Monitoring of Collective Worship and RE

This process is working well, schools who will receive a monitoring visit this academic year are aware and dates have all been agreed. Seven schools across all phases have been visited so far, with a further two planned for the summer term. The visit is evolving and a report outlining collective strengths and areas for development will be presented to the SACRE at the final meeting of the academic year. This will be included in the SACRE Annual report which will be sent to all schools, other stakeholders and the DFE as per the SACRE statutory requirements. Advice document for Schools

This document is now available to all schools. It is the culmination of a collaboration between SACRE, Education and wider community groups. The document seeks to support schools with information that will be useful in relation to questions schools have been asked with regards to faith linked issues and the parental right to withdraw.

An electronic copy has been sent to all Head teachers and Deputies as well as being attached to this information newsletter. One hard copy was available at the summer term SELF meeting that Senior Leaders and Governors attend. The SACRE plan to update this annually (each spring term) and the document together with any updates will be hosted on the SACRE website currently in development.

Locally Agreed Syllabus

There will be CPD in Southampton for Foundation Stage, Key Stages 1-4 to support the new Locally Agreed Syllabus in Autumn 2016 once it is adopted by the SACRE.

Following a number of enquiries I would like to reassure colleagues that the principles of the syllabus currently remain essentially the same, using the development of concepts through the Cycle of Enquiry methodology, but there are developments being made to Assessment and other content.

The new syllabus will be launched in Autumn 2016 and all schools will be invited to the launch.

Resource development – an exciting media project is being completed in collaboration with Solent University, Southampton SACRE and pupils from Highfield CE Primary School. Films exploring "when children notice difference" have been created for use by schools. The resources will be available to schools via the new SACRE website in time for the launch of the new Syllabus.
