

BYELAW for the Good Rule and Government of the City of Southampton and for the prevention and suppression of Nuisances, made by the Southampton City Council under Section 235 of the Local Government Act 1972.

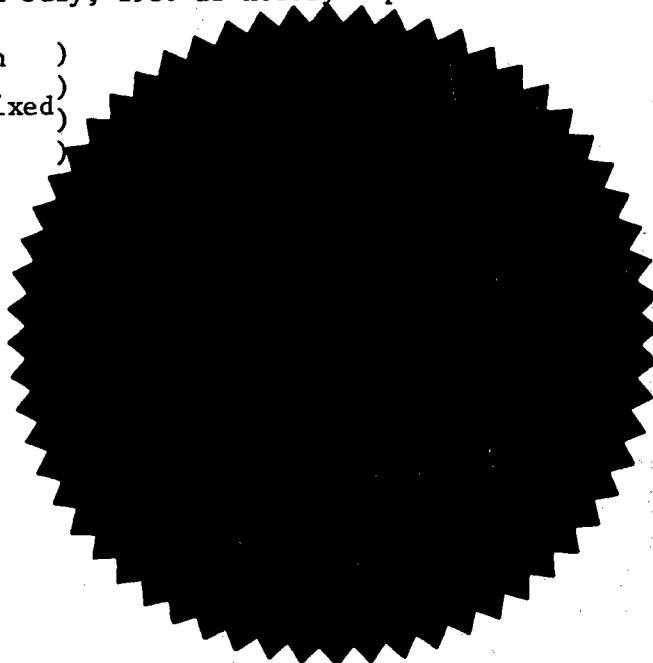
Roller-Skating on Public Footways

1. No person shall on any public footway or carriageway skate on rollers, skateboards, wheels or other mechanical contrivances to the danger of other persons lawfully using the footway or carriageway.
2. In this byelaw "public footway" includes public highways, public paved areas, pedestrian precincts, pavements, garage areas adjoining pavements or public highways and paths in public parks (unless such paths are specified by the Council as being suitable for skating and indicated as such by notice displayed).
3. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.¹⁵⁰
4. Repeal of Byelaw.
