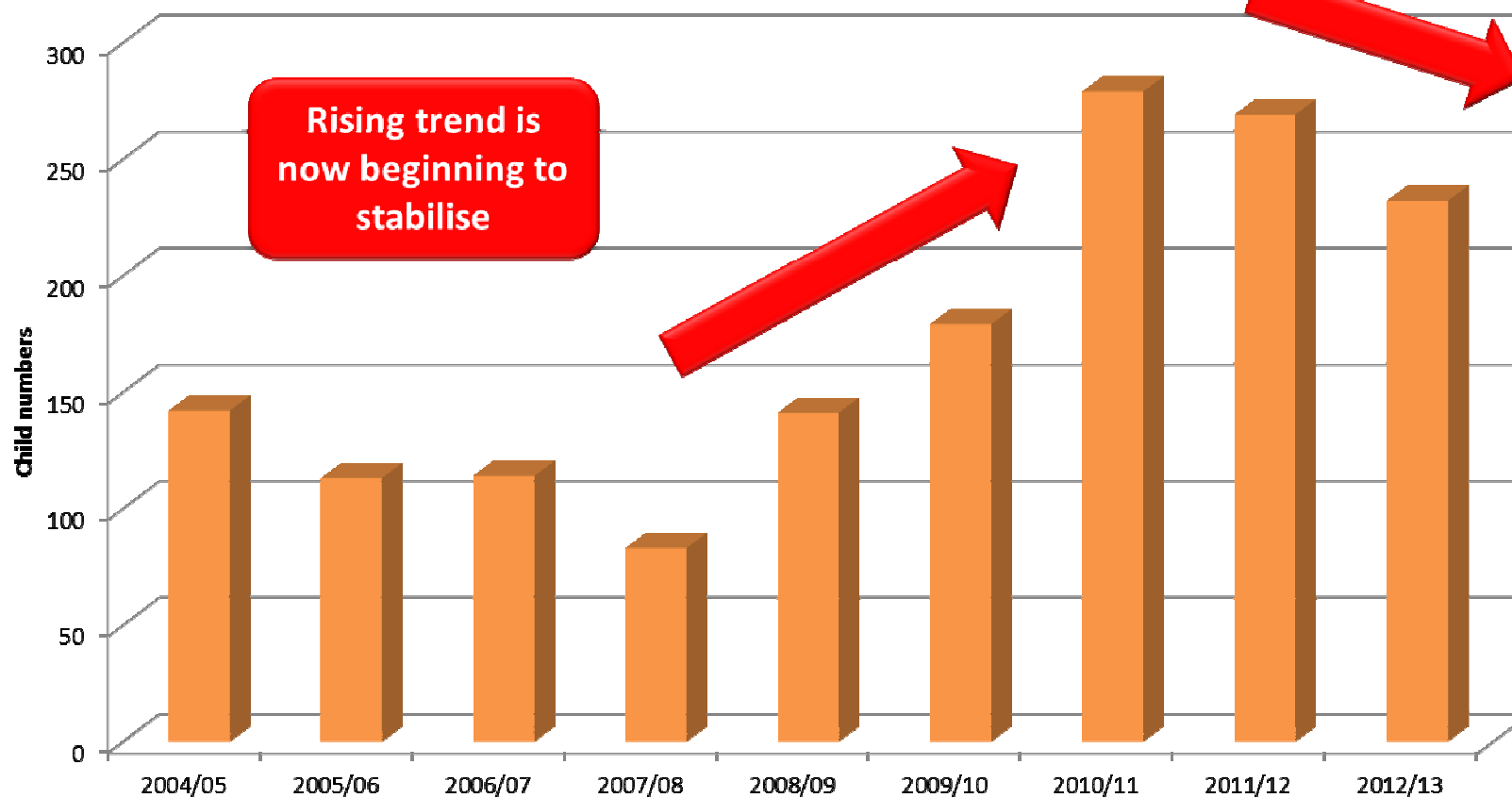
**Number of Child Protection Referrals

Protection Plan comparisons 2012/13**

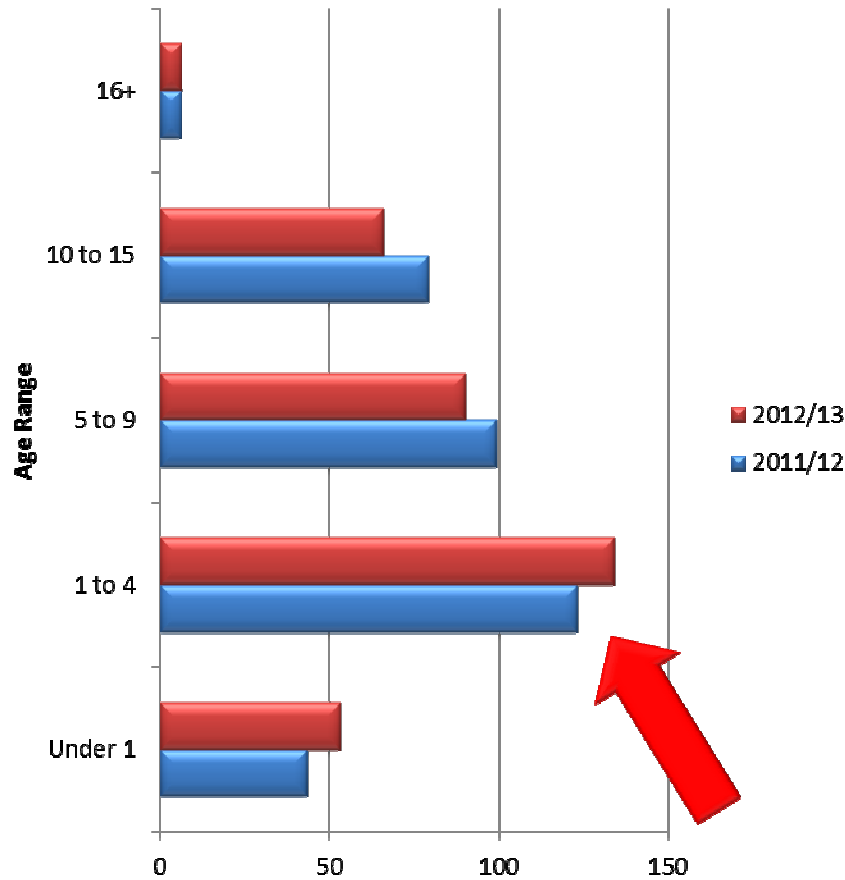

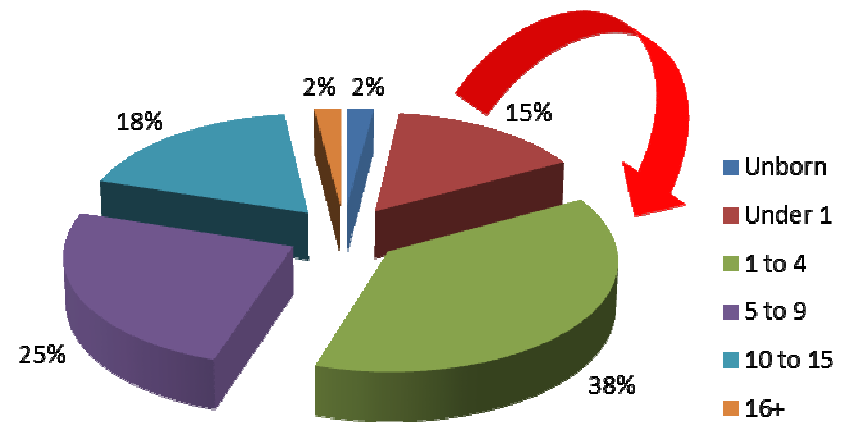

Children subject to CP Plan Age Range



