Brief Service Profile (including number of customers)

The Council is the owner of a large portfolio of investment properties in the City. The decision concerns a Council freehold owned parade of shops (176 – 202) in the Northern Above Bar area of the City, where several properties are subject to long leases. A previous Cabinet decision resolved to dispose of properties to individual long leaseholders. Following a change in administration there has been a review of this strategy. The current Cabinet report recommends ceasing the sales in the Northern Above Bar area and that future decisions regarding these properties are taken once a vision and strategy has been developed through a masterplanning process which will form a development brief.

Summary of Impact and Issues

The area of Northern Above Bar is situated in the Bargate ward. The ward profile data from the Southampton Data Observatory shows that it is the most deprived ward in the City (Source: Index of Multiple Deprivation (2015) Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) and it has the highest recorded crime rate in the City (Source: Hampshire Constabulary and Hampshire County Council's 2016 based Small Area Population Forecasts).
