This has included a minimum of six meetings and drop-in sessions at each Day Service centre for individuals using Day Services (where appropriate), their relatives and carers and two public meetings at the Civic Centre. Separate meetings have been held for Councillors and other stakeholders, including the council's partners and providers. Independent advocates have been commissioned to obtain the views of the individuals using Day Services, where appropriate. Coproduction meetings and working groups have been running concurrently with the consultation and the findings from this work will also inform the recommendations contained in the report.