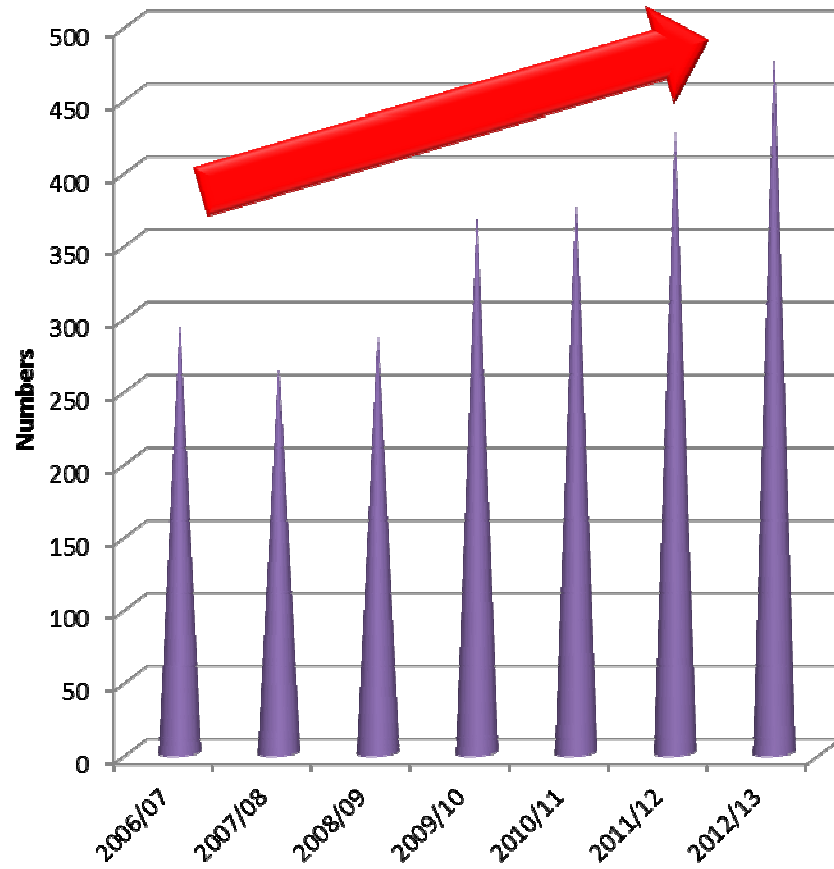
Children with CP Plans Ages 2012/13



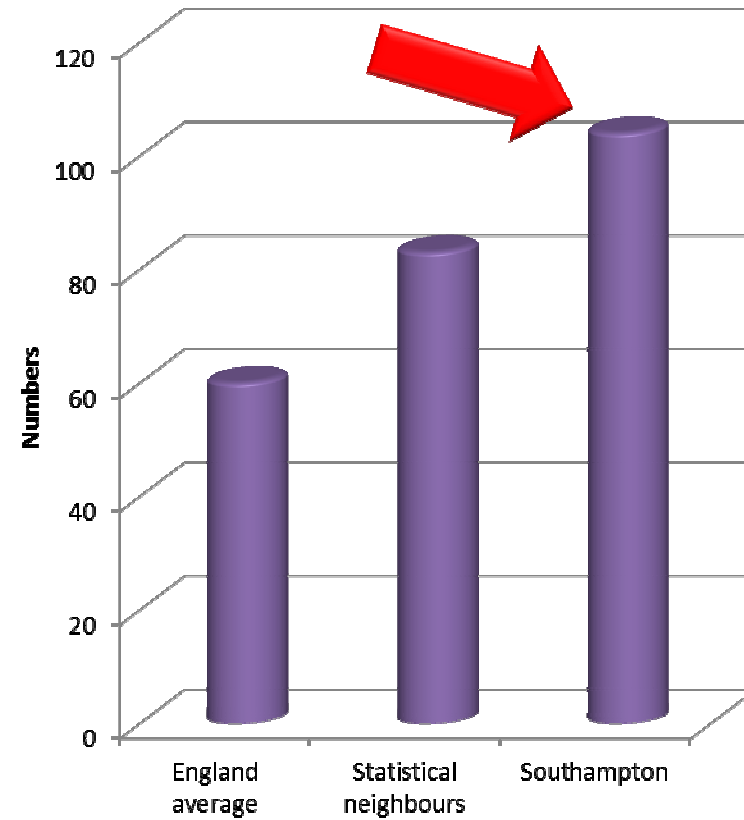

CLA per 10,000 population at year end 2012/13

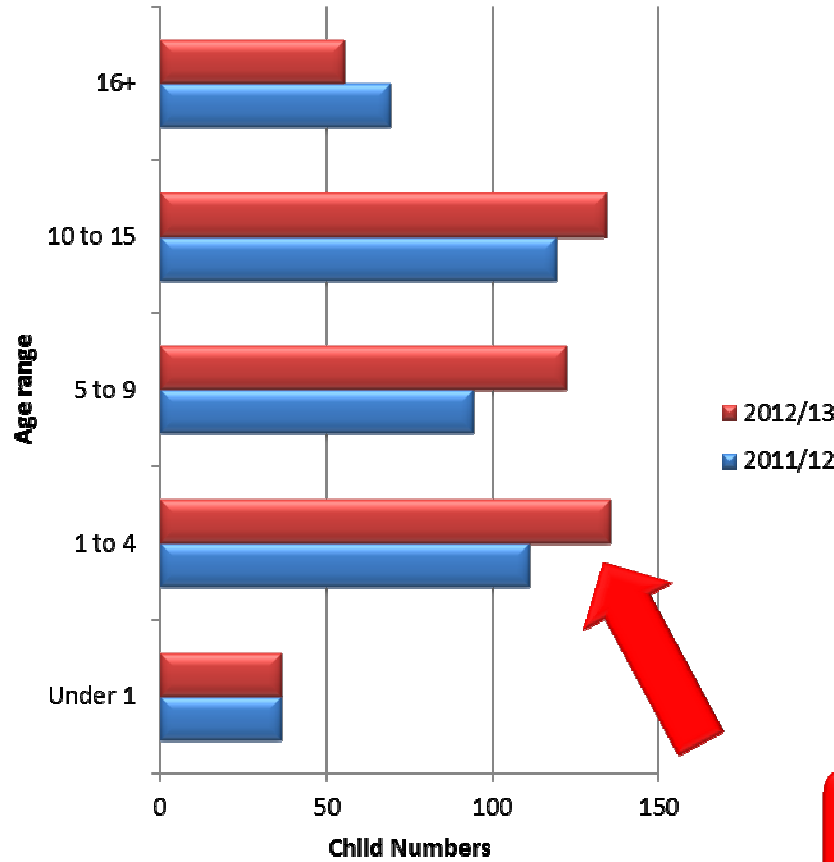

