BRIEF SUMMARY

Local authorities have an over-arching responsibility for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all children and young people in their area but the responsibility for a child's education rests with their parents. In England, education is compulsory, but school is not.

In Southampton over 200 children are home educated. Appendix 1 is provided to enable the Panel to discuss the issue; the document outlines the statutory duties, current position and future plans with regards to elective home education and safeguarding arrangements in Southampton.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(i) That the Panel note the statutory duties placed on the local authority in relation to elective home education, and discuss and challenge the safeguarding arrangements for children being educated at home in Southampton as a result of their parents' choice.
