Council Tax explanatory notes

Can I appeal against my property's valuation band?

The Valuation Office Agency (VOA) values domestic properties to set your council tax band. Council tax is then collected by your council to fund local services. You might need to contact the VOA if you think your council tax band is wrong.

You can find out more about when you can challenge your band and what you need to do at gov.uk/challenge-council-tax-band If you challenge your band, you must continue to pay council tax at your current band until your appeal is decided.

Adult Social Care precept

For adult social care authorities, Council Tax bills show two percentage changes: one for the part of the overall change attributable to the adult social care precept, and one for the part attributable to general expenditure.

Properties exempt from Council Tax

While all properties have to register for Council Tax, you don't have to pay if everyone living in the property is on the exemption list.

The main groups are:

- Full time students, student nurses, apprentices and youth training trainees
- Under 18 years old
- · Severely mentally impaired
- Diplomats & certain dependants
- Dependant relatives in self-contained parts of the property (e.g. granny annexe)
- Patients living in hospital / care homes

Single Person Discount

Council tax is based on at least two adults (18 years old or over) living in the property. If you live on your own or all other adults in the property are on the exemption list, you can get 25% off your bill.

Reduction for those on low income/benefits

Empty properties

There is no Council Tax to pay for one month from the date a property became empty and unfurnished.

Additional Council Tax (premium) will be charged if the property has been empty and unfurnished for:

Between two and five years - an additional 100% Council Tax is payable

Between five and ten years - an additional 200% Council Tax is payable

Over ten years - an additional 300% Council Tax is payable