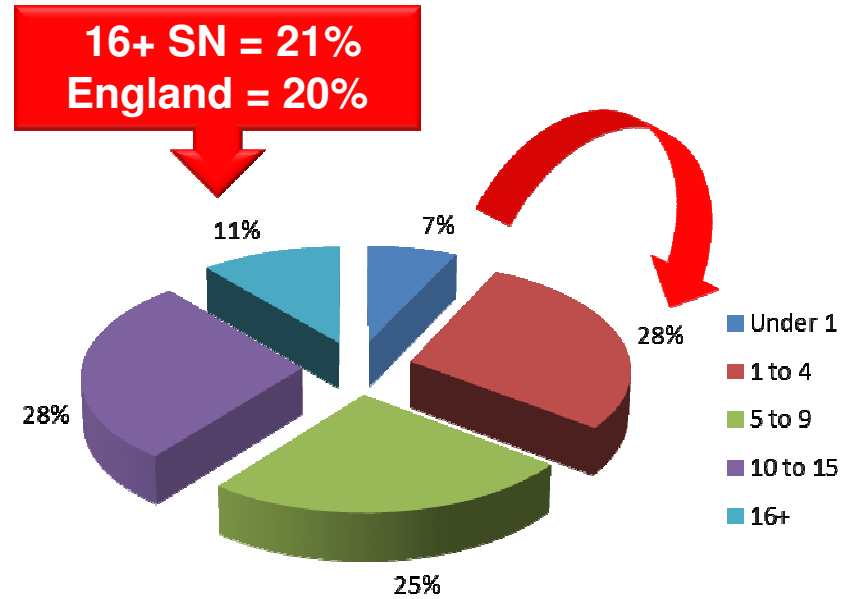

CLA Age Ranges

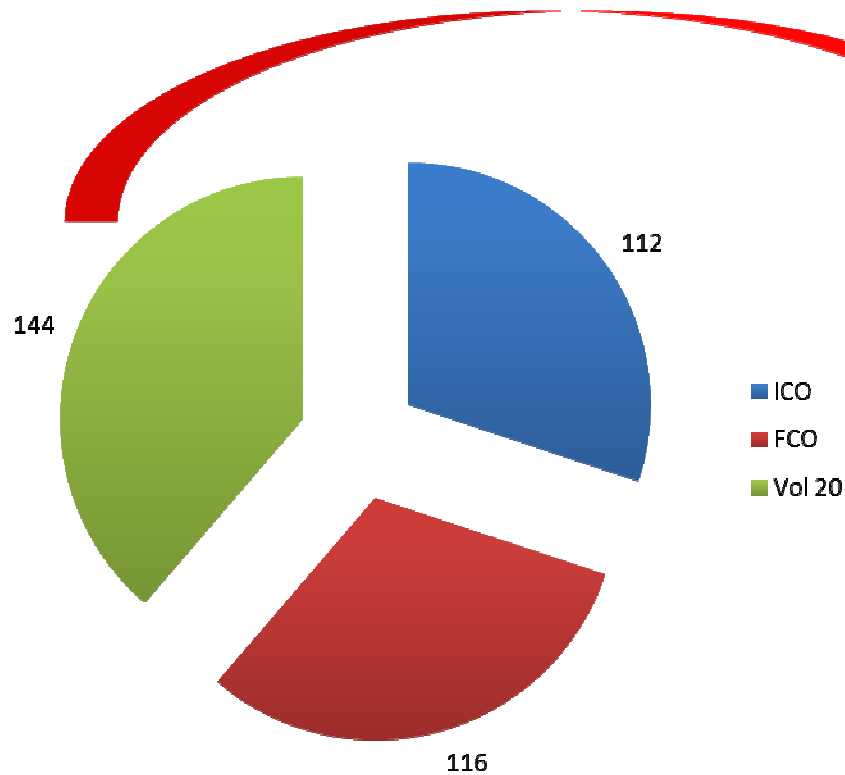


CLA age ranges at end of year 2012/13

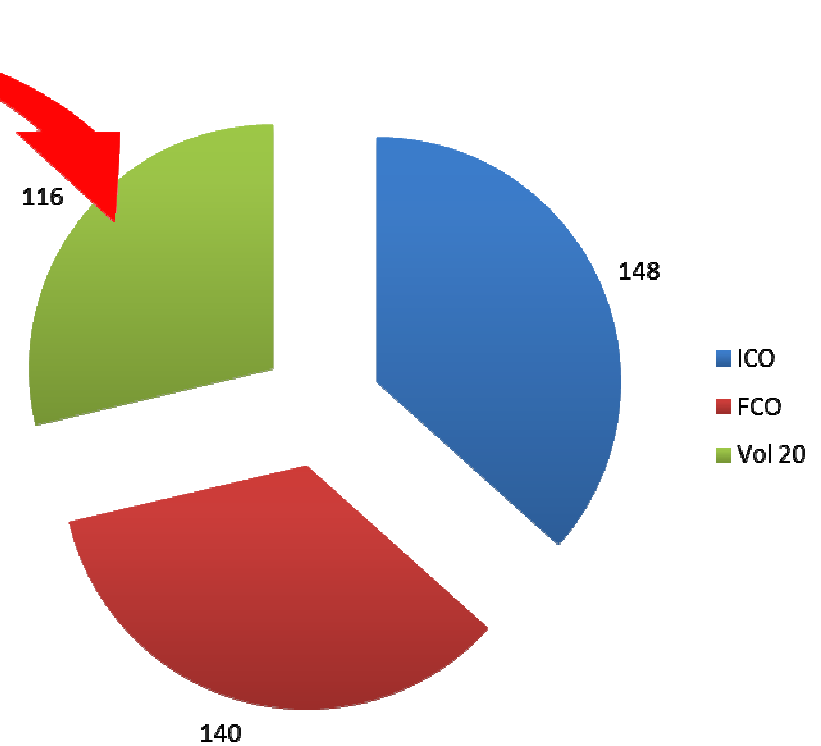

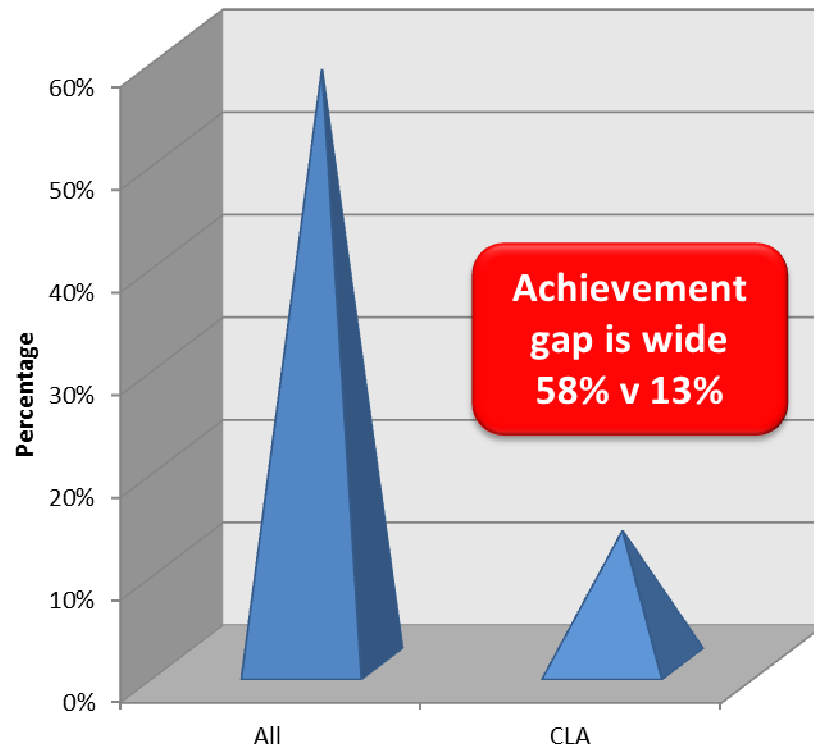

