BYE-LAWS

FOR THE

**MANAGEMENT, USE, AND REGULATION OF
ST. MICHAEL'S HOUSE.**

Bye-Laws made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southampton, acting by the Council under the provisions of Section 62 (1) of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, for the management, use and regulation of the Lodging House established by them for male persons and known as St. Michael's House.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these bye-laws the expression "the Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southampton, acting by the Council.

For securing that the Lodging House shall be under the management and control of the officers, servants or others appointed or employed in that behalf by the Council. For preventing damage, disturbance, interruption and indecent and offensive language and behaviour and nuisances.

2. Every person resorting to the Lodging House shall before being admitted to use such Lodging House obtain by payment from the authorized money-taker a ticket whereon shall be stated, in addition to such other particulars as the Council may from time to time direct, the part or parts of such Lodging House which such person shall be entitled to use.

3. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not wilfully obstruct the Superintendent of the Lodging House, or any officer, servant or person appointed or employed by the Council, in the proper execution of his duty.

4. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any part of such Lodging House or any furniture or fittings therein, or any bedding or other articles supplied for his use.

5. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not by shouting or by any disorderly or improper conduct, disturb or interrupt any other person in the proper use of the Lodging House or any part thereof.

6. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not use therein any indecent and offensive language or behave therein in an indecent and offensive manner.

7. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not, except in any case of illness, bring or cause to be brought therein, any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.

8. A person who is in a state of intoxication shall not enter or remain in the Lodging House.

9. A person resorting to the Lodging House shall not smoke tobacco or any other like substance in any cubicle or room used or appointed for use as a sleeping apartment.

10. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing bye-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of Five Pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Forty Shillings for each day after written notice of the offence from the Council. Provided nevertheless, that the justices or court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment

as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this bye-law.
