Going to the park



Bug hunt

Go on a hunt for insects or other animals and objects. You could come up with your own or use a ready-made one e.g. <u>Downloadable activities for kids | Fields in Trust</u>

- Vocabulary think about the describing words you could use when looking at what you have found e.g. slimy, sticky, tiny, creepy, slow, quick etc.
- Categories what group do they belong to e.g. insects, birds, animals?
- Same / different what do they have in common? How are they different?

Play equipment

When you're playing on the swings, slides etc, try and think about some of the words you can use...

Action words – climb, step, slide, jump, push, pull Comparison words - higher, faster, slower Concept / position words - in, on, under, off Direction words - Up, down, round & round

Hide and seek

Play hide and seek with each other or take a toy you can hide and then try and find it. Make it harder by using a smaller toy. This is a good one for position words e.g. on, under, behind, in front, between, top, bottom.

I spy

Play a version of I spy where you give more clues about what you have seen such as:

- the group / category
- where else you might find it
- what the features are / what it looks like
- what it does / is used for
- how many claps / syllables.

Make it harder / easier depending on your child.