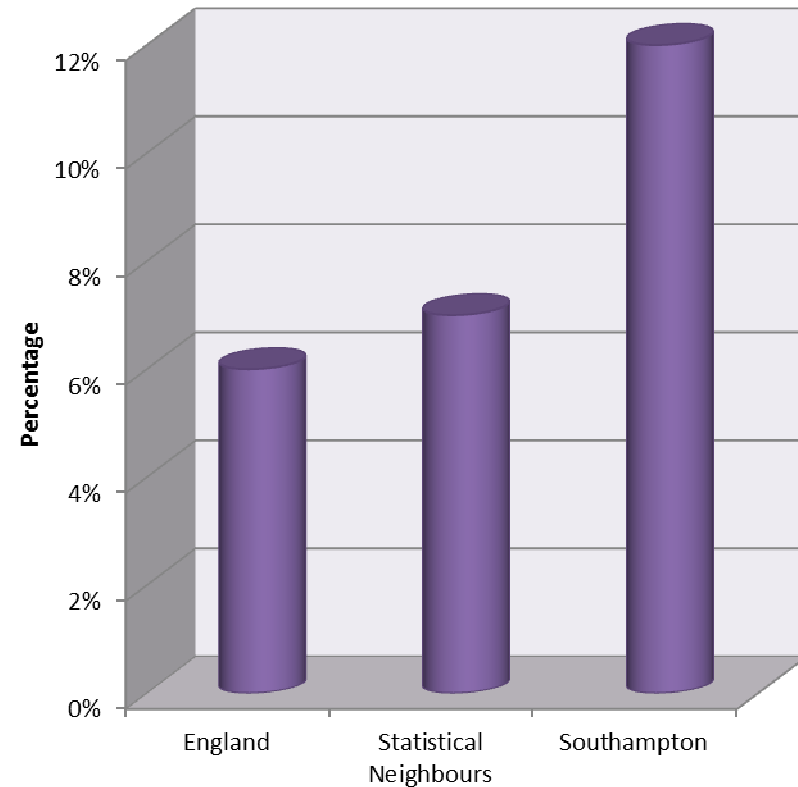

Southampton children achieving 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Maths 2012/13



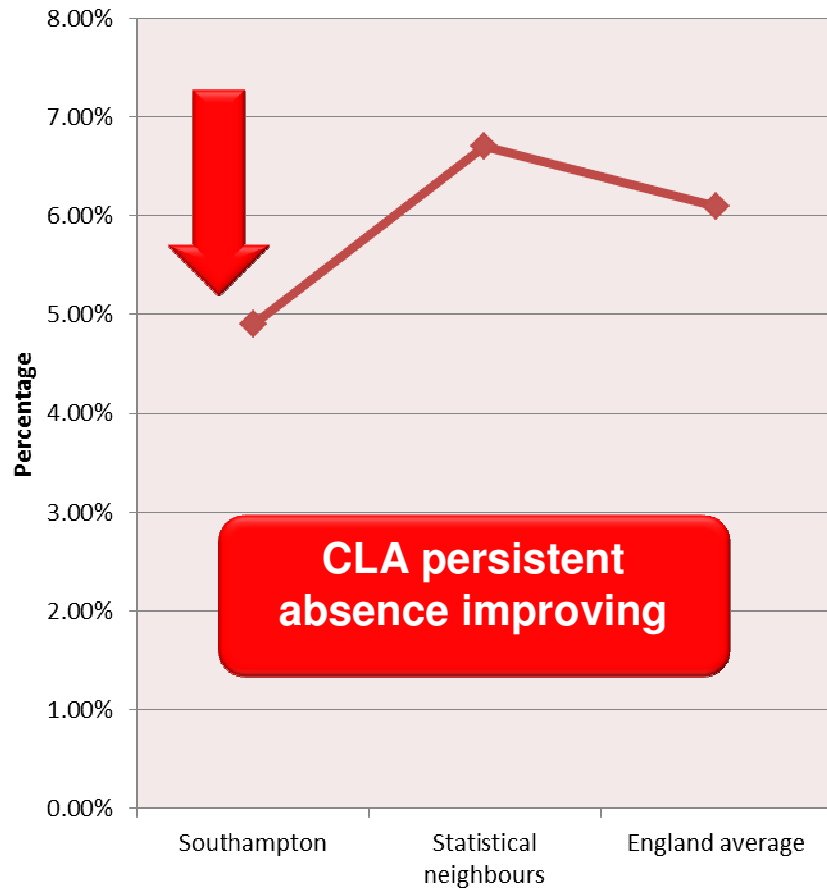
CLA rate entering the world of offending 2012/13



