5 PLANNING APPLICATION - 22/00351/FUL - MAYFIELD CARS, ARCHERY RD (Pages 1 - 2)

Redevelopment of Mayfield car sales – Archery Road, Woolston, Southampton. Hampshire To be read at the meeting on 14th March 2023

Whilst I do not completely object to houses being built on this site, I do object to the number of houses looking to be built at this current time. 6 x 3 bed houses and 3 x4 bed houses with only one parking space per dwelling is not enough, especially as we are on a main bus route.

I would have though 6 houses on this site would be more that enough and would also provide better parking and garden space for each house. The parking spaces could then be next to each house, which would also be in-keeping with other properties along Archery Road.

I live opposite Mayfield Garage and when my home was built back in 1995, and as I understand things Wimpey homes had to provide a minimum of 2 parking spaces off road for each of the six dwellings that were to be built on the main road. With this in mind I would have thought that this would also be the case for this new proposal.

I am also concerned that if there is not enough parking for the proposed new houses that people will park outside my house causing me problems getting on and off my driveway, which I am sorry will be unacceptable.

Within the proposal I cannot see and planning/provision for the potential new residents to charge an electric vehicle if they have one. Considering the government proposals to work towards a cleaner environment by trying to get more people to switch to electric cars, the current plans do not take any of this into consideration.

There is no mention of the Bus stop currently situated outside the Mayfield garage site, I can only surmise that the person who wants to build on this side wants this removed. Although I do not use the bus very often the bus stop where is it currently situates is ideal as it provides a good services for people living in Bevan Close and Ticonderoga Gardens.

One last thing, Does everyone know that there are new road calming measures being installed on Archery Road, works was due to start on the 6th March, but I have been told that these measures are definitely going ahead. This being the case and from the information that I was supplied with as a resident of Archery road, I think you will find that part of these road calming measure with be a problem for where some of the suggested allocated parking is going to be on the proposed site. Has any of this been taking into consideration. I am sorry but I think NOT.

I do not think enough research into the area has been done by the person who has submitted these plans. I may be wrong but I just feel that they have overlooked the impact on the residents already living in the area, for the sake of getting what they want, with little regard for anyone else.

Whether this is submitted and read at the meeting or not, I thank you for your time and hopefully for taking the time to present my thoughts on this matter.
