If they take Catholic/Christian girls then they be potentially diminishing the numbers that attend SI Anne's. If you are prepared to look strategically at this, a huge increase in numbers of the indices is not predicted so inveitably the wes obsolos will be completing for it same 'por' of girls. If they remain the same size then other schools around us, notably Cantell and Regent's Park, may well be affected as more pupils who are not Catholic move to our schools to fill up empty spaces.