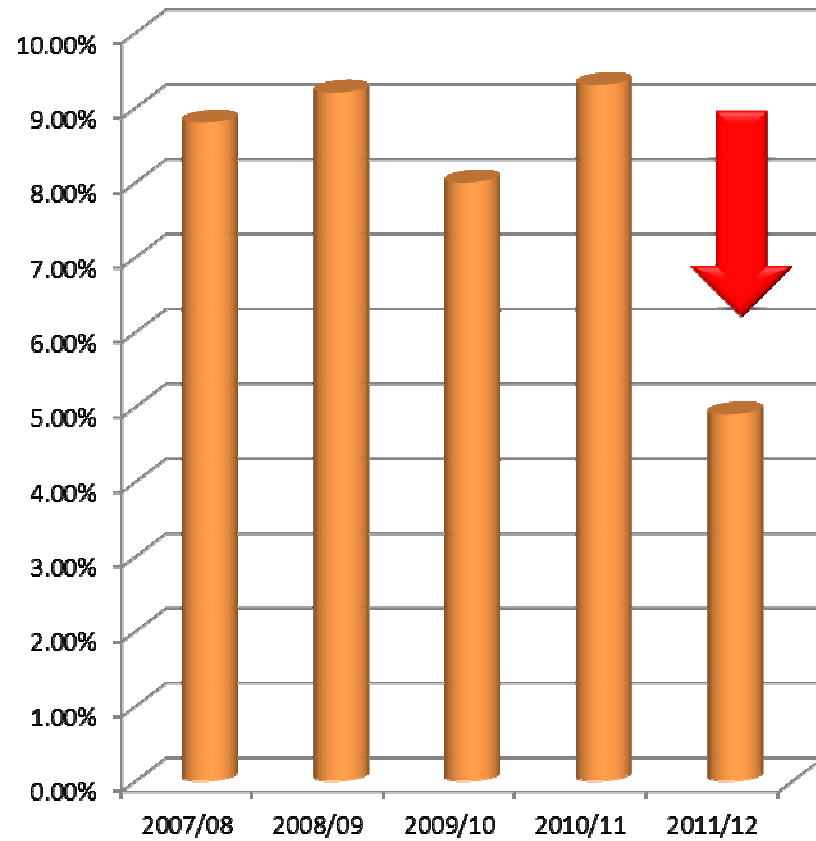

CLA offending is nearly double the national average

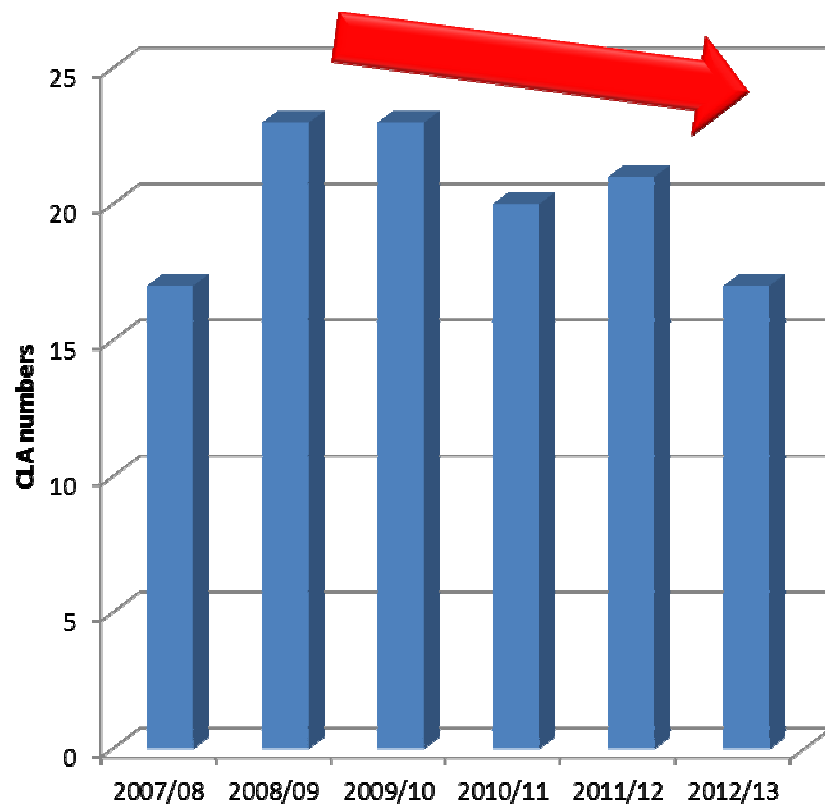
CLA classed as Persistently Absent 2011/12



