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#### **DETAIL (Including consultation carried out)**

3.	The Scrutiny Inquiry Panel undertook the inquiry over 5 evidence gathering meetings and received information from a wide variety of organisations. This included the Leader of the Council, Public Health England, academics from the Universities of Southampton, Cambridge and City – University of London,
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	Energise Me, Solent NHS Trust, City Catering, Bristol City Council, Leeds City Council, Testlands as well as Southampton City Council officers.
4.	The draft final report, shown as Appendix 1, has been sent to the individuals who provided evidence to the Inquiry. Comments generated from this consultation process have been reflected in the final report.
5.	The final meeting of the Scrutiny Inquiry Panel was due to be on 8 <sup>th</sup> April 2020. Due to the Coronavirus this meeting was postponed. Evidence emerging from the pandemic has identified obesity as a risk factor that can worsen the effect of Covid-19.
6.	Evidence presented to the Panel preceded the pandemic and the report has not been retrospectively changed to reflect the current position. It is the intention to reflect upon Covid-19, and the impact of the lockdown on childhood obesity, in the Chair's Introduction to the report that will be drafted prior to the final report being presented to the OSMC and Cabinet.
7.	The Panel is now invited to consider the attached final report, and summary of the draft conclusions and recommendations, and approve a final report for submission to the OSMC in August 2020.
