General Risk Assessment



Implementing a supervised tooth brushing programme in a childcare setting can be hazardous if not correctly managed. By completing a risk assessment, it will help you identify and manage the risks, which will keep children and staff safe and reassure parents too. When completing the risk assessment follow the guidelines in the HEYA Supervised
Toothbrushing Handbook and the Settings. The following risk assessment sample has a few examples to help you get started and there will be support and training provided when undertaking the Southampton Healthy Mouth Award.

What are the hazards to consider after toothbrushing? Toothbrush may come into contact with the tap during washing causing the toothbrush to become cross contaminated.	Child	Carefully rinse the toothbrush under cold running water taking care to avoid contact with the tap.