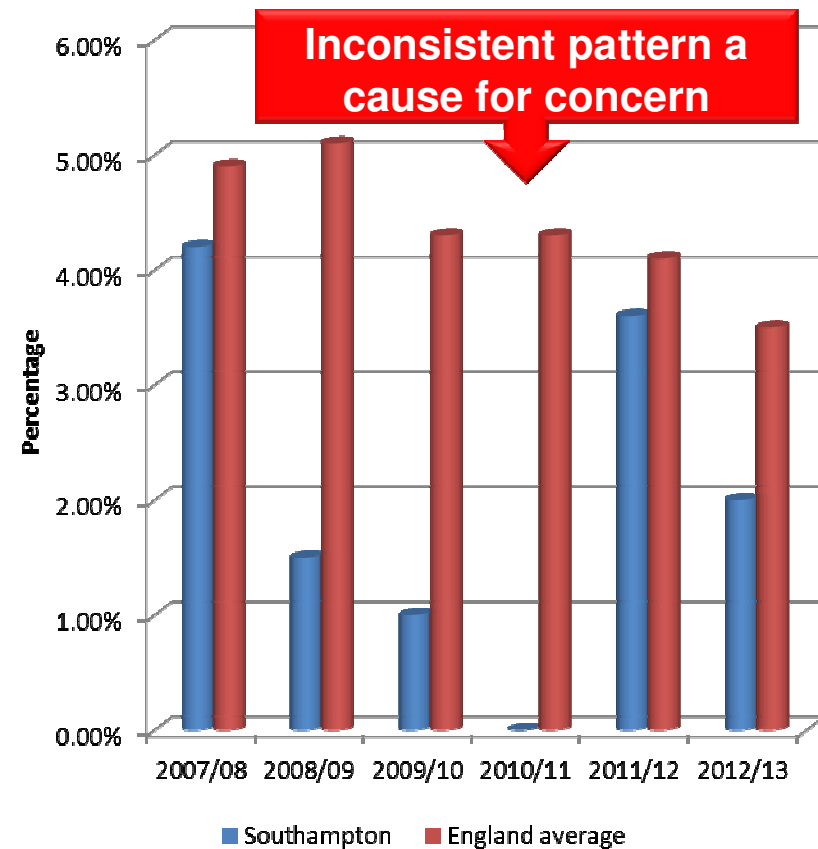
CLA classed as persistently absent



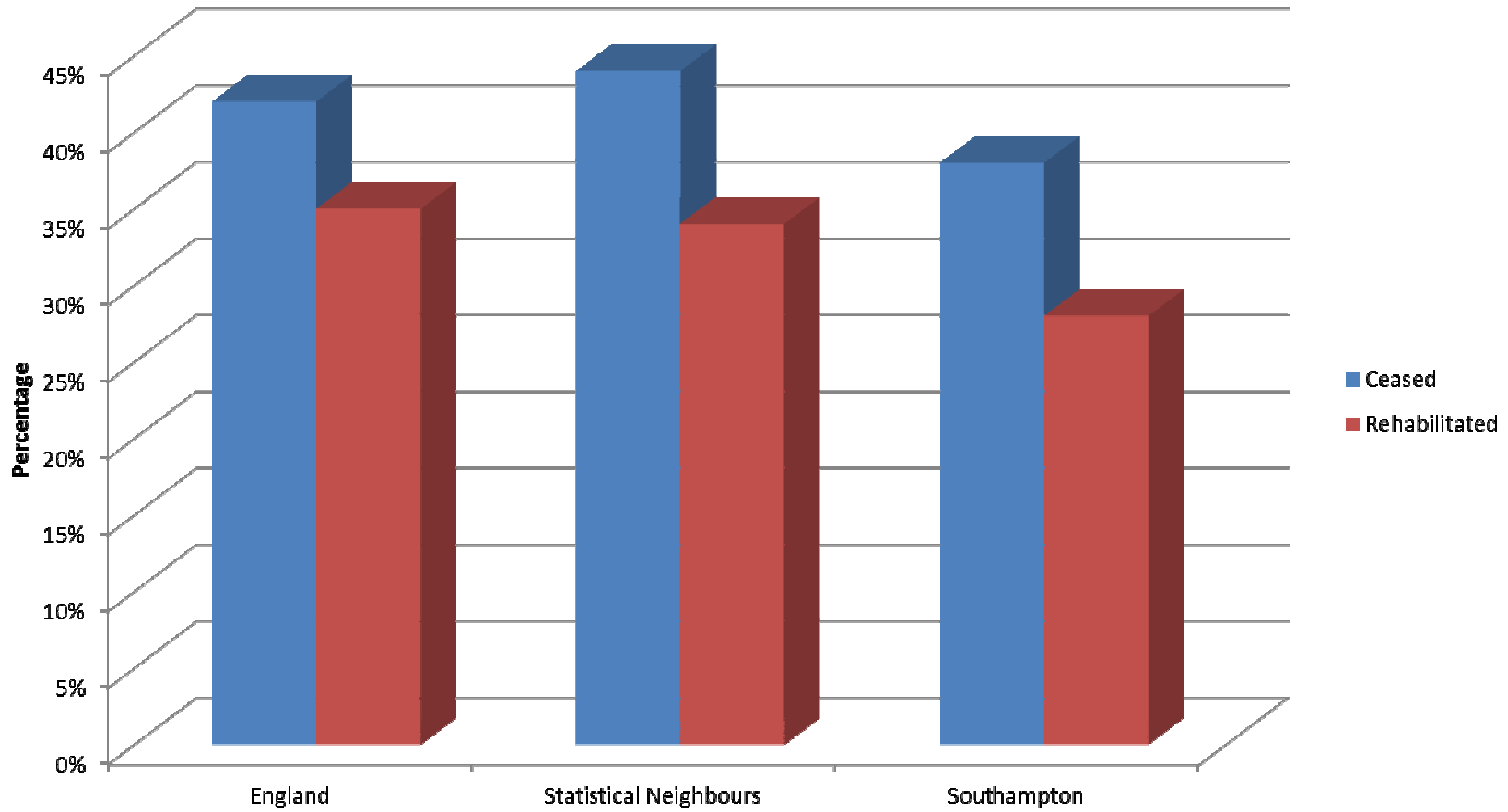
CLA aged 10+ convicted or subject to a final warning or reprimand during the year



Percentage of CLA identified as having a substance misuse problem during the year



