The HSF is funded by central government to provide direct payments to families and individuals in particular hardship at a time of rising costs.

SCC has been advised that there will be an award in the region of £2m for the period 1/10/2022 to 31/3/2022 – to date the accompanying guidance and eligibility criteria for the fund have yet to be received, however the broad outline as indicated in the accompanying cabinet report

Summary of Impact and Issues

There may be groups who are vulnerable to rising prices even though they are supported through these schemes, for example large families or single-income families. It is important to stress that The Fund is intended to cover a wide range of low-income households in need including families with children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers, and people with disabilities.

Information to date advises that when administering the fund Authorities are encouraged to adopt the following principles:

- use discretion on how to identify and support those most in need, taking into account a wide range of information;
- use the funding from 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023 to meet immediate needs and help those who are struggling to afford energy and water bills, food, and other related essentials. Authorities can also use the funding to support households who are struggling to afford wider essentials;

- in exceptional cases of genuine emergency, the funding can additionally be used to support housing costs where existing housing support schemes do not meet this exceptional need,
- this includes payments made, or committed to, by the Authority or any person acting on behalf of the Authority, from 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023.
- work together with District Councils and third parties, including where necessary and appropriate other local services. This may include social workers, housing and family support services, and may incorporate intelligence and data from wider children's social care systems to help identify and support individuals, families and households within the scope of The Fund.

Failure to accept these funds would mean Southampton residents not having access to this at a time of rising costs

Potential Positive Impacts

- Support families and individuals in need at a time of rising prices
- Enable families to access other support including advice and guidance on benefits and other support they may be eligible for
