## BYE-LAWS

Made by the Council of the County Borough of Southampton, in pursuance of Section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, at a Meeting of the Council, held on Wednesday, the 28th day of January, 1903, at which thirty-nine Members of the Council were present, being not less than two-thirds of the whole number of the Council.

---

1.—No person shall in any street or public place fight, or provoke, or incite any person or animal to fight.

2.—Any person offending against the foregoing Bye-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

The Corporate Seal of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Southampton was affixed hereto, by order of the Council, this 28th day of January, 1903.