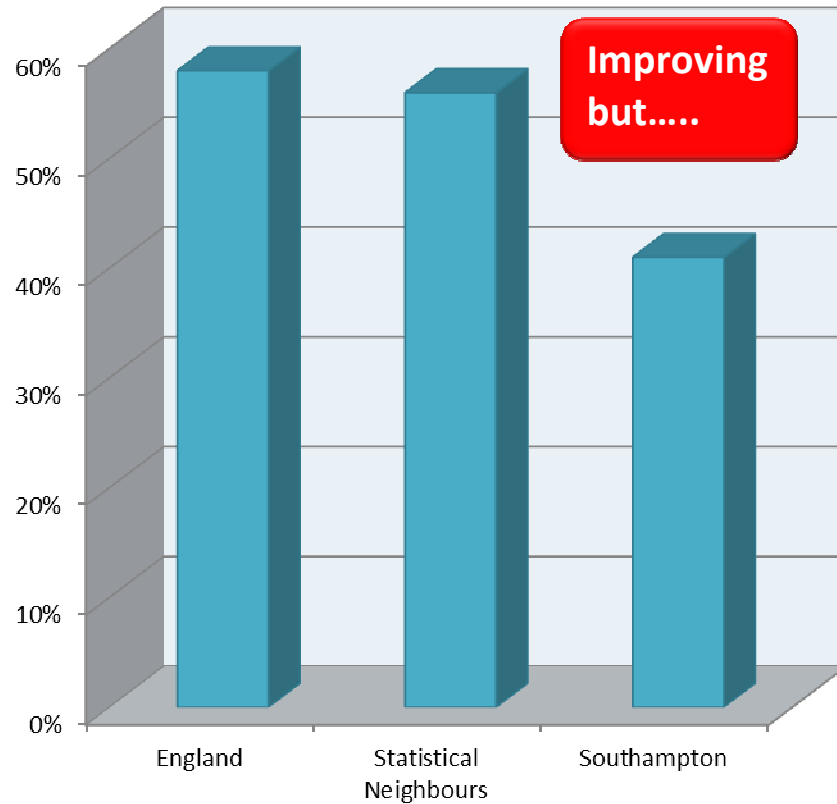
CLA Ceased Interventions 2012/13



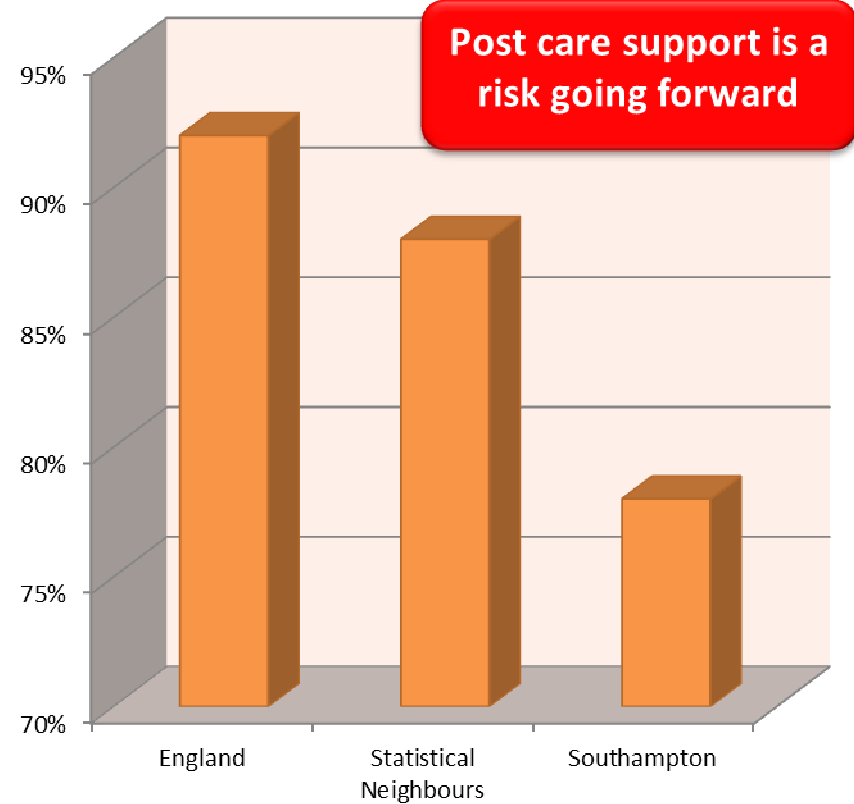
More CLA ceased in 2012/13 but still below comparators



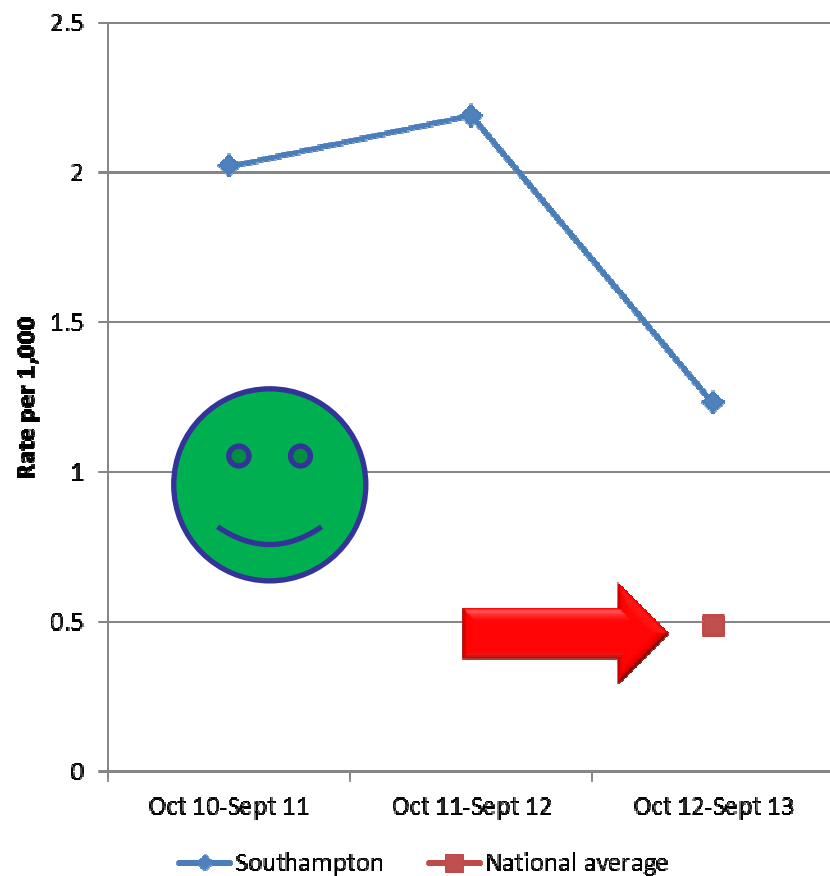
Percentage of Care Leavers in Education, Training or Employment 2012/13



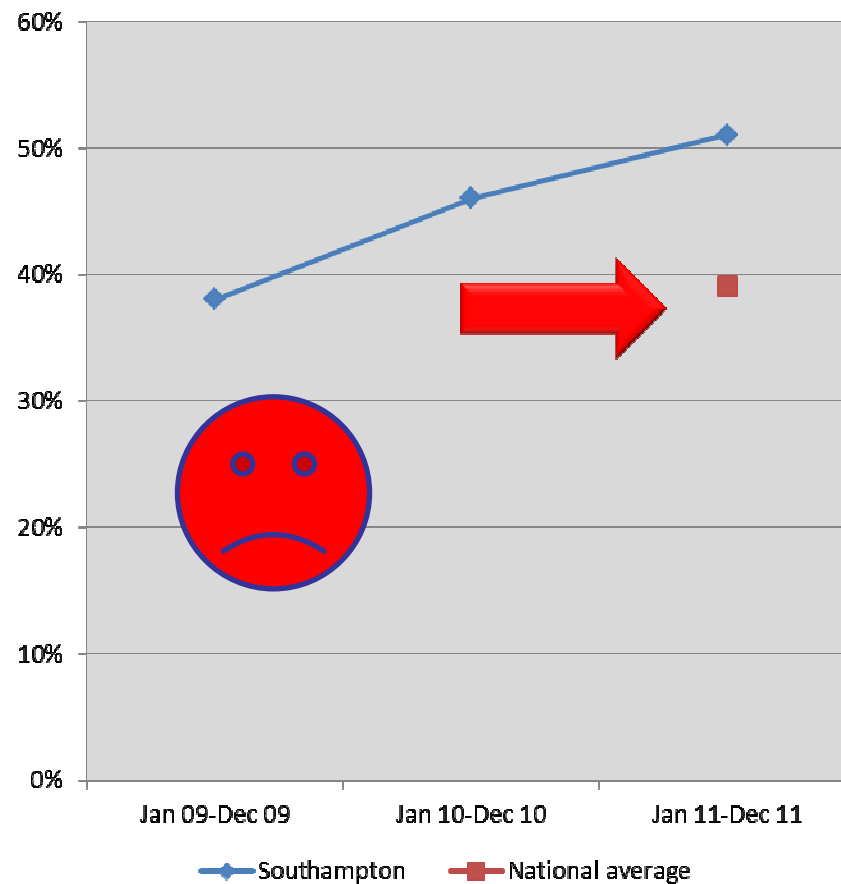
Proportion of all Care Leavers who still keep in touch with Children's Services



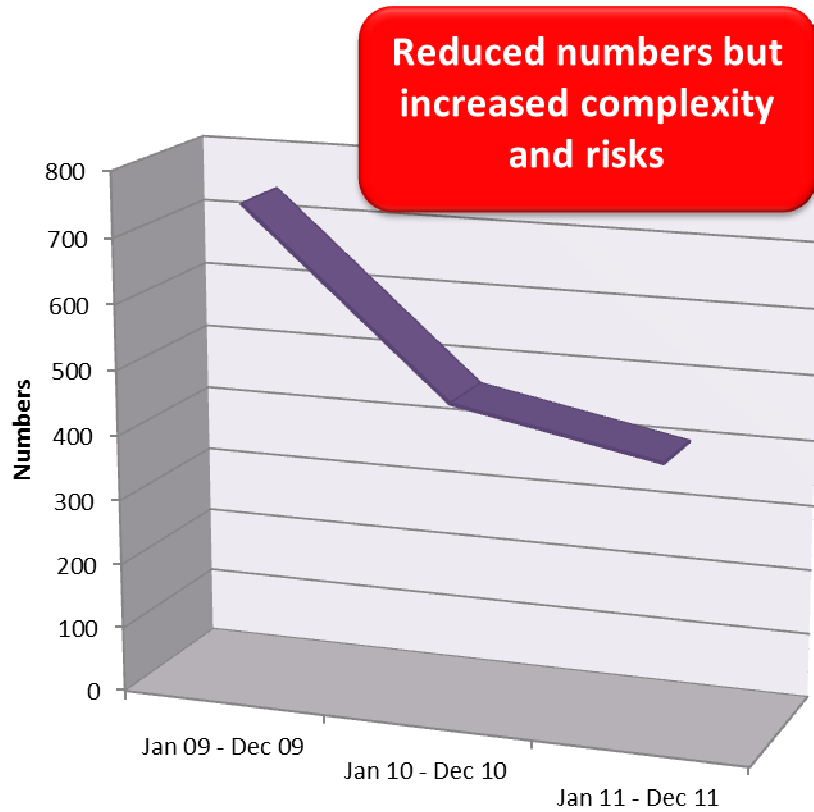
Youth Custody rate per 1,000 2010 - 2013



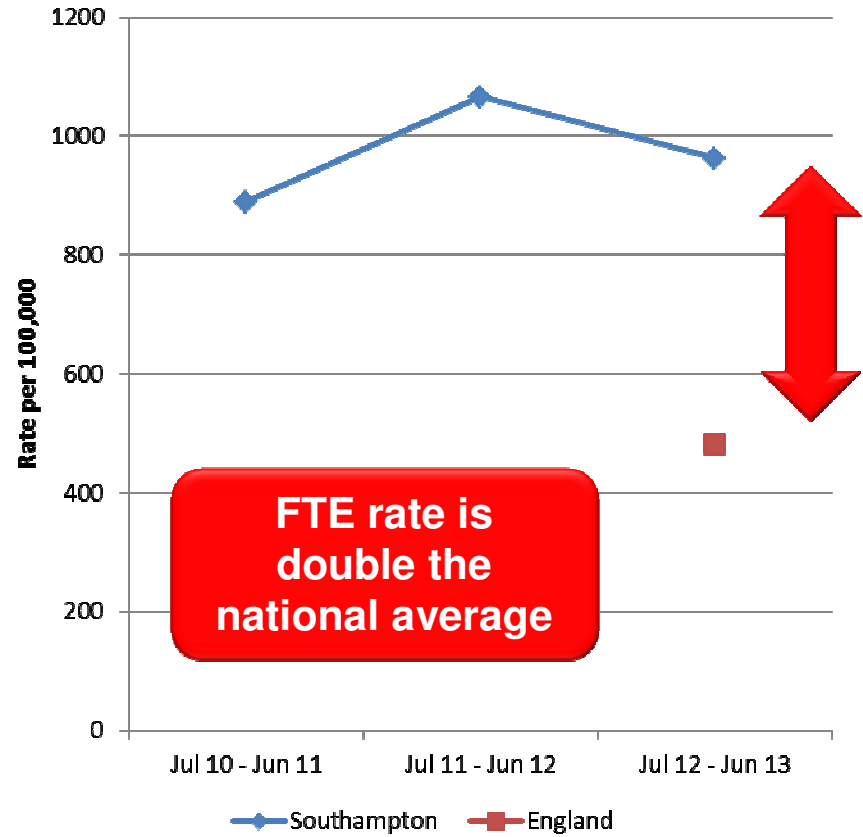
Re-offending Rate 2009 - 2011

Summary 1

General

- Rising demand continues to put pressure on local services.

Children In Need

- Rising numbers for 0 to 4 cohort are a cause for concern because children are entering the system at a younger age.

Children Looked After

- CLA numbers are likely to remain high for the foreseeable future.
- 16+ reducing but 0-4 increasing.
- Persistent absence for CLA compares favourably but has increased marginally from 4% in 2011/12 to 5% in 2012/13.
- Education attainment gap is unacceptably wide.
- CLA substance misuse may be under-reported and the quality of detection activity might need to be reviewed.
- Support for Care Leavers poses a risk which needs to be managed.

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Summary 2

Youth Offending Service

- First Time Entrants to the Youth Justice System is a cause for concern because Southampton's rate is double the national average.
- Whilst the local prolific offender cohort is reducing, the complexity and risks associated with supporting them is increasing.
- Youth Offending remains high in comparison to the national average and needs to be addressed as a priority. Hampshire Constabulary have agreed to work with the YOS to pilot a triage arrangement for Southampton youth cases starting in April 2014, which should help.
